According to Asmussen, the four-year-old colt will return to the worktab Saturday, joining stablemate **Pyro** (Pulpit), who was runner-up to War Pass in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. An Eclipse award finalist in the two-year-old male division, Pyro is scheduled to have four more works before a start in the Feb. 9 GIII Risen Star S.

The second and third choices, respectively, behind favored Mini Sermon, Golden Velvet and Lady Marlboro rated behind that rival through opening splits of :23.62, :46.10 and 1:11.04. Golden Velvet made the first move, steering wide on the turn, but encountering the heels of Mini Sermon in the process. Forced outside of that foe, the Darley homebred forged to the front and looked like the winner with a furlong left to negotiate. However, Lady Marlboro had something left, and countered with a rail-skimming run that brought the bays to the wire in tandem. Mini Sermon rounded out the trifecta. "Right after the finish, I was on the phone to Jimmy Bell [Darley racing manager in Kentucky] and I frankly thought we got beat, so we'll be glad to settle for the dead-heat," said Kiaran McLaughlin, trainer of Golden Velvet. "Her next race will probably be the [GII] Rampart H. Mar. 9."

Golden Velvet, a half sister to Grade I winner Sky Mesa, had raced with modest success in France and Dubai in 2006 and 2007, but started to turn things around with an eye-catching score going a mile at Belmont in a \$75,000 optional claimer Oct. 18. Favored in her latest start in the GII Top Flight H. Nov. 23, the dark bay had to settle for third behind winner Mini Sermon and Lady Marlboro. The latter, who is a full to the useful stakes winner Two Down Automatic, also put in a career-best performance heading into the Top Flight, winning the Lifes Magic S. by five lengths at Belmont Oct. 12. "I really thought she [Lady Marlboro] got in front near the finish," explained Lady Marlboro's trainer Jimmy Jerkens. "She's really come around in her last three starts now. I'm not sure where we go from here, except that she's better going one turn rather than two."



SANTA ANITA KO'D AGAIN SUNDAY After rain continued to plague Southern California, Santa Anita Park officials decided to cancel racing Sunday due to the slippery condition of the new synthetic surface. Following 48 hours of heavy rainfall, the Cushion Track failed to drain properly, which has caused the surface to be inconsistent in spots. Track officials met with several riders and horsemen Sunday morning to ascertain whether the track would be safe for racing, however, further rain late Sunday morning forced the cancellation of the second consecutive day of racing at the Arcadia oval. The California Horse Racing Board will conduct a special meeting by teleconference Tuesday to consider allowing Santa Anita to move some or all of its racing dates to Hollywood Park if the drainage problems are not quickly resolved. Santa Anita's training track will remain open, and the track will be open to the public for simulcast wagering, with free General Admission offered to all attendees. Live racing is scheduled to resume today, with first post time at 1 p.m.





KEENELAND JANUARY STARTS TODAY

After two years of record-setting entries, the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale gets underway today in Lexington with a slightly smaller cata-



logue. Last year, 2,933 horses were catalogued during an eight-day sale, while this term 2,548 head will sell over seven sessions. This year's catalogue includes 1,201 broodmares, 862 yearlings, 482 horses of racing age and two stallions. The numbers are not a concern for Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell, who views January entries as an extension of the November sale. "[In 2007], the November sale was larger," Russell observed. "Some people just de-

cided to market their horses in November instead of January--that's what the difference in the size really comes down to, I think, anyway. If you combine the two sales, you're about even. It all balances out." The 2006 November and 2007 January catalogues totaled 7,961, while the 2007 November and 2008 January figure is 7,963.

A Sale Unto Itself...

It's easy to look at the January sale as an extension of Keeneland's November auction, but Russell thinks the January sale has created its own identity. "January is an interesting sale," Russell admitted. "It was developed as an afterthought to the November sale, but it has now established itself in its own niche within the sales season. We've seen that in the last couple of years, where people have planned to sell here. It's a very good spot for broodmare prospects, which we seem to attract a lot of." A broodmare prospect stole the show at last year's January auction, with Grade I winner Point Ashley (Point Given) bringing a sale-topping \$1.8 million. The 2007 auction recorded a record gross of \$72,868,200. This year's offerings include the dispersals of Jaime Carrion and of the late Cynthia Phipps.

November Trends Likely to Continue...

Results at last year's November sale were buoyed by a strong foreign contingent and Russell thinks that trend will continue in January. "Our dollar is still very weak, so it has a great attraction to our international buyers," he said. "And we're looking forward to a strong regional participation as well. We hope that the trends from November continue." Keeneland first held its January Sale in 1956 and has staged the auction annually since 1961. Among the sale's prominent graduates are Mackie, a half sister to Kentucky Derby winner Sea Hero; champion Escena; Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Desert Stormer; Solar Slew, dam of champion Cigar; and major stakes winners Showing Up and Downthedustyroad. Bidding begins daily at 10 a.m. and the sale runs through Sunday.

62, died from injuries suffered in a fire at her Manhattan apartment last October. Claiborne Farm is handling the consignment. "It's a sad time," admitted Claiborne's Dell Hancock. "Cynthia was a great sportswoman. She really loved her horses. And she was a great person." A member of the prominent racing family, Phipps entered racing in the 1970s. Among the horses to carry her gold and purple silks to victory were 1982 champion three-

year-old filly Christmas Past; Grade I winners Versailles Treaty; Gold Fever and Singh, as well as graded stakes

winners Sugar Plum Time, Saarland, Jackpot, For Kicks, Out of Place and Lead Kindly Light. The January dispersal provides a chance to bid on pedigrees not often on offer at public auction. "This is a unique opportunity," admitted Hancock. "Obviously, it all goes back to that one

great mare, Ten Cents a Dance (Buckpasser)." Ten Cents a Dance is the dam of multiple Grade I winner Versailles Treaty (Danzig), the dam of GII Remsen S. winner and GI Met Mile runner-up Saarland. "There are a lot of young mares from that family and this is an opportunity to buy into that family." Versailles Treaty herself, in foal to Unbridled's Song, will be offered as hip 482. The in-utero foal is a three-quarter sibling to Saarland. "She's 20, but she looks good," Hancock said of Versailles Treaty. "And there are some young mares out of her."

Daughters of Versailles Treaty on offer are: lot 373, the unraced broodmare prospect Palais Versailles (Pulpit); lot 406, Rhineland (Mr. Prospector), in foal to Giant's Causeway; and lot 450, the broodmare prospect Supreme Council (Rahy). Rhineland's yearling filly by El Prado (Ire) sells as lot 407, while her stakes placed daughter Cologne (Horse Chestnut {SAf}) sells as lot 560 and her three-year-old colt **Wotan** (Dynaformer) sells as 1876. "They all raced in New York against the very best competition. So where you see some of those placings, those probably would have been wins if they weren't in New York against the very best."

Dave and Adrian Munro's Highfield Stock Farm made headlines at last year's Keeneland January sale with the

purchase of multiple graded stakes winner **Solvig** (Caerleon) from the dispersal of F. Eugene Dixon, Jr. Highfield purchased the 10-year-old mare, in foal to dual Classic winner Afleet Alex, for \$750,000. That was the top price of last year's second session of the January auction. Solvig's Afleet Alex foal was foaled last February.

"He is doing very well," Adrian Munro said of the now-yearling. "Our plans are to run him through the September sale at Keeneland."

As for Solvig, Munro added, "She is in foal to Seeking the Gold and is being bred back to Smart Strike. We're going to retain her and see what happens."

Highfield's primary focus is commercial breeding.


"For the most part, we breed to sell," Munro commented. "However, if they don't meet the reserve, we're not afraid to run them as well."

The farm does have a small broodmare band in Kentucky, but the majority of its stock is in Alberta, Canada, which is enjoying a spike in its breeding industry.

"In various partnerships in Kentucky, we have six or seven mares now," Munro said. "Here in Alberta we have 26."

Highfield also stands Captain Bodgit at their Canadian operation, and recently acquired Cape Canaveral.

"We were at the November sale to find more broodmares to bring home here," Munro said. "We just bought Cape Canaveral from Overbrook, so we bought six more mares to bring home to breed to him."

Among those six mares is SW and GSP **Devil at the Wire** (Devil His Due), purchased in November for \$55,000. The breeding industry in Alberta is heating up. In addition to Cape Canaveral, American stallions Gilded Time and Kissin Kris have also moved to the Canadian province. According to Munro, Alberta's burgeoning breeding industry can be traced to its rich incentive program and to construction of a new track.

"Alberta probably has one of the best regional programs that no one knows about, as far as Alberta-breds are concerned," he said. "Our sire bonus last year for Alberta-breds was almost eight percent and our overall breeders bonus was 33 percent for Alberta-breds. They're also working on building a new racetrack in Calgary. Hopefully, we'll have it done for training in January of 2009 and opening in May of 2009."

Highfield Stock Farm does have some horses in training. "Selling is our primary goal, with the mares and stallions that we own now, however, we do have a racing contingent," Munro said. "Our horses are wintering at Delta Downs in Louisiana. Training [in Alberta] will pick up in probably another three weeks."
