Mabee H. at Del Mar in August and the GI Matriarch S. at Hollywood in late November. She will remain in training with Frankel. "We hope that she brings as much pleasure to the Jacksons as she did to us," Ken Ramsey said. "Selling her was a tough decision and

we'll miss running her in the big races this year. We hope she wins a 2008 Eclipse Award for the Jacksons and goes on to an equally successful career as a broodmare. 



KEENELAND JANUARY

The fifth session of the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale ended with a bang yesterday. In one of the more entertaining bidding duels all week, Donato Lanni, on the phone in the doorway of the sales pavilion, outlasted a pair of rivals to land the racing prospect Wotan (Dynaformer--Rhineland, by Mr. Prospector) for \$380,000. It was easily the highest price on the day, and one of only two six-figure horses Friday. Lanni purchased Wotan, a three-year-old ridgling from the dispersal of Cynthia Phipps, for the California-based George Krikorian. Krikorian has had luck with horses featuring Dynaformer in their pedigrees. His Grade I winner Hollywood Story was out of a Dynaformer mare, while Grade I winner Starrer, another to wear Krikorian's silks, was by the Three Chimneys stallion. "He brought more money than we expected, but he's a made horse, he's two turning three, and he looks like he can run," Lanni said. Wotan has run twice. Going long on the grass, he was third on debut at Saratoga in September for trainer Shug McGaughey, then rallied to be second at Belmont a month later.



"He got some good numbers in those starts," Lanni added. "He looks like grass, but he's got some dirt pedigree on the family side." Wotan is out of the Mr. Prospector mare Rhineland, a daughter of Versailles Treaty who earlier in the week sold for \$350,000 to Ben Walden for Kelley Farms Racing. Lanni said he expected Wotan to continue his career in California, but said a decision as to who would train him hadn't been made. Claiborne Farm handled the Phipps dispersal.

### Who's on First at KEEJAN...

The Irish-bred three-year-old filly Whos Minding Who (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) brought the second-highest price yesterday when knocked down to Nico Ojea Quintana for \$115,000. The unraced dark bay, who was selling as a racing or broodmare prospect, will be sent to the breeding shed...in Argentina. "We have a farm there with about 80 mares," explained Quintana, who buys under the banner of Argentina Bloodstock. Quintana has been active in recent months at Keeneland and was making his fifth purchase of the January sale with Whos Minding Who. Quintana said he hadn't yet picked out a mate for the filly, but said, "We use mainly the La Mission stallions that shuttle from here: Thunder Gulch, Hennessy previously, stallions like that." Quintana's other January purchases included Randy Cat (Arg) for \$320,000 and Sadler's Profile for \$125,000. Two months ago, at Keeneland November, Quintana secured 19 mares, with prices ranging from \$40,000 to nearly \$300,000. Quintana's most expensive purchase then was the \$290,000 Inthecoolofthenite, an Unbridled's Song mare in foal to Sky Mesa.

## Eye on the Prize...

Whos Minding Who was consigned to the sale by Burleson Farms LLC. Bred by King Bloodstock, she is a half-sister to graded stakes winner Cliquot (Bertando), stakes winner Stockholder (Bertrando) and two other stakes horses. Her dam, the Lyphard mare Pharapache, is herself a half or three-parts sister to group winners Antheus (Northern Dancer) and Alexandrie (Val de I'Orne {Fr}), the latter of whom produced Group 1 winner Poliglote (GB), among others. This marked the second time Whos Mindin Who has been sent through the ring. She was knocked down to BBA Ireland for 145,000gns (\$286,001) at the 2006 Tattersalls October Sale. Lyn Burleson's Burleson Farms had a quartet of mares in his draft yesterday that fit a similar profile--BBA Ireland purchases which were either unraced or lightly raced. Two scratched, while a third, Spanish Eyes (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}--An Mosey, by Royal Academy), who hailed from the immediate family of Thunder Gulch, was knocked down to Guy J. Potter for \$42,000. "They were purchased as part of a package a little while ago," explained Burleson, who said they wound up in the January Sale because of timing. "We sorted through them and kept some and decided to sell some." Burleson said he was acting on behalf of a client who didn't wish to be named.



#### Burleson Builds on Success...


A theme from the 2006 Keeneland September Sale was the success of small consignors. No one embodied that more than Lyn Burleson's Burleson Farms, which proved that little guys could sell big horses, too.

Burleson Farms, in its first year of operation, consigned Meydan City, the Kingmambo--Crown of Crimson colt who topped the sale on Sheikh Mohammed's \$11.7-million bid. Burleson was swarmed with reporters--but, in what was a telling moment, there were two or three well-wishers offering congratulations for every member of the clamoring press. Burleson, it seemed, was very popular among his fellow horsemen. It could be his easy-going demeanor, or maybe his blue-

collar work ethic. Regardless, Burleson has remained a popular figure on the sales grounds, and has managed to build on his initial success--as much as one can build on a \$11.7-million horse, of course. In addition to selling the second-highest-priced horse yesterday in Whos Mindin Who, he consigned Miss Norman, a \$470,000 purchase for Cheyenne Stables during Tuesday's session. At Keeneland November, Burleson's 55-strong draft included Guilty Pleasure, who sold for \$1.3 million, as well as Mauralakana (Fr), who made \$900,000. Five of his KEESEP yearlings sold for \$200,000 or more. "I haven't had a big horse like [Meydan City] since, but every sale I've had since then has been very solid," Burleson said yesterday. Despite the exposure from Meydan City, Burleson said he's maintained his momentum with primarily the same clients he always had. "I wouldn't say I got any new clients from it, but something like that is obviously huge," he said. "Financially, it's a big help. But my clients have been very loyal and I'm pretty much working with the same people as before." Originally from Texas, Burleson came to Kentucky in 1992 and worked at Taylor Made Farm. He did a stint in Florida with juvenile pinhooker Jerry Bailey, then served as the farm manager for Becky Thomas and Lewis Lakin's Lakland Farm for 10 years. In 2006, he struck out on his own and began Burleson Farms, which today is a 300-acre operation in Versailles. Burleson tends to around 125 mares, the majority of which are owned by clients, although he does own about 25 mares in partnership. For the time being, at least, Burleson said he's content maintaining the size and scope of his broodmare and sales divisions, and isn't ready to jump into the stallion business guite yet. "You know, it's kind of just me right now by myself, and if I got any bigger, I'd have to restructure my whole staff and whole organization," he said. "I don't want to be in the regional market as far as stallions go, and I wouldn't be able to play at the level I'd like to in Kentucky. I'm happy being a breeder."

Won a stakes over Poly in September despite being four wide both turns, and then bounced when getting another wide trip in the new Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf. This colt has never raced on dirt, but he's working well on it, and has a late-developing pedigree on both sides (see sire profile and siblings). He should be much better this year, and will probably run a new top soon, so with the rail draw he's a borderline contender. In the long run, his best game may be on grass.

#### 2 The Darp Proud Citizen Albarado 6-1

Ran poorly on Poly in his debut, jumped forward when switched to dirt, then paired that strong figure when stretched around two turns last time in his first local start. Paired-up tops usually lead to at least another good effort if not a new top in most young lightly raced horses and, with four weeks' rest, the timing is right. This colt also has tactical speed and an inside draw in a race featuring a very short run to the first turn, and gets significant weight from most of the other contenders (five pounds is worth a point on the Thoro-Graph scale). Strong contender.

#### 3 He's Eze Silver Deputy Rivera II 10-1

Had shown moderate ability before exploding with a huge effort last time, beating Smooth Air, who came back to win the Hutcheson by only pairing up the race he ran that day. A repeat of that effort would make He's Eze very strong here, but he has already bounced twice off tops and now he's coming off a huge jump. Even with nine weeks rest a bounce is very likely.

For some people, racing is a family tradition. Others are drawn by the competition. Tom Moore got involved in the sport to help a friend.

"I got into horse racing through my friend and partner Mike Maniscalco," Moore explained. "Mike was feeling very down in the mid-'90s over the loss of his wife, and there seemed to be nothing I could do to get him back to his old self. He's a wonderful guy, a dear friend, and we went to the track together often. So I came up with what turned out to be a brilliant idea. I bought a few racehorses and, suddenly, Mike was bright-eyed and bushy-tailed."

Moore, who races his horses with his wife Judy under the nom de course Waterford Stable, started out small, campaigning a couple of claiming horses in Florida, but by the end of the century Moore and Maniscalco had joined forces with trainer Frank Gomez.

"We became more serious about the whole thing," Moore said. It was then that Moore and company started frequenting the two-year-old sales. Why did they choose to concentrate on the juveniles?

"I liked the idea of having some sense of how good the horse might be, which you can't get as much from the weanlings and yearlings," he explained. "With the two-year-olds, you have the workouts and so much more information about the horses. That was appealing to us."

Maniscalco signed the ticket on a \$115,000 colt at OBS February in 2000. Named Sir Brian's Sword, he went on to win three stakes and earn \$327,709. "He was our first star," Moore said.

Encouraged by his success, Moore went to \$130,000 to get a colt by Put It Back at OBS March in 2005. That acquisition was named In Summation (Moore is a lawyer who represents patients in medical negligence cases; he has been practicing in New York City for 35 years). In Summation took five of his six starts at two. Winless the following season, In Summation came back last year to add three stakes to his resume, including the GI Bing Crosby H.

"Winning the Bing Crosby was our highlight in racing so far," Moore said. "I can't tell you what a huge thrill that was."

The dark bay added a victory in the GIII El Conejo H. on New Year's Day, and he has his connections dreaming of bigger and better things.

"I don't want to jinx us, but we would love to go to the Breeders' Cup with In Summation," Moore said. "You never know day to day, but we believe he would have a wonderful shot."

He jumped forward at Churchill last time, but that effort also looked better than it was due to another inside trip courtesy of Borel. Horses that stay at the same level for an extended period of time and then jump are far more likely to go back than forward again, and even at the weights, this colt's best only makes him a marginal contender.

7 Mad Flatter Flatter Graham 6-1

Has thrown the same figure in all three of his starts, two in sprints in Kentucky, then locally going two turns. Since there is no movement here, this is actually a tough pattern to read--it's hard to tell whether those are efforts that will set him back, or a prelude to better. Since he only has 16 days' rest, an outside post, and would need a new top to get into the mix, we'll let this one beat us.

8 Macho Again Macho Uno Leparoux 9-2
Jumped forward in his third start, and then bounced a couple of points last time. With six weeks' rest this colt is about 50/50 to return to his best, but even if he does he's still only a borderline contender, and the post hurts.

9 Star Defender Vindication Mena 15-1 Is way too slow to compete with these.

**Bottom Line:** This is a pretty competitive race, and several of these could turn out to be nice three-year olds. But The Darp has a lot going for him, and should be a square price.

#### Take Two cont.

Tom Moore has come a long way from his humble beginnings in racing, but he is not so far from his roots.

"I am originally from Ireland," he remarked. "I grew up there and, as you know, the Irish have an affinity for horses. It was in the air, if not in my genes. I was always interested in horses."

That interest has grown into not only a modest racing string, but also a small breeding interest.

"We weren't looking to create an empire--we just wanted to have a couple of horses and have fun and follow them around," Moore said. "But the stable has grown a bit--we have four horses [including In Summation] with Christophe Clement and three with Jason Servis, and three broodmares, two of which are in foal. We also have two yearlings and three two-year-olds.

"You know what they say about the best laid plans. We intended to stay very small, but racing becomes addictive--in a good way."

Sadly, Team Moore lost one of its most valued members last year. Gomez, who was responsible for selecting many of the horses, most notably In Summation, passed away Dec. 23 after a long illness.

"We are eternally grateful to Frank...we depended on him, and he was a dear friend," Moore said. "We are going to miss him."







RICARDO GETS 10,000TH WINNER Jockey Jorge Ricardo picked up his 10,000th career winner Wednesday while winning five races on card at Argentina's San Isidro. His landmark victory came aboard Membrisia (Arg) in the day's 11th race. The 46-year-old becomes the first rider in the history of the sport to break the five-figure win mark. "The world record was very important for me," Ricardo told Racing Post through an interpreter. "This is a goal that will remain in the annals of world turf, and of course I wanted to be the first to reach it." He added, "I don't know yet when I'm going to retire, but I have enough ambition to keep winning more and more races and get as many as I can. I think I'll be able to win something between 12,500 and 13,000 in my career."
