HORSE OF THE YEAR CURLIN TO RACE IN 2008

There were few surprises during last night's Eclipse Awards ceremony in Beverly Hills, but there was a bit

of welcome news. Making the announcement as he accepted the trophy for the 2007 Horse of the Year, Stonestreet Stables's Jess Jackson revealed that Curlin (Smart Strike) will be back in action this year. Jackson bought out partners Padua Stables and George Bolton after the colt's smashing success in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Monmouth Park, and now holds an 80-percent interest. The re-Brandon Benson maining 20 percent, once controlled by Midnight Cry's

beleagured partners Shirley Cunningham Jr. and William Gallion, is now in the hands of the courts. Jackson is confident that he will be free to chart a course for his Eclipse champion, but did caution, "There are provisos: he must be fit and we must work out the ownership issues." He added, "It's very likely that he will race in 2008, because I think those issues can be worked out."

In Summation is almost unbeatable on artificial surfaces. Second in three straight stakes starts on the grass, the five-year-old was off the board in a pair of turf outings before taking the June 23 Sneakbox S. on the lawn at Monmouth Park. Then he switched to the grass, and took the Bing Crosby at 8-1. He added the Arlington Sprint H. in August, then was beaten less than a length in the Underwood. He opened 2008 with a narrow score over Barbecue Eddie in the El Conejo, and had to fight even harder to get the job done here. In Summation stalked Barbecue Eddie through a half in a blistering: 43.18, collared the pacesetter in deep stretch and prevailed to take three ticks off the track record. "I knew my horse was going to finish strong," said jockey Rafael Bejarano. "I knew there was only one speed horse in the race, and I knew he was going very fast, so I saved what I could and let my horse run when it counted." 

A couple of years ago, when I wanted to take a photograph of Hasili, I was reminded of that feeble joke which runs along the lines of:

Question: "What do you feed a 600lb gorilla?" Answer: "Anything it wants."

It turned out that the last thing Hasili wanted to do at that particular time was to stand still while a bumbling amateur photographer clicked away. Instead, she skilfully eluded all attempts to catch her as she played leader of the pack in her paddock. But then Hasili has earned the right to do anything she wants. She could out-diva Diana Ross, Mariah Carey and Whitney Houston and no one in the Juddmonte operation would dream of complaining.

While Hasili still has a bit of work to do to match Fall Aspen (eight group/graded winners, including four Grade I winners) and Courtly Dee (seven graded winners, headed by three Grade I scorers), this extraordinary mare has a near-faultless record. Thanks to Champs Elysees's stylish victory in the GII San Marcos S., her first six foals have all scored at Grade I or Grade II levels, with four of them achieving Grade I-winner status. It took the great Dahlia 11 foals to come up with four Grade I winners and a pair of Grade II scorers.

She is one graded winner ahead of Juddmonte's recently retired Toussaud, who also produced four Grade I winners. Coincidentally, Hasili is currently carrying to a late cover by Empire Maker, one of Toussaud's Grade I winners. She also has a three-year-old, Raise The Flag, by Sadler's Wells and a yearling filly by Storm Cat. It was a shame she was barren to Oasis Dream in her last season in Europe. This tremendously speedy son of Green Desert (sire also of Hasili's excellent daughter Heat Haze) sired his first group winner, Visit, from Hasili's younger sister Arrive.

Although Arrive and Hasili share the same parents, Kahyasi and Kerali, they showed very different talents on the racetrack. Hasili was fast enough to make a winning debut over five furlongs at two, before doing all her winning at up to a mile. Arrive, on the other hand, didn't race at two and set track records over 1 1/2 miles and nearly 1 7/8 miles. The explanation is that Arrive was the more typical daughter of Kahyasi, winner of the Derby and Irish Derby, whereas Hasili clearly inherited more of the precocious speed which made her second dam, Sookera, one of the fastest juvenile fillies of her year. With a background like this, Hasili was always likely to produce a range of winners, even when mated to Green Desert and Danehill, two Danzig line stallions which made their names as sprinters. Her first foal, Dansili, was straightforward, racing almost exclusively over a mile, but Hasili's subsequent runners have displayed their talents over a variety of distances. Heat Haze and Intercontinental must be considered her fastest offspring, as they became stakes winners over 6 1/2 furlongs and seven furlongs respectively, but they also had enough stamina to win Grade I races over 1 3/16 miles and 11/4 miles. Banks Hill was equally effective over a mile and 11/4 miles and Cacique was pretty versatile too, gaining a pair of Group successes over a mile in France before becoming a Grade I winner over 1 1/4 and 1 3/8 miles.

Champs Elysees, for his part, has already shown himself to be the best stayer of the bunch, as he once


failed by only a nose to land the G3 Prix Maurice de Nieuil over 1 3/4 miles. However, he doesn't look like a stayer, as he's a strong, robust sort with plenty of substance and, looking at him, you could be for-Benoit Photo given for thinking that he's a miler. He was

once considered the most precocious of Hasili's sons until a bout of coughing forced him to miss the summer meeting at Deauville, where he had been expected to shine.

His performance in the San Marcos suggests that Champs Elysees is well suited by a mile and a quarter and that he is now ready to fulfil the promise of his immaculate bloodlines. He managed to out-speed the opposition at Santa Anita despite having been held up last in a race in which the commentator said they "couldn't be going any slower--if they did they'd start trotting."

There's a good chance that the firm ground at Santa Anita also suited him. According to the Racing Post form, he never encountered ground faster than good during his time in Europe and I wouldn't be at all surprised were he to prove best on ground firm enough to allow him to use his acceleration. Although Dansili could handle very soft going, three of his best efforts came on the few occasions he encountered fast ground, on which he could use his change of gears.

Champs Elysees' victory makes him no less than Danehill's 16th graded winner on American turf tracks, following Artiste Royal, Aussie Rules, Cacique, Landseer, Banks Hill, Intercontinental, Dress To Thrill, Danish, Light Jig, Luas Line, Makderah, Simple Exchange, Spring Star, Chiming and Desert Lady.



The first 10 horses on this list all scored at the Grade I level and it is reportedly Bobby Frankel's ambition to add Champs Elysees' name to this elite list.

Bearing in mind the scale of success enjoyed by Danehill's American turf runners, I find it a little surprising that there is only one stallion son of Danehill in Kentucky, with another in Florida.


However, the Kentucky-based son is the Derby-winning North Light, whose adverts include Frank Stronach's assertion that "we have bred him to quality mares and fully expect his progeny to excel on dirt."

Only time will tell whether North Light can fulfil Stronach's prediction regarding dirt, but there is no reason why a son of Danehill shouldn't excel as a sire of turf and all-weather performers in the USA. Dansili was Britain's champion sire of all-weather performers in 2006 and 2007, as well as being France's champion sire of turf performers in 2006. Danehill took third place behind Dansili among 2007's all-weather stallions, with another son, Danetime, in eighth place, so this tough male line is thriving on the synthetic tracks.

And Champs Elysees is thriving in the USA, to the extent that he could help Hasili become the first mare to produce five Grade I winners.

CURLIN RISES TO THE OCCASION

Maybe it's a good thing horses can't read the newspaper. Some of the connections of **Curlin** (Smart Strike)

were surrounded by controversy, but, blissfully unaware of any negative headlines, the Horse of the Year maintained his brilliance from February to October. Serious in every start, the three-year-old captured six of his nine appearances, was never off the board and earned a whopping \$5,102,800. He will add to that bankroll during his four-year-old

campaign. "This couldn't be better," said Jess Jackson, whose Stonestreet Stables now owns 80 percent of the colt. "It's a thrill of a lifetime for all of us. This is a guy who saw Seabiscuit in 1939, saw Swaps and Native Dancer all through Secretariat--and this is a dream come true."

HORSE OF THE YEAR CH. 3YO COLT

Curlin, bred by Fares Farm in Kentucky, has skyrocketed in value since being sold to Ken McPeek, agent for Midnight Cry Stable, for just \$57,000 as a KEESEP yearling. Stonestreet Stables, Padua Stables and George Bolton bought into the colt for a figure reported to be around \$3 million after a 12 3/4-length maiden victory at Gulfstream Park in February (video), and he wore his game face in just about every one of his next seven starts.

"I have to thank John Moynihan, who put us all together; and the brilliant strategy of Steve Asmussen, and the way he arranged the campaign, has to be noted," Jess Jackson of Stonestreet Stables said as he accepted the award. "There is so much to say for Steve's whole team--Scott Blasi and the rest, and for the athleticism of Robby Albarado. A great horse needs a great rider and a great trainer, and we were lucky enough to have them."

Curlin cruised though wins in the GIII Rebel S. and GII Arkansas Derby (video), and was not disgraced when third in the GI Kentucky Derby. Off at 3-1 in the GI Preakness, he stumbled at the start, but was relentless down the lane, catching Derby hero Street Sense in the final jump for his first Grade I victory (video).

His stretch drive in the GI Belmont S. was just as impressive, but Rags to Riches was out to make history, and she outgamed Curlin to take the "Test of the Champion" by a head.

It may have taken the colt some time to recover from beaing beaten by a filly. Curlin was sent off the 9-10 chalk in the GI Haskell Invitational S. two months later, but, after making a tepid bid in the stretch, he flattened out and finished third, beaten 4 1/2 lengths by Any Given Saturday.

Shaking off his two tough defeats, Curlin demonstrated his determination once again as he battled past fellow Eclipse hero Lawyer Ron to take the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup (video), and his sophomore finale was a tour de force, as he handled the sloppy track and the best in the nation to take the GI Breeders' Cup Classic in a gallop. Most of those behind him that afternoon have headed off to the breeding shed, but Curlin will be back in action this year. Jess Jackson said that the decision to bring the colt back, rather than take the quick dividends available for top stallions, was in large part influenced by the fans.

"I want to encourage everyone to work together to raise racing to a new level of marketing, of ethics, of sincerity, and to give the fans what they need," he said. "That's why we decided to race Curlin this year."

Plenty of champions have showcased their brilliance at historic Saratoga Racecourse, and Lawyer Ron added his name to that list with two dominating performances at the upstate New York racetrack last summer.

Following odds-on defeats in the GI Metropolitan H. and the GIII Salvator Mile H., the chestnut rebounded to demolish the nine-furlong track record at Saratoga when he stopped the clock at 1:46 3/5 while posting a 4 3/4-length victory in the GI Whitney H. (video). Picking up eight pounds in the GI Woodward S. (video) at the Spa, he was even more dominating, scoring by 8 1/4 lengths.

"It takes a lot of people to make a horse like Lawyer Ron a champion, and at the top of the list is trainer Todd Pletcher and his crew," said attorney Ron Bamberger, for whom the colt is named.

Favored to make it three in a row in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup S. at Belmont (<u>video</u>), Lawyer Ron hooked up in an epic battle with Horse of the Year Curlin, and came up just a 1/4 of a length short. Installed as the morning-line favorite in the GI Breeders'

Cup Classic, he never got a hold of the sloppy conditions at Monmouth Park and reported home seventh.

Lawyer Ron also posted a victory in the GII Oaklawn H. in April (video).

"His two races at Saratoga were unbelievable, when you think about setting a track record going a mile and an eighth at Saratoga--they've

been running there a long time," Pletcher said. "To me, the Whitney was arguably the most impressive dirt race of any run there last year. He was consistently the best older horse in training last year."

Added Bamberger, "It takes a lot to bring back a horse like Lawyer Ron, after the success he had during his three-year-old campaign, and the fans were significant in making the decision to race him again this year. I think that winning this award is a vindication of that decision."



Owner Robert LaPenta has accomplished in 10 years in the Thoroughbred business what many cannot do in a career and, last night, he earned his first Eclipse Award when GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero War Pass easily outpointed the dynamic duo of **Court Vision** (Gulch) and **Kodiak Kowboy** (Posse) to take the award as top juvenile.

"Our family has been over the moon since War Pass raced for the first time at Saratoga," LaPenta said at the awards ceremony. "He is an incredible animal, and to be here tonight, with the odds of winning this award--it's overwhelming."

LaPenta has had success not only at the races, but also in sales rings around the country as a yearling-to-juvenile pinhooker. He has routinely bought back horses off high reserves, and that might have been the case with War Pass. But fate intervened.


"We were going to put him in the two-year-old sales and David Scanlon had him evaluated as his top horse," LaPenta recollected. "We were going to put a big reserve on him, but unfortunately he developed some ankle chips and had an operation."

Turned over to trainer Nick Zito, War Pass made his career debut in the first Saturday maiden of the Saratoga meeting, overcoming a sluggish start to ultimately lead at each call en route to a 2 3/4-length victory with the visiting Corey Nakatani aboard. In a decision which would prove crucial to the colt's future success, Zito passed on the GI Hopeful S. in favor of a first-level allowance at the Spa for his next start.

War Pass responded in kind, strolling home 5 1/2 lengths best, with Pyro back in third.

"That was a great, great move by Nick," commented LaPenta. "We could have run in the Hopeful, but Nick is great with bringing horses along slowly, and it worked out great."

Faced with the daunting task of taking on the the much-hyped Hopeful top two Majestic Warrior (A.P. Indy) and Ready's Image (More Than Ready) in the GI

Champagne S., War Pass proved more than equal to his first Grade I assignment, dominating his rivals from the front end (video). He employed those same tactics on Breeders' Cup day, a performance which clinched divisional honors beyond a shadow of a doubt.

LaPenta acknowledged that, in trying to live up to the accomplishments of the 2007 sophomore

crop, War Pass had his job cut out for him, but, he added, "I give special thanks to Street Sense, because he finally broke the juvenile jinx at the Kentucky Derby, and we can only hope that lightning strikes twice. Go War Pass!"

Following six starts in 2006--which included maiden and allowance wins--Ginger Punch was put on the shelf and underwent laser surgery to remove growths on her throat. It was very clear from the beginning of her four-year-old campaign that the Stronach homebred had returned a new horse.

But Frank Stronach was quick to give trainer Bobby Frankel a lot of credit for the turnaround. "We can raise a great horse, but it takes a great man to put on the final touches," he said.

Ginger Punch began her championship season with a second-place finish in the GII Vinery Madison S. at Keeneland. Following her stakes debut, she posted a facile allowance win at Churchill. Stepped up to the top level, the Florida-bred rallied to a bang-up second-place finish in the GI Ogden Phipps H.

As the weather began to heat up, so did Ginger Punch. She put together three straight stakes victories following the Phipps--the GII First Flight H. (video), the GI Go For Wand H. (video) and the GI Ruffian H. (video). The winning streak ended with a third-place finish in the GI Beldame S., but Ginger Punch redeemed herself on racing's biggest day with a determined 1/4-length victory over Hystericalady in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff.

"She had a great season," Frankel said. "I don't know if she's the best [filly or mare that I've ever trained], but she's very good, tries very hard and she got the job done. She has to rate up there with some of the best ones I've had."

Added Stronach, "In the final analysis, Bobby makes the right decisions--thank you, Bobby."

Ginger Punch has been kept in training and will begin her five-year-old season in the Sunshine Millions Distaff at Gulfstream Park Jan. 26.

CH. 3YO FILLY RAGS TO RICHES

Few fillies can boast the kind of season that Rags to Riches enjoyed in 2007. A winner of five of six starts in 2007--all at the Grade I level--the statuesque filly collected her biggest and most important career victory in the GI Belmont S., defeating eventual Horse of the Year and champion three-year-old colt Curlin in the process. In winning the Belmont, the chestnut became only the third filly in 139 runnings of the race--and the first in 102 years--to win the 1 1/2-mile event. Her accomplishments on the race track also helped her trainer, Todd Pletcher, collect a fourth consecutive Eclipse Award in 2007.

"The Belmont win stands out as the strongest victory by any filly we've ever trained," said Pletcher, who also trained two-time champion filly Ashado. "The Belmont was probably the most exciting win of my career."

Rags to Riches kicked off the season with an impressive six-length score in a Santa Anita maiden Jan. 7. Moved up to Grade I company for her next appearance, she rallied late to record a 3/4-length victory in the onemile GI Las Virgenes S. Feb. 10. Having a much easier time of it next time out, the \$1.9-million KEESEP yearling rolled home 5 1/2 lengths in front in the Mar. 11 GI Santa Anita Oaks (video). Following a series of minor setbacks, Rags to Riches returned with a vengeance in the May 4 GI Kentucky Oaks (video), winning by 4 1/4 lengths over stablemate and subsequent GISW Octave.

Pitted against the boys for the first time in the Belmont (video), she proved to be a force to be reckoned with despite stumbling at the start. In a race for the ages, the filly handed GI Preakness S. winner and GI Kentucky Derby third Curlin a head defeat, becoming the first filly to win a Triple Crown event since Winning Colors triumphed in the Kentucky Derby in 1988.

"It is quite an accomplishment to win the Belmont, and given that she beat Curlin in the Belmont really adds to the mystique of the race," said Pletcher.

An awkward start may have affected the result in her next start in the GI Gazelle S.at Belmont Sept. 15, but the game filly still gave it her all and came up only a half-length short in what would prove to be her final race of the season.

"She came out of the last race with the injury; my guess is that it started on a microscopic level and manifested itself after she had a stressful race," Pletcher surmised.

"So that kept us from accomplishing some of the things we were hoping for after the Belmont."

A distant second to Curlin in the voting for Horse of the Year, Rags to Riches defeated her Belmont S. rival in their only encounter in 2007, but, according to Pletcher, circumstances may have prevented the filly from getting stronger support in that division.

"So much weight is given to what happens in the Breeders' Cup and what happens in the last couple of months," he said.

"Voters have a tendency to ignore what happens early in the year. Had she raced again and possibly had she won a Breeders' Cup race, I think she could have made a case for herself."

According to Pletcher, the major goal for the 2008 season will be Breeders' Cup day in either the Classic or the Distaff, with a probable stop at Saratoga for the GI Personal Ensign S.

CH. 2YO FILLY INDIAN BLESSING

Hal J. Earnhardt III and his wife Patti have had quite a few top runners with Bob Baffert, including GISWs Behaving Badly, El Corredor and Indian Charlie, but they picked up their first Eclipse with Indian Blessing, who capped an unbeaten three-race campaign with a frontrunning score in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies.

Fittingly, the dark bay was bred by the Earnhardts. Her dam, Shameful (Flying Chevron), was a \$50,000 KEESEP yearling purchase in 1999. She went on to win four of her 12 starts, including the Pine Tree Lane S., and placed in a pair of graded events while earning \$241,345 under Baffert's tutelage. Bred to Indian Charlie her first two years as a broodmare, the Florida-bred mare produced Indian Blessing as her second foal.

"The mother--she was a nice, fast filly, but [Indian Blessing]'s more like Indian Charlie: he had brilliance, and she has the same thing," said Baffert. But that wasn't readily apparent in her early training.


"She never really made any of the top lists," Baffert recalled. "When we went to nominate to the Hollywood Starlet--it's early--she didn't make the cut." The first nomination for that Grade I event is in May, but several months later, Baffert's opinion changed.

"In August, she started coming around," Baffert continued. "We really hadn't pressed on her. One day, I worked her five-eighths, and I knew I had something really special. I remember calling HaI, telling him that... she was good--like really, really good. He knows that means like Indian Charlie good, El Corredor good, and so that's why we took her to Saratoga."

Bet down to 4-5 for her debut Aug. 30, Indian Blessing flew through 5 1/2 furlongs in 1:03.26 (video), a tick off the track record, and was tabbed as a *TDN* Rising Star. She continued to train smartly at Belmont and had no trouble coping with a mile at the sweeping oval. The homebred led every step of the GI Frizette S. Oct. 6 (video), scoring by 4 1/2 lengths at 3-5.

Sent off as the 8-5 favorite in the Juvenile Fillies, she took the lead soon after the start and never looked back, splashing home a 3 1/2-length winner (video), giving Earnhardt his first winner at the championship event. Indian Blessing is the third champion two-year-old filly conditioned by Baffert, who had Silverbulletday in 1998 and Chilukki in '99. She's the second straight Eclipse Award winner for her sire, who was represented by champion older female Fleet Indian in 2006.

Indian Blessing got an early start to her sophomore campaign, flashing her trademark speed before holding on by a head to set a new track record of 1:19.89 for seven furlongs in the GII Santa Ynez S. Jan. 13 at Santa Anita.



"It looked like a gut wrencher--she was tired--but she bounced right out of it," Baffert explained. "Now she's tight; she looks ready to do something."

The filly may hit the road for her next start. "There's the [GIII] Silverbulletday at Fair Grounds [Feb. 9]," her trainer added. "We'll nominate to that. I think that might be the next spot for her."

The Earnhardts have a two-year-old half-brother to Indian Blessing by Candy Ride (Arg) named He's Shameful. Shameful produced a Roman Ruler colt in 2007 before being bred back to that stallion.

Last June, trainer Kiaran McLaughlin thought he had a top prospect for the GI Breeders 'Cup Filly & Mare Turf in the form of European import Makderah (Ire), a Shadwell Stable homebred who had just won the GII New York S. But McLaughlin was told by Shadwell chief Sheikh Hamdan that, as good as Makderah was, the real star was another import, Lahudood. McLaughlin wasn't sure, but with some late-season heroics, Lahudood convinced both her trainer and the Eclipse voters that she indeed was the top turf mare in the land. Lahudood gave Shadwell, also named leading owner, its second Eclipse Award of the night and its third in two years by a wide 145-vote margin. Shadwell's Invasor (Arg) was named Horse of the Year in 2006. Lahudood secured the championship with 188 first-place votes, well ahead of runner-up Nashoba's Key (43 votes) and Precious Kitten (16 votes).

"We did think that she was Grade I quality [when she was transferred to us], but not as much as we liked Makderah in the early stages," McLaughlin recently explained. "But Sheikh Hamdan insisted that Lahudood was the better of the two. He loved her."

Lahudood got her chance to shine when Makderah was sidelined with an ankle injury in September. An allowance winner at Belmont in her second U.S. start in July, she was coming off a seventh-place finish in the GI Beverly D. when McLaughlin asked and received permission from Belmont racing officials to sub Lahudood for Makderah in the GI Flower Bowl Invitational S. at Belmont in late September. Lahudood was wasn't on the original list of invitees and went off a 21-1 bomb at post time, but proved she was up to the task with a rail-skimming victory that gave both her and jockey Alan Garcia their first Grade I wins (video).

Sent postward an 11-1 outsider in the Breeders' Cup a month later, Lahudood handled the bog-like conditions at Monmouth Park and skipped home in a champion performance.

"It was so soft and such rough conditions, that no one knew what to expect in the Breeders' Cup," said

McLaughlin. "She dug in and ran great and it was very thrilling and very satisfying for Sheikh Hamdan, because he normally retires all of his fillies at the end of their three-year-old year. He believes that they'll produce better foals as young mares, so he doesn't run four-year-old fillies usually. So I'm glad he

made that decision, and it worked out great for every-body."

Lahudood now heads to the breeding shed...and with an Eclipse Award in tow. She is reportedly book to Lane's End stallion Kingmambo.

The chestnut, a close third to Miesque's Approval in last year's balloting, got the nod over GI Breeders' Cup Mile victor Kip Deville (Kipling) and After Market (Storm Cat).

Purchased for a mere \$50,000 out of the 2003 Keeneland September sale, English Channel doubled his

career number of Grade I tallies and his bankroll in 2007. Successful in defense of his title in the GI United Nations S. (video), he bounced back from a runner-up effort in the GI Sword Dancer Invitational S. to take the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic (video), knifing through the slimmest of

openings at the rail en route to the win. His score on Breeders' Cup day came at the hands of former champion Red Rocks (Ire) and Better Talk Now, as well as favored Dylan Thomas (Ire).

English Channel is standing his first year at stud at Hurricane Hall near Lexington for \$25,000.

When Maryfield splashed home to a half-length victory in the inaugural Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint (video), she also secured the first-ever Eclipse statuette as Filly Sprint Champion.

Maryfield, claimed for \$50,000 from a Santa Anita turf event in January 2006, began 2007 with three offthe-board efforts in Southern California graded-stakes company. But things turned around for the bay mare when she was forced to rate after a slow start in the GII Distaff Breeders' Cup H. (video) at Aqueduct in March.

"The key was getting her to relax, which happened

pretty much by accident after she broke slow in the Distaff Breeders' Cup H., and for that I give a lot of credit to jockey Jorge Chavez," trainer Doug O'Neill said after the Breeders' Cup. "I just wish we'd figured it out sooner."





Mike Pegram has several Eclipse Awards in his trophy case, doubling up with champion filly Silverbulletday in 1998 and 1999, and his Real Quiet nailed the three-year-old colt title in 1998 with his heroics in the Triple Crown. Fittingly, Pegram gets to share another one this year with partners Carl Watson and Paul Weitman, as Real Quiet's son Midnight Lute turned in pair of dominating performances to be crowned champion sprinter.

Midnight Lute's bottom line is sprinkled with a series of solid turf performers--his second dam is 1984 GII La

Prevoyante H. heroine Bolt From the Blue--but his speed has carried the day so far. A \$70,000 KEESEP yearling, he RNA'd for \$290,000 at OBSMAR in 2005 from the draft of Eddie Woods, and found his way to Pegram and partners. The nearly black colt has been carefully managed by trainer Bob Baffert.

"You never really know how good they are until you work them five-eighths, that's when you realize what you have," he said. "I had high hopes for him as a two-year-old, [but] he had throat issues."

Midnight Lute made one appearance in 2005, rallying to win at Del Mar in July, but didn't face the starter again for 368 days. He came back at three to win two of his four starts, including a victory in the GIII Perryville S. over Keeneland's Polytrack, before finishing the year with a third in the GI Malibu S.

Second by a nose in the GII San Fernando BC S. last January, Midnight Lute finished a close fourth in the GII Strub S. the following month.

"He just started coming around in the winter last year," Baffert said. "He had a lot of bad luck--I think his throat was bothering him. We redid the throat, and he started training a lot different."

Midnight Lute ran fourth in the GII Commonwealth BC S. at Keeneland Apr. 14, and Baffert began charting his course with an eye to later races.

"He was training really well at Del Mar--he looked fantastic," Baffert said. "I worked him at Saratoga and he was fantastic there again."

Midnight Lute made his next appearance in the GI Forego H. Sept. 1 at the Spa and turned in a tour de force (video). That effort earned him a 124 Beyer Speed Figure, the highest since Ghostzapper's 128 in 2004.

"You never know until you put them in a race," said Baffert, "but I knew when he got away and he made that big move around that turn, it was like, wow, he's a pretty amazing horse when he puts it all together."

Midnight Lute went postward as the 5-2 favorite in his next outing, the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at Monmouth Oct. 27. Well back in the early stages, he rallied boldly through the slop, dashed by the swift Idiot Proof inside the eighth pole and went on to score by 4 3/4 lengths. He had one more start, the GI Cigar Mile at Aqueduct Nov. 24, but couldn't quite catch the streaking Daaher and settled for second; the final time was 1:33.79.

While Midnight Lute's worktab is riddled with bullets, Baffert opted to skip his proposed seasonal opener in yesterday's GII Palos Verdes H. "It's going to be a long year," he said. "I just want to keep him fresh. I want him ready for a summer/fall campaign."

On top again despite stumbling late in Belmont's GI Lonesome Glory Sept. 22, the Maryland-bred tired over the soft turf to be fourth behind McDynamo in the GI Breeders' Cup Grand National at Far Hills Oct. 20. But, looking to close out the season on a high note in the Nov. 18 GI Colonial Cup at Springdale Race Course in Camden, the gelding was on the front end throughout and powered home a 2 1/4-length winner. With the victory, Good Night Shirt set a single-season steeplechase earnings record of \$314,163.

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum's Shadwell Farm started strong in 2007, with reigning Horse of the Year Invasor (Arg) (Candy Stripes) returning with a dramatic win in the GI Donn H. before traveling to Dubai for an authoritative win in the G1 World Cup.

"Invasor winning the World Cup--well, it doesn't get any better for our outfit than that," explained the cham-

pion's trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "It just doesn't get any better than that. I understand winning the Kentucky Derby would be great for me personally--being born and raised in Lexington--and great for an outfit and owner in America, but the World Cup is equally important to the Maktoums. And to go back there

For the fifth consecutive year, Frank Stronach's Adena Springs led all individual breeders in wins and purse money won and, once again, it wasn't even close. Boasting 564 starters who made 3,479 starts in 2007, Adena Springs racked up 538 wins, 539 seconds and 449 thirds and a staggering \$18,055,772 in earn-

ings. By way of comparison, the runner-up on the earnings list, Sez Who Thoroughbreds, had 267 starters make 2.059 starts last year, with 291 finding the winner's circle and with earnings of \$7,856,427--nearly \$10.2 million less than Adena.

In a lopsided tally that reflected those numbers. Eclipse voters handed Adena's breeding program its fourth consecutive Eclipse Adena homebred Ginger Punch Award and its fifth overall. Adena received 203 firstplace votes, followed by Fares Farm Inc (13 votes)

and Pam and Marty Wygod (12 votes). Adena Springs hasn't finished worse than second on the earnings list since 1999.

The star of the show for Adena was homebred Ginger Punch, a daughter of Adena stallion Awesome Again, who won a trio of Grade I races in 2007, including the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. Last night, Ginger Punch was honored in her own right, earning an Eclipse as champion older mare. Adena also bred 2007 Grade I winners Wicked Style, Citronnade and Sugar Shake, and Grade II winners Cobalt Blue and Going Ballistic. Only Citronnade, by Lemon Drop Kid, is by a stallion that doesn't now stand, or once stood, at Adena Springs. Wicked Style is by last year's freshman Macho Uno. Sugar Shake, like Ginger Punch, is by Awesome Again. Cobalt Blue is by Golden Missile, who has since been moved to New York, while Going Ballistic's sire Lite the Fuse, once an Adena resident, now stands in Pennsylvania.

Adena Springs has bred no fewer than 11 champions in both America and Canada, including Horse of the Year Ghostzapper and champion juvenile Macho Uno.

Stronach, who earned his first Eclipse as outstanding breeder in 2000, is also a three-time Eclipse Award winner as outstanding owner (1998-2000). He finished second to Shadwell in the category last night.





CHAMPION TRAINER TODD PLETCHER

The Todd Pletcher jugernaut continued to roll in 2007 when the 40-year-old scaled new heights with yet another single-season earnings record left in the dust. Pletcher, who also collected the title for outstanding trainer in 2004, 2005 and 2006, landed his first victory in a Triple Crown race in 2007 with Rags to Riches.

"We arguably had our strongest year, yet I think sometimes you get compared to your own statistics, so it becomes increasingly tougher each year," said Pletcher.

In addition to champion three-year-old filly Rags to Riches, Pletcher was blessed with a strong group of female competitors, including the other two Eclipse finalists in that category: GI Coaching Club American Oaks and GI Mother Goose S. heroine Octave and Panty Raid, victorious in the GI American Oaks and GI Spinster S. Also under the Dallas, Texas native's tutelage was Cotton Blossom, who landed the GI Acorn S.; and GI Beldame S. winner Unbridled Belle. Not to be outdone by his fillies, Pletcher also boasted an impressive roster of colts in 2007. Leading the fray was the quirky yet talented English Channel, who culminated a remarkable season with a scintillating victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf and an Eclipse Award as the outstanding male turf horse. Another headstrong pupil, Lawyer Ron bagged the GI Whitney/GI Woodward double at the Spa last summer, netting him a champion older horse title. Scat Daddy, winner of the GI Florida Derby, and GI Haskell Invitational hero Any Given Saturday were also among notables trained by Pletcher.

"What I really try to focus on is the horses," explained Pletcher. "Any time we have the favorites to be champions, that's more important than the individual awards. If we keep putting our horses in the position to be champions, all the other stuff will fall into place."

A former assistant to Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas, Pletcher, who broke his mentor's stakes-winning record in 2006 with 95, failed to surpass that mark in 2007, but did come close with 94 stakes victories in 2007. He also just missed tying his 2006 record tally of 57 graded stakes wins with 56 this term, but did rack up an impressive 17 Grade I victories in 2007. Among trainers, Pletcher, who was sixth overall in career earnings last year, rose to fourth at the conclusion of 2007, with over \$143 million in the coffers.

"We are very fortunate to get some good horses to train and we try to work hard, capitalizing on those opportunities," he added. "We try to figure out what each horse wants to do and what they do best, and we take a common sense approach to it."

Talk about making the most of a second chance. Battling substance abuse problems, Arizona native Garrett Gomez was once out of action for 21 months, but, since making his return in 2005, he has not looked back. Two years to the day after he entered a rehab clinic, Gomez was at the '05 Breeders' Cup, scoring with Mile hero Artie Schiller and Juvenile winner Stevie Wonderboy. The 36-year-old led the country in earnings in 2006, finishing second in the voting for the Eclipse Award, and he topped the North American standings once again in 2007 with more than \$22 million in purses. He added his first Eclipse to his impressive roster of success last night.

In addition to thanking his family and his friends, Gomez said, "I'd like to thank the horses--without them, I wouldn't be standing up here. And there is somebody else who deserves a very special award--that's my agent, Ron Anderson."

It's fitting that jockey Joe Talamo won the first race back at Fair Grounds after the track was closed by Hurricane Katrina. Talamo grew up in Marrero, a suburb of New Orleans, and spent his childhood Thanksgivings at Fair Grounds. He recorded the memorable victory aboard Clouds on the Walk on Thanksgiving, 2006, and has been riding high ever since. Now 18, Talamo was just seven when he started tagging along to the track with his dad, Joseph Talamo Jr., who was an assistant trainer at Fair Grounds. At the tender age of 11, he started galloping horses at a Louisiana training center, and he left high school during his junior year to become a jockey. The young rider picked up his first victory at Louisiana Downs in June of 2006, and went on to become the first apprentice to take the Fair Grounds title with 119 wins. Talamo then headed west, where he earned his first Grade I score with Nashoba's Key in the July 7 Vanity H. at Hollywood, and added a second success at the highest level with Bilo in the Triple Bend H. on the same card. He lost the bug just a couple of weeks later, but continues to hold his own on the circuit, finishing fifth at the Hollywood fall meet and currently sitting tied for fourth at Santa Anita.







ANOTHER EXTENSION FOR NYRA The long-term franchise has yet to be awarded, but the New York Racing Association has reached an agreement with the Oversight Board and the State that will allow racing to continue at Aqueduct through Feb. 13. NYRA signed a similar agreement on Dec. 31, 2007, giving it the right to hold racing at the Big A through Jan. 23. "While we are disappointed that a final resolution has not been reached, we appreciate the diligent efforts of the Spitzer administration," said NYRA Chairman C. Steven Duncker. "The latest temporary agreement provides the necessary time to enact legislation granting a long-term racing franchise."
