#### A CHERRY ON TOP

Back when Pierre and Leslie Amestoy first began breeding Thoroughbreds some 20-odd years ago, they made a promise to each other that they would make it to the top of the game, no matter how long it took.

Yesterday, they saw the realization of that promise when their mare Irish Cherry (Irish Open, dam of Grade I winners Spun Sugar and Daaher, sold to Southern Equine for \$2.7 million to top the opening day of the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale in Lexington, Kentucky. "We got there!"

said a grinning Leslie Amestoy immediately after the sale. The Amestoys, who operate as Lobo Farm, owned Irish Cherry along with Mike Abraham, a longtime friend and partner. Abraham and the Amestoys kept a close watch on their star prior to the 14-year-old's entry into the ring as hip 284, following her from the back walking ring to the lead-in chute. The Amestoys watched with arms crossed and nervous expressions as the bidding quickly escalated past \$600,000 and then \$1 million, but when the price on the board hit \$2 million, Pierre flashed a broad smile to his wife. Irish Cherry's \$2.7-million price tag was the seventh-highest in Keeneland January history, well off the \$5 million paid for Mackie in 2000. John Sikura, whose Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency consigned Irish Cherry, conceded that the mare's age prevented further fireworks. "If she was nine, she would have brought \$5 million," he said. "But her age is offset by the fact that she's thrown two Grade I winners, including what may be one of the best horses in training today." Sikura is referring to Daheer, the son of Awesome Again who won the GI Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile in his most recent effort. Irish Cherry sold in foal to Ghostzapper, a son of Awesome Again. "She's such a classy mare," said Leslie. "I don't know who got her, but that got a very special mare." Cont. p2



year ago. In November of 2006, the stakes-winning Irish Cherry (Irish Open--Eston, by Ancestral {Ire}) could already boast a Grade I winner in Spun Sugar. But at the Keeneland November Sale, bidding began to slow well short of the seven-figure mark, and John Sikura, whose Hill 'n' Dale had consigned her, jumped in to buy her

at what he regarded a bargain \$800,000. Sikura sold the mare privately shortly thereafter to the Amestoys and Abraham, who paid "about \$1 million," according to Leslie. Irish Cherry produced a Storm Cat colt for the partnership this spring, and when Daaher notched an impressive wire-to-wire win in the Cigar Mile in November, they decided that the time was right to sell Irish Cherry. "We were hoping she would do that well, but you never know," said Leslie, who added that the Storm Cat colt will be put through the Keeneland September Sale nine months from now. "He's gorgeous," she added. Neither the Amestoys nor Mike Abraham are strangers to the horse business. Leslie trained for 15 years in New Mexico before marrying Pierre, a former jockey agent who owns and manages Amestoy Dri-wall, a construction company, with his father. They began breeding both Thoroughbreds and Quarter Horses, and actually reached the top of the Quarter Horse world a while ago. In 2002, a runner they owned in partnership with Abraham won the GI Rainbow Futurity. Lobo Farm sits on 265 acres in Paris, Kentucky, where they keep about 30 mares.

#### Southern Equine Aiming High...

Trainer Eric Guillot can't be accused of dreaming small. Guillot went to \$2.7 million to bring home Irish Cherry to Mike Moreno's Southern Equine Stables. Afterwards, Guillot admitted, "The plan is for me to win the Kentucky Derby with the Ghostzapper and syndicate him for \$75 million. Walt Disney is not the only one that can create fantasy." The loquacious Cajun thought the mare's seven-figure price tag was fair. "It was probably about what I thought, maybe \$200,000 more," he said. "I was trying to get her for \$2.5 million, but a couple of hundred here today, what the hell is that going to matter?" But the trainer did admit to a few anxious moments during the bidding. "I thought I had it at \$2.4 million, it stopped, got quiet, then another guy bid, and another. And I thought, 'ahhhh.' That's why I thought I'd take the gamble and just roll with it. Basically I think she was the only one that was worthy. I don't think the big money is here today. I think if everybody was here with the big money, she would have gone for more." Guillot is confident the mare's in utero foal alone will prove the investment worthwhile. "She's got a colt in her belly. I think the Ghostzapper baby, if he becomes a sire, will be worth a mint," he explained. "I think the Ghostzapper babies are pretty good. We've got a few of them now that are pretty sharp. He was a phenomenal individual." Southern Equine, represented on the racetrack last year by GII Best Pal S. winner Salute the Sarge, has added several high-priced purchases to the roster recently. At last year's Keeneland November sale, the organization paid \$1.7 million for a weanling daughter of Pulpit out of Madcap Escapade, as well as \$1.65 million for the mare Spoken Fur. Guillot said Irish Cherry fits the model of the mare Southern Equine is interested in acquiring. "She's the kind of mare that we've been steadily trying to get into the last couple of years," he confirmed. "I get a little choked up when I think about an Irish Open mare, at that age. But when you look at what the produce record is, I don't think there are that many mares through the ring as of late that have produced two Grade I winners. I can't remember the last one at public auction. I was happy with her."



#### What's Next for irish Cherry?

As for 2008 breeding plans for Irish Cherry, Eric Guillot is keeping all options open, but he has an eye on Adena stallion Awesome Again, the sire of her two Grade I winners Spun Sugar and Daaher. "I love Awesome Again," Guillot said. "I bred a couple mares to him this year, but we haven't crossed that bridge just yet. We'll see what the Ghostzapper looks like. We'll be foolish, maybe, not to breed her back to Awesome Again." Guillot said there was a chance the Ghostzapper foal could be sold as a yearling, but more likely would be kept to run for Southern Equine. "There is a 90-percent chance I will keep everything we breed and buy," he explained. "That's what we do. If the individual looks the part and I tell my partner, 'He's the one, Mike,' Mike will say, 'Well, they don't have enough money to buy him.' It's that simple. That's kind of what we do. We're in the racehorse business."

#### Premium Red Headed East...

King Abdullah of Saudi Arabia purchased American Grade I winner Premium Tap, and that acquisition worked out so well, he went to \$700,000 to bring home the six-year-old's dam Premium Red (Thirty Six Red) early in yesterday's opening session of the Keeneland January sale. The 14-year-old mare, in foal to First Samurai, was consigned by Legacy Bloodstock, Agent VI. Frank McGovern, general manager for King Abdullah and Sons Stables, signed the ticket for the chestnut mare. "She's going to Saudi Arabia," McGovern confirmed. While trained in the U.S. by John Kimmel, Premium Tap won the 2006 GI Clark H. and GI Woodward S. and was third in that year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Transferred to Saudi Arabia last January, the bay went on to run second in the G1 Dubai World Cup in his final start for Kimmel. He currently has earnings of over \$2.5 million and is being aimed at a return engagement in the World Cup. Premium Red's now four-year-old Carmel Coffee (Holy Bull) won a Hollywood maiden special weight in his second start Dec. 14. Premium Red will head to Saudi Arabia, but breeding plans have yet to be made. "She'll be bred back in Saudi Arabia," McGovern said. "We haven't decided who she will be bred to. We've got quite a few stallions there. We've got Dynever standing there, as well. So we have several options." Like Premium Tap, King Abdullah and Sons purchased Dynever, an eight-yearold son of Dynaformer, prior to the stallion's runner-up effort in the 2005 World Cup. Premium Tap wasn't the only inducement to buy Premium Red, McGovern said. "We also liked the covering stallion," he explained. First Samurai (Giant's Causeway) won the 2005 GI Champagne S. and GI Hopeful S., as well as the 2006 GII Fountain of Youth S.

### What They're Saying At The Sales...

## TDN Columnist Bill Oppenheim, when asked what New Year's resolutions the horse industry needs to make:

"I think breeders need to find a way to make purse money grow significantly, because of my 'tail wagging the dog' example: owners of racehorses are losing too much of their investments. It's not that breeders shouldn't make money, or even need to be handing some of their profits over to owners. But, as John Gaines did with the Breeders' Cup, the breeders need to find real solutions to the owners' dismal recovery of investment rate, or owners will keep disappearing. Second, as I've said a number of times recently, the business must find a way to create an international organization which can administer internationally, like FIFA does in soccer. From the medication nightmare in North America to a coherent international racing calendar to the ability to market and promote the business world-wide, it's time for such an organization to come into existence."

#### Speightstown Colt Brings \$270k...

A colt from the dispersal of Jaime S. Carrion realized the day's third-highest price yesterday for a yearling after being knocked down to Bridie Morrison of Fair Green Bloodstock. Morrison, standing in a doorway of the sales pavilion, outlasted a determined challenger to secure the attractive chestnut for \$270,000. Morrison said she was acting on behalf of a group of clients. "He'll most likely to stay to race here in America," she said. Asked about his appeal, she added, "I just thought he was a very nice colt. He had plenty of range to him, and I would think he'll be a two-turn horse." The first

The son of Gone West was well-received at the sales last year, and his WinStar and Taylor Made connections are excited about his chances. Jones among freshman sires, which, considering the difference in stud fees, is very good," said WinStar Farm's Robert Hammond. "There has been a lot of buzz about his [first crop], which just turned two. They look like they'll be early, but a lot of them have a lot of scope and look like they'll stretch out, too." Catalogued as hip 205, yesterday's yearling topper was produced by the unraced eight-year-old Deputy Maiden (Deputy Minister), who was actually bred by Carrion before being sold as a yearling by Robert Courtney's Crestfield Farm to WinStar Farm, agent, for \$350,000 in 2001. Deputy Maiden didn't make it to the track, but returned to the ring several more times. She sold for \$160,000 at the 2003 Keeneland November sale, \$335,000 at the 2004 Fasig-Tipton November sale and \$350,000 at the 2005 Fasig sale. She was finally reunited with Carrion and Crestfield in 2006, when Courtney paid \$425,000 for her, carrying this colt, at the Keeneland November sale in 2006.





#### A Flying Start for Aaron and Marie Jones...

Aaron and Marie Jones weren't on the grounds at yesterday's Keeneland January opener, but made their presence felt with the purchase three broodmares. With their advisor Frank Taylor handling the bidding duties, the Joneses first landed hip 206, the six-year-old Deputy Minister mare Deputy of Wood for \$460,000. Produced by Wood of Binn (Woodman), a Group 3 winner in France, Deputy of Wood, is a half-sister to GII Illinois Derby winner Distilled (Hennessy) and GIII Kent Breeders' Cup S. hero and young sire Three Wonders (Storm Cat). She sells in foal to last year's champion sire Smart Strike, meaning the resulting foal will be bred on the same cross that produced likely Horse of the Year Curlin. Drew Nardiello's Chesapeake Farm consigned Deputy of Wood. About an hour later, Taylor, sitting in the front row of the pavilion, purchased another sixyear-old mare for the Joneses, the dual Grade III winner Flying Glitter (Glitterman--American Flier, by Quiet American). Taylor signed the ticket for \$620,000, the third-highest price for a broodmare Monday. Flying Glitter enjoyed her best season in 2005 when, as a three-year-old, she went on a four-race winning streak that included the GIII Monmouth Breeders' Cup Oaks and GIII Indiana Breeders' Cup Oaks. Her streak ended with a runner-up finish in the GII Raven Run S. here at Keeneland. Flying Glitter was retired last winter and was bred to Empire Maker on an early Feb. 27 cover. "She'll go back to Forestry," said Taylor. "She's got Dr. Fager on her dam's side [Flying Glitter's damsire is Quiet American, who was produced by a Dr. Fager mare], and Foresty has worked well with him." Taylor said that the Joneses are actively supporting the stallions that they own, including Forestry and the newly retired Half Ours, both of whom stand at Taylor Made Farm. "We've got 20 other mares back on the farm, so we'll decided who's going to who," he said. Taylor added about the sale's first day, "I think it's a fair market. The good ones are selling well. I think that was a fair price-that was about what we thought going in." Yesterday's sale of Flying Glitter was a big score both for her consigner, Noel Murphy's Castle Park Farm, and for Richard and Nancy Kaster, who raced her. Richard is listed as co-breeder of Flying Glitter, along with Richard and Nathan Fox. Purchased by trainer Mark Casse for \$57,000 at the 2003 Keeneland September Sale, Flying Glitter went on to bank nearly \$600,000 for the Kasters, then more than matched that sum in the sales ring yesterday. The Joneses also picked up hip 243 yesterday, the five-year-old racing/broodmare prospect Gauze (Saint Ballado). Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent LXXV, the half to GSW Unbridled Hope (Unbridled) and SW Forestier (Forestry) brought a final bid of \$200,000. She finished third in a maiden test going two turns at Arlington Park in her latest outing Sept. 14.

#### Crestfield Sells Top Three Yearlings...

The top three yearlings yesterday at Keeneland January all hailed from the dispersal of Jaime S. Carrion, which is being handled by Robert Courtney Sr.'s Crestfield Farm. In addition to the Speightstown which sold for \$270,000, Crestfield sold the Saint Liam --Ministrada filly that led all short yearlings yesterday on Tom Van Meter's \$475,000 bid, and the Ghostzapper half-sister to champion Action This Day that sold to Lee Rogers for \$300,000. Robert Courtney Jr., who is taking over the reins at Crestfield when his dad officially retires following this sale, admitted that selling off Carrion's horses is a bit bittersweet, given Carrion's integral role in Crestfield's success over the past 30 years. "But we had a good horse sale," he said. "The good horses brought the money. The other ones that had some issues didn't--we had a tough time selling some of those. But what you don't make on the peanuts you make on the popcorn." Catalogued as hip 338, the Saint Liam filly is from the lone crop of the Horse of the Year, who died after suffering a fractured hind leg from a fall as he was being led to his paddock in August of 2006. Hip 338 is a daughter of the unraced Deputy Minister mare Ministrada, a half to a pair of stakes winners, and is a half-sister to Grade III winner Lone Star Sky (Conquistador Cielo) and stakes-placed Rahystrada (Rahy). Van Meter was turned onto the mare when Courtney encouraged him to visit the farm to see a broodmare. "But then this filly came out and I was like, 'wow,'" said Van Meter. "Some you can't afford; some you can't afford not to have." Van Meter added that he liked the fact that the filly was in-bred 4x3 to Fappiano, and pointed out that he's had success with the family in the past. He and partner Maurice Miller bought Zahwah, a half-sister to hip 338's dam Ministrada, for \$420,000 as a weanling in 1998 and resold her a year later for \$925,000 to John Ferguson. "Plus the consignor is a great friend of mine and raises great horses, and that's a big part of it," Van Meter smiled as he gave Courtney a congratulatory handshake. Van Meter said he bought the filly for himself and would race her. Selling toward the end of the day was hip 355, a handsome filly from the first crop of another Horse of the Year in Ghostzapper. She was purchased by Rogers for \$300,000. In addition to being a half to 2003 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Action This Day, she is a close relation to another two-year-old champ: her third dam was English champion \*Bitty Girl. Hip 355 was produced by MGSP Najecam (Trempolino).

#### Some Expensive Buy-Backs...

Included among yesterday's 96 RNA's--a rate of 33 percent--was the very good grass mare **Attima (GB)** (Zafonic), who was led out of the ring unsold at \$775,000. Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency consigned the

scopey Attima, who had drawn the attention of bloodstock agent James Delahooke, among others. But Hill 'n' Dale's John Sikura said that, in the end, the price wasn't quite right. The five-year-old Attima is a dual Grade II winner on the grass in California. Trained by Nick Canani after shipping over

from Europe, she registered wins in the GII Honeymoon Breeders' Cup H. and GII San Clemente H. She was cataloged as a broodmare prospect. Another Grade II winner who failed to meet her reserve was **Theater R. N.** (Theatrical {Ire}). Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, the chestnut mare went unsold at \$625,000. She was the only mare at Keeneland January selling in foal to leading sire A.P. Indy.

#### Day One Wrap-Up...

After the close of business at yesterday's opening session of the Keeneland January Sale, Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell admitted the day's results reflected a weakness in the market. "I think it's a very discerning market," Russell said. "Perceived quality is selling very, very well. I think there is a little bit of polarization there. The top end is strong and then there is a weakness in the rest of it." Russell admitted the trend is troubling. "We have a serious problem that needs to be looked at," Russell said. "There is an overproduction or oversupply of non-commercial horses-whichever way you want to phrase it. And that needs to be reviewed." Russell added that strong foreign participation has kept the market afloat. "At the auction sales of 2007, and now slash 2008 season, the success of it has been on the weakness of our currency," he said. "It's the only thing that has saved us from a massive correction." For the session, Keeneland sold 195 horses for \$21,325,900. The average was \$109,364 and the median was \$55,000. A total of 96 horses were unsold. At last year's corresponding session, 211 horses sold for \$18,970,000, while the average was \$89,905 and the median was \$55,000. There were 80 RNA's at last year's opening session.

#### A Scary Moment...

A potentially dangerous situation was avoided yesterday by the quick actions of one of Keeneland's handlers. Hip 254, a yearling colt by El Corredor--Golden Tango, by Saint Ballado, became agitated in the ring and, trying to rear, pulled away from the handler and crashed through the ropes. Clearly scared, the colt allowed himself to be collected by the handler, who did a fine job of soothing the dark bay once the pair were back into the ring. Bidding went on from there, with the colt going to Pricilla Smith for \$100,000. Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency consigned hip 254.

#### THIRD STRAIGHT CANCELLATION AT SANTA

ANITA Racing at Santa Anita was called off for the third straight day yesterday, but entries were taken for Thursday's card and officials are optimistic that the track will be back in action. Approximately 7 1/2 inches of rain fell in the Arcadia area over the weekend, exacerbating the drainage problems Santa Anita's Cushion Track has suffered since it was installed last fall. "The weather forecast is very encouraging through the weekend and we're confident we'll be able to run on Thursday," said Santa Anita Director of Racing Michael Harlow. "This has obviously been a very difficult period for everyone involved, but we're looking forward to getting back to business. A lot of people are very anxious to run on the turf, which is in terrific shape, and the [Cushion Track] should be ready by Thursday." Harlow added, "We've got some huge stakes over the weekend, with the [GII] San Fernando and the [GIII] San Rafael on Saturday and the [GII] El Encino and [GII] Santa Ynez on Sunday. These are very important, long-standing stakes here at Santa Anita, and we want the horsemen and the public to know that we fully intend to run."

I wonder if Santa Anita's executives have had Albert Hammond's 'seventies hit going through their minds in recent days.

"Seems it never rains in Southern California Seems I've often heard that kind of talk before It never rains in California But girl, don't they warn ya It pours, man it pours."

Sadly, the torrential rain forced the cancellation of some highly interesting stakes races which, with a bit of luck, will be re-staged next weekend. Fortunately, the East Coast tracks were able to stage some alternative stakes entertainment, which provided a double for Giant's Causeway's 2005 crop.


The GIII Tropical Park Derby saw Cowboy Cal extend his unbeaten record on turf to three, following a disappointing debut on the main track, and the unbeaten Giant Moon was winning for the fourth time on dirt when he showed all of his sire's renowned fighting qualities to land the Count Fleet S.

This double is particularly encouraging because several factors combined to suggest that Giant's Causeway's 2005 crop ought to be his least successful. I'll elucidate.

When Giant's Causeway retired to Coolmore at the end of 2000, breeders clamoured for his services, and understandably so. Ten of his last 11 appearances had come in Group 1 contests, and the son of Storm Cat had won six of them and finished second in the other four, missing by a neck to Tiznow in the Breeders' Cup Classic.

American breeders were similarly enthusiastic when Giant's Causeway left Coolmore for Ashford after a single season.

He covered over 200 mares at a fee of \$135,000 in 2002, but even this exciting prospect wasn't immune to the third-season syndrome, and his book dropped to 144 in 2003, at the slightly reduced fee of \$125,000.

Then Giant's Causeway's first yearlings reached the sales in 2003, to rather mixed reviews, and even a sizeable reduction in his fee to \$75,000 in his fourth season in 2004 wasn't enough to prevent his book falling to its lowest level, at 130 mares. This means that not only is Giant's Causeway's fourth crop his smallest, but it was also sired at his lowest fee.

But, judging by the efforts of Cowboy Cal and Giant Moon, it won't be his least successful crop. At the moment I would nominate his third crop for that unwanted distinction. Maybe his 2004 crop simply represents one of those unaccountable blips which affect even the most accomplished stallions. As yet it has come nowhere near matching either of its predecessors, both of which have proved prolific sources of stakes winners in general, and graded winners in particular. The single Irish crop did especially well, with five Grade I winners in Shamardal, Aragorn, My Typhoon, Footstepsinthesand and Maids Causeway.

This impressive collection has ensured that enthusiasm for Giant's Causeway was fully restored in 2005 (when his fee was \$150,000) and 2006 (when it doubled to \$300,000), so the Ashford stallion has a large collection of impressively related two-year-olds in 2008. He has an even more eye-catching collection of yearlings. As he also covered 176 mares at a fee of \$225,000 last year, he surely represents a tempting proposition at his 2008 fee of \$125,000.

Cowboy Cal is out of Texas Tammy, a daughter of Seeking the Gold. Breeders understandably considered Giant's Causeway to be a pretty safe bet as a mate for Seeking the Gold mares, if only because they have excelled with his sire. Six of the first 28 foals by Storm Cat out of Seeking the Gold mares have become stakes winners (21 percent). Among them are Good Reward, Pure Prize, Seeking The Sky and the high-class Japanese horse Seeking The Dia.

Inevitably, this has encouraged breeders to consider sons of Storm Cat as viable alternatives to their sire, and at least 20 sons have a total of over 100 foals of racing age from daughters of Seeking the Gold. Their results aren't as impressive as Storm Cat's, but there's reason for thinking that Giant's Causeway could have a future with Seeking the Gold mares. Although Cowboy Cal is only the second stakes winner to emerge from his first 25 foals, two of the others--the Florida Derby second Noble Causeway and the Humana Distaff third Carriage Trail--have been placed at the Grade I level.

Cowboy Cal should have no problems staying at least 1 1/4 miles, as both Giant's Causeway and Seeking the Gold were major winners over that trip. Also, his dam Texas Tammy is a half-sister to the admirable Behrens, a triple graded winner over 1 1/4 miles. Cowboy Cal's second dam, Hot Novel, was a smart performer, a dual Grade III winner at around seven furlongs.

Hot Novel is one of a handful of mares by Mari's Book to have excelled as broodmares. Mari's Sheba produced Congaree, while Goulash hit the Grade I jackpot with Ashado and Sunriver. Not a bad record for a stallion who collected less than \$50,000 during a 17-race career, but Mari's Book had the saving graces of being a son of Northern Dancer and of being inbred 3x4 to Almahmoud.

The fact that Cowboy Cal has yet to win on dirt doesn't rule him out as a Kentucky Derby candidate. Todd Pletcher insists the colt has always trained well on dirt, and it's worth remembering that Barbaro--like Cowboy Cal--won the Laurel Futurity and the Tropical Park Derby on turf. The Fountain of Youth is going to be particularly interesting if Cowboy Cal turns out.





#### University of Arizona Announces New Scholarship:

Added Joyce's son, Turf Paradise President and General Manager Eugene T. Joyce, "The success of the RTIP meant so much to my father. He thoroughly enjoyed mentoring the students and giving back to an industry that was very good to him. The entire Joyce family is grateful that the University of Arizona has honored our request to name a scholarship in his memory." The scholarship will be administered by RTIP staff, and will be awarded to a student based on academics, participation in the industry and RTIP program activities. 
