THE WORLD BELONGS TO MANDURO

Manduro (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) was yesterday unveiled the leading horse in the 2007 World Thoroughbred Racehorse Rankings (WTRR), becoming the first German-bred to achieve that feat. In being handed a final rating of 131 pounds, Baron Georg von Ullmann's

celebrity pipped the 129rated quartet of archrival Dylan Thomas (Ire) (Danehill), G1 Epsom Derby and G1 Juddmonte International S. hero Authorized (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) and the leading Stateside champions Invasor (Arg) (Candy Stripes) and Curlin (Smart Strike). Manduro, who is about to embark on his

breeding career at Sheikh Mohammed's Kildangan Stud in Ireland, established a mark two clear of last year's best achieved by Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's subsequent G1 Dubai World Cup winner Invasor and is the highest since Hawk Wing's 133pound tag at the inaugural publication of the WTRR in 2004. Champion of the separate miler and intermediate trip categories courtesy of an unbeaten sequence which took in Longchamp's G1 Prix d'Ispahan, the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot and Deauville's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois, the Andre Fabre-trained luminary bettered his 2006 rating by 11 pounds after the World Rankings Supervisory Committee's decision was published by the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities (IFHA). Nigel Gray, co-chairman of the committee, said yesterday, "His impressive performances in the Prix d'Ispahan and the Prix du Haras de Fresnay le Buffard Jacques Le Marois merited him the title of champion miler in 2007, but his best performance was in defeating Dylan Thomas in the Prince of Wales's S. over 2000 metres at Royal Ascot. Having established his versatility in winning the [G2] Prix Foy over 2400 metres, it was a great shame that injury prevented him from showing us whether he was as good over that distance as he was over shorter distances."

SANTA ANITA TO REFORMULATE SURFACE

WITH PRO-RIDE Santa Anita has announced that racing will continue this season with a reformulated main track. The Arcadia oval was forced to cancel three straight cards last week after the Cushion Track exhibited drainage problems. The Australian company Pro-Ride, which manufactures a different synthetic surface, conducted tests which showed that its patented polymer binders assisted the existing Cushion Track to drain properly; tests done at the University of Southern California yielded the same results. "The test results are dramatic and extremely encouraging," said Santa Anita President Ron Charles. "We have only a short window of opportunity to get this done, and we believe we have finally solved our Cushion Track drainage problem. After exhaustive research, we feel strongly that this is the way to go." He added, "The tests show that we've found a way to reformulate the existing Cushion Track surface. With the addition of polymers and fiber, the surface becomes kinder, more consistent and it cushions the impact of the track on the horses. It functions properly in diverse weather conditions and reduces the amount of kickback." According to Santa Anita's statement, Pro-Ride's testing has demonstrated that the existing track required a binder to encapsulate the fine silt contained in the sand. The binder promotes stability and will permit the drainage of rainwater through the seven inches of synthetic surface, which lies atop a porous asphalt base. Cont.p2


World Thoroughbred Rankings cont. *Close Behind...*

Despite the reversal suffered in the Royal meeting's feature, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's Dylan Thomas made his own headlines in 2007 with four successes at the top level in the G1 Prix Ganay and G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp, G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown and Ascot's G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. His 129pound rating exceeded his 2006 mark by three pounds, and the Committee's co-chairman Garry O'Gorman paid tribute to the achievements of Ballydoyle's star turn. "He is the first horse since Lammtarra in 1995 to achieve the King George--Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe double, and he added the Tattersalls Millions Irish Champion S. to his tally over the shorter distance of 2000 metres," he said. Over a mile and a half, or the "long" distance division as penned by the Committee, Dylan Thomas shared top honors with Saleh Al Homaizi and Imad Al Sagar's Authorized, who became the highest-rated Epsom Derby winner since the inception of the WTRR after his five-length Classic romp for the Peter Chapple-Hyam stable. In the previous 10 years, only Sinndar (Ire), who went on to reach a lofty 132 rating in 2000 and the following year's winner Galileo (Ire), who also finished on 129, has a winner of the blue riband fared so well in the end-of-term classifications. Topping the U.S. charts are the aforementioned Invasor and GI Preakness S., GI Jockey Club Gold Cup and GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero Curlin, Tom Robbins, chairman of the North American Ratings Committee, lauded the joint dirt champions yesterday. "Invasor achieved the same rating for winning the Dubai World Cup as he had achieved in winning the Breeders' Cup Classic in 2006, but subsequent injury deprived him of the opportunity to improve on that performance figure," he explained. "He shares the billing of top dirt horse in the world with Curlin, who won the Preakness and was placed in the Kentucky Derby and the Belmont S. before winning the Breeders' Cup Classic in the autumn. He is the first three-year-old to [top the list] since Tiznow back in 2000." GI Belmont S. and GI Kentucky Oaks victoress Rags to Riches (A.P. Indy) was named the champion filly or mare in 2007, finishing on 123. "These victories enabled her to be ranked top filly or mare in the world on any surface," Robbins concluded.

"We are now in the process of developing a timeline for acquiring the necessary polymer and fiber," Charles said. "It is estimated that it will take 10 to 12 days to produce the binder. The material will be mixed into the

track surface without having to remove or displace the track. It is our intent to schedule the application so as to minimize any disruption to training or racing."

"We've conducted an extensive search nationwide to find 20,000 tons of high-quality material within the timeframe we have to work with, and have been unsuccessful," said Charles. "In addition, if we were able to find the dirt and get it here quickly, it would take a significant amount of time for a new dirt track to settle, which would hinder our ability to resume training and racing. There may also be community regulatory problems that could cause additional delays."



World Thoroughbred Rankings cont. New Approach, Same Story...

As in 2006, when Teofilo (Ire) topped the European Two-Year-Old Rankings on 123 pounds, it was another of Jim Bolger's juveniles who led the way yesterday. In capturing the same races as his predecessor, New Approach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), who is now owned by Princess Haya of Jordan, was handed a rating of 126, a pound in front of Godolphin's acquisition Fast Company (Ire) (Danehill Dancer (Ire)). Achieved with a half-length defeat of that former Brian Meehan-trained colt in the G1 Dewhurst S. at Newmarket in October, New Approach's rating is on par with 2001 champion Johannesburg, and joint-second only to Xaar (GB) in recent times. Susan Magnier's Tommy Stack-trained G1 Prix Morny victor Myboycharlie (Ire) (Danetime {Ire}) was next best on 122 pounds, with His Highness the Aga Khan's G1 Prix Marcel Boussac winner Zarkava (Ire) (Zamindar) topping the fillies' division on 119 for the Alain de Royer-Dupre stable. Of the sprinters, the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Midnight Lute (Real Quiet) came out best on 121. Last month's G1 Hong Kong Sprint scorer Sacred Kingdom (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) was ineligible for inclusion. In the "extended" distance category, Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's Septimus (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) beat stable companion Yeats (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) by a pound with a rating of 122 as a result of his impressive success in the G2 Doncaster Cup.

ASTARTE RENAMED FOR DE ROTHSCHILD

This year's G1 Prix d'Astarte will bear a new name to honor the late Guy de Rothschild and his father Eduoard, the European Pattern Committee has confirmed. Deauville's premier mile event for fillies and mares will be run under the title the Prix Rothschild as a direct tribute to the famed multiple champion owners and breeders. Baron Guyde Rothschild, whose breeding empire centred around the Haras de Meautry and who was president of the French Thoroughbred Breeders' Association in the 1970s and early 1980s, died last June at the age of 98.

'WATSON' AIMED AT EARLY CLASSICS Last year's G2 Norfolk S. and G2 July S. winner Winker Watson (GB) (Piccolo {GB}) is on the road to recovery, according to trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam, and will be




THE BATTLEGROUND

The past few weeks we have been surveying the stallion markets in North America and Europe; this week we arrive at the final region in this review, Great Britain and Ireland. But when you look at the stallion landscape in these two countries what jumps out at you is how, far more than anywhere else we've been reviewing, Britain and Ireland have now become the chief stallion battleground in the struggle for world domination between Coolmore and Darley.

Though others may guite understandably have lists which differ from mine, I counted 38 stallions (see p8) between the two countries which I would classify as major figures, usually (though not without exception) stallions standing for £15,000 or higher. Fifteen of these stallions are either directly under the Coolmore banner (14) or could be called, as they say in the political arena, 'leaning toward' Coolmore (Dansili) (more on this below). Another 13 come under the Maktoum banner, including two of Shadwell's, and two which are now 'leaning toward' the Maktoum camp (Pivotal and Invincible Spirit, in both of which Darley has reportedly bought a quarter interest). That means 74 percent of the leading stallions in Britain and Ireland (28 of 38) are in the orbit of one of the two camps. This leaves only 10 'neutral' or 'independent' higher-tier stallions, barely a guarter of the total. More than on any other major northern circuit, in the British and Irish stallion markets, the conflict between Coolmore and Darley dominates the landscape.

There are six top-class proven sires in Europe, not counting Sadler's Wells, now 27 years old. As we've noted before, Coolmore dominates this top tier, and right now this is the center of their worldwide strength. Fortunately for them, these are not older horses, but relatively young ones. After the premature death of Danehill at 17 in 2003, it was all looking very up in the air for Coolmore. But, of their three candidates for the top tier whose first two-year-olds raced in 2004 (first foals 2002), they came pretty close to hitting the jackpot. Giant's Causeway (by then in Kentucky) and Montjeu went pretty much straight into the World Top 12; only Fusaichi Pegasus (still quite a useful sire) proved to be not out of the top drawer. Then the next year came Galileo, giving Coolmore what is now a powerful European six-figure stud fee trio of Danehill Dancer, Montjeu, and Galileo (believed to be Europe's most expensive stallion now, at €225,000, though listed as private), while simultaneously (though somewhat belatedly) suddenly establishing Sadler's Wells as a serious sire of sires.

I'm counting Dansili in the 'leaning toward' Coolmore camp not because Coolmore owns an interest in him, as Darley now does in Pivotal and Invincible Spirit, but because they appear to be using the son of Danehill as a backup to their own Danehill Dancer. Coolmore has bought yearlings by Dansili; they went out and bought a son of his (Strategic Prince) to stand; and they are reportedly sending mares to him.

So four of Europe's six top-class proven sires are either controlled by or 'leaning toward' Coolmore. Pivotal is 'leaning toward' Darley, leaving only Germany's Monsun as completely 'neutral' or 'independent,' whichever word you prefer. But nobody is resting on their laurels. I'd classify another five European sires as world 'second 12.' Of those, Darley controls Cape Cross, whose 34 yearlings sold last year averaged nearly \$300,000, from his first crop at a \in 50,000 stud fee. British sires Selkirk and Medicean are neutral, while, of the two top European sires whose first foals just turned four (first foals 2004), Darley has bought an interest in Invincible Spirit; Coolmore has repatriated Rock of Gibraltar after his gap year in Japan. A third group of proven sires, all standing for £15,000 or €25,000, divide up along similar lines: Darley controls the stillunderrated pair of Cadeaux Genereux and Singspiel; Barathea and Zamindar are neutral; and Peintre Celebre is at Coolmore, Cont. p6

Of the 10 proven sires counted here which would not be counted among the World Top 12, four are controlled by or leaning toward Darley, four are neutral and two are controlled by Coolmore.

The proven sires with first foals 2004 or earlier account for 16 of the 38 sires on this list. Of the remaining 22, with first foals 2005 or later, nine stand at Coolmore; eight are at Dalham Hall, Kildangan, or Shadwell; and only five are 'neutral.' But three of those five (Acclamation, Oasis Dream, and Dalakhani) already have runners: their first foals are all three-year-olds this year. Coolmore and Darley have three speculative sophomore sires--Hawk Wing and High Chaparral at Coolmore, and Nayef at Shadwell. All three stand for £10,000 or \in 15,000, and by the end of this year, all three will either sink or swim. They may make this corresponding list for 2009, they may not. That leaves seven which have not had runners at Coolmore, six for the Maktoums, and only two--Azamour and Motivator, both with their first yearlings this year--among the neutrals. Of this entire list of 38, there are 74 percent controlled by either Coolmore or the Maktoums, but, of the 15 which are yet to have runners, it is 13 of 15 (87 percent). This titanic struggle isn't leaving much room for the (relatively speaking, of course) 'little guys.' So, next week, armed with the new APEX ratings, we will try and point out a few cheaper alternatives to the big guns.

KEEJAN: Reality Bites...

Until this year, it seemed as though Keeneland's January Sale was just going to keep adding a day a year: six days in 2005, seven days in 2006, eight days in 2007. But this year, the sale dropped back to seven days. Despite 20 percent fewer horses sold (see Weekly Sales Ticker), the gross was down just 3 percent and the average was up by 21 percent, you'd think we'd all be declaring it a fantastic sale. Yet Keeneland Sales Director Geoffrey Russell's comments were decidedly guarded all week, and for good reason. The horses that people want are selling stronger than ever, but what happens when the horse business contracts is the bar defining what 'they want' keeps getting higher. Keeneland January 2008 is an example of that, and of what happens to the ones 'they' don't want.


For one thing, the 'clearance rate' is dropping. Though the percentage of those offered which sold was off only marginally, there was a somewhat bigger drop in the percentage of those catalogued which sold, indicating more late withdrawals. Three years ago, at the 2005 Keeneland January Sale, 66 percent of the horses catalogued sold. The percentage dropped marginally, to 65 percent in 2006 and 63 percent in 2007, but there was a further 4-percent drop this year, to 59 percent. That statistic is heading in the wrong direction. 

"Since Book 1 accounts for two-thirds of the Keeneland January gross, it's not surprising that the entire sale's statistics tend to follow the trends established in Book 1. Sure enough, for the whole sale this year the clearance rate of horses sold from those catalogued declined again, to 59%. It doesn't mean expensive horses are getting cheaper; but it does mean there are more horses nobody wants, which of course makes them cheaper. These are the fruits of producing too many horses for not enough buyers. It will result in overall production cuts, but not necessarily the other part of the equation—improving the returns on the racetracks for the prospective buyers."— *Bill Oppenheim*

But there's an even more dramatic statistic which illustrates how the gap between the haves and the have-nots is widening. We asked ace number-cruncher Robert Williams, TDN's IT guru, if he could help us figure it out, so Brianne wouldn't have to compile it by hand, like she did last week for the Monday session. So he did, and the results are sobering, if not downright scary. Of the 1,965 horses sent through the ring during the seven days of the January sale, a total of 1,362 of them were either 'short yearlings' (649 foals of 2007) or in-foal mares (713). Of the 649 yearlings, the 'hammer price' for 326 of them--slightly more than 50 percent--was at or below the 2006 stud fee. Of the 713 mares, the hammer price for 229 of them--32 percent, just under a third--was similarly at or below the 2007 stud fee. This doesn't mean you had a 50-percent chance, or a 32-percent chance, of not making money. it means if you took a yearling up to the ring at Keeneland, there was a 50-50 chance it would bring no more than the nominal stud fee it cost to produce it. If you took a mare up there, one in three didn't even bring more than the corresponding stud fee. That's why Geoff Russell was guarded, and that's why a lot of consignors had a bad sale even if the average was up 21 percent. We have no way of knowing how many of the 555 horses which couldn't bring more than the stud fee were bred on foal-shares, discounted seasons, etc.; but however many there have been the last two years, there are sure to be a lot more in 2008--that, or a good many mares will simply be taken out of production. That would be, collectively, a good thing, but when it's your mare, or your yearling, well, reality bites, and bites hard.




ARTHUR APPLETON DIES Longtime owner/breeder Arthur Appleton, who founded Bridlewood Farm in Ocala, Florida, died yesterday morning. He was 92. "Mr. Appleton was truly a great man, a loving husband

and father," said George Isaacs,
Bridlewood's manager since 1996. "He
was a brilliant businessman, a fiercely
competitive sportsman and a generous
philanthropist. Underneath his tough,
Swedish exterior beat a huge, giving
heart. I personally witnessed so many
acts of kindness he anonymously bestowed on people over the years I can't
begin to count them all." Born in Chicago, Illinois, Oct. 15, 1915, Appleton
graduated from Dartmouth College and

entered his family's electronics business, eventually becoming president and chairman of the board. He attended racing at Arlington Park with his father, Edgar Appleton, and bought his first racehorses in the 1960s; his first stakes winner was Gallant Knave in 1972. With a second residence in Florida, the Appleton family at one time owned interests in both Gulfstream Park and Hialeah Park. Those interests were later sold, but Appleton remained on the Gulfstream advisory board. His contributions to the Hallandale oval have been recognized by the GIII Appleton H., which will be conducted Jan. 27. In 1977, he purchased 500 acres in Ocala and established Bridlewood, which has grown to 960 acres and currently has a roster of 15 stallions; a 16th stallion, Stormy Atlantic, has made the transition to Hill 'n' Dale in Kentucky. In 1992, Appleton purchased I'm Very Irish (Pleasant Colony), a son of North of Eden (Ire) (Northfields)--herself a 3/4-sister to champion Theatrical (Ire)--for \$130,000 at KEEJAN. I'm Very Irish developed into a stakes winner, and the mare's second foal, Paradise Creek, became a champion. Appleton acquired North of Eden privately from Mr. and Mrs. Bert Firestone, and the mare's first foal for him turned out to be GISW Wild Event (Wild Again). She later produced GISW Forbidden Apple (Pleasant Colony) and Paradise River (Irish River {Fr}), who later became the dam of MG1SW David Junior (Pleasant Tap). The mare's most recent foal is a 2006 colt by Vindication. According to Bridlewood's website, Appleton bred nearly 100 stakes winners, including additional GISWs In Summation, Jolie's Halo and Southern Image. Along with his sister, Edith-Marie, he founded the Appleton Museum of Art in Ocala in 1987. He is survived by his children Arthur Jr., Tom, James, William and Linda as well as 13 grandchildren and 13 great grandchildren.

Purses Up, Handle Steady in 2007:

Purses in the U.S. rose 5.5 percent last year, while wagering in the country was down 0.37 percent from 2006, according to figures released yesterday by the National Thoroughbred Racing Association. The total number of race days dropped by 0.82 percent. Results in 2007 were buoyed by the opening of Presque Isle Downs in September. For the fourth quarter of 2007, total wagering declined by nearly one percent, while purses rose 3.63 percent and race days increased by 0.75 percent. "Handle, purses and auction sales are three leading economic indicators of the sport, and the three are interrelated," said Alex Waldrop, president and CEO of the NTRA. "Handle was steady in 2007, while auction sales also remained steady after an all-time record year in 2006. The robust growth in purses was clearly aided by revenue from racinos, but we are optimistic that increased purses will lead to increased handle as these higher purses translate into a more attractive racing product." Wagering, including worldwide commingled betting on U.S. races and separate pool wagering in Canada on U.S. races, totaled \$14,727,170,578 in 2007 and purses totaled \$1,177,782,612. There were 6,168 race days.



JOHN CORBETT DIES Bloodstock agent John Corbett died on Sunday, aged 69, following a short illness. One of the founders of the Heron Bloodstock agency in the late 1960s, the Wiltshire-based entrepreneur is widely accredited for introducing Japanese interests into Europe and America and, alongside his Heron partner Stan Dunckley, pioneered the flying and shipping of their purchases to the Far East. Heron Bloodstock were at one time responsible for the worldrecord yearling when paying \$1.6 million for Hoist the King at Keeneland's 1979 July Sale. The operation was dissolved in the early 1980s, after which Corbett set up as an independent agent. Among his purchases was the "flying filly" Lyric Fantasy (Ire), who conquered the G1 Nunthorpe S. in 1992 and the 1987 and 1990 G1 2000 Guineas winners Don't Forget Me (Ire) and Tirol (Ire).

'ICON' TRAINS ON Susan Roy's 2006 G1 St Leger hero Sixties Icon (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) will be back in 2008, trainer Jeremy Noseda announced yesterday. Following his impressive return success in the G2 Jockey Club S. at Newmarket last May, Sixties Icon was down the field in both the G1 Coronation Cup the following month and the G2 Princess of Wales's S. in July. "Sixties Icon is back in training," his conditioner said. "He was fully examined after his last run and hopefully, we have resolved one or two small issues. The plan is to aim him at the same starting-point that he had last year--the [May 4] Jockey Club S. at Newmarket. Following that race, we will decide as to whether we stay at a mile and a half or possibly think about a tilt at the G2 Yorkshire Cup, as there is a view that we could consider upping him in trip."
