#### SANTA ANITA CANCELS SATURDAY CARD

Racing was called off at Santa Anita Saturday after five inches of rain fell on the track in 24 hours. Officials consulted with track maintenance, jockeys and horsemen and determined that there were safety issues with the Cushion Track, which has been plagued by drainage problems. The two graded stakes that were scheduled for the card, the GII San Pasqual H. and GIII Santa Ysabel, will be run next weekend. A decision on today's card is expected to be made at 9 a.m. PST. As for the future, track president Ron Charles told *Daily Racing Form* that managment is "looking at all options on how to get through the meet." Asked if a move to Hollywood was under consideration, he added, "I'd hate to speculate, but we are looking at all options."

#### BERNARDINI REPRESENTED BY FIRST FOAL

The first foal by champion **Bernardini** (A.P. Indy--Cara Rafaela, by Quiet American) was born Friday, Jan. 4 at Gracefield in Lexington. The foal, a filly, was bred by Gracefield and Partners and was produced by Belle Nuit (Dr. Carter), the dam of two-time Grade I winner Octave. Belle Nuit is one of 64 Grade I winners or producers booked to Bernardini in his first year at stud. Winner of the GI Preakness S. and \$3,060,480 in one starstudded year at the races, Bernardini proved a popular covering sire last year, with an average per in-foal mare of \$1,152,000. The five-year-old stands at Darley's Jonabell division in Lexington for \$100,000.

# Hutcheson S. cont. Speed from the Start...


Smooth Air kicked off his career with a front-running maiden victory in the slop at Calder July 21 and came back to be third in the Aug. 11 Dr. Fager S. Freshened after that effort, he chased He's Eze throughout in the Nov. 10 Jack Price Juvenile S., finishing second, but followed up with a decisive allowance tally. Overlooked in his first try in graded company, the Florida-bred was this time rated off the pace as Tiz It (Tiznow), pressed by Silver Edition, cut out fractions of :22.04 and :44.53. Silver Edition drove to the front in the stretch and was game all the way to the wire, but Smooth Air dug in late to get home in front. "The Calder horse did well," trainer Bennie Stutts Jr. said. "You should never count them out. I've been training for 40 years and this is the biggest race I've ever won. I want to thank Brian Burns [Mount Joy Stable] for giving me the opportunity. I've had a small division for him at Calder for seven or eight years." As for what's next, Stutts said, "There are a couple of options to consider, including the Sunshine Millions Dash [Jan. 26 at Santa Anita] and the Sam Davis S. at Tampa Bay Downs [Feb. 16]."

#### First Stakes Winner for Smooth Jazz...

Smooth Air provided sophomore sire **Smooth Jazz** (Storm Boot--Blushing Issue, by Blushing John) with his first stakes winner. The nine-year-old Smooth Jazz was purchased by trainer Tony Dutrow for \$95,000 as a KEESEP yearling, and won his first two starts under Dutrow's colors, including a 2 3/4-length score in the 2002 Best Turn S. Purchased privately by owner Michael Tabor after that effort, he came back to be 10th in the GI Florida Derby, but captured three of his next eight outings for trainer Todd Pletcher, and was retired after his victory in the 2003 GII Commonwealth Breeders' Cup S. Standing at New York's Buckridge Farm for a 2008 fee of \$3,000, Smooth Jazz has had nine winners from his first crop.

MAIMONIDES TO SKIP SAN RAFAEL Next weekend's GIII San Rafael S., the first Kentucky Derby prep race in California, lost some of its luster yesterday when trainer Bob Baffert declared that Zayat Stable's Maimonides (Vindication) would pass the race, owing to the recent spell of inclement weather in Southern California. "He needs another work and the rain messed me up so I'm going to pass," the conditioner told Daily Racing Form. Baffert gave no indication where the colt could appear next. A \$4.6 million Keeneland September yearling purchase, Maimonides originally trained over the Del Mar Polytrack, but debuted instead at Saratoga, where he posted an 11 1/2-length maiden victory Aug. 8. The half-brother to GISWs Roman Ruler and El Corredor was last seen finishing third to Majestic Warrior in the GI Hopeful S. at the Spa Sept. 3.






#### A SALE UNTO ITSELF

Following on the heels of a record-breaking 2006, the 2007 auction season had a lot to live up to. In some segments, such as yearlings and broodmares, the market for Thoroughbred horses held steady or experienced healthy growth. In others, such as juveniles in training, sellers left the sales mildly disappointed, if not surprised, by declines in average and median.

When all was said and done, the year ended in a virtual dead-heat statistically with 2006. So what's in store tomorrow, when Keeneland kicks off the first of the seven sessions of its January Horses of All Ages Sale in Lexington, Kentucky, and what conclusions can be drawn at the sale's end? Does the January Sale act as a mirror to what's happening to the marketplace?


Put simply, no, not really. Perhaps more than any other major sale in the nation--especially given its considerable size--the January Sale is its own animal. Trends at January, in general, rarely tie in to national trends, and that's to be expected given the nature of the sale--there are a great many less expensive horses interspersed with the occasional blockbuster mare or yearling. For example, the inclusion of Mackie, the daughter of Summer Squall who was knocked down to Britton House Stud for \$5 million in 2000, meant an 8.1-percent boost in average for that year's January event.

Keeneland January's incongruity with the rest of the market is especially pronounced when comparing the change in the sale's average from year to year with the change in average of all North American sales. Back in 1998, when the national sales average grew by a healthy 13 percent, the January average skyrocketed 91.4 percent. Comparing the January average with the previous year's national gross average doesn't work either--when the market slumped by 13.7 percent in 2001, the 2002 January sale was up 12.8 percent.

So whether you consider the January Sale the end of one buying season or the beginning of another, it's best to remember that KEEJAN is often a sale unto itself.

#### Luck of the Irish Cherry for Hill 'n' Dale, Lobo...

With a dramatic late-season flourish in form, Daaher (Awesome Again) put himself among the country's elite sprinter/milers by beating probable sprint champion

Midnight Lute in the GI Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile H. in November. It's fitting, then, that the sponsor of that prestigious race is offering Daaher's damthe 13-year-old Irish Cherry-on tomorrow's opening day of selling at Keeneland January. Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency consigns Irish Cherry as hip 284.

Daaher's exploits in 2007, which also include a victory in the GII Jerome H. in October, combined with the accom-

plishments of his full-sister, multiple Grade I winner Spun Sugar, make Irish Cherry one of the more desirable horses at the January sale, and Hill 'n' Dale has plenty of ties to the family.

For starters, Hill 'n' Dale sold Daaher as a 2004 Keeneland September yearling for \$375,000 to Shadwell. A year later, Spun Sugar, racing for her owner/breeder Adena Springs, won the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. as a three-year-old before annexing the GI Apple Blossom H. and GI Go For Wand H. at four.

In the fall of 2006, Hill 'n' Dale consigned Irish Cherry herself, in foal to Storm Cat, to the Keeneland November Sale. Despite the accomplishments of Spun Sugar, bidding for Irish Cherry began to slow well short of the seven figures Hill 'n' Dale chief John Sikura had hoped for, and he instead jumped in and bought the mare himself for \$800,000.

"To be completely frank, I was shocked she didn't bring more money at that sale," Sikura said last week. "My intent was not to buy her, but that's what happened. I thought then that she was a \$1.2- to \$1.5-million mare, especially in foal to Storm Cat. She was just getting started."

Though he landed Irish Cherry for what he considered a bargain, Sikura opted to sell the mare privately to Pierre and Leslie Amestoy's Lobo Farm shortly after the sale when the opportunity arose. Irish Cherry produced a Storm Cat colt for Lobo Farm last spring, and was bred back to Awesome Again's son Ghostzapper on a May 8 cover. According to Sikura, Lobo Farm wasn't looking to part ways with Irish Cherry so soon. But then Daaher came along.

Daaher made an inauspicious debut, running a well-beaten eighth over Keeneland's Polytrack in April. An impressive maiden win on the dirt at Belmont next out convinced his trainer, Kiaran McLaughlin, to give the Ontario-bred a shot in the Queen's Plate at Woodbine, where he ran a respectable fourth in his stakes debut. A third in Fort Erie's Prince of Wales S. made Daaher look like a useful prospect, but then the colt turned a corner in a big way. Adding blinkers in his next start, Daaher blew the doors off a Saratoga allowance, then overcame a rough start to take the Jerome H.

After passing on the Breeders' Cup with his progressive charge, McLaughlin sent Daaher up against GI BC Sprint winner Midnight Lute in the Cigar Mile. Daaher was put on the front end and sizzled through six furlongs in 1:09 4/5, but wouldn't be caught down the lane, cruising home well clear.

Now Irish Cherry boasted two Grade I winners from her first four foals, and Lobo Farm had a change of heart

"They're commercial breeders, and everybody was in agreement that, if you were going to sell, now is the time," Sikura explained. "In this business, you have to take advantage of when fortune smiles upon you. It's the first sale since Daaher won the Grade I, and Ghostzapper's weanlings sold so well. Everything is lined up."

A pair of weanlings by Ghostzapper sold in 2007. A colt made \$775,000, while a filly brought \$735,000. His in-foal mares average a very strong \$423,437.

Plus, Sikura added, Irish Cherry is a fine specimen in her own right.

"She's in great shape; she's a very well-made mare," he said. "And she has a very good Storm Cat foal--he'll be offered at the [2008] Keeneland September Sale. We think she's a must-have mare for a serious breeder."

It will be Irish Cherry's fourth time through the sales ring. Back in 1995, she sold for \$10,000 as a yearling. Adena Springs acquired the mare privately, then resold her (after she produced Spun Sugar for Adena) for \$80,000 at Adena's November sale. Yvonne and Dagmar Schwabe bred Irish Cherry's next four foals: the Wild Rush horse Press Gently; Daaher; an unraced Sky Mesa colt now named A Cat Named Snipe; and an unnamed Medaglia d'Oro filly, now two, which Crupi's New Castle Farm bought for \$200,000 at last August's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale.

At the Keeneland November Sale two months ago, Spun Sugar went through the ring and elicited a bid of \$4.5 million from Shadwell. She was carrying her first foal to the cover of A.P. Indy.

At last year's bloodstock sales, no North American covering sire was more popular than Lane's End's A.P. Indy. The son of Seattle Slew saw 10 in-foal mares go

through the ring, with seven selling for an average of \$2,278,571. At Keeneland January, just one mare sells carrying a foal by A.P. Indy, the Grade II winner Theater R. N. She goes under the hammer tomorrow as hip 112. The eight-year-old Taylor Made consignee is a

daughter of Theatrical (Ire) out of Yokama (Irish River {Fr}), who ran third to Ryafan in the 1997 GI Matriarch S. and later closed out her run with a career-best victory in the GII Long Island H. Theater R. N. matched her dam's feat, capturing a Grade II event of her own when taking the GII Las Palmas H. for trainer Bobby Frankel in 2004. Theater R. N., who raced for Mark Dedomenico LLC, is carrying her first foal.

The only other North American covering sires to average over seven figures in 2007 were Kingmambo (\$2,135,714), Bernardini (\$1,152,000) and Storm Cat (\$1,030,000). There are no mares offered at January in foal to Kingmambo, while one each is offered in foal to Darley's Bernardini and Overbrook's Storm Cat.

Selling shortly after Theater R.N. is another Grade II winner in Two Item Limit (Twining), consigned by Three Chimneys as hip 123. A durable, consistent racehorse, the now 10-year-old Two Item Limit is carrying a member of the first crop of 2006 star three-year-old Bernardini, a son of A.P. Indy. The millionaire Two Item Limit was a four-time graded heroine whose resume included wins in the GII Demoiselle S. and GII Black-Eved Susan S.

The one mare offered in foal to Storm Cat is hip 702, the Mr. Greeley mare Miss Lodi, who Lane's End offers Tuesday. The nine-year-old Miss Lodi was produced by a half-sister to Grade I winner Super May and graded winner Ide, and was a Grade III winner on the track.

Miss Lodi was purchased by Skara Glen Stables for \$2 million in 2004. She has produced three foals by A.P. Indy, a colt and two fillies, and is in foal to Storm Cat on an Apr. 3 cover.

#### **COURTNEY HITS THE WIRE IN FRONT**

When Crestfield Farm patriarch Robert Courtney Sr. bought his first mare in October of 1941, the United States was two months away from being drawn in to

Word War II by Pearl Harbor, Whirlaway was putting the finishing touches on his Triple Crown season and Glen Miller was topping the charts with "Chattanooga Choo Choo." A lot has changed in the interim, and on Wednesday, when hip 1030 goes through the ring, an era will come to an end as the 86-year-old Courtney sells his last horse and officially retires from the business.

"I've had a really good run," said Courtney, who's still sharp as a tack some seven decades

into racing. "I guess it's the time."


Courtney, born and raised in Lexington, Kentucky, said his decision was based on a number of factors.

"I've had two heart procedures in the last 10 years, and my wife, Evelyn, has some health problems, too," he explained. "My wife and I just moved back into town, where we won't have all the stress of running the farm. And, as I've gotten older, my client base has thinned out a great deal. When my main client who boards horses at Crestfield decided that he was going to retire, too, it made my decision easier."

The main client Courtney refers to is Jamie S. Carrion, a Florida-based businessman for whom Courtney has been an advisor since 1977. A prominent breeder under Courtney's tutelage, Carrion privately sold the majority of his broodmare band recently to a single unnamed breeder and is dispersing the remainder of his stock at Keeneland January through Crestfield.

Courtney and Carrion met at a commencement ceremony--Courtney's son and Carrion's daughter both graduated from Rollins College in Florida--and their success in racing has been interwoven ever since.

In 1979, Courtney bought the Raise a Native mare Suspicious Native for \$70,000 on Carrion's behalf. Sent to the Florida stallion Hold Your Peace, Suspicious Native would produce the speedy Meadowlake. Meadowlake won the GI Arlington-Washington Futurity as a juvenile, but was injured and retired after winning all three of his races. Meadowlake enjoyed a successful career as a stallion, siring the likes of Grade I winners Greenwood Lake and Meadow Breeze, as well as two-time GI Breeders' Cup Sprint runner-up Meafara.



Meadowlake's best runner, however, was Meadow Star, another Carrion/Courtney collaboration. Courtney

purchased the In Reality filly Inreality Star for \$125,000 at the 1980 Keeneland July Sale. She won one race for Carrion, but went on to distinguish herself in the broodmare shed. Carrion bred Inreality Star to Meadowlake and came up

with Meadow Star, who Courtney sold as a yearling for \$90,000 at the 1989 Keeneland September Sale.

Racing for Carl Icahn, Meadow Star went a perfect seven-for-seven as a two-year-old. Her wins included the GI Spinaway S. and a 14-length romp in the GI Frizette S., and she put an exclamation point on a brilliant year with a five-length win in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. She was the runaway winner for the Eclipse Award in her division.

Nearly 15 years later, Carrion and Courtney teamed to breed, raise and sell another juvenile champion, Action This Day. Again, it was Courtney who picked out the dam of the future champ for Carrion. Courtney bought the then-five-year-old Najecam, a multiple Grade II-placed mare by Trempolino who was in foal to Gulch, for \$550,000 at the 1998 November Sale.

"I'd found Najecam in the catalog, and I thought, 'I'll buy this mare for me," said Courtney. "For Mr. Carrion,

I'd usually come up with a short list of mares and then take him around to see them. And I didn't put her on the short list, but I liked the little mare. I'm not too picky about the mares--I'm more picky about yearlings. She wasn't quite big enough, but that's all right. So Mr. Carrion was sitting next to me when Najecam came into the ring, and I got to bidding on her, and she just kept going up and up and up. Finally, they brought me the ticket, and he said, 'Who'd you buy that mare for?' And I said, 'I bought her for you.' He said, 'But you didn't show her to me.' And I

laughed and said, 'Well, because I meant to buy her for me, but she got too expensive and now you own her.' I sent her to Kris S. to get a little size into the foal, and that's how we got Action This Day."

Purchased by B. Wayne Hughes for \$150,000 as a Keeneland July yearling in 2002, Action This Day stormed from the back of the pack to win the following year's renewal of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, earning an Eclipse Award as the nation's top juvenile male.

Another major purchase that Courtney made for Carrion was the 1996 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner Storm Song, a \$1.4-million acquisition at the 1997 Keeneland November Sale, the top price for a mare at the sale.

#### A Sweet Start...


The \$1.4 million Courtney bid for Storm Song was a long way from the cost of the first mare he purchased, way back in 1941. Her name was Sweet Face, and she cost Courtney, the son of banker who dabbled in the horse business, the princely sum of \$50.

"It was at Fasig-Tipton, back when they had a sale out on Paris Pike," Courtney remembered. "Keeneland had been built, but didn't have a horse sales facility at that point."

Not long after Courtney bought the 14-year-old Sweet Face, her son, named Bright Willie, won stakes races in New York and at Hialeah Park in Florida, boosting the value of his dam.

"But by then, the war had came along, and my dad said, 'Son, I can't be worrying about your horses,'" Courtney said. "So we sold her for \$1,000."

Not a bad profit. What's more, Sweet Face produced a filly for Courtney by the sire He Did. Sweet Did, whom Courtney sold for \$600 as weanling, became the first winner bred by Courtney.



"So we made \$1,600 out of a mare I paid \$50 for," Courtney said. "That was pretty good. So then I bought a mare for \$1,500, and later I sold her for \$3,500, and that's how it all got started. I've run a first-rate parlay is what I've done."

Courtney's eye for value was never keener than when he bought Hasty Queen II for himself and partner Rob-

ert Congleton for \$11,000. A foal of 1963, Hasty Queen, by the Count Fleet stallion One Time, produced no fewer than six stakes winners, including the top-notch Fit to Fight, for Courtney and Congleton. They sold Fit to Fight, a son of Chieftain, as a yearling for \$175,000 in 1980. Fight to Fight went on

to capture a trio of Grade I victories, with tallies in the Met Mile, Suburban H. and Brooklyn H. Fit to Fight's exploits earned Hasty Queen Broodmare of the Year honors in 1984.

"These days, it's all about money," said Courtney. "[Hasty Queen] was the best mare I every owned, and look what she cost. You can't equate everything to dollars in this business. I have to tell you, I've sold a couple horses for a million dollars, but that's not what I always wanted to do.

"I never had the background where I could go buy high-priced horses, until Mr. Carrion came along. The first mare I bought for him, I gave \$40,000. He said, 'Bob, you don't understand, I want to be in the horse business.' So I went out and bought a mare for \$125,000. He said, 'Bob, you don't understand--I want to be in the *horse business*.' At first, he equated everything to dollars. He thought that if one brought \$20,000, it was twice as good as one that brought \$10,000. And that's not always true."

Despite his 'official' retirement, Courtney is retaining some Thoroughbred interests. The land he bought in 1956 that became Crestfield Farm will be sold privately by Justice Real Estate, but a second Crestfield will still be run by Courtney's son, Robert Courtney, Jr. Courtney also plans to keep a few broodmares, including Golden Illusion, a stakes-placed half-sister to Grade II winner Dollar Bill. Courtney bred both Golden Illusion and Dollar Bill, having purchased their dam, Saratoga Dame, for just \$55,000, while she was carrying Golden Illusion. He sold Golden Illusion, by Devil's Bag, for \$70,000 as a yearling in 1997, then bought her back \$210,000 when her racing career was through in 2000.

"I tell you, sentiment is a damned expensive thing in the horse business," Courtney chuckled. "But I'm going to keep some mares with my son, and I'm going to keep some mares with other people, just so I have some people to go around and harass."






