Sweep), winner of three Group 1 races in 2007, including the G1 Dubai Duty Free, was last night named the

Japan Racing Association's 2007 Horse of the Year. The four-vear-old was also named champion older male. Admire Moon received 178 out of 289 possible votes for Horse of the Year, and was the overwhelming winner of top older male with 249 votes. After scoring his first Group 1 victory overseas in Horse of the Year Admire Moon the Duty Free in March, he returned home and triumphed in two more presti-

gious races, the G1 Takarazuka Kinen and G1 Japan Cup. He is now retired to stud at Sheikh Mohammed's Darley Japan Farm Co. in Hokkaido. Daiwa Scarlet (Jpn) (Agnes Tachyon {Jpn}) was runner-up in Horse of the Year voting and was honored as champion three-year-old filly. Cont. p2

There could hardly have been a more fitting winner of last week's GII Palos Verdes H. than In Summation. This very fast five-year-old was bred by Arthur I. Appleton, who had died six days earlier at the grand age of 92, and his sire Put It Back is part of the stallion team at Appleton's Bridlewood Farm.



In Summation

Bridlewood, of course, has been home to plenty of stallions which have been significant assets to Florida's breeding industry. Skip Trial sired Horse of the Year Skip Away and others worthy of mention include Jolie's Benoit Halo, Halo's Image, Jules and Stormy Atlantic. Bridlewood is

currently home to a large team of stallions, including a likely type in the GI Champagne S. winner Proud Accolade, but none of them costs more than Put It Back, whose fee now stands at \$7,500, having been as low as \$3,500 at one stage.

Put It Back arrived at Bridlewood in 2001 after compiling a record which left us wondering what might have been. His five starts as a three-year-old yielded five front-running victories and he accounted for the accomplished Flame Thrower when he led throughout to take the GII Riva Ridge S. on the Belmont S. undercard. The GII Amsterdam S. at Saratoga was to be the next rung on the ladder for Put It Back, as he ascended the sprinting ranks. Unfortunately a shin injury forced his retirement, so we were never able to establish the exact extent of his talent. Cont. p3

There were a number of Special Awards presented, including a pair that went to Vodka (Jpn) (Tanino Gimlet {Jpn}) and Meisho Samson (Jpn) (Opera House {GB}). Vodka became the first filly to win the Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby), while the latter made his

own history by claiming the G1 Tenno Sho Spring and G1 Tenno Sho Autumn in the same year, becoming only the fourth horse in JRA history to achieve the feat. Daiwa Major (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), winner of the G1 Yasuda Kinen and G1 Mile Championship, won

champion sprinter or miler for the second year in a row. Other winners on the evening were: Goshawk Ken (Bernstein), champion two-year-old colt; Tall Poppy (Jpn) (Jungle Pocket {Jpn}), champion two-year-old filly; Asakusa Kings (Jpn) (White Muzzle {GB}), champion three-year-old colt; and Vermilion (Jpn) (El Condor Pasa), champion dirt horse. Top trainer Kazuo Fujisawa returned to the top for most races won, his first championship since 2004 but 11th overall. Superstar jockey Yutaka Take turned in another historic season, first by surpassing Yukio Okabe's all-time record of 2,943 career wins and then by reaching the unprecedented milestone of 3,000 wins in November. These feats, along with champion jockey titles for wins and money earned, brought him a Special Award, given to only three other jockeys in the past. Take also continued his streak of at least one JRA award every year since being named Best Newcomer Jockey in 1987. Jockey Katsumi Ando led the field with highest winning average.

What we did know was that he was just the type of stallion to suit the Florida industry, which is still based on speed--preferably precocious speed. Although Put It Back hadn't won either of his juvenile starts, he is by Honour and Glory, a leading juvenile who developed into a very good sprinter-miler. Honour and Glory had quickly established his ability to sire quick-maturing stock, as his first crop included Caressing, the champion juvenile filly of 2000.



Incidentally, although Honour and Glory ultimately didn't do well enough to retain his membership on the Ashford stallion team, he is also responsible for such good sprinters as Battle Won and Keyed Entry. He is now plying his trade not far away from Ashford at Wintergreen Stallion Station, and will no doubt be shuttling to South America later in the year, having enjoyed considerable success in 2007 with his Argentine foals. At least four of them won at Group 1 level last year, suggesting that Honour and Glory is another who has benefited from attracting a comparatively higher grade of mare in the southern hemisphere than in the north.

Put It Back, who is also a member of his sire's distinguished first crop, has also made a fast start. His 2003 crop, which numbered only 34 named foals, contains not only In Summation but also Smokey Stover, another very successful sprinter who carries the Appleton/Bridlewood hallmark. There should be more to come from Put It Back, as his 2008 crop of two-year-olds is his biggest so far and he covered more than 100 mares in 2007.

It is hardly surprising that In Summation--now a winner of 10 of his 21 starts--is as fast as he is. His dam Fiesta Baby is by Dayjur, the champion English sprinter who would surely have won the Breeders' Cup Sprint on his debut on dirt, had he not jumped shadows in the closing stages. *Cont. p4*

Just how fast Dayjur was is reflected in his Timeform rating of 137, which was the highest by a margin of five pounds of all the horses rated in 1990. It was a similar story on the International Classifications, with Dayjur again being rated the year's best performer. His speed was no fluke, either, as his parents were Danzig and Gold Beauty, the latter a champion sprinter by Mr. Prospector.

Dayjur started his stallion career at a fee of \$50,000 and there seemed to be convincing evidence for thinking that he could develop into a worthy heir to his exceptional sire. There was one nagging doubt, though. Dayjur hadn't shown his exceptional ability until after he had undergone a Hobday wind operation at the end of his juvenile year.

Could that operation explain why Dayjur's 2008 fee stands at only \$5,000. He covered only 16 mares at the age of 20 last year and only 25 the previous year, so it is unlikely he is going to be able to turn his career around now. The bare facts are that he has sired only one Group 1 winner--the Middle Park S. winner Hayil--from a total of nearly 500 foals in his first 14 crops.

One interesting aspect of Dayjur's record is that his AEI stands at only 1.20, whereas the dams of his foals established a Comparative Index of 2.92 with the sires of their other progeny. That CI of 2.92 indicates that Dayjur has been mated to some highly qualified mares, especially in the early stages of his career, and the quality of these mares has stood him in good stead as a broodmare sire.

His older daughters have been doing well as broodmares. They have produced performers of the calibre of the Grade I winners Confidential Lady (Prix de Diane), Shadow Cast (Personal Ensign H.), Elusive City (Prix Morny) and In Summation (whose Grade I victory came in last year's Bing Crosby H.).

In Summation--a \$130,000 two-year-old at Ocala--is out of the Appleton-bred Fiesta Baby, a mare from Dayjur's second crop. Although she was only a minor winner at three, her dam Fiesta Gal proved herself one of the best fillies of her generation by winning both the Mother Goose S. and CCA Oaks. It cost Arthur Appleton \$1,500,000 to acquire Fiesta Gal as a five-year-old in 1989, so In Summation has every right to be as good as he is.


BOOKMAKER OFFERS ODDS ON FRESHMAN SIRES
