Nov. 24, and trainer Barclay Tagg is looking at the Hutcheson as a starting point for his charge's threeyear-old campaign. "The Remsen is a throw-out," Tagg told *Daily Racing Form*. "He had a bad trip every step of the way. The Hutcheson is really coming back a little too soon for him, but there really isn't any other place to run him." Tagg would have preferred to run his colt going a bit further, but with Gulfstream's revised stakes schedule, is bringing Big Truck back a bit earlier. "I wish they had left the Holy Bull where it used to be during the opening month of the meet instead of moving it back near the end [Apr. 12]," Tagg added. "That would have been perfect. The only reason I'm turning him back to seven furlongs is because there's nowhere else to go right now." Hutcheson cont. p2



IN THE PROVINCES


Just as the North American auction marketplace is shrinking outside Kentucky, so, too, is the concentration of stallions there becoming so intense that Not For Love (\$25,000, in Maryland) is the only stallion I know of in North America who stands outside Kentucky for more than \$15,000. The one exception to the concentration of stallions is Florida, which effectively acts like a Triple AAA baseball club, feeding its best prospects to the majors. It was happening as far back as Mr. Prospector and Fappiano, and has continued in recent years with the relocation of the likes of Stormy Atlantic, Yes It's True, Successful Appeal and Songandaprayer, to name just a few.

Of the 36 North American stallions I've selected to highlight in this issue (see p9), which stand in Florida, California, and the three eastern states of Maryland, New York and Pennsylvania, 16 (44 percent) stand in Florida. Of those 16, probably at least 10 could be said to still be having tryouts for Kentucky. Not that they necessarily would move, but, if successful, they could do so. Only three of the 16 had more than three crops racing at the end of 2007, and one of those, **Alphabet Soup**, is being sent by Adena Springs from its Kentucky farm to its Florida division. I've been recommending him for years, so I'm unlikely to stop now that he's back down to around his original stud fee.

Using the 2007 year-end state sire lists, and the North American General Sire and Juvenile Sire lists from bloodhorse.com, four of the top six on the 2007 Florida list make this list. Florida's number one sire in 2007 was Trippi, who ranked 42nd on the General Sire List. He had ranked number five on the 2006 Juvenile Sire List with his second crop, and was number four in Florida in 2006, with two crops racing. In 2007, his third crop ranked 23rd on the Juvenile Sire List (19 two-year-old winners), and number one in Florida with the earners of nearly \$4.4 million, headlined by GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint third Miss Macy Sue and GII Kelso H. winner Trippi's Storm. Both of those runners hailed from Trippi's first crop, four-year-olds of 2007. Second in Florida (72nd nationally) is Montbrook, whose stud fee reached as high as \$20,000, but is back down to \$10,000 again for 2008. He sported a 2.01 APEX A Runner Index through July 31, 2007, and has sired 35 stakes winners in 10 crops. Number five in Florida last year was Concerto, also with a 2.01 A Runner index, and the sire in 2005 of Bellamy Road, winner of the GI Wood Memorial with a spectacular 120 Beyer figure. Like Trippi and Montbrook, Concerto stands at Ocala Stud.

Number six was another third-crop sire, Bridlewood's **Put It Back**. He registered an equally spectacular 3.69 A Runner index through July 31, including top sprinters In Summation (winner of the GIII El Conejo H. at Santa Anita on New Year's Day) and Smokey Stover. The latter's connections also have the unbeaten Put It Back Put It Back filly, High Resolve.

Florida nearly always has something to say about the Freshman Sire list, and in 2007 the state's leading freshman sires were **D'wildcat** and **Repent**, both of

whom stand at Vinery South and who ranked 11th and 13th, respectively, among 2007 freshman sires nationally. D'wildcat, who was from Forest Wildcat's first crop and won the GI Frank J. DeFrancis Memorial, had five stakes horses which won or



placed in 11 stakes, including The **Repent** Louise Reinagel photo Golden Noodle, winner of the Landaluce S. at Hollywood Park, and later third in the GI Hollywood Starlet. Interestingly, six of his seven winners--90 percent of his 2007 progeny earnings--came on all-weather surfaces. Repent, a Grade II winner at two and three, ran second to Johannesburg in the GI Breeders' Cup Juve-

nile at two and second to Medaglia d'Oro in the GI Travers at three. He had 18 winners, including four stakes horses.

Peace Rules, a Grade I winner at three (Blue Grass S., Haskell Invitational) and four (Suburban H.), and third in the GI Kentucky Derby to Funny Cide and Empire Maker in 2003, is one of four prominent Florida prospects for the 2008 Freshman Sire list. An earner of over \$3 mil-



Peace Rules Louise Reinagel photo lion by Forty Niner's beautifully bred son, Jules, Peace Rules had 50 yearlings sell last year for an average of \$50,963 (per *Insta-Tistics*), and a high of \$220,000. Even so, he barely edged out the previously unknown **Spanish Steps**, an unraced full brother to Unbridled's Song, for leadership among Florida's first-year

sires of yearlings in 2007. That stallion's 25 yearlings sold averaged \$50,548, with a high of \$200,000. When a Florida sire comes from nowhere to post numbers like those (off an original \$5,000 stud fee), you know they must look the part. Another interesting prospect is **Omega Code**. Winner of the GIII San Miguel S. sprinting at Santa Anita, he was from the inaugural crop sired by Elusive Quality. The 34 yearlings from Omega Code's first crop averaged \$31,647, with a high of \$150,000. Finally, there is Burning Roma (Rubiano), who won the GI Futurity as a two-year-old and went on to win or place in 24 stakes in 36 lifetime starts, earning just over \$1.5 million. He had only two yearlings sell, averaging just \$4,000, but four weanlings from his second crop averaged \$16,750, with a high of \$40,000. He had the racetrack credentials, especially class and consistency, to make those prices look ridiculously cheap.

Two remaining Florida stallions with their first foals in 2007 merit a mention. I would have said three, but Closing Argument, who won the GIII Holy Bull S. and ran second to Giacomo in the GI Kentucky Derby in 2005, has now followed his sire, Successful Appeal, in the migration to Kentucky. He had 11 foals sell from his first crop last year, averaging an impressive \$40,545, with a high of \$185,000. Still in Florida is Bwana Charlie (Indian Charlie), one of the top three-year-old sprinters of 2004, when he won two graded stakes, including the GII Amsterdam S. at Saratoga. He placed in four more stakes, and ran fourth in both the GI King's Bishop S. and GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. Six weanlings from his first crop averaged \$28,666, with a high of \$60,000. Another with his first yearlings in 2008 is High Fly (Atticus), a Live Oak homebred who won the GII Fountain of Youth S. and GI Florida Derby in 2005. He comes from a top family developed by Charles T. Wilson at Jonabell Farm: his third dam is One Sum, winner of five graded races in the early days and a halfsister to GI Belmont S. winner Summing.



There are rumblings among Florida breeders that other states with bigger incentive programs and purses (particularly Pennsylvania now, the latest to benefit from slots-fueled supplements) are staring to impact the Florida breeding industry. So it will be interesting to follow whether this has an effect on stallion retirements and developments. One prospect it definitely didn't impact is Pomeroy (Boundary), who won graded stakes at Saratoga three consecutive years, namely the GI King's Bishop at three, the GII Alfred G. Vanderbilt at four (Beyer 114) and the GI Forego at five. He covered 150 mares last year. Another who was well supported was Mass Media, one of three Grade I performers up to a mile in Touch Gold's first two crops on this list. Mass Media, who covered 80 mares last year, won the Forego as well, and placed in the GI Cigar Mile and GI Met Mile. An interesting Florida recruit who debuts this year is Wilko. He'll hold court at Adena Springs South and is by that outfit's star Kentucky sire, Awesome Again. Wilko only won one stakes in his life, but it happened to be the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. However, he also placed in 11 other stakes, including a second in the G1 Dubai World Cup in 2006, and earned over \$2.4 million.


California: Native Sons Rule...

Though California was for a few years the favored dumping ground for stallions which almost but not quite made it in Kentucky (then followed Texas, now Pennsyalvania), five of the top seven sires on the 2007 California sire list have stood there for their entire careers. California's number one sire in 2007 was Bertrando, whose runners earned \$4.2 million (ranked 45th nationally), and included eight stakes winners. With the advent of mandated all-weather surfaces to replace dirt at the Southern California tracks, it looks significant that all five of the top California homegrown sires in 2007 had between 30 and 37 percent of their 2007 progeny earnings on synthetic surfaces. Bertrando had 37 percent, and three of his eight 2007 stakes winners (also 37 percent) came on the allweather. Second in California was another of the state's perennial leaders, In Excess (37 percent of earnings AW, 25 percent of 2007 stakes winners). Fourth in California was Unusual Heat (3.71 APEX A Runner Index), a virtual unknown even in California until the APEX figures uncovered him a few years ago. His runners earned over \$3.5 million last year; 36 percent of his 2007 progeny earnings came on all-weather, including three of his five (60 percent) 2007 stakes winners. Fifth in California was Swiss Yodeler, who was California's top sire in 2006, when he had GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Thor's Echo. Now aged 14, he's the only one of California's current top five homegrown sires under 17 years of age. He had 30 percent all-weather earnings, and one of his three 2007 stakes winners was on a synthetic surface.

This top five is rounded off by **Benchmark** (30-percent AW, 33-percent AW stakes winners in 2007/two of six), sire of dual Grade I winner and \$1.5-million earner Brother Derek; and top 2007 sprinter, Idiot Proof, a Grade I winner and second in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. Deputy Commander (third) and Salt Lake (sixth) were the two Kentucky imports to also top \$3 million in 2007 progeny earnings.

Horses which raced in California are naturally logical candidates to stand there, and there are two interesting prospects with their first two-year-olds this year. Momentum won only once in California, in the GIII Native Diver H. at three, but he also placed in five stakes there, including Grade I seconds in the Hollywood Gold Cup and Pacific Classic, running Beyers as high as 116. That would earn him a place at stud anywhere, which makes him an especially interesting prospect for the Golden State. Marino Marini, a \$1.8-million yearling by Storm Cat, was Group 1-placed at two in Ireland. He placed in four graded stakes in America, including when second by a head in the GI Malibu S. in his dirt debut. He was a real speedball, with serious form ranging from five to seven furlongs. Singletary was a top grass horse in California over four seasons. He also won the GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Lone Star in one of his rare forays outside California. He won or placed in 15 grass stakes in 22 career starts, and will have his first yearlings in California in 2008.

These days, the top 40 on the year-end General Sire List is almost all Kentucky sires. It's newsworthy when a stallion standing in another state makes that list. In 2007, only one stallion from the five states we're covering penetrated the top 40, and that is Not For Love, who, not coincidentally, has the highest stud fee (\$25,000) of any stallion standing in those five states (Florida, California, Maryland, New York, Pennsylvania). He's number 18 on the General Sire List, with 2007 earners of more than \$5.7 million, including 11 stakes winners. Number two in Maryland is Outflanker, who transferred over from Florida and looks a real bargain at \$4,000. He's sired the winners of over \$3.5 million this year, with eight stakes winners, three of them graded. Louis Quatorze, a son of Sovereign Dancer and sire of the promising freshman sire Repent, is number three in Maryland, with progeny earnings over \$3 million. His first Maryland crop was juveniles of 2007. He was previously in Kentucky, but Maryland looks a good move for him right now.

Maryland's leading stud farm, Northview, which stands Not For Love and Two Punch among others, has an exciting freshman sire prospect for 2008 in Domestic Dispute. He's a son of Unbridled's Song who won two California two-turn Grade IIs, the Santa Catalina at three and the Strub as a four-year-old. Trained by the engaging Paddy Gallagher, his form has an authentic stamp about it as he ran Beyers of 107-106-108 when running first or second in three Grade II races at nine, seven, and eight furlongs in his four-year-old year. Twenty yearlings from his first crop averaged \$49,370 at the sales, with a high of \$240,000, which puts him in the same ballpark, commercially, as Florida stallions Peace Rules and Spanish Steps. Medallist, who moves to Northview from Three Chimneys in Kentucky, is the second of the three by Touch Gold in today's story. He won the GII Dwyer and GIII Withers at three and the GIII Deputy Minister at four, and was second to Forest Danger in the GI Carter. Five weanlings from his first Kentucky crop averaged \$24,600 last year. Also with his first foals last year (but always in Maryland) is Oratory, a son of Pulpit who impressively won the GII Peter Pan as a three-year-old in 2005. Still owned by Darley, he stands at Country Life Farm, which developed Malibu Moon before he went back to Kentucky.

New York's sire power seems depleted these days, but one bright spot is **Freud**, a stakes-placed full brother to Giant's Causeway. He had good mid-year APEX ratings (1.98 A Index, 2.08 ABC Index), and his second crop included Quick Little Miss, a dual Grade I-placed two-year-old in 2006. His third crop includes Meriwether Jessica, second in four stakes at two last year, including the GIII Tempted. He's siring quality and precocity.

now, too, though, including **Read** the Footnotes, who kicked off in Florida with a crop that will be twoyear-olds in 2008. Nineteen yearlings from his Florida crop averaged \$29,568 last year, with a high of \$140,000. Also of interest is **Midas Eyes**, who won the GI Forego as a four-year-old, having placed in both the GI Cigar Mile (to Congaree) and GI Malibu at three. He's the third of our three interesting regional sire sons of Touch Gold.



Read the Footnotes Horsephotos

Plenty of stallions who started out in Kentucky have ended up in Pennsylvania over the years, but with three Grade I winners in his first three crops, **Real Quiet**--who missed winning the 1998 Triple Crown by a nose--looks like the state's first legitimate \$10,000 stud fee sire in recent memory. Besides Pussycat Doll, a Grade I winner at three, four and five, Real Quiet is the sire of 2007 sensation Midnight Lute, winner of the GI Forego (Beyer 124, fastest figure of the year) and the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. He is sure to be named North America's champion sprinter when the Eclipse Awards are announced later this month.

Lite the Fuse, a son of Buckaroo who won six stakes sprinting, including the GI Carter H. twice (he also ran second twice in the GI Met Mile), has stood in several



different states or provinces, and has defied the odds to be a very decent stallion everywhere. In 2007, he had GII Super Derby hero Going Ballistic. An interesting new recruit to Pennsylvania for 2008 is **Service Stripe**, a Pin Oak-bred son of Deputy Minister who ripped up the record books

in Michigan, then stood for five seasons at Crestwood Farm in Kentucky. He had a mid-year 2007 APEX A Runner Index of 2.31, and had 18 winners listed in *TDN* Progeny PP's from his first three Kentucky crops in just the last three months of last year.

Nominations from the Floor...

This is a business which depends upon everybody not having exactly the same opinion, so I am pleased to report the choices of various readers which have not made previous lists. Eight horses were pointed out to me as having been 'overlooked,' and though the cynical among you will notice that six of the eight 'nominations from the floor' so far are first-year stallions, I hasten to assure you that the majority of these were not nominated by the farms at which they stand. The first of the eight to have runners, though, will be Champali, whose first foals will race this year. I must admit I nearly put him in anyway, so I was actually guite pleased that one of our readers pushed him over the borderline. He's a son of Glitterman, himself a grandson of Bold Ruler by Dewan. Glitterman sired Grade I winners Balto Star and Glitter Woman among others. Champali himself won four Grade III races at two (one mile) and four (three, all at six furlongs), and won four other stakes as a threeyear-old. He had eight stakes wins in all, plus another five stakes placings in 22 starts, and earnings over \$1 million. He had 28 yearlings sell in his first crop, averaging \$28,111, with a high of \$200,000. He had the speed, that's for sure.

A full brother to Group 1 winner Sophisticat and halfbrother to Harlington and Serena's Tune, **Grand Reward** is by Storm Cat out of Serena's Song, so he's bred on the same Storm Cat/Rahy cross as Giant's Causeway. There were 25 weanlings sold from his first crop which averaged \$33,697 last year, and I noticed some attractive pedigrees by him coming up in Book 2 of the Keeneland January sale. It looks like he's going to be a popular commercial sire in his price range.

After Market goes to Lane's End with very attractive credentials, starting with a blockbuster pedigree. He's by Storm Cat out of Tranquility Lake, winner of seven graded races (two Grade I) and over \$1.6 million, and a half-sister (by Rahy) to successful sire Benchmark. After Market won four in a row on the lawn last summer, including the GI Charlie Whittingham H. at Hollywood Park and the GI Eddie Read H. at Del Mar. **Corinthian** was always very talented, but as a result of being disqualified to third after beating First Samurai in the 2006 GII Fountain of Youth S., he didn't officially win a stakes until he was four, last year. He won three in 2007, including the GI Met Mile (Beyer 108), and an off-the-graph Beyer 119 in the inaugural (and therefore ungraded) Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile.

Half Ours, by Unbridled's Song, showed blinding speed to win a five-furlong stakes at Churchill Downs in May of his two-year-old year by four lengths, and brought a final bid of \$6.1 million at the 2006



Keeneland November sale, when Aaron Jones bought out partner Barry Schwartz. He won a Grade II at seven furlongs last year, and placed in a Grade III race at 8 1/2 furlongs, so he wasn't just a one-dimensional speedball. Istan, by Gone West, definitely did not have to carry his racetrack with him. He won five stakes this year at five different tracks, including Grade III wins in Kentucky at Turfway (Polytrack) and Churchill Downs. He joins the roster at Airdrie, which also stands Proud Citizen, a success-

ful 2007 freshman sire by Gone West. Then there is **Purim**, winner of the GI Shadwell Mile this year, by Dynaformer out of a Lord at War mare, who goes to Nathan Fox's Richland Hills Farm. A word to the wise: Dynaformer himself started out at Nathan Fox's previous farm, Wafare. If memory serves, his original stud fee was \$5,000.

Finally, **Scat Daddy** never ran huge figures, but he showed good form in the traditional key races, winning the GII Sanford and GI Champagne at two (and also second in the GI Hopeful and fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile). At three, the son of Johannesburg won both the GII Fountain of Youth and GI Florida Derby. If form is as important as speed (and it often is), he's got the right credentials.


