# THREE SEVENS AT KEENELAND JANUARY

For the first time in six years, three horses made \$1,000,000 or more during a single session at the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale in



The \$1.9-million Miss Lodi Lucas Marquardt

Lexington, Kentucky. Then, it was the weanling Value Plus (\$1.1 million), his dam Roll Over Baby (\$1 million), and GI Breeders' Cup Sprint heroine Desert Stormer (\$3.6 million). The three sold during the first session of the 2002 sale. During yesterday's second session of the 2008 January event, it was Miss Lodi (\$1.9 million),

Gwen's Song (\$1.5 million) and Moon Catcher (\$1.35 million) who made headlines. Taken with the sale of Irish Cherry for \$2.7 million during Monday's opener, yesterday's fireworks marked the highest number of seven-figure horses at January since six sold for a million or more in 2000. "Considering who they are, I wasn't surprised," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "That's what people are after--topquality product. They're willing to give any money for them." # Hancock Satisfied with Phipps Dispersal...

Claiborne Farm sold 12 horses yesterday in the com-



plete dispersal of the Estate of Cynthia Phipps, who died last October. The dispersal's top price was the \$625,000 paid for the broodmare prospect Palais Versailles (Pulpit), while that filly's dam, the 20-year-old Versailles Treaty (Danzig), in foal to Unbridled's Song, brought Palais Versailles \$475,000. "I don't think you have any ex-Sarah K Andrew pectations going into a dispersal," Claiborne Farm's Dell Hancock said yesterday. "I

think you come up here and hope the horses look well, and that they are well-behaved and that they are wellrepresented. I think that Cynthia would be proud of the way that her horses looked." Of the results of the sale, Hancock said, "I thought they sold fine--they sold well. Certainly, the one Pulpit filly sold really, really well. And the old mare [Versailles Treaty], I thought, sold well. She looked so well. I hope that Dinny and Daisy [Phipps] are pleased with the way the dispersal went. We're satisfied. I think when you're dispersing horses you don't have any huge expectations, just because it is not a joyous sale. I think the job was done, and it was done well." Cont. p7

# SANTA ANITA IN LIMBO

The California Horse Racing Board conducted an emergency session via teleconference yesterday to address the possibility of moving all or part of Santa Anita's current meeting crosstown to Hollywood Park. The Arcadia oval, which had Cushion Track installed during the summer, was forced to cancel three straight live racing days due to drainage problems exacerbated by severe storms that inflicted 7 1/2 inches of rain within a 72-hour period. While the Los Angeles Turf Club was unanimously granted permission to use Hollywood as an alternative, Santa Anita President and Magna Chief Operating Officer Ron Charles indicated that there may be another course of action. "We will have an announcement in the next 48 hours that we believe will be well received," he said during the teleconference. "It's up to us to address this problem, which we inherited from Cushion Track, and have a contingency strategy that gives us a safe surface and allows us to race, even in the rain." Racing at Santa Anita is slated to resume tomorrow. CHRB Chairman Richard Shapiro said that the board would conduct a second special phone meeting Jan. 17 to consider waiving California's synthetic track mandate--passed in 2006--for Santa Anita this season. While Hollywood also has Cushion Track, its surface is of a different composition, and has not experienced the severe drainage problems seen at Santa Anita.

# Lodi Back Again...

The nine-year-old **Miss Lodi** is no stranger to the sales ring at Keeneland. In 2004, the Grade III winner sold carrying her first foal, by A.P. Indy, to Skara Glen Stables for \$2 million. The Mr. Greeley mare returned yesterday and nearly matched that figure, selling to

Charles Albright for \$1.9 million. "It is my understanding that it was to end a partnership," Keeneland's Geoffrey Russell confirmed after the sale. Albright, who did his bidding from inside the sales pavilion, signed the ticket as Sha-Li Leasing, who is listed as the co-breeder of each of Miss Lodi's three foals, along

with Skara Glen, each of whom is by A.P. Indy. Albright said Sha-li Leasing is the nom de course of the breeding business he and partner George Prussin operate. "I loved the mare," Albright said. "She's got a good pedigree. We bought a few at the September Sale, and we saw this one we wanted." Miss Lodi was the lone mare in the sale in foal to top sire Storm Cat. Winner of the GIII Safely Kept S. on the track and also Grade I-placed, Miss Lodi was produced by a half-sister to Grade I winner Super May, graded winner Ide and stakes winner Barbara Sue.



## Miss Lodi Sells for \$1.9 Million cont.

Charles Albright, based in New Jersey, said he and Prussin were strictly in the commercial breeding business, though he added that he races on the side. "We just had a winner the other day," said Albright, referring to Kristabella, who broke her maiden at first asking at Turfway Park on Saturday for Albright's Raquel Racing Stable Inc. Albright confirmed the mare would remain at Lane's End Farm, which is also the home of Skara Glen's broodmares. "All our mares are there," he said. He said a decision as to who Miss Lodi will be bred back to had not been made. Miss Lodi's first foal, the unraced three-year-old A.P. Indy colt Thrust, was bought back at the 2006 Keeneland September Sale for \$725,000. She had fillies by Lane's End's star stallion in both 2006 and 2007.

# Reprise for Fulton at KeeJan...


The vast majority of the dispersal of Stan Fulton's stock went through the ring at Keeneland November, with the exception of one or two horses that couldn't make the sale for various reasons. One of those Fulton horses was the Unbridled's Song mare **Gwen's Song**.

Whether the spotlight shone brighter on the strapping chestnut due to her placement at Keeneland January is unknown, but she nonetheless sparkled during yesterday's second session of the sale. When the dust settled, Frank Taylor, on the phone with Marie Jones, withstood a bidding battle to land the

mare at \$1.5 million. A representative of U.S.-based Paul Manganaro was reportedly the direct underbidder, while Eric Guillot of Southern Equine confirmed that he dropped out of the bidding at around \$800,000. Taylor purchased Gwen's Song for Marie and her husband Aaron Jones. "There was a contractual agreement on Distorted Humor that she be not sold at November," explained Bruce Gibbs, whose Greenfield Farm consigned the five-year-old, the lone mare in the sale in foal to WinStar Farm's leading stallion. "It probably worked out for the best; she probably stood out more here." Originally a \$500,000 purchase by Fleetwood/NW Management at the 2004 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale, Gwen's Song was a first-out winner at Philly Park in 2006. She made her last start in February of 2007 before being retired to the breeding shed. The lone remaining horse to sell from the Fulton dispersal is the stakes-winning Buddy Got Even (Stephen Got Even), who goes through the ring Thursday as a racing or stallion prospect (hip 1501). Gwen's Song easily proved the most expensive mare to sell from Fulton's dispersal at November and January. Fulton's top mare in November was another daughter of Unbridled's Song, Queen's Song, who made \$325,000.



# Song of My Heart...

The well-built Gwen's Song sports an impressive page, one that features her sire Unbridled's Song prominently. Gwen's Song is out of the Seattle Dancer mare Gwenjinsky (Seattle Dancer), making her a half-sister to multiple graded winner Lead Story (Editor's Note) and stakes winner Capejinsky (Cape Town). Gwenjinsky is a half-sister to GI Breeders' Cup Distaff winner Unbridled Elaine, by Unbridled's Song, as well as to Grade I winner Glitter Woman (Glitterman). The latter, meanwhile, is the dam of 2007 GI Suburban H. hero Political Force, another son of Unbridled's Song. Despite a page replete with the Taylor Made stallion's name, Bruce Gibbs said he considered Gwen's Song an atypical Unbridled's Song. "She is a heavier, stronger type than most, with a lot of bone," Gibbs opined. "It's not so much the size, but the substance to go along with it." Gibbs added that he thought Gwen's Song was well-sold at \$1.5 million. "She actually brought more than we though she would," he said. "But she is an outstanding mare from a family that's really live. Plus the way she's bred, you can go a lot of different ways. She has Northern Dancer back [in the fourth generation]. I don't know what they'll do with her, but she's probably a really good match with Forestry." That indeed is the plan, according to Frank Taylor. Gwen's Song cont. p4



# Femmes for Forestry...

Aaron and Marie Jones are committed to supporting their stallion Forestry, and they demonstrated that yesterday. The Joneses went to \$1.5 million to bring home the mare **Gwen's Song** (Unbridled's Song), with an eye to breeding the five-year-old to the 12-year-old son of Storm Cat. The seven-figure purchase came just a few hours after the Joneses purchased **Stolen Prayer** (Songandaprayer)--who will also go to Forestry--for \$525,000. After surviving an extended bidding war, advisor Frank Taylor said, "The mare is made for Forestry. That was my number one pick of the sale." The big price tag didn't surprise Taylor. "Obviously someone else wanted her," he observed. "That family, Political Force just came out of there and is a Grade I winner,

and then you have Etched, who is two-for-two and is really a top horse out of that family, and Lead Story is being bred well. So there are a lot of good things happening in that family. Plus, she's in foal to Distorted Humor, we haven't talked about that. He's such a great stallion, so

you really couldn't start this mare off with a better stallion. I think it's just a really good family and we wanted to invest back into it." TDN Rising Star" Etched, out of Unbridled Elaine, dominated a maiden field at Belmont in his debut last September before an impressive win in the GIII Nashua S. at Aqueduct in October. During the bidding on Gwen's Song, Taylor was sitting in the back of the sales pavilion and speaking on the phone with Marie Jones, who gave the goahead at every call in the bidding. "She wanted that one," Taylor said. Also going to Forestry next year is Stolen Prayer. After signing the ticket on the five-year-old mare, Taylor admitted, "We always want to buy them cheaper, but I think she is a great physical and I think she fits Forestry really well.

Taylor continued, "Of course that horse Etched, the Forestry that Sheikh Mohammed has that is two-fortwo and just went to Dubai--he's bred that same way, out of an Unbridled's Song mare by Forestry, so we were thinking that way. Plus she was a great physical and she was real sound." Stolen Prayer, a five-year-old broodmare prospect, was a four-time stakes winner and graded-stakes placed on the track. She won six starts

and earned \$426,944
while racing for her breeders, Bea Oxenberg, David
Melin and trainer Edward
Plesa, Jr. She was consigned by Summerfield
Sales Agency, Inc., Agent
CXXXVI. Aaron and Marie
Jones, who also purchased three mares during
Monday's opening session
of the sale, are reinvesting after a successful
2007, according to Taylor. "They had a really

good year last year," he explained. "Their yearlings sold for a lot, their stallions did really good. We just wanted to build the broodmare program back up and keep it going. We actually have a 23-stall barn and we don't usually keep more than that. We're up to 25 right there [with the purchase of Gwen's Song]. We usually take a few mares out every year, so we'll probably sell a couple of mares and keep replenishing. They just sold part of Sunriver for stud in New York [see p14] and stayed in for some shares of him, so they had that money to beef up the broodmare band so they can support their stallions." Of the specific focus on Forestry, Taylor added, "They race some horses, but they also breed for the market and he's been a real success for them and we just want to make sure that we continue to support him really strong. They own him in entirety and they want to do everything they can to keep him going the way he's been going."

POWERSCOURT fulfills both criteria. He started 21 times, including 14 times at Grade 1 level, and won over \$1,900,000. I also think his progeny will be favored by the new synthetic surfaces which look like being the future of racing here.

# Catch a Rising Moon...

She looked a picture yesterday morning as buyers made their last-minute inspections and, a few hours later, the Grade II winner **Moon Catcher** (Malibu Moon-Smartster, by Smarten) sold to her looks when Narvick

International's Emmanuel de Seroux secured the four-year-old for \$1.35 million. "She's for Marsha Naify," de Seroux said. He added that Moon Catcher, winner of last year's lucrative GII Delaware Oaks, would be kept in training for the 2008 season. "Marsha has many trainers, but this one will go to

Christophe Clement in Florida now," de Seroux added. "We still think she has a lot of racing left in her, and are optimistic that she could be a Grade I mare this season." The agent added that Moon Catcher's pedigree makes her a good broodmare prospect, as well. Her second dam, the \*Vaguely Noble mare Alabaster, is a half-sister to the top West Coast runner Ancient Title. As a racehorse, Moon Catcher had a busy 2007, making all of her 11 career starts last season. She won six of those starts, including three stakes: the Delaware Oaks, the Susan's Girl Breeders' Cup S. and the Maryland Million Oaks in her latest start in October. She raced for trainer Tim Ritchey, who co-owned the mare with CJZ Racing Stable. Ritchey and Chuck Zacney's CJZ are better known as the team behind the brilliant Afleet Alex, who now stands at Gainesway Farm. Gainesway consigned Moon Catcher to yesterday's sale. "She's been a great mare for us, and I hope she'll





win a few graded stakes for them, too," said Ritchey afterwards about the winning bidders, adding with a smile, "And maybe somewhere down the line they'll want to breed her to Afleet Alex." Ritchey said Moon Catcher's price tag didn't surprise him. "I thought she'd bring a million or more for sure," he said. "That's what a

lot of people are looking for, young mares that they can still race. Maybe this year they can crank out \$500,000 or \$600,000 and make half of the purchase price back." Ritchey's involvement with Moon Catcher goes way back. He purchased her as a weanling for \$49,000 for a pinhooking partnership. He told a partner that, if she didn't bring more than \$100,000, he planned on buying the filly for himself, and wound up doing just that at the 2005 September Sale, where she was knocked down to Ritchey for \$75,000. Zacney later bought into Moon Catcher, who has thus far banked \$663,450.

# Cauthen Hits the Books, Gets Mare...

When a reporter pointed to Hip 373 in Doug Cauthen's catalog and noted how much ink the president of WinStar Farm had committed to the page, Cauthen laughed and said, "Yeah, I do a lot of homework." If that was the homework, then Cauthen passed the exam yesterday after landing that particular lot, an unraced three-year-old daughter of Pulpit named Palais Versailles, for \$625,000. It was the second-highest price for a broodmare prospect at yesterday's second day of action at Keeneland January. "She had a great physical and is from a great family, and we'd like to get some more black type out of the family," said Cauthen of the broodmare prospect, who was selling as part of the Claiborne Farm-consigned dispersal of the late Cynthia Phipps. Palais Versailles is a daughter of Versailles Treaty, who Phipps bred and raced to a pair of Grade I wins. Versailles Treaty's offspring also includes graded winner Saarland (Unbridled). "We haven't figured out exactly who we'll breed her to, but there's a good shot she'll go to Storm Cat," said Cauthen. "We're excited to have her. I would have loved to get her for \$400,000, but that's about what I thought I'd have to pay."







## A Smart Strike...

"There's nothing like a little luck to make you look real smart," quipped Bradley Thoroughbred Brokerage's Pete Bradley after a Smart Strike filly he bred in partnership realized \$300,000, the second-highest price for a short yearling yesterday. Lucky or not, Bradley reaped the benefits of a blockbuster 2007 for Smart Strike, who

set a record for progeny earnings when his sons and daughters, including Breeders' Cup winners Curlin and English Channel, banked over \$14,358,570. "He was always a good sire, but what he did in the last seven months helped us immensely," Bradley confirmed. Consigned by Lane's End, the filly is the third foal produced by the unraced Coronado's Quest mare Tash Dash, herself a daughter of dual Grade I winner Life at the Top (Seattle Slew). Life at the

bradleythoroughbreds.com Top, who twice made seven figures at bloodstock sales in the 1980's, is also the dam of group winner Elizabeth Bay (Mr. Prospector), a \$1-million KEEJUL yearling way back in 1991, as well as several other daughters who have gone on to be good stakes producers. Bradley and his partners--Blackwater Farm and Castlecove--purchased Tash Dash for \$100,000 at this sale in 2005 while in foal to Deputy Commander. Tom Biederman, agent, signed the ticket. They sold the resulting filly for \$7,500 as a short yearling at FTKFEB. "The first foal out of her wasn't very commercial, and the second foal was a nice Forest Wildcat colt who brought \$75,000 [at the 2007 Keeneland September Sale]," Bradley explained. But it was this filly that really shone in the ring. "A few people told me that she was the best filly selling today, and owners always like to here that," Bradley laughed. Bradley added that there was "no real reason" that the partnership chose the January Sale to showcase the chestnut. "She was a nice filly and we thought she'd be one of the top two or three in the sale, and it looks like the market bared that out," he said.




# Versailles Treaty Brings \$475,000...

Versailles Treaty (Danzig), the marguee name in the dispersal of the Estate of Cynthia Phipps, is now 20, but still can draw a crowd. The mare, in foal to Unbridled's Song, was purchased for \$475,000 by Olin Gentry. "We bought her for Gaines-Gentry," Gentry confirmed. "She's in great shape, a beautiful mare. There aren't many like her around that you can get your hands on." Asked if he was concerned about Versailles Treaty's age, Gentry said, "She looks like she has several more babies in her, and a good foal out of her would be worth more than that, I would think." Versailles Treaty won the 1991 editions of the GI Alabama S., GI Test S. and GI Gazelle H. and the 1992 running of the GI Ruffian H. She was second in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff in both 1991 and 1992. She is the dam of graded stakes winner Saarland (Unbridled) and is carrying a 3/4-sibling to that stallion. Gentry said breeding plans for Versailles Treaty are undecided, but that he expected to sell her Unbridled's Song foal. The \$475,000 price tag was about what Gentry expected to pay. "It was a fair bid, but she's a bit special, too," he said.

# Day 1 Trends Continue on Day 2...

While figures at yesterday's second of the Keeneland January sale were up across the board and three lots reached seven figures, Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell remained concerned about the polarization of the market which he saw developing during Monday's opening session of the auction. "It was a continuation of yesterday," Russell said Tuesday. "The top end is very, very strong. I think it's a little weak below that. Today was more even throughout and then the three highlights today added a lot more sparkle." Russell said the results were typical of the mixed bag nature of the January sale. "It's a mixture of a lot of horses," he said. "The quality horses are shining bright, but the auctioneers are saying it's tough out there. The not-selling rate is higher--that's not a positive thing. They're not throwing money away anymore. It's a buyer's market by a longshot. People are after the topquality product, and they're willing to give any money for those. It's the next two levels that are very tough out there. We've sold in the last sales year to 44 different countries, and we still have a huge representation from them still here; Australians are here, Russians here, Koreans here, Japanese. All those people are here. But they are very conservative in what they are willing to spend. People want the perfect horse and, if you don't have it, it's tough." For the session, the average was up 30.9 percent to \$113,340 and the median was up 27.7 percent to \$60,000. There were 64 horses reported as not sold. After two sessions, the average was up 26.7 percent to \$111,553 and the median was up 17 percent to \$58,500. The buy-back rate was 26.9 percent.

# Hines a Logical Addition to Southern Equine Team...

From afar, at least, the guys from Southern Equine-owner Mike Moreno and his trainer/bloodstock advisor Eric Guillot--look as though they enjoy having a good time. So it seemed a perfect fit when it was announced in November that trainer Nick Hines, the flag-saluting Sarge of Southern California, was joining Southern Equine as racing manager. The operation's multiple graded stakes winning juvenile last year, Salute the



Sarge (Forest Wildcat), was named in honor of Hines. Hines said it was a tough decision to give up training, but is excited about Southern Equine, which is fast becoming a major player in both racing and breeding. "It was a huge opportunity," Hines said yesterday from the Keeneland sales pavilion. "I still consider myself a young guy, but I'd been training for 13 years,

and it can be a treadmill of sorts. If you don't get the right kind of opportunities, it can be tough. Eric and I have been friends since the early 1990's, and he came to me and told me, 'Listen, there will probably never be another opportunity in our lifetimes to work with a guy like Moreno.' Obviously, it should have been a nobrainer, but they still have me plenty of time to decide. Mike's a great guy, and a very humble guy for what he's accomplished at such a young age. It's just like hanging out with a buddy, going up to the bar to get a beer. It's exciting. I kind of look at us like an expansion team, a new franchise." Hines pointed out that Southern Equine has a few colts that are Kentucky Derby prospects, including Signature Move, a Vindication youngster who won an allowance race at Santa Anita last week. Southern Equine were again busy yesterday at Keeneland January. A day after buying the dam of Grade I winners Daaher and Spun Sugar, Irish Cherry, for \$2.7 million, the operation purchased Tuesday's top-priced short yearling, a colt by Malibu Moon, for \$375,000. The colt sold as hip 643 and followed his dam, Inclination (Victory Gallop), into the ring. Southern Equine also purchased Inclination, in foal to More Than Ready, for \$140,000. Warrendale Sales consigned both horses. "Eric's a stickler when it comes to picking out stock," Hines said when asked about the purchases. "The last thing he does is look at the pedigree. He thought the colt had good bone and liked his balance, and felt he was the best colt in the sale. We'll probably send the mare down to our Louisiana division and have a Louisiana-bred More Than Ready foal. We have about 50 broodmares down there, with 25 top-end purchases, including the mare we bought [Monday]."

I don't think 100 [mares] is, in this day and age, an especially big book. We've been limiting our books to around 125, with a sire like Distorted Humor around 100. But I think there's plenty of demand for attractive mares with a little race record who are in foal to hot sires, whether they're established sires like Smart Strike or Distorted Humor or Street Cry (Ire), or whether they're young stallions like Bluegrass Cat."



# **MONDAY'S NUMBERS**

A casual observer might be forgiven for reading the totals from Keeneland's Monday session and thinking that wasn't too bad at all. Yes, the not-sold percentage was up from 27 percent to 33 percent, but the gross was up 12 percent (over \$2.3 million, not all of it Irish Cherry), and the average was up 22 percent. Why, then, did Keeneland Sales Director Geoff Russell sound so downbeat? He was quoted in yesterday's TDN: "The top end is strong, and then there is a weakness in the rest of it...We have a serious problem that needs to be looked at." Maybe this is why. Prices don't necessarily reflect the cost of production, and the cost of stud fees the last few years has obviously risen. Plus, so many people are breeding to big-book, more expensive fivefigure stallions. So we went back and did a count. Of the 240 horses which went through the ring on Monday which were either in foal-mares (carrying a stud fee) or 'short' yearlings (produced by a stud fee). Exactly one-third of them--80--brought final bids (whether sold or RNA'd) for at or below the stud fee which it, at least nominally, cost to produce them. In other words, if you paid a stud fee, there was a one in three chance the horse you brought over would not even cover the stud fee. So the totals or averages may stay the same or even go up, but it clearly doesn't mean people are making money. Demand is shrinking.

To continue our series on recommended and prominent stallions for 2008, this week we look at France; next week, Britain and Ireland.

# French Revival...


It's not just M. Sarkozy and Arqana. After several years when it was difficult to find more than one or

two proven sires in
France, the picture looks
better for French breeders
who choose to stay in
France in 2008--and for
breeders from other
European countries, who
often ship in to breed to
French stallions. In the
seven years since his first
runners were three-year-

olds (2001), **Anabaa** has never been out of the top 10 sires in France, and he has been in the top five on four occasions. In 2007, he ranked second only to Danehill, and he was champion French sire of two-year-olds for the second time. Back in France for 2008 after covering 54 mares in Kentucky last year, he is at about his lowest price ever of €27,000.



Though his first-crop superstar--Alexander Goldrun--is retired, **Gold Away** proved in 2007 he's no one-trick pony, with Group 2 winners All Is Vanity and Musical Way and the Group 1-winning two-year-old Full of Gold. He looks very cheap, among French proven sires, at  $\in$ 3,500. The massive **Green Tune** covered only eight mares in 2003, which were last year's three-year-olds, and consequently he slipped down the rankings. But he's covered an average of 96 his last three seasons, which means he's likely to be back among the leaders on the French sire list sooner rather than later.

Kingsalsa made a bright start--he was France's leading freshman sire in 2005--but has quieted down since, as they often do. However, his initial success meant he's covered an average of 103 mares the last three years and, with his stud fee halved to €6,000, this looks like the right time to roll the dice with him. Lando won seven Group 1 races, including the Japan Cup, and was brought to France from Germany in 2005, so his first French crop are now two-year-olds. He's covered an average of 92 mares in the three seasons he's been in France, indicating sustained support. French Sires cont. p12



Marchand de Sable took a long time to get going, but had G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest winner Marchand d'Or and the good three-year-old Stoneside, a multiple group-placed listed winner, on his side last year. Marchand d'Or was his second Group 1 winner, following E.P. Taylor heroing Commercante. Muhtathir, a top miler who won the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois, sired 2007 Group 1 winners Doctor Dino (in the U.S. and Hong Kong) and Satwa Queen (Prix de l'Opera) in his first crop. The latter topped Tattersalls' December Sale at 3.4-million guineas (over \$7 million). Not surprising, then, that Muhtathir covered 110 and 109 mares the last two years, meaning he's another who will have plenty running for him. Sinndar, winner of the G1 National S. at The Curragh at two and the G1 English and Irish Derbies and Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at three, transferred over from Ireland in 2006. He's had seven group winners in his first three crops, and you'd have heard of most of them. He could come up with a superstar at any time.

# New Recruits...

I don't think there's a single unproven French stallion standing for as much as €10,000, which means there's plenty of upside if you pick the right one. **Domedriver**, the 2002 G1 Breeders' Cup Mile winner, transfers over from England. He ranked 24th on the 2007 European Freshman Sire list (Hyperion Promotions, through Nov. 25), but averaged only 40 foals per crop in his four English crops. Being about the best-bred son of Indian Ridge to ever go to stud (his second dam was a full sister to El Gran Senor), he should find more favor back at his breeders' farm in France.

Of the stallions whose first two-year-olds will race this year, there's a lot to like about **American Post**. Bred and raced by Juddmonte, he is the best son of Bering,





won the G1 Prix Jean-Luc
Lagardere (Grand Criterium)
and G1 Racing Post Trophy at
two, and the G1 Poule d'Essai
des Poulains at three, which
means he's not short of

credentials. But he didn't cover nearly as many mares as Ballingarry, a half-brother to Starborough by Sadler's Wells who was a Group 1 winner at two and three, and placed in the Irish and Italian Derbies for Aidan O'Brien.

Darley, as we know, is into world domination, and France is evidently no exception. Sulamani, a six-time Group 1 winner, is another with his first two-year-olds in 2008, and he also moves from England to the Haras de Logis, where Darley stands several stallions, for 2008. Another of those is the 2002 G2 Gimcrack winner, Country Reel. He is out of a stakes-winning Seattle Slew mare who is a half-sister to Anabaa and Key of Luck, so he has obvious appeal to French breeders. Country Reel has yearlings in 2008. Also at Logis for Darley is Layman, a son of Sunday Silence from the family of Cape Cross, who covered 92 mares in his first season last year. He won the G3 Prix de Cabourg, a race only won by two-year-olds with serious speed, and placed in the G1 Prix Morny and G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere. Sunday Silence had last year's top French freshman sire, Divine Light (since exported to Turkey), so the Darley team is hoping Layman can follow suit.

Another whose first foals arrive this year is Gentlewave, by none other than Monsun, one of the top six sires in Europe and the best stallion to stand in Germany for many years. Trained by the incomparable Andre Fabre, Gentlewave won four of his six races, including the G1 Italian Derby, and ran second to Dylan Thomas in the G1 Irish Derby. Most promising retirements for 2008 are Group 1 winner Turtle Bowl, by Night Shift's now-Spanish based son, Dyhim Diamond; and Stormy River, who won the G1 Jean Prat at three and placed in five Group 1 races at two, three, and four, including the French 2000 Guineas, St. James's Palace S., and Prix Jacques le Marois, all at three. He showed an awful lot of form around a mile. often a key indicator of future sire success in Europe, and has an interesting pedigree, being by the very successful Verglas (whose first two-year-olds in Ireland will race this year), and being inbred 4x4 to Riverman. He's been syndicated, and will be supported by a wide range of breeders.

# **DUBAI WORLD CUP FIELD TAKING SHAPE** With

a strong group of potential runners slated for this year's Dubai World Cup at Nad al Sheba Mar. 29, a new challenger has emerged as a likely starter in the 1 1/4-



mile test. According to trainer Kunihide Matsuda, MG1SW Daiwa Scarlet (Jpn) (Agnes Tachyon {Jpn}), originally slated for the G1 Dubai Duty Free, may make an appearance in the World Cup instead. In Daiwa Scarlet S. Mighty photo preparation for Dubai, the fouryear-old will start next in the

G1 February S. Feb. 24. "I think Dubai suits horses on the front end," said Matsuda. "I am really looking forward to March." Also slated for the world's richest race is Student Council (Kingmambo), winner of last season's GI Pacific Classic and GII Hawthorne Gold Cup H. The six-year-old finished eighth in his most recent start in the G1 Japan Cup Nov. 24. "I think running uphill the last part of the [Japan Cup] might have surprised him a little bit and maybe that's why he didn't do as well," explained trainer Vladmir Cerin. "I think he'll do quite well in Dubai." According to Cerin, the bay was placed in a hyperbaric chamber for 10 treatments following the lackluster effort. "It was like he didn't even go overseas," said Cerin. "They recover very quickly when if you put them in oxygen." Another Japanese representative on course for the Dubai World Cup meeting is Meisho Samson (Jpn) (Opera House (GB)). According to trainer Shigetada Takahashi, the five-year-old will contest either the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic or the Duty Free. Pre-entries for the Dubai World Cup meeting close Jan. 9.

broke alertly to race with the early leaders, but dropped back to settle in sixth through an opening quarter of :22 1/5. Taken out four wide entering the lane, Overbid began to put in his rally and found another gear when re-directed to the inside in deep stretch to run down Afleet Ruler (Northern

Afleet) by a half-length. The Kentucky-bred earned a Bris Speed Rating of 86 and a Beyer Speed Figure of 79. He stopped the clocked in 1:09 3/5 in the six-furlong contest.

"It was a pretty good race," Guillot said of his charge's unveiling. "They really weren't closing on that

track that day or the last couple of weeks at [the] Hollywood Park [meeting]. He made up at least three lengths and got the last eighth in :12 1/5. He did it like a precocious older horse and galloped out strong. I like him."

Overbid, a half-brother to GI Kentucky Oaks heroine Lemons Forever, has posted three listed works since, including a fivefurlong move in 1:00 at Hollywood Park Jan. 4.

"I got him in :59 3/5," Guillot said. "I got him galloping out in 1:11 and seven-eighths in 1:24 3/5. He came back like King Kong, like it was nothing. He's sitting on tilt. He's been training like a freight train since. He has a route horse's pedigree. He gallops out like he'll go all day."

Guillot picks out all of the stock for Southern Equine. Overbid, a \$450,000 KEEAPR juvenile, worked an eighth of a mile in :10 1/5 at the first breeze-up show at Keeneland.

"His workout [at Keeneland] was average, but he had a demeanor about him--the way he bowed his neck when he came out of the stall, he acted like he owned the place," Guillot explained. "He was a May baby and was kind of small."





# SAM-SON PRESIDENT SAMUEL-BALAZ DIES

Tammy Samuel-Balaz, president and general manager of Sam-Son Farm, died Saturday following a long battle with cancer. She was 47. An accomplished equestrienne, Samuel-Balaz was a director of Woodbine Entertainment Group, The Jockey Club of Canada, Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association and The Jockey Club. Upon the passing of her father Ernie Samuel, Samuel-Balaz, who took over the leadership of Sam-Son Farm in 2000, also became a director of her family's business, Samuel Son & Co., Ltd. Industrialist Ernie Samuel, the founder of Sam-Son Farm, began to build his racing empire in the late 1970s. In 1991, Samuel was named Canadian racing's Man of the Year when his unbeaten filly Dance Smartly became the first Canadian-owned and bred horse to win a Breeders' Cup race, taking the GI Distaff at Churchill Downs. She was also the only filly to win the Canadian Triple Crown, and is the only mare to foal back-to-back Queen's Plate winners (Scatter The Gold and Dancethruthedawn). In the Thoroughbred business for the better part of three decades, Sam-Son has received over 60 Sovereign Awards, including Canada's Horse of the Year eight times, broodmare of the year on six occasions, owner of the year nine times and breeder of the year seven times. Samuel-Balaz is survived by her husband, Rick, and their children, Lisa and Michael; brother Mark; sister Kim; and her mother Elizabeth. There will be a private family funeral.

JUDDMONTE OPERATION HONORED Juddmonte Farms yesterday was awarded the Thoroughbred Breeders' Association's Andrew Devonshire Bronze in recognition of the far-reaching contribution that the organization has made to the Thoroughbred breeding industry through the past three decades. His Highness Prince Khalid Abdullah, the driving force behind Juddmonte Farms and joint Honorary Vice President of the TBA, purchased his first yearlings in 1977 and had his first winner under the now famous green, white and pink colors in Britain with the Jeremy Tree-trained Charming Native at Windsor in May 1979. He was the first Arab owner to win an English Classic when Known Fact was awarded the 1980 G1 2000 Guineas upon the disqualification of Nureyev. The operation registered its first homebred winner when Fine Edge scored at Newmarket in May 1982. That same year, Khalid Abdullah purchased the former Cayton Park Stud at Wargrave-on-Thames in Berkshire from Gerald Leigh and renamed it Juddmonte Farms, creating one of the most successful breeding operations of modern times. Thoroughbred Breeders' Association President Michael Goodbody, speaking at the TBA Annual Awards' Dinner in London yesterday, expressed the enormous gratitude that British breeding owes to Arab investment in the industry. "I think the time has now come for someone in authority to publicly state the enormous gratitude that the British bloodstock industry owes to the Arab influence and participation which we have all witnessed over the last 25 years," Goodbody said. "It is not just that of the Maktoum family, but also that of Prince Khalid Abdullah and his Juddmonte Farms. Having personally been involved with the Maktoum family and worked for over 25 years for the late Sheikh Maktoum, I feel qualified to express gratitude on behalf of the industry. Without their support and enthusiasm and love of everything English, this whole industry of ours would be in a backwater." Goodbody added, "Their enthusiasm and passion for the sport has never diminished from the day they started and all are true sportsmen, gracious both in winning and defeat. On behalf of the TBA and the whole breeding and racing industry, I should like to express our appreciation and thanks for all that they have done for the industry."

# New TBA Chair Calls for Accord...

Kirsten Rausing, who was elected chair of the Thoroughbred Breeders' Association at the organization's Annual General Meeting yesterday, called for increased cooperation between the British organization and its counterparts in Ireland and across Europe. "It is certainly my intention to instigate further, closer and, I hope, lively cooperation with our Irish--and, for that matter, continental--colleagues in the near future," commented Rausing. "We all face very similar problems, particularly in terms of overproduction, relationships with the European Union authorities, and with various sales companies and registration authorities. Joint veterinary medical issues are most important in these days of intense traffic across various borders. I feel sure we can improve on the way these matters are handled by keeping communications open with our overseas friends, particularly our colleagues in Ireland. At the risk of stating the obvious, I feel it is fair to point out that our present-day bloodstock sales, at least in the original Tripartite countries, are just different facets of one and the same pan-European market. We must act accordingly."

# A Word of Warning...

Rausing also issued a note of caution about the health of bloodstock markets in the short-term future, calling for breeders to be realistic about their stock. "It is truistic to point out that the Thoroughbred industry develops in response to numerous external factors," she said, "The most important of these would seem to be the domestic economic and political situation and, of course, the worldwide political scenario. Bearing this in mind, it is not entirely easy to be massively optimistic in terms of the short-term future. An issue that springs to mind is that of Breeders' Prizes. Whilst we are enormously grateful for their existence, we must face the fact that they will, no doubt, be subject to external criticism. We will make every effort to retain them. I have stated my caution in terms of optimism for the short-term future. Today's very large numbers of yearlings and breeding stock presented at the bloodstock sales in Britain and throughout Europe calls for a large dose of realism to be applied. The measures we all apply to our breeding stock in the near future will have long-term repercussions."

PALACE MUSIC DEAD Grade/Group 1 winner Palace Music (The Minstrel--Come My Prince, by Prince John), the sire of two-time Horse of the Year Cigar, was euthanized Monday at Rangal Park Stud in Victoria, Australia, according to Racing Post. The 27-year-old stallion had been pensioned for several years. A \$130,000 Keeneland July yearling in 1982, the flashy chestnut captured the G1 Dubai Champion S. in England, the GI John Henry H. and GII Bay Meadows H. in the U.S. and a pair of Group 3 races in France, heading to stud with a record of 21-7-7-2. Cigar appeared in his third crop, but only became a sensation when switched to dirt near the end of his four-year-old season in 1994. Allen Paulson's homebred wound up winning 16 straight starts, including the 1995 GI Breeders' Cup Classic and the first Dubai World Cup in 1996, and retired as the world's leading money winner with a bankroll of \$9,999,815 before proving infertile at stud. Palace Music was also represented by Australian champion Naturalism (NZ) and South African champion Palace Line (Aus) among 33 stakes winners in both hemispheres.
