### A Quick Study...

Rock Hard Ten didn't waste any time once he made it to the races, winning his maiden going seven furlongs at first asking Feb. 7 before tacking on a two-turn allowance victory Mar. 3. Thrown to the wolves in the GI Santa Anita Derby exactly one month later, Rock Hard Ten was making a winning move, but drifted inward in deep stretch. That move forced Imperialism to take up, and the inexperienced colt found himself demoted from second to third, effectively eliminating a chance at the Kentucky Derby. Fifth in the Belmont following his effort at Old Hilltop, Rock Hard Ten was an impressive winner of the GII Swaps Breeders' Cup S. July 10, but went missing after a disappointing sixth in the GI Haskell Invitational H. Aug. 8.

### Dazzling Debut for Mandella...

Making his first start for new trainer Richard Mandella, Rock Hard Ten was content to trail the field as Stone Rain (Grindstone) set fractions of :22.20 for the quarter and :44.35 to the half. Asked to take up the running leaving the three-eighths marker, the son of Kris S. advanced on his own courage into the stretch and took aim on the front. Stevens was closing fast on Perfect Moon, who took a short lead in deep stretch, and decided to go inside instead of around that rival. The choice nearly proved costly as Rock Hard Ten was just able to sneak through a narrow opening between rivals en route to the win. Harvard Avenue raced along the inside in the stretch and was forced to steady off heels at the eighth pole before staying on gamely for third. The script unfolded just as Mandella thought it might. "I told Gary not to get in a hurry, just let him settle back, get comfortable, and when he's ready to go, go on. What a great ride it was." The winner will make his next appearance in either the GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup S. Jan. 15 or the GII Strub S. Feb. 5.

Wayne Lukas, Carson City won the GII Sapling S. as a two-year-old and added victories in the GII Fall Highweight H. and GIII Boojum H. the following year. As a sire, Carson City was repre-

sented by Grade I winners State City, City Zip, City Band, Carson Hollow, Cuvee, Flying Chevron, From Carson City (Brz), Islam, and Pearl City, as well as Canadian champion Small Promises. In 2004, the chestnut sired 10 stakes winners, including graded stakes winners Bohemian Lady, Classic Elegance, Molto Vita, and Pollard's Vision. From 11 crops to race, Carson City has sired 72 stakes winners and the earners of more than \$50 million.

### Calder to Employ Temporary Safety Rail From Chute:

Calder Race Course has introduced a new temporary safety rail for races contested at six, 6 1/2 and seven furlongs out of the chute. "We had been experimenting over the years with ways to deter horses from making a left turn at the gap once they come out of the chute," said Steve Cross, director of racing surfaces. "Riders cite it as a problem everywhere and we wanted to find a way to keep it from happening." The safety rail includes a three-foot plastic panel on top of a rail on wheels which can easily be set up and removed for those races beginning in the chute.




