# DAWN AFTER DAWN VICTORIOUS IN CANADA

Dawn After Dawn (Successful Appeal) was sent to trainer John Sadler to take advantage of California's synthetic surfaces, and the move paid dividends yesterday when the four-year-old filly skipped to a one-length victory in the GII La Canada S. at Santa Anita. The even-money choice was loose on the lead through pedestrian fractions of :25.28, :50.56, 1:15.08 and 1:38.36, and confidently held off Say You Will (Ire) (A.P. Indy) to the wire. "They thought her best race last year was in the [GI] Ashland when she was a good third on Polytrack at Keeneland, so [owner] Mr. [lke] Thrash called me up from Mississippi last summer and said, 'We'd like to send this filly out for a campaign in California,'" Sadler explained. "It was a nice call. I was delighted, because she already had good form when she got here, and she's been what we were hoping she'd be. She fit the program in the sense that we have a four-year-old filly series here, she was three turning four, and she had already shown herself well at Keeneland." After her third-place effort in the Ashland, Dawn After Dawn was fourth behind Rags to Riches in the GI Kentucky Oaks. Off the board in a pair of graded stakes after that race, the bay filly was given a fourmonth freshening and returned with an optional-claiming victory Nov. 30 in her first start for Sadler. She pulled Garrett Gomez to the lead as her saddle slipped in her last start, the Jan. 13 GII El Encino S., before tiring to fourth. Cont. p2

As for what is next for Georgie Boy, Kathy Wash sited the Mar. 15 GII Rebel S. at Oaklawn as a possibility before adding, "We'll kind of play it by ear. We'll get him out of this race and make sure he's in good shape and it didn't take too much out of him."

Into Mischief, making his first start since winning the Dec. 22 GI CashCall Futurity, held on for second. "It was a good start back," trainer Richard Mandella said of the runner-up. "Kathy Walsh's horse ran fabulous, but mine ran real good. I thought he might be eligible to get a little tired. We'll probably look at the [Mar. 15] GII San Felipe in a month."

Of the third-place effort of Massive Drama, jockey Garrett Gomez said, "I was a little disappointed. We set decent enough fractions. After a half a mile, we quickened. But by the time I got to the top of the stretch, he was already emptied out on me. But he's a talented little horse, and he'll find something. I don't think he's a mile-and-a-guarter horse, but he's definitely a nice little sprinter."

The three-year-old colt was entered in Friday's eighth race at Fair Grounds, a six-furlong allowance contest, with Asmussen listed as trainer. Also among the four horses Baffert trains for Zayat is Maimonides (Vindication), a \$4.6-million yearling who was an 11 1/2-length debut winner at Saratoga last August, but has not been out since running third in the GI Hopeful S.

# ISN'T THAT SUMPHIN! PRADO JOINS 6,000

**CLUB** "A classic moment in the career of a classy guy!" So said track announcer Larry Collmus as jockey Edgar Prado booted home his 6,000th winner at Gulfstream Park Sunday afternoon. The 40-year-old



rider sent Sumphin, trained by Tom Albertrani, right to the front in the sixth race at Gulfstream, and the four-year-old gelding drew clear in the stretch to give Prado his milestone score. The rider picked up his first victory in his native Peru 25 years ago and A Coglianese went right to the top in that country, then moved his tack to

the U.S. in 1986. He started out in Florida before heading north to Maryland, where he dominated the standings, and he led the nation in races won for three straight years, 1997-99. Joining the New York colony in 1999, Prado took his first Big Apple title at Belmont Park in the fall of 2000, and he led all riders in New York in 2005. He was honored with an Eclipse Award and an ESPY in 2006 after guiding Barbaro to victory in the GI Kentucky Derby.

# PYRO LIKELY FOR LOUISIANA DERBY Pyro

(Pulpit) came out of his eye-catching victory in Saturday's GIII Risen Star S. in good order and will now likely point for the Mar. 8 GII Louisiana Derby. 

## **CUVEE FILLY SHINES AT SECOND OBS SHOW**

A filly from the first crop of Grade I winner Cuvee (Carson City) flashed her speed during yesterday's breeze show at the OBS Training Center, the second and final preview before tomorrow's OBS Selected Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training. The bay filly blitzed an eighth of a mile in :09 4/5, which was two ticks faster than any other horse who worked the distance Sunday and was quicker than any juvenile worker at the initial breeze show Feb. 3. The filly, hip 61, improved considerably off her initial work of :10 3/5. Consigned by McKathan Farms, agent, the filly is the third foal of the winning Awesome Again mare Miss Awesome. A total of 172 horses have been cataloged for OBS February, though with the scratch of 40-some horses, the sale has been whittled down to around 130 head.

Three horses shared the bullet for a quarter mile yesterday. They included hip 60, a Songandaprayer colt who tore through the distance in :20 4/5. An early Feb. 4 foal, the \$100,000 OBSOCT yearling breezed a furlong in :10 1/5 at the first breeze show Feb. 3. He is offered by Eisaman Equine, agent.

A filly representing the first crop by Grade II winner During (Cherokee Run) equaled that time. Hip 95, hailing from the draft of Shadybrook Farm Inc. (Michael Yates), agent, was produced by a half to a pair of stakes winners and worked an eighth in :10 1/5 Feb. 3.

The third horse to stop the clock in :20 4/5 was hip 135, a colt by freshman sire Alke (Grand Slam). The dark bay shared the bullet during the first breeze show, too, when he went an eighth in :10 flat, and returned yesterday with another sharp move. Hip 135 is registered Florida-bred.

# On the Fast (and Safe) Track...

On Sunday, Feb. 3, the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company kicked off a new chapter in its history. OBS conducted its first breeze show since installing Safetrack, a synthetic racing surface, on the company's one-mile track. OBS became the second major sales company, following Keeneland in April of 2007, to hold a breeze show over a synthetic surface, and the new track earned rave reviews from nearly all quarters.

"If we could've written the script six months ago, it came pretty close as to how we would've liked it to turn out," said OBS Director of Sales Tom Ventura.

One of the initial concerns for both horsemen and OBS officials alike was how the new surface would play in terms of speed, as synthetic surfaces around the country have varied wildly, from ploddingly slow to blisteringly fast.

"When we announced we were putting in Safetrack, the immediate reaction was positive," explained Ventura. "But when the horsemen pick up the papers and read that the fastest three-quarters of a mile at Del Mar is 1:11 4/5, there are concerns the track is going to be too slow. Then when they were running 1:06 and change at other places, there were concerns the track was going to be too quick."


When all was said and done, it appeared that the track was a tick or two faster than previous years, and more horses worked well over it. For example, 95.7 percent of horses who worked an eighth at the first breeze show completed the time in :10 4/5 or better. In 2007, that number was 80.5 percent. Cont. p3

### First Breeze Show 1/8-mile Workouts '07-'08







Looked at another way, a week ago, a total of 44.8 percent of the horses who worked an eighth did so in :10 or :10 1/5, the two fastest times. Those were also the two fastest times at the first 2007 show. Only one horse managed to go in :10 flat, while 13 went in :10 1/5, meaning that only 11.2 percent shared the top two times.

"I think it helps the slower horses more than the faster horses," consignor Don Graham offered of the new surface. "They move up more on a track like this."

Whether that tighter grouping at the top will make it harder for buyers to single out the best horses remains to be seen, though most agree with the adage, 'It's not how fast they go, it's how they go fast.'

Regardless of times, Ventura said he was pleased that consignors were dealing with very similar track conditions throughout the show, regardless of which set their horses were in.

"One of the reasons we put in this track is that we

hoped it would be consistent from the beginning of the day to the end, and it certainly played out that way," he said. "Admittedly, we didn't have to deal with any weather, other than the fog in the morning--we had to delay the show about an hour and a half because it was too foggy--but of all the :10 flats, there were five in the first group of horses, five in the second group, and four in the third group, so that's a pretty good indication of how consistent it was from beginning to end."

Most importantly, said Ventura and others, is that horses emerged from the works in fine fettle.

"The day after, from going from barn to barn and talking to the consignors, [you saw that] the horses did real well on the track and came back in great shape," Ventura said.

Straightaway Farm's Carl Bowling was effusive in his praise of the Safetrack surface--and synthetic tracks in general.

"Let me tell you, I've never galloped on a better track in my life, and I've trained for 37 years," Bowling said of Safetrack. "If you breezed a horse and he could go :10, he went :10. It was completely uniform. And it's almost unusual, after a fast breeze show, that you don't hear of 20, 30 horses coming back with [bucked] shins. I haven't had one person--not one person--say that had shins."

Bowling, who is a director at OBS, said that he envisioned two-year-olds in training staying sounder because of synthetic tracks like Safetrack.

"There are some people, in my opinion, training horses who don't really know how," Bowling said. "They can use, misuse and abuse horses. I think for a green trainer, if I was learning, knowing what I know about this track, I would head for it and rent stalls. I think it's going to save horses. We even had horses at Straightaway that we were training on a really great mile racetrack near here, and even the little windpuffs we had on a few of them were gone in three or four days, and we were galloping every day with them. I think it's the best money that sales company ever spent; the horses are coming back great, and everybody I've talked to say the same things. A lot of those problems--windpuffs, hot ankles--are getting better rather than worse. It's got to be good for the horses, and if it's good for them, it's good for me."

Eddie Woods, perennially a leading consignor, offered a positive assessment of the track, as well.

"I think the first breeze show was a very fair reflection on what the Safetrack can give you," said the Irishman. "It's the same for everyone; it's so consistent, from nine in the morning to three o'clock in the afternoon. My horses came back really well--I'm delighted with it."

Top horsewoman Murray Smith has been shipping in her youngsters to work over the track twice a week since November, shortly after construction was completed, because of her fondness for the surface.

"It's a very consistent surface--there are no dips, no unevenness," she said. "You could work a horse at 10 in the morning or one in the afternoon, and it's all the same. We have an immense amount of rainfall here at different times of the year, and with conventional tracks, when that happens, you can't train on it or you're limited to jogging. On a track like this, it is really truly all-weather. As soon as it quits raining, you can go right out and train on it."

And while Don Graham was hesitant to throw his full support behind the new track, he said the initial signs were good.

"So far, I like it," the pinhooker said. "They gallop out and move over it pretty well. I'm kind of from the old school, and think the jury's still out [on synthetics], but if it's a safer track, that's the main thing. So far, so good."

### From England to Florida...

All the praise, of course, is good news for David Andrews, one of the principals of Andrews Bowen Ltd., the company that manufactures Safetrack.

"We've had a great response for it, and so long as the trainers, owners and consignors are happy with it, we're happy," said Andrews.

Andrews and his partner, Simon Bowen, originally worked for another company which produced synthetic surfaces, but decided to strike out on their own several years ago.

Originally based in England but with an eye across the pond, Andrews Bowen scored its first major project in North America installing a Safetrack surface over the training track at Paul Bulmahn's GoldMark Farm in Ocala. That project has helped give the young company exposure among local horsemen, many of whom were impressed by Safetrack's ability to handle the Ocala weather, which can run from extreme heat to torrential downpours, often in the course of the same afternoon.

When officials decided to put down a synthetic surface at the OBS training track, they bypassed some of the more widely known products in favor of one which they felt had proven effective in the local environment.

"Each of these surfaces is just a little bit different," explained Ventura. "One of the reasons we chose [Safetrack] is that it's been tested here at GoldMark. And we've been talking with the Safetrack people for three or four years. Let's put it this way: it came as advertised."

Andrews Bowen even decided to open up a branch office in Ocala. The office is located right on the OBS sales grounds.

"One of the things that attracted us to the Ocala area is that it's a very knowledgeable area," said Andrews. "There are a lot of horsemen with very high standards."

Ventura said it was important for OBS that Andrews Bowen was committed enough to open a local office, and added that both companies are working together to make sure that any problems that may arise are dealt with quickly.

"They're going to be holding our hands throughout the spring; we have an ongoing commitment from them to make sure the track is maintained to where it's at now," said Ventura. "They're trying to make a go of it here and expanding their operations, so it's important for them, too. It's a high-profile job, so the better it is from us, the better it is for them."
