#### PYROTECHNICS LIKELY IN THE RISEN STAR

The Triple Crown trail is just getting underway, but

today's GIII Risen Star S. at Fair Grounds can produce some early fireworks. Pyro (Pulpit) had the misfortune of hooking two-year-old champ War Pass in three straight outings following a game Churchill maiden win at first asking in July. The handsome dark bay finished Pyro working at Fair Grounds a troubled third behind the Robert LaPenta colorbearer

in a \$75,000 optional claimer at Saratoga Aug. 26, then placed a good second at 32-1 in the GI Champagne S. Oct. 6. Pyro closed out his juvenile campaign with a second-place finish over the sloppy going at Monmouth Park in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Oct. 27. The Winchell homebred has been training smartly in the Big Easy with stablemate and Horse of the Year Curlin. His Beyer Speed Figures of 78 and 80 don't exactly jump off the page, but Signature Move (Vindication)'s last two victories in Southern California are worth a second look. After racing a bit headstrong in the early stages, the \$625,000 KEESEP yearling purchase powered clear to post a 1 1/4-length maiden win at Hollywood last December (Video). Facing only three rivals in his first attempt against allowance foes, Signature Move coasted home to an effortless 2 1/4-length decision at Santa Anita Jan. 4 (Video). "He shipped over good and he's training really well," trainer Eric Guillot said by phone yesterday. "He just finished schooling in the paddock 10 minutes ago and he looked great. I wanted to give him some shipping experience, a dirt track and a test of class and [today] we'll find all of those answers out. If you want to be a Derby horse, you need to get tested. This horse is a legitimate horse. He ran his last sixteenth with a ton of horse left last time. He could have run a mile and a quarter that day." Cont. p2





#### NO EXCUSES FOR DAAHER; STABLEMATE

FOY BOUND Daaher (Awesome Again) has exited his disappointing seventh-place finish as the 4-5 favorite in last Saturday's GI Donn H. without injury, according to trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "We're still scratching our heads and throwing the whole thing out," McLaughlin said of the GI Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile winner's effort in the Donn. Daaher can earn a spot in the starting gate for the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 29 if he rebounds in his next start. "We'll nominate to everything, including the 1 3/16-miles race here," McLaughlin said of the GII Gulfstream Park H. Mar. 1. The Mar. 8 GII New Orleans H. at Fair Grounds and the GIII Razorback H. at Oaklawn Park are other possible targets for Daaher's next start. Edgewood Farm's Make the Point (Menifee), an impressive seven-furlong allowance winner in his sophomore bow at Gulfstream Jan. 24, will make his next start in the GII Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 24. The bay fired a four-furlong bullet in :48 4/5 at Palm Meadows Feb. 5. "He worked [Tuesday] really nice," McLaughlin offered. "He'll get another two works--probably on the 11th and 18th--and be ready to go."

#### SEACHANGE LOOKS TO SECURE DUBAI BID

New Zealand standout **Seachange (NZ)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) will be favored in today's NZ\$200,000 G1 Waikato Draught Sprint at Te Rapa, a race which will confirm whether the mare heads to Dubai for the \$5-million G1 Dubai Duty Free Mar. 29. "If she goes to Dubai, she has to get there in the right condition," owner/breeder Karreman Bloodstock's Racing Manager. Rick Williams, told The Dominion Post. "If she doesn't win this weekend, there would be no point in going. But logic tells you she wins, and wins well. There's no such thing as a given, but you wouldn't be betting against her on Saturday." He added, "She's so well and is racing at weight-for-age over what is probably her best distance [1400 meters]." Seachange is coming off a score in the G1 Telegraph H. Jan. 19. If all goes to plan today, the brown mare will likely depart New Zealand next Monday, and will be given a prep at Nad Al Sheba in the G2 Jebel Hatta Mar. 6. "There are no other suitable races in New Zealand, and Australia is not an option," Williams continued. "By going over earlier, she can have a run over the same track and distance as the Duty Free, and if there are any hiccups, it gives us time to work around them. She will have to carry 60kg in the Jebel Hatta, but that is on a 55kg minimum, and she will drop back to weight-for-age in the big race." Seachange could head further afield if the Dubai venture goes well. "We will consider giving her two or three races in England, but she would need to win, or go close, in Dubai first," Williams added. "The stake is one of the main attractions of Dubai--it's a chance to get a huge payday, while going to England gives her a chance to internationalise her pedigree."



Worked his way down to a good figure late in his three-year-old season, but it took a lot out of him, and he didn't get back to that level for 15 months, when he won a local stake last time out. This horse has a history of bouncing following big efforts (unusual for a grass stakes horse), and even his best would only make him a marginal contender here.

#### 2 Silverfoot With Approval Leparoux 12-1

Was a top grass horse three years ago, not nearly as good the next year, and resurfaced recently after a long layoff at the age of eight with a mediocre effort. It's tough to play a horse to do something he hasn't done in three years.



3 Warn War Chant Campbell 20-1
Has never run fast enough to threaten here.

#### 4 Sterwins Runaway Groom Husbands 6-7

Has been the rare horse that can run stakes-level figures on both dirt and grass. In his first local appearance he won despite a very wide trip (4w4w, upper left), earning a big figure, before bouncing in a paceless race. He's about 50/50 to return to his top now, which at the weights and with a good draw makes him a strong contender.

#### 5 Better Talk Now Talkin Man Dominguez 3-1

Really wasn't much different at eight than he was at six and seven, except that he ran his best race less often. Now nine, he faces some serious obstacles herehe's spotting serious weight (five pounds is worth a point in the Thoro-Graph scales), and shipping into Fair Grounds from the north, which almost no one does successfully. He's not likely to run his best, and even if he does it only makes him a marginal contender.

#### 6 Baby First (Fr) Enrique (GB) M Baze 15-1

Was a decent three-year-old in France, and is another that returned recently following a very long layoff. He would need a significant jump forward to contend here, and normally second-off-a-layoff might be the time for that, but look how poorly the barn does in that category (see trainer profile).

## 7 Jazz Quest Jambalaya Jazz Velazquez 6-1 Ran 11 times last year, and every one was a paired top or a new one. Amoss added blinkers last time and got the best effort of this colt's life, and given his history and six weeks' rest, it's likely he'll pair up once again, which at the weights makes him a borderline contender.

#### 8 Daytona (Ire) Indian Ridge (Ire) Smith 7-2

Developed quite a bit last year, and will be heavily bet here due to three straight graded-stakes wins in California. But the Thoro-Graph figures he earned in those races were just okay, and the advantage he will gain by saving ground on the lead here will be offset by the weight he spots his main rivals. A contender, but an underlay.

#### 9 Save Big Money Storm Cat Albarado 10-1

Ran some good figures last year, but has not gotten back to them in three turf tries. He would need a significant forward move, and the post doesn't help.


#### 10 Inca King Sir Cat Bridgmohan 9-2

Improved dramatically for Asmussen last fall, throwing two big figures in Kentucky. His local debut was not as good, but it came shortly after shipping north/south, and the way the barn is going, we expect a sharply improved effort this time. This colt has good tactical speed in a field lacking of same, and Bridgmohan is riding like a man possessed, so with a long run to the turn, we're not too concerned about the post. Very strong contender.

<u>Bottom Line</u>: Sterwins and Inca King are the two most likely winners, and Jazz Quest can be used at a price in the exotics.





#### Arlington Announces Stakes Schedule:

Following approval by the Illinois Racing Board, Arlington Park has announced a stakes schedule of 27 (14 graded) races worth \$5.575 million. The International Festival of Racing, featuring the \$1-million GI Arlington Million, \$750,000 GI Beverly D. S. and \$400,000 GI Secretariat S., will be held Aug. 9. The track has also inaugurated the \$200,000 American 1000 Guineas, a one-mile race on grass for three-yearold fillies to be run May 24. The race's winner will automatically qualify for the GI American Oaks at Hollywood, typically contested in July. "In every major racing jurisdiction around the world, the 1000 Guineas is the first classic race of the year for three-year-old fillies," explained Arlington Park Vice President of Racing and Racing Secretary Kevin Greely. "America has its Derbies and Oaks, but this will mark the first time a 1000 Guineas race will be run in North America." The \$200,000 Arlington Sprint has been switched to the turf this year in order to serve as a prep for this year's new Breeders' Cup event, the \$1-million Turf Sprint Oct. 24 at Santa Anita. For 2008, the track has elected to shelve a pair of long-standing events, the GII Washington Park H. and Round Table S. "We will assess the strength of these longtime Arlington fixtures to determine when they need to be run to maximize both the local and national stakes programs," Greely stated.

#### Kentucky Breeders' Awards Announced:

Senator Damon Thayer, the legislative author of the Kentucky Breeders' Incentive program, announced the Award amounts for the 2007 Kentucky Breeders' Incentive Fund yesterday. The 2007 KBIF Awards, which total \$19,220,007, are 100 percent funded from a sixpercent sales tax on stud fees in Kentucky. The Awards totaled \$15 million in 2006. "These are positive steps to help Kentucky's horse industry," Thayer said. "It is gratifying to see the Fund grow over 20 percent from 2006 to 2007, a sure sign that the Fund is accomplishing its goal of attracting more horses to Kentucky's farms. This will create more equine commerce and a more robust economy." Eighty percent of the Awards are allotted to Thoroughbreds.
