MIAMI-DADE VOTERS APPROVE SLOTS

Miami-Dade County voters on Tuesday approved slot-machine gaming for the Florida county's three pari-mutuel facilities, including Calder Race Course. The



vote came by an overwhelming margin, with 63 percent of voters in favor of the measure. A similar referendum went down to defeat in 2005, the same year adjacent Broward County voters approved slots for Gulfstream Park. "We are very pleased with the outcome of the election and greatly appreciate the overwhelming support that voters in Miami-Dade County have shown for Calder, Thoroughbred

racing in South Florida, and the thousands of workers who depend on the pari-mutuel industry for their livelihood," said Robert L. Evans, president and chief executive officer of Churchill Downs Inc., which owns Calder. "Yesterday's vote was an important step in keeping Calder on a level playing field with area casinos and with racetracks in Florida and other states that already offer slot-machine gaming." The vote will allow Calder, Flagler Dog Track and Miami Jai-Alai to install up to 2,000 slot machines each.



Curlin, with regular exercise rider Carmen Rosas aboard, and Pyro, with Curlin at the Breeders' Cun Dominic Terry up, went to the track at about 6:20 a.m. and worked together through frac-

tions of :24 3/5, :36 3/5, :49, and 1:00 4/5. They galloped out seven furlongs in 1:26 and a mile in 1:40 2/5. The first guarter was run into a strong headwind. Asmussen said he hasn't vet chosen a definitive spot for Curlin's return. Pyro, runner-up to War Pass in Eclipse voting for juvenile male, is on course for a sophomore debut in the \$300,000 GIII Risen Star S. at Fair Grounds Feb. 9. "The Risen Star, no doubt, will be tough," said Asmussen, who may also send out GIII Lecomte S. winner **Z Fortune** (Siphon {Brz}). "But," he added, tipping his cap to Pyro's morning effort, "Curlin won't be running in [the Risen Star]." Curlin and Pyro will both likely work again Tuesday.

Did You Know?

Since 1989, when Cryptoclearance won the race, there has been just one other Raise a Native-line horse to win Gulfstream's GI Donn H.: Formal Gold in 1997. Kiss the Kid (Lemon Drop Kid) is the lone representative in 2008.





THIS DATE IN HISTORY...

January 31, 1958...Jockey **Bill Shoemaker** notched his 3,000th career win aboard Eternal Pere in the eighth race at Santa Anita.

February 1, 1939...Gulfstream Park opened for its first season of racing. The opening attracted a crowd of 18,000 and a mutuel handle of \$224,287. After four days of racing, the owners ran out of money and the track was closed for four years.

February 1, 1941...Golden Gate Fields opened for its inaugural race meet. After five days, the track was forced to close because torrential rainstorms washed out the racing surface. The advent of World War II prevented the facility from reopening until September 9, 1947.



MARYLAND DELAYS STEROID BAN The Marvland Racing Commission, which had announced that it would become illegal to race on anabolic steroids in the state beginning Apr. 19, has delayed the steroid ban indefinitely. Acquiescing to protests made by horsemen and veterinarians, MRC Commission Chairman John Franzone announced that the ban would be shelved pending further study, and appointed a four-person task force to look into the issues. Horsemen have expressed their concerns regarding withdrawal time for steroids, as well as testing procedures and penalties. While it is now estimated that it will be at least Jan. 1, 2009, before steroid rules go into effect in Maryland, Pennsylvania is scheduled to implement a ban beginning Apr. 1, and Delaware is slated to follow suit when its 2008 meet opens Apr. 19.





New York Horseman William A. Levin Dead:

Textile manufacturer and former New York Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund Board Chairman William A. Levin, an owner and breeder of New York-breds whose 11-year span as Fund chairman lasted from July of 1994 to December of 2005, died on Saturday, Jan. 26--a day after his 84th birthday. Levin was active in virtually every sector of New York's breeding and racing industry, and was instrumental in standing his most famous racehorse, Bold Reason, at his Gold Mills Farm in Old Westbury, Long Island from 1980-1985. Bold Reason, by Hail to Reason, was the first stakes winner to race for Levin, who was president and chairman of the board of Gold Mills, Inc. The \$52,000 yearling emerged in the summer of 1971 with six consecutive victories (four on turf), including the Hollywood Derby, Aqueduct's Lexington H., Arlington Park's American Derby, and the Travers S. Bold Reason was co-highweighted in his division in the Daily Racing Form's Free Handicap along with Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner Canonero II, behind whom he had placed third in the Derby. Stakes winners bred by Levin included New York-breds Sir Ack, Sir Keys, Adlibber, Costly Reason, and Noble Flyer. Levin is survived by his wife, Corinne Knepper Levin; his daughter, Dr. Linda Levin Carmine; his son-in-law, Professor Michael Carmine; and his granddaughter, Gabrielle Carmine. Levin was predeceased by his son Louis R. Levin.



The connections of the three-year-old filly Rated Fiesty (Exchange Rate) are contesting her disqualification from first to third in Saturday's \$50,000 Dixie Belle S. at Oaklawn Park, Daily Racing Form reports. An assistant and authorized agent to the filly's trainer, Steve Asmussen, filed an appeal with the Arkansas Racing Commission on Sunday. Rated Fiesty began her career with three straight wins at two, including a romp facing males in the GIII Kentucky Breeders' Cup S. and in her own division in the GIII Debutante S. in early July. Sidelined for the summer and fall, Rated Fiesty was making her return in the Dixie Belle as the public's prohibitive 3-5 favorite. Under jockey Luis Quinonez, Rated Fiesty was sent to the lead and cut out the running. Turning for home, she drifted a little wide, at which point Chris Emigh tried to hustle Palanka City (Carson City) on through. As they straightened for home, Rated Fiesty began to drift back to the rail and Emigh took up on Palanka City (video). Rated Fiesty then held off Kadira (Kafwain) to hit the line 3/4 lengths in front, but Emigh lodged an objection and stewards also posted the inquiry sign. The stewards DQ'd Rated Fiesty to third, promoting Kadira to first place and Palanka City to second.

NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL

STIMULUS PACKAGE COULD AID HORSE INDUSTRY

The House-passed version of the "Recovery Rebates and Economic Stimulus for the American People Act of 2008" would temporarily increase the expensing allowance under Section 179 from \$125,000 to \$250,000. The ceiling for total purchases of qualifying property would also be raised from \$500,000 to \$800,000. The expensing allowance is used in lieu of taking depreciation.

In addition, the stimulus bill reauthorizes a bonus depreciation that was put into place after Sept. 11, 2001 but subsequently expired. The proposed bonus would be increased to 50 percent, up from the post-Sept. 11 level of 30 percent.

The expensing allowance changes and bonus depreciation would apply only to property placed into service in 2008.

The Senate continues to debate its version of the stimulus package, with leadership on both sides calling for a speedy conclusion to discussion and a minimum of extraneous amendments.
