

WAR PASS OK AFTER BOUT OF COLIC According to Daily Racing Form, likely two-year-old champion War Pass (Cherokee Run) suffered a mild case of colic Friday and was sent to Palm Beach Equine Clinic, but returned to trainer Nick Zito's barn at Palm Meadows Saturday morning. "War Pass showed signs of abdominal discomfort with the symptoms of a mild impaction at feed time on Friday," Dr. Joseph Migliacci told DRF. "As a result, we decided to send him to the Palm Beach Equine Clinic, where he could receive maintenance fluids all evening. It was basically a precautionary measure. He passed manure all evening, had a good night, and is back to normal this morning." The colt missed a scheduled workout yesterday, but Zito expected him to be back at the track today. "He came back looking great and I'll probably send him to the track Sunday," Zito told DRF. As for War Pass's schedule, he added, "We'll just have to adapt, but better this sort of thing happened now than in March, when it could force him to miss an important race like the Wood [Memorial]."

## AN ACE IN THE CLAIMING GAME

Mike Mitchell, a staple on the Southern California racing circuit since the 1970s, has enjoyed a solid training career improving horses off the claim.

The conditioner claimed Kessem Power (NZ) for



\$50,000 in 1997 and went on to win two graded stakes with him in 1998--the GII San Luis Rev S. and the GII San Luis Obispo H. Star Over the Bay, haltered for \$80,000, won three graded stakes for Mitchell out of the box, including the 2004 GI Clement L. Hirsch Memorial Turf Championship S. On the Acorn (GB), a \$40,000 claim in 2006, rattled off backto-back wins in last term's GII San Juan Capistrano Invitational H. and GII Jim Murray Memorial H. Leprechaun Kid Benoit Photo notched the 2005 GII Del Mar

On the Acorn Benoit

H., one start after being

claimed by Mitchell for \$80,000. The 59-year-old also won graded stakes with Sun Boat (GB) and Symphony Sid after claiming the duo for \$50,000 apiece.

According to Brisnet, Mitchell won with 90 of 336 starters (27 percent) making their first attempts off the claim between 2002 and 2007.


"Once you get a line on the trainers and who your competitors are, you then kind of handicap them right along with the horse," Mitchell said of the claiming game. "It's the closest thing to a poker game. You don't know what the other guy's got in his hand; you don't know if he's bluffing. And that's the way I look at claiming horses. Sometimes it comes down to me taking a look at a certain horse and walking away from him. If they've got a healthy and good look about them, I might claim them right off looks. Years ago I would claim everything, but now I'm a little bit more cautious. I'm a little smarter and walk away from a lot of claims now. It's not like I have to fill up an empty stall. I just don't want to fill that stall up with a bad horse."

Mitchell posted a breakthrough season in 2004, winning 97 of 391 races and more than \$3.8 million in earnings. He won the first two Grade I stakes races of his career that term with the aforementioned Star Over the Bay and Kela, who annexed the GI Bing Crosby H. at Del Mar. The latter thrived under Mitchell's care after being purchased privately and went on to finish second behind champion Speightstown in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint.

"Little by little I realized that a lot of these owners can't afford to own a horse 100 percent now," Mitchell explained. "If I put three owners together, I could claim an \$80,000 horse. If I took all of those guys separately, I could probably claim a \$10,000 horse for one guy, a \$20,000 horse for another guy, etc. I put a lot of my owners together as partners and they all get along good. When I partner them up, I can look for a little bit more expensive horse, and that's probably what's really changed my business."

Although he has enjoyed the majority of his success in the claiming game, Mitchell also recently developed GISW Romance Is Diane and GSW Sindy With An S. The former closed out her sophomore campaign with a win in the GII Bayakoa H. She recently resurfaced to place a solid third behind the highly regarded Zenyatta in the GII El Encino S.

Mitchell worked for conditioners Farrell Jones, Ron McAnally, Willard Proctor, Loren Rettele and Jack Van Berg before going out on his own in 1974.

"When I worked for Jack, Loren Rettele was the trainer of record," he said. "Loren was a really good horseman. Farrell Jones was probably the best teacher





that I had. I also spent a lot of time off and on with Proctor. They were all good horsemen in their own right and I learned a little bit from each one of them."

Mitchell's dad, Earl, was also a trainer. His brothers, Earl, Jr. and Guy, followed in their father's footsteps as well.

bly the first time I was really introduced to horses," Mitchell said. "My dad had been training, but I really hadn't been around horses. Little by little my brothers went to work for my dad and I was kind of the last one that came into the horse business. When I did, it actually worked out good for me, because my dad didn't need me, so they sent me to the farm. I was able to learn the breeding business, worked with breaking babies and worked with our 10 stallions. By numbers, we were the second largest in California. It was a good experience. It was a real good foundation for me. I think it was very helpful in developing me as a horse trainer."

Nov. 10. The bay followed with a powerful 2 1/2length victory at that level Dec. 8 (<u>Video</u>), and steps up in company for Monday's GII Palos Verdes H.

"He's doing great, but I realize that I'm probably running in a Grade I race by the way it sounds," Mitchell said. "It's a full field of nice horses if they all go. He came into me in pretty good shape, soundness wise. We just took our time with him and he's doing good. He ran good in his first start for us, then we ran him again and he ran awesome. He's earned a right to run against these horses." Soul City Slew has posted five workouts since his last start, including a five-furlong move on the Hollywood Cushion in 1:03 4/5 Jan. 12.





JAMES H. STONE PASSES AWAY Owner James H. Stone, who campaigned European champion and MG1SW Ardross (Ire), GISW and GI Kentucky Derby runner-up Menifee and GSW Chamrousse, died Monday. He was 82. Born in New York City and a decorated veteran of World War II and the Korean War, Stone founded an oil company in Cincinnati, Ohio, in 1952, and turned it into the billion-dollar corporation Stone Energy Corp. He served as chairman of Stone Energy until his death. Ardross was the finest horse to carry his colors, winning the G1 Ascot Gold Cup twice, as well as the G1 Prix Royal Oak and 10 Group 2 and Group 3 events. The bay was runner-up in the 1982 G2 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and, during his four seasons on the track, was named champion older horse in England, Ireland and France. Both Menifee and Chamrousse were owned in partnership with Arthur B. Hancock III. A longtime resident of New Orleans, Stone is survived by his wife, Joelle Rogers Stone; as well as three sons, three daughters and eight grandchildren. Nakatani was working a horse for trainer Kristin Mulhall when the horse broke down. He was taken to Centinela Hospital after the accident, and is likely to be sidelined two to three weeks, according to agent Craig O'Bryan. Nakatani, 37, is currently 10th in the standings at the Santa Anita meet with five wins.

DELTA JACKPOT FINISH CONTESTED The connections of Golden Yank (Yankee Gentleman), beaten just a neck when third behind dead-heaters Z Humor and Turf War in the Dec. 7 GIII Delta Jackpot S. at Delta Downs, have filed a lawsuit against the Louisiana Racing Commission contesting the order of finish in that race, the Daily Racing Form reports. The suit was filed Tuesday in Lake Charles, Louisiana. Attorney Byron Bonck is representing owner/breeder Millard R. Seldin Revocable Trust and trainer Gary Thomas. Jockey Gerard Melancon, who was aboard Golden Yank as he battled between Z Humor and Turf War down the stretch in the Delta Jackpot, claimed foul after the race, alleging interference by both winners. The claim was disallowed by the stewards, and the Louisiana Racing Commission upheld that decision in a subsequent appeal. The lawsuit seeks to to overturn that ruling.




