In 1989, Mister Frisky swept all before him in Puerto Rico, winning all 13 of his starts in the Caribbean before heading to California. The chestnut added scores in the GII San Vicente S., GII San Rafael S. and GI Santa Anita Derby, and while his perfect record came to an end when he ran eighth as the 9-5 favorite in the 1990 GI Kentucky Derby, he bounced back to finish third to division leaders Summer Squall and Unbridled in the GI Preakness S.

M Racing's **Copa de Plata** (Pioneering) may not quite possess those same credentials, but his connections have big plans for their five-year-old. M Racing principal Mickey Gonzalez is flirting with the idea of sending Copa de Plata to Dubai for the G1 Golden Shaheen Mar. 29, he told *El Nuevo Dia*.

But first things first. The chestnut, now stabled with Brian Koriner at Santa Anita, will make his first start on the mainland in Monday's \$150,000 GII Palos Verdes H., where he'll face none other than likely champion Midnight Lute and Grade I winner In Summation.

"We got him in the middle of December," Koriner explained. "The folks in Puerto Rico bragged on him, but then we saw he was in once for a claiming price of \$22,500. He's a big, pretty horse; he's got a lot of ability, but we weren't really ready to run him yet, but I guess they have big hype coming from Puerto Rico. They've been writing about him every day in the papers there, and they're sending all kinds of media for this race."



Given his form in South America, there was reason to think Happy Boy would be competitive in Dubai. From September 2006 to March 2007, he won four of his first five starts in Brazil, all on dirt, including a Group 2 event. He was switched to the turf last spring and made each of his next four at 1 1/2 miles, and though he was close in a few of them, Happy Boy won just once, in a Group 3 race in his most recent at Cuidad Jardim in November. He got his chance to get back to the dirt here and put forth an effort that thrilled his connections. "We were confident of a win, but we never imagined he would win like that!," exclaimed Eduardo Guimares, racing manager for Happy Boy's owner, Roberto Reichert. "We will look at the next rounds of the Matkoum Challenge and hopefully he can be a Dubai World Cup horse." Reichert also won the day's nightcap, the \$120,000 Marju H., with Happy Runner (Brz) (Romarin {Brz}). Both are trained by Pedro Nickel Filho and were piloted by Da Silva. Round II of the Maktoum Challenge will be held Feb. 7. The Dubai World Cup card is slated for Mar. 29. Recent wet weather forced the three turf races scheduled for yesterday's card to be moved to the main track.

REPORT: AUSTRALIA BACK ON TRACK AFTER

EI OUTBREAK Following several months of turmoil and uncertainty concerning the equine influenza outbreak in Australia, industry organizations are posting upbeat bulletins on the situation. The Australian Racing Board (ARB) said in a release yesterday that EI "is under control and on track for early eradication." Australia's Chief Veterinary Officer Dr. Andy Carroll said that, due to successful control programs undertaken by New South Wales and Queensland veterinary authorities, as well as the actions of Australian horse industries and individual horse owners, the disease is contained and large populations of horses have fully recovered. "Since reaching a high of some 10,000 infected premises in October/November last year, we now have less than 1,000 infected premises, indicating that our strategy in combating the disease has been highly successful," Carroll said. ARB said the number of infected premises is continuing to rapidly decrease with no new detections of the disease reported since Dec. 22. Movement restrictions have been eased dramatically over the past week, with Victoria opening its borders to recovered horses from NSW and Queensland without the need for quarantine. The news was hailed by Australia's racing, breeding and sale industries. "2008 starts on an excellent note...with all of the major sales and racing events traditionally scheduled for the first half of the year now allocated new dates and set to proceed under full steam," said Bob Pearson, chairman of the ARB. Pearson added about sales, "Obviously, there will be biosecurity precautions, but these will be sensible and manageable, causing the minimum possible amount of inconvenience to both vendors and purchasers."

Copa de Plata, a \$40,000 FTKJUL yearling and a \$150,000 OBSMAR juvenile, admittedly took some time to get going at El Commandante/Camarero Racetrack. Second by a nose in the Clasico Bandit Bomber in his 2005 finale, he missed all of 2006, and was dropped into claiming company when he returned to action this past summer. The Kentucky-bred raced his way back into form and capped 2007 with a 6 1/2-length score in the Clasico Dawn Glory Oct. 28.

For owner Michael House, it started back in the early 1970's, racing Appaloosas on the California fair circuit.

"There used to be races for just Appies then--half-mile, five-eighths, and there used to be pretty big purses, races for \$100,000, even," said House, a semi-retired businessman who lives with his wife Dawn in Rancho Santa Fe, California, not too far from Del Mar.

But those big purses began to dry up in the 1980's, and House.

who had raced a few Thoroughbreds, switched full time to the flats. That proved a fortuitous move, as House can now boast an enviable breeding and racing operation, given its size and scope. With a racing stable typically numbering about a dozen, House has in recent years won the GII San Luis Obispo (Nazirali), the GII Hollywood Breeders' Cup Oaks (Brooke's Halo), and the \$250,000 WinStar Oaks (Sweet Fourty), while another runner, MSW Cayoke (Fr), took the Houses halfway around the world when fourth in the \$1-million Godolphin Mile in 2003.

"That was an amazing experience," said House, who added with a laugh, "I've been looking for someone to get me back."

Whether the three-year-old filly Final Fling will proved talented enough to eventually get House back to Dubai remains to be seen, but the Jeff Mullins-trained daughter of Bertrando announced herself on the sophomore fillies scene with a sharp upset victory in the GIII Santa Ysabel S. at Santa Anita Jan. 13.

Final Fling is House's latest success, and like many of his other top runners, she emerged from a juveniles-in-training sale. The filly was purchased by House for \$100,000 at last year's Barretts May sale (click here to watch her 1/4-mile breeze in :21 2/5).

"Jeff really like the way she breezed, and liked the way she was made, and I really liked her pedigree--I'm more the pedigree guy. I leave it to the trainers to judge the conformation and how they move--and Jeff really liked her from Day 1."

Final Fling broke her maiden in career start number three in December, then came back to best Grace Anatomy at 10-1 odds in the Santa Ysabel.

"I've gravitated toward the two-year-old sales because I feel you can get a better line on the horse," said House when asked about his success at juvenile sales. Sweet Fourty was a mere \$10,000 at the 2005 OBSAPR sale; Brooke's Halo was a \$40,000 OBSFEB buy.

"But Final Fling might be one of our best when she gets done," said House, who used to develop commercial industrial properties. "She hasn't done a thing wrong yet. Hopefully, she's just getting started. We're looking at the GI Santa Anita Oaks, with maybe the GI Kentucky Oaks as an ultimate goal, depending on how she does in her preps. Of course, Indian Blessing and Bobby Frankel's filly [Country Star] are out there, and I'd like to avoid them, but there are still some nice races."

House, who has been a resident of California for most of his life, has expanded his Thoroughbred operation to include breeding. He owns Chestnut Farm in Versailles, Kentucky, where former trainer Judd Feld oversees House's 16-strong broodmare band.

"We mostly have stakes winners and stakes producers, and breed exclusively for the market," said House. "We sell all our yearlings, so people don't think we're keeping our best ones. We've got a half-sister to Curlin, so we're excited about her. She's carrying a Fusaichi Pegasus colt and is booked to Smart Strike."

The broodmare prospect, Puerto Rico's champion sophomore filly, was consigned by Derby Daze Farm, Agent II, and was purchased for \$50,000 by Adena Springs. For the session, OBS sold 184 horses for a total of \$1,158,600. The average rose 2.5 percent from a year ago to \$6,297, while the median rose 8.7 percent to \$4,350. The second and final open session of the three-day sale gets underway this morning at 11 a.m.





THIS WEEK IN HISTORY...

January 19, 1955...Swaps won the San Vicente S., the first race of his three-year-old campaign, by $3\frac{1}{2}$ lengths at Santa Anita Park. He went on to triumph over Nashua in the Kentucky Derby, but was in turn defeated by his rival in a \$100,000 match race at Washington Park on Aug. 31, his only loss that year.

January 20, 1972...Secretariat was shipped from Virginia to Florida to be trained by Lucien Laurin.

January 20, 1979...Odds-on favorite Affirmed, with Steve Cauthen aboard, finished second in the San Fernando S. at Santa Anita, beaten 2 3/4 lengths by Radar Ahead. It was their fourth consecutive defeat. Cauthen subsequently lost the mount on Affirmed to jockey Laffit Pincay, Jr., who rode the horse for the remainder of his four-year-old season, winning seven victories in as many starts. Affirmed was later voted Horse of the Year for 1979. Cauthen had ridden Affirmed to a Triple Crown sweep the previous year and the pair recorded 11 wins in their 16 races together.
