#### **CURLIN TO DUBAI WORLD CUP**

Majority owner Jess Jackson put out a statement Sunday night announcing that Horse of the Year **Curlin** (Smart Strike) would make his 2008 debut in the

Mar. 29 GI Dubai World Cup. The four-year-old capped off his championship campaign with a win in the Oct. 27 GI Breeders' Cup Classic. "We feel the best thing to do for Curlin is to take him to Dubai and point him to the Dubai World Cup," Jackson commented. "We weighed the pros and cons of taking him overseas or kicking off 2008 in the States. As long as he's fit and healthy, it comes down to the fact that Curlin has earned the chance to

compete in the Dubai World Cup and has the opportunity to continue to make history as an international champion on Mar. 29. This horse's greatest moments and best efforts may still lie ahead." Jackson also restated his hopes that Curlin's four-year old campaign will provide a marketable star for the industry. "I deeply

care about improving the state of Thoroughbred racing, as well as the horse industry in general. We, as owners of Curlin, are trying to do our part to help. The time is well past to organize a Major League of Racing, like the NFL, and bring horse racing into the mainstream of sport to the benefit of all participants, including the backstretch, jockeys, trainers, owners, tracks, the athletes themselves and--most

importantly--the fans. We all share a vision of even greater things for horse racing. In 2007, we saw a super generation of three-year-olds and the racing season was one of the most exciting in recent memory. There is simply nothing that compares to horseracing. Not in excitement. Not in beauty. Not in history. But in order to preserve this pastime, we have to work together to ensure that future generations are able to enjoy this ancient and honorable sport. Go Curlin!"



#### LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON?

The CloverLeaf II homebred was a distant third in his stakes debut, the Oct. 13 In Reality S. at Calder, but rebounded to post an allowance score Nov. 17 and added a 3 1/2-length triumph in the Dec. 1 What A Pleasure S. Transferred to trainer Todd Pletcher after that performance, he makes his first start under new management in his sophomore bow.



VENGEANCE OF RAIN RETIRED Vengeance of Rain (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}--Danelagh {Aus}, by Danehill), who became the first Hong Kong-based horse to win a race on the Dubai World Cup card, has been retired from racing after suffering a heart defibrillation during Saturday's Centenary Vase at Sha Tin. The multiple champion captured last year's G1 Dubai Sheema Classic. It was the second time the eight-year-old gelding had suffered an irregular heart condition and, under Hong Kong rules, he would have to be sidelined for six months. "It's heartbreaking, but I guess in racing you have to roll with the punches," said trainer David Ferraris. "He has been training like a bomb, there was never any indication, so it's such a shock for this to happen. Without a doubt, he is the best horse I've ever trained." In 2005, Vengeance of Rain won the G1 Hong Kong Cup, G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup and Hong Kong Derby and was named champion stayer. He suffered his first heart irregularity two years ago, but returned in top form to be named champion stayer in 2006 and 2007. He was also named Horse of the Year in Hong Kong last season. On the board in 17 of 26 starts, Vengeance of Rain won 10 starts and earned \$8,557,899. The champion will be returned to his birthplace at Cambridge Stud in the Waikato for his retirement.

#### SUWANNEE RIVER RESULT UNDER REVIEW

Trainer Mark Hennig yesterday filed a formal protest into the result of Sunday's GIII Suwannee River H. at Gulfstream Park. The winner, Green Girl (Fr) (Lord of Men {GB}), tossed jockey Rene Douglas during the post parade of the race and was loose for eight minutes. She was finally corralled by the outriders and was allowed to compete, but Gulfstream Park's rules mirror those of The Jockey Club, which state that "the horse must carry its assigned weight from paddock to post and from post to finish." Hennig saddled La Dolce Vita (Quiet American) to a second-place finish in the Suwanee River. Jockey Eibar Coa, aboard third-place finisher J'ray (Distant View), and Edgar Prado, the rider of sixth-plave finisher Bel Air Beauty (Smart Strike), dismounted their horses during the lengthy delay caused by the loose horse and are also involved in the review. Gulfstream Park President Bill Murphy commented, "The integrity of this sport is of paramount importance to all of us at Gulfstream Park and this matter will certainly receive full and prompt attention." A decision on the matter is expected to be announced by Friday.



When it comes to Producer of the Week, nothing in the Thoroughbred world came close to matching Mrs. Olivia Manning's feat. Her son Eli followed in the footsteps of older brother Peyton by collecting the MVP award at the Super Bowl, and in the process Mrs. Manning became the first woman to have sons triumph in consecutive editions of the Super Bowl.

As an Englishman, I have no idea what the odds are against lightning striking twice in the NFL showpiece. However, I do know that broodmares occasionally defy seemingly enormous odds, good examples being Windmill Girl, whose sons Blakeney and Morston landed the Epsom Derby, and Better Than Honour, who produced consecutive Belmont S. winners in Jazil and Rags to Riches. WinStar Farm's mare Winter's Gone doesn't yet merit mentioning in the same breath as such as Windmill Girl and Better Than Honour, but she is developing into an outstanding producer and was represented by her second Grade I winner-- and third Grade I performer--when Spring at Last took the GI Donn H. three days ago.

You would never have expected Winter's Gone to scale such heights, judged solely on her racing career. The daughter of Dynaformer raced a total of six times at two and three for her breeder, Maycroft Farm, and was tried on dirt and turf, over a variety of distances. Nothing helped, though, and she failed to fulfil the potential of her excellent bloodlines, never finishing better than fourth. Her career earnings amounted to \$2,610. I don't know whether she was injured when she finished only 11th of 12 at Fair Grounds in the March of her sophomore season, but--whatever the reason--her owners decided not to persevere with her racing career. Instead she was mated to Coronado's Quest before being sent to Keeneland the following January. Some idea of the strength of her bloodlines can be gauged from the fact that the WinStar Farm partners were prepared to pay \$410,000 for her.

Winter's Gone has since confirmed that, in some instances, pedigree can be far more important than performance in a potential broodmare. Her third foal, the Dixieland Band mare Sharp Lisa, became a Grade I winner in the 2005 Las Virgenes S. and her fourth foal, a colt by Silver Deputy, is none other than Spring at Last. Her fifth is the Touch Gold filly Sharp Susan, who was beaten only ¾ lengths in the GI Garden City S., not long after taking last year's GII Lake Placid S. So Winter's Gone has produced three consecutive graded winners to three different stallions (two of them sons of Deputy Minister), which is a tremendous achievement (even if it doesn't match Mrs Manning's!).

Unfortunately she was barren in 2005 and slipped in 2006, but she got back into the swing of things a year ago, when she foaled a colt by Storm Cat. It took a sale-topping \$3.4 million for the BBA Ireland to acquire Sharp Lisa (a \$50,000 yearling) at Fasig-Tipton in 2006, so the Castleton Group must now be more than happy to have paid \$410,000 in 2005 for the dual winner Winter's Quest, Winter's Gone's eldest daughter.

Winter's Gone's appeal as a potential broodmare must have stemmed partly from her unusual pedigree, which features the top-class brothers His Majesty and Graustark. This means she is inbred 4x3 to their parents, the brilliant Ribot and the high-class racemare Flower Bowl. This inbreeding could be particularly relevant to her emergence as Dynaformer's most successful broodmare daughter, in view of the success that Roberto and his sons experienced with mares with Graustark or His Majesty blood.

Incidentally, Graustark and His Majesty also appear together in several of Danehill's good winners, including the champion sprinter Mozart. There is even an Australian Group 1 winner by Danehill called Keeper, who is inbred 3x3 to His Majesty. Interestingly, Keeper is beginning to shine as a stallion in New Zealand and his 2007 representatives included the Group 1 winners Insouciant (New Zealand 1000 Guineas) and Keepa Cruisin.

Winter's Gone's failure on the racecourse was in sharp contrast to the success enjoyed by several of her

half-brothers and -sisters, which include the top-class turf horse Bien Bien and the dual Grade III winner Dr. Schwartzman. Bien Bien possessed plenty of stamina, as he showed with his victories in the San Juan Capistrano H. and San Luis Rey S. This provides some encouragement for thinking that Spring at Last, now a mature five-year-old, will stay well enough to make his presence felt in the G1 Dubai World Cup over 11/4 miles. He has already shown, with his Group

2 win in the Godolphin Mile, that the travel and the Nad Al Sheba dirt course hold no fears for him.


As Spring at Last's first three dams are daughters of Dynaformer, Graustark and Princequillo, there is reason to think that Winter's Gone would have stayed at least 1½ miles, given the chance. This is good news, as a degree of stamina in the mare is probably necessary for Silver Deputy to get horses which stay 1½ miles.

Silver Deputy's outstanding daughter Silverbulletday, who landed the GI Alabama S. over 1½ miles, is out of a grand-daughter of Ribot. The very talented Badge of Silver, like Spring at Last, is out of a grand-daughter of Roberto and he thrived over 1 1/8 miles. Silver Deputy also sired Archers Bay, winner of two legs of the Canadian Triple Crown, from a mare by the stamina-packed Val de l'Orne, so he can get the occasional 10-furlong horse. Maybe Spring at Last will prove to be another.

DATES SET FOR DERBY/OAKS FUTURES Churchill Downs has established the dates for the three wagering pools that will comprise the track's 2008 renewals of its Kentucky Derby and Kentucky Oaks Future Wager. Pool 1 will kick off this Thursday, Feb. 7, and run through Sunday, Feb. 10. Pool 2 runs Thursday, Mar. 6, through Sunday, Mar. 9, while the third and final pool runs Thursday, Apr. 3 through Sunday, Apr. 6. All pools open at noon. The Kentucky Derby Future Wager pools will close at 6 p.m. and the Kentucky Oaks Pools will close a half-hour later at 6:30 p.m. The Kentucky Derby and Kentucky Oaks Future Wagers are minimum \$2 wagers and are win bets only. James Tafel's Street Sense, winner of last year's GI Kentucky Derby, was the betting favorite on Derby Day, although he had not been favored in any of the three Kentucky Derby Future Wager pools. The mutuel field, or all others, was favored in Pools 1 and 2, while Curlin, the then-unbeaten winner of the GII Arkansas Derby and the eventual third-place finisher in the Kentucky Derby, was the favorite in the third and final pool.

#### Catalano Eyes Options for Dreaming of Anna:

Trainer Wayne Catalano, who sent out 2006 champion juvenile filly **Dreaming of Anna** (Rahy) to a fourfurlong workout Sunday, is contemplating which spot would best suit the four-year-old in her seasonal debut. Catalano said the 1 3/8-mile distance of the GIII The Very One S. at Gulfstream Mar. 8 would be too far, but added that, depending on where she did make her return, the GIII Orchid H. going 1 1/2 miles at Gulfstream Mar. 30 could be the filly's second outing of the season. Working in Hallandale, Frank Calabrese's homebred breezed a half-mile around the 'dogs' on the sod in :53 flat, the fourth fastest of six at the distance. "It was fine and she got a little tired out there," Catalano said of the move. "She needs another workout and then we'll start to see what's out there."

#### Unknown Quantity Tomcito Works at Palm Meadows:

Tomcito (Street Cry {Ire}), the Peruvian phenom who captured two legs of that country's Quadruple Crown while still a two-year-old, worked yesterday at Palm Meadows. The sophomore breezed four furlongs in :50 3/5, the 10th-fastest of 13 at the distance. He has one other listed breeze, going three furlongs at Palm Meadows in :36 2/5 Jan. 27. Purchased by trainer and bloodstock agent Dante Zanelli, Jr. for just \$7,500 at Keeneland September in 2006, Tomcito won four of five starts in Peru last year. Trained by Zanelli's uncle, Juan Suarez, Tomcito was a closing second in the G1 Clasico Polla de Potrillos in September, then romped in the G1 Clasico Ricardo Ortiz de Zevallos Oct. 20. In his seasonal finale, he took the 1 1/2-mile Clasico Derby Nacional in November, and was subsequently shipped to the U.S. Zanelli is overseeing the colt's training in Florida. Tomcito is reportedly being pointed toward the GI Florida Derby or G2 UAE Derby on the Dubai World Cup undercard. Both races are on Mar. 29.


