A SILVER START TO OBS FEBRUARY

The 2008 edition of the OBS February Selected Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training got out of the blocks in fine order as hip 1, a Silver Deputy filly from the draft of Eisaman Equine, elicited a bid of sales-topping

\$520,000 from bloodstock agent Buzz Chace. Chace was bidding on behalf of Terry Finley's West Point Thoroughbreds and the Atlanta, Georgia-based John Williams, who are partnering on the filly. Chace outlasted a stubborn foe on the far side of the sales pavilion to land the racy-looking dark bay, who was produced by

the 10-year-old Ghazi mare Daisy Dukes. "She had a long stride and just moved beautifully over the racetrack," explained Chace. "She was a nice, good-sized filly with a good attitude. I thought we'd probably get her for a little bit less." Hip 1 shared the bullet with several other horses after breezing a furlong in :10 flat at the first breeze show (video). For consignors Barry and Shari Eisaman, the transaction represent the second big sale horse produced by their mare Daisy Dukes, who would be in somebody else's barn if it weren't for a fortuitous turn of events. The Eisamans purchased Daisy Dukes as a youngster and brought her to the OBS April, where she was knocked down to Kenneth and Sarah Ramsey for \$45,000. "The folks that bought her were concerned about something, and we accepted her return," explained Barry Eisman. "That was the end of the two-year-old season, so we decided to race her, which is rare for us. We race very few horses." Cont. p2

A Shrewd Buy...Back...

Daisy Dukes turned out to be a very useful racehorse. She won four of 14 starts, made \$100,918 and won a minor stakes at The Meadowlands in 2000. But her real forte turned out to be as a broodmare.

The Eisamans sent her to young sire Songandaprayer in her first season in the shed, and she produced the colt Surplus Singer, who was purchased by Japanese interests for \$485,000 at the 2006 OBS March Sale.

Surplus Singer is now a stakes winner in Japan of over \$700,000.

Daisy Dukes produced an unraced Carson City colt in 2005 who did not sell. Hip 1 was Daisy Dukes' third foal.

"Silver Deputy is a longtime favorite of ours," Eisaman explained of their decision to go to the Deputy Minister stallion. "He's got a reasonable stud fee

and can get a really good horse. She's typical of the good Silver Deputys. She resembles her sire quite a lot-she's got a good body."

Daisy Dukes is currently carrying another foal by Songandaprayer.

"I think she's due to foal in March or perhaps April," said Eisman, who added that Daisy Dukes was booked back to Malibu Moon. Both of those foals will eventually be sold as juveniles, said Eisman.

"We sell everything we have at the two-year-old sales," he said. "Years ago, we sold some yearlings, but some buyers perceived them as simply the ones we didn't want to keep, so we stopped doing that."

Friends in High Places...

Leprechaun Racing's Mike and Britt Mulligan won't need to slip on down to the oasis to chase the blues away, not after a selling a strapping Friends Lake colt



to Padua Stables for \$450,000 yesterday. Leprechaun also sold a Lion Heart filly for \$475,000 (see p5).

The Friends Lake colt, a heavily muscled chestnut selling as hip 33, put buyers on notice with a co-bullet :10 flat breeze at the first under tack show (video), and

became one of the talking horse in the days leading up the sale as buyers made repeated sojourns to Leprechaun's barn.

Bidding on the colt boiled down to a scrum between representative of Satish Sanan's Padua Stables and Buzz Chace, sitting alongside Kiaran McLaughlin and West Point's Terry Finley.

"This was one of the top horses of the sale, and we really wanted to buy him," Sanan offered shortly after launching the winning salvo. "He is by a freshman sire and he's a nice-moving horse. We liked everything about him."

Hip 33 first went through the ring as a weanling in 2006, selling to DKW Racing for \$195,000. He returned to last year's Keeneland September Sale and was knocked down to Mike Mulligan for \$140,000.

Sanan, joined by son Sasha and daughter Nadia, admitted that he had to pay less for the colt than expected. "We were going to buy him," he said. "But I thought we'd have to go to \$500,000 at the bottom end." Sanan added that he was impressed with the February line-up OBS had assembled. "There are some of the best horses that have every been here, according to my team," he said.

The colt isn't the only new addition to Team Padua. About four weeks ago, Nadia Sanan-Briggs and her husband Robert 'Bo' Briggs had a baby boy. "His name is Cullen Connner," said the proud new grandfather. The little guy was born Jan. 9 and checked in at eight pounds, four ounces.

Parrish and his father George do just about everything that makes their 50-acre operation run. They shoe their horses. They do all their own shipping. G.W. breezes youngsters in the mornings.

"Heck, I even body clipped the horses for this sale," said G.W. Parrish. Yesterday, their hard

work and perseverance was rewarded when a striking colt from the first crop of champion Speightstownwas purchased by Dublin-based bloodstock agent John McCormack for \$475,000, the top price for a colt and the second-highest price on the afternoon.

An hour before the horse went through the ring as hip 128, both Parrishes looked on proudly as buyers went through their last-minute inspections.

"This horse is as good as I've ever had," said G.W. Parrish. "He's jumped through all the hoops and done everything he's supposed to do. All he needs now is a good name and a good trainer, and point him toward the big races."

A Town in England...


When a trainer is picked to train the Speightstown colt, that conditioner will likely be based in England, according to McCormick.

"He's been bought for an established client in the Middle East, and he's likely to go to England," McCormack explained. "I think this sire's got a real chance. I think he could be influential not just for dirt, but for turf as well. He's getting great-looking colts. This horse, actually, is a little bit of an Unbridled type-he's out of an Unbridled mare. He's tall and leggy and scopey, and has lovely action; he really pointed his toe. We'll be fairly patient with him, and with any luck next year will be his year."

Given the colt's work--and eye-catching quarter-mile breeze in :21 3/5 at the Feb. 3. show (<u>video</u>)--and the pre-sale activity he generated--the final price tag was no surprise.

"He had eight scopes and was out of the barn a lot," said G.W. Parrish, who echoed McCormack's opinion that, despite being by a champion sprinter, his former pupil figures to relish a route of ground.

"He's a big, two turn, long-striding horse," he said. "He'll be a Classic-distance runner."

Bred by the Alan S. Kline Revocable Trust in Maryland, hip 128 was produced by the 12-year-old stakeswinning Unbridled mare Unbridled Lady, an earner of just under \$200,000. Parrish Farms acquired the Speightstown colt, a \$145,000 RNA at last year's Keeneland September Sale, in a private transaction.

The Parrishes originally got into the horse business with Quarter Horses. "We started with the Quarters, racing down at Pompano," said G.W. Parrish. "We switched to Thoroughbreds in 1974 and were at the racetrack for years, so we starting buying at selling babies."

Parrish Farms bought 19 yearlings to pinhook this year, up from 15 in 2007 and 10 the year before. Last year, the operation sold Jockey Ridge (Broken Vow) to Alan Cook for \$110,000 at the FTMMAY sale.

Padua Back in a Big Way...

Over the last few years, the Sanan family's Padua Stables, a major player on the scene in the late 1990s and early in this decade, was relatively quiet on the commercial front. But last fall, Padua jumped back in at the yearling and bloodstock sales in a big way, and yesterday showed that it planned to continue the trend at the two-year-old in training sales, as well.

Padua was easily the leading buyer at OBS February, with a healthy 10 purchases for a total of \$2.38 million. Padua secured a Friends Lake colt for \$450,000, the sale's second-highest priced colt, and landed hip 130, a daughter of Montbrook, for \$425,000.

"She's such a beautiful mover," Padua's General Manager Nadia Sanan-Briggs said of the filly. "She's the definition of athleticism. She has such efficiency to her motion. You couldn't help but fall in love with her. And Montbrook can throw some amazing horses, stakes winners and graded-stakes winners."

A full-sister to GSW Beacon Shine and produced by a sister to GISW Outofthebox, also by Montbrook, the filly was consigned by J. Michael O'Farrell Jr.'s Ocala Stud. Ocala Stud bred and raised the handsome dark bay, and also bred and raised Beacon Shine, who sold at this sale in 2005 for \$200,000.

"Beacon Shine was a good horse; she's better," said O'Farrell.

Among Padua's other purchases were $\frac{\text{hip }76}{73}$, a Fusaichi Pegasus colt for \$360,000; $\frac{\text{hip }73}{73}$, a Read the Footnotes colt for \$150,000; $\frac{\text{hip }74}{74}$, a Repent colt for \$200,000; $\frac{\text{hip }90}{74}$, a Montbrook colt for \$140,000; $\frac{\text{hip }94}{73}$, an Aptitude filly for \$110,000; $\frac{\text{hip }111}{73}$, a Tale of the Cat colt for \$100,000; $\frac{\text{hip }114}{73}$, a Harlan's Holiday colt for \$210,000; and $\frac{\text{hip }158}{73}$, another Harlan's Holiday colt for \$235,000.

OBS officials were clearly pleased to see the Padua name so many times on the sales sheets.

"They obviously haven't been buying many two-yearolds lately, and having them jump back in was huge," said OBS's Tom Ventura. "[Padua Horse Operations Manager] Bruce Hill commented on how much he liked the horses in the sale, and obviously they were very aggressive."

It also ended a successful day for Mike and Britt Mulligan's Leprechaun Racing, which consigned the Lion Heart filly as hip 170. Leprechaun also sold the Friends Lake colt who brought \$450,000. Originally a \$77,000 KEENOV weanling, the

filly was knocked down to Leprechaun for \$85,000 at the OBS August Sale. She matured the right way on the farm, and at the Feb. 3 breeze show stood out with a :10 flat breeze that was co-fastest of the day.

She is from the first crop of Grade I winner Lion Heart (Tale of the Cat), who stands at Coolmore's Ashford Stud in Kentucky.

"She sold very well," said Mike Mulligan, who admitted that he was hoping for a bit more for his top-end horses, especially the Friends Lake colt.


"I thought the colt had a shot of bringing a little more money that he did, but we're real happy with the price," Mulligan said. "He seemed to be a buzz horse before the sale, and I think some people were surprised that he brought what he did. I thought he'd bring between \$400,00 and \$800,000, realistically, and that the filly would bring between \$300,000 and \$600,000. But we're not going to put huge reserves on our horses; we're going to let the market decide what they're worth. In the end, we're very happy with the prices. We congratulate everybody who bought our horses today, and we appreciate it."

A Few Requests for Steroid Testing...

In December, OBS announced that it would become the first major auction house to ban the use of exogenous anabolic steroids at its two-year-olds in training sales. Under the new rule, buyers can request tests for anabolic steroids on their purchases. Should a horse test positive, the purchaser is allowed to rescind the sale. "I think we had about 15 requests for this sale," Ventura said last night. That included a major buyer, who Ventura declined to name, but had all of their purchases tested. Ventura said that results from the tests could be expected by Friday.

A \$500,000 Filly With a Royal Task...

About an hour after buying the top-priced colt at OBS February, John McCormack was back at it for hip 161, a Johannesburg filly named Mythical Border that he purchased for \$500,000--second best among the fillies at the sale. As was the case for the Speightstown, McCormack made the purchase on behalf of unnamed clients from the Middle East. But while the colt is being looked at as a late-developing prospect, Mythical Border has an immediate target.

"We bought her for the [five-furlong, G2] Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot," McCormack said. "Of course it's a longshot, but she has a very specific goal. She's by a world champion two-year-old, and she looks early; she looks very fast. Plus this sale comes at a very timely part of the year, in relation to climitizing the horses."

McCormack said a decision as to who would train the filly would be made in the next few days. Regarding the price, he admitted, "We were getting to our limit."

Hailing from the family of the great racehorse and producer Franfreluche, Mythical Border is the first foal out of the unraced six-year-old mare Border Dispute (Boundary), herself a full-sister to GSP Plenty.

Mythical Border was acquired as a weanling by Helen T. Andrews for \$145,000 at the 2006 KEENOV Sale. Second Wind Racing's Alan Pesch saw her at the following summer's Fasig-Tipton July Sale and fell in love, paying \$150,000 to acquire the chestnut.

Pesch only grew more fond of the filly as she progressed impressively under the tutelage of Ocala pinhooker Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stables. In fact, Pesch was reluctant to offer the filly back up for sale, but was committed to a business plan that called for all his juveniles to go through the auction ring.

Pesch was on hand yesterday with his family to watch Mythical Border, who worked in a co-bullet :10 flat at the first show, sell.

"I've got mixed emotions," he said after the bidding was through. "She's really special. She had beautiful balance, a beautiful attitude. We had a pretty high reserve on her. We even tried to find someone to buy her who would let us buy 25 percent back, but we couldn't find anyone."

When told the filly was headed to England, Pesch said, "She's a fast filly. I don't know how she'll do on grass, but she's real fast."

Through Second Wind Racing, Pesch, who previously developed simulation software and equipment for maritime operations, typically buys 15 or so yearlings to pinhook, with those failing to find homes going to his racing stable. Second Wind is based in Ocala.

Record Average, Median as 2yo Season Begins...

There were many questions coming into the twoyear-olds in training season, and many still remain, but by all accounts, the season is off to a very good start. Spurred by a number of new buyers, plus several returning to the fray, OBS February established new records for average and median.

Average topped out at \$157,640, which bested the previous record of \$139,430, set in 2006, by 13.1 percent. Yesterday's median of \$125,000 represented a 4.2 percent boost from 2005's record \$120,000.

"We're obviously thrilled with the results," said OBS Director of Sales and General Manager Tom Ventura. "Buyers were fighting for the good horses."

Ventura credited a good mix of new and established buyers for the sale's strong showing.

"If you look at the top buyers, Padua was new, John McCormack was new--he was the third leading buyer with \$1.075 million in purchases," Ventura said. "Buzz Chace bought four horses for \$1.24 million. Omar Trevino bought five for \$1.035 million. Steve Klesaris, with Jeff Puglisi, was the fifth-leading buyer. They came back to the two-year-old sales in a strong way and worked this sale very hard."

Ventura is cautiously optimistic that the momentum can be carried forward to the upcoming sales: Fasig-Tipton Calder, Barretts March, and especially OBS's March Selected Sale.

"Although you can't read too much into this sale, it sure is a good sign as to where we're going to go from here," he said. "Because of the number of horses we sell here, you can't look at the results and predict greatness for the rest of the year, but we hope it goes forward. We feel we have a very strong group in March."

PREMIUM TAP SET TO DEFEND IN KING'S CUP

Premium Tap (Pleasant Tap), now racing in Saudi Arabia under the name Allam, is set to defend his title in Friday's G1-KSA Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques Cup (King's Cup) at The King Abdulaziz track northeast of Riyadh. Formerly trained by John Kimmel, the 2006 GI Breeders' Cup third-place finisher was sold to Saudi King Abdullah bin Abdul Aziz and Sons and won the King's Cup prior to a runner-up effort behind Invasor (Arg) in the G1 Dubai World Cup.In his most recent appearance, Premium Tap overcame a world of trouble to win the Dec. 7 Crown Prince Cup. In that event, Kent Desormeaux reportedly had his reins break and was able to grab onto only one side of the reins for nearly the entire 2400-meter distance. Nonetheless, he prevailed by a head. Premium Tap is using the King's Cup as his final prep for this year's World Cup at Nad Al Sheba Mar. 29.



IEAH ACQUIRES UNBEATEN PURE CLAN IEAH

Stables has purchased a majority interest in unbeaten three-year-old filly Pure Clan (Pure Prize--Gather the Clan {Ire}, by General Assembly). After opening her career with a pair of victories on the grass at Ellis and Keeneland, Pure Clan switched to dirt and continued her winning ways at Churchill Downs, annexing the GIII Pocahontas S. Oct. 28 (video) and the GII Golden Rod S. most recently Nov. 24 (video). Bred in Kentucky by A. Lakin and Sons, the chestnut is a half-sister to 2005 GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. hero Greater Good. Owner Lewis Lakin has retained an interest in Pure Clan, who is four-for-four with \$316,209 in earnings. "We'd been watching this filly for a while and trying to get a deal done because she makes a great addition to our stable," IEAH Co-President Michael lavarone said of the daughter of GSW Gather the Clan. "She is already a multiple graded stakes winner with some pedigree, and obviously has a world of talent. Hopefully, she can continue to progress and get us to the [GI] Kentucky Oaks." Pure Clan will remain in training with Bob Holthus at Oaklawn Park. She is slated to make her sophomore bow in the GIII Honeybee S. Mar. 16. IEAH also recently acquired an interest in GI Kentucky Derby hopeful Court Vision (Gulch). "With her and Court Vision in the barn, maybe we can have some fun on Kentucky Derby weekend," lavarone added.



Heavy favorite Granizo lived up to his billing in this contest, the final leg of Peru's Quadruple Crown. An impressive two-length winner of his turf debut, the Clasico Stash Jan. 13, the gray colt drove with determination up the rail en route a convincing success. Classic-placed Quiron earned second, with Peru's leading three-year-old filly Democracia grabbing the third spot in the 11-horse field. Granizo's victory represented a memorable last winning ride in Peru for jockey Juan Pablo Vargas before he embarks on a U.S. campaign, where he hopes to emulate the success achieved in North America by Peruvian-born, Eclipse Award-winning riders Jorge Chavez and Edgar Prado. Granizo is by last year's Peruvian Stallion of the Year Farallon P. (Fappiano)--an unplaced half-brother to GI Met Mile hero Swept Overboard (End Sweep)--also the sire of last year's Peruvian champion miler Farrel (Per). Granizo's third dam is Peruvian champion Portadora.



GOLDEN OPPORTUNITY IN FRITCHIE

It took Golden Dawn (Hennessy) six starts to break her maiden, but the four-year-old hasn't looked back since graduating at Aqueduct in November. The Marty Cunningham colorbearer will climb another rung up the ladder when she makes her graded-stakes debut in Saturday's GII Barbara Fritchie H. at Laurel Park.

Golden Dawn was off the board in three of her five starts in Kentucky last year, then was sold privately by breeder Brian Scott Dance and shipped to trainer Mike Hushion at Belmont Park. The chestnut took to her new surroundings immediately, taking a six-furlong maiden special weight test at the Big A Nov. 4 in 1:09.98. Stepped right into stakes company off that effort, she was third in the Dec. 7 Raise Heck S.

But it was in her latest appearance that the filly really came to life. Sent off at 4-1 in the Jan. 9 Fiesta Lady S., she pressed the pace, took over in the stretch and galloped away to a six-length success.

"We thought she was going to run well, but we had no idea she would run like that," Hushion said. "But you could see it in the barn--she just kept getting better and better."

Hushion opted to skip last Saturday's Correction H. at Aqueduct in favor of the Fritchie.

"I think it's the right time to make the move," Hushion said. "We made sure to give her

plenty of time after her last race, and every race has been better than the one before it. If she moves forward just a little bit more, I certainly think she'll be competitive in here."

As it turns out, it is in her nature for Golden Dawn to move forward.

"The expression I like to descibe her is that she's very 'rammy,'" Hushion remarked. "That fits her. With her, everything is go, go, go. If Barbara Fritchie

you get in front of her, she'll just walk right over you."

The event was the subject of a John Greenleaf Whittier poem named in her honor, which starts:

"Shoot, if you must, this old gray head, But spare your country's flag," she said. A shade of sadness, a blush of shame, Over the face of the leader came; The nobler nature within him stirred To life at that woman's deed and word; "Who touches a hair of yon gray head Dies like a dog! March on!" he said.

WORLD DOMINATION

Coolmore, Darley, Coolmore, Darley--take your pick. Sheikh Mohammed is playing the long game with Darley's super stallion spending spree, estimated at \$200 million in 2007. They need to play the long game, too, because a look at the table of leading sires of new 2007 A Runners shows just how dominant Coolmore is right now, along with Kentucky's Lane's End Farm. Between then they stand or stood 10 of the 20 stallions that sired eight or more new A Runners (top 2 percent earners in North America, Britain, Ireland, France, Germany and Japan) in 2007.

Darley stood just one, Machiavellian, who died in 2004. While his son Street Cry is likely to replace him on this list next year, an unbiased observer might well say that these 2007 statistics show their spending spree was justified.

Coolmore stands the top three sires on this list: the incredible Sadler's Wells leads all sires with 17 new A Runners in 2007; relative newcomers Danehill Dancer (16) and Giant's Causeway (14, and who stands at their Kentucky farm, Ashford) are second and third.

Cynics point out that all three sires have had huge foal crops, and that is true, but they're getting results. Sadler's Wells has now sired an unbelievable 219 'unique' A Runners from 2,031 foals of racing age in 20 crops. Champion Sire 14 times in Britain and Ireland, he was the horse that singlehandedly put Europe back on the stallion map.

Danehill Dancer had the highest number of two-year-old A Runners (six) of this top 20, and was second in the proportion of two-year-old A Runners (37.5 percent) last year only to another son of Danehill, Dansili, who had 40 percent two-year-old/new 2007 A Runners (four of 10).

Danehill himself ran out of two-year-olds this year, His last crop were three-year-olds of 2007, and since he has no three-year-olds this year, 2007 is the final year he will be assigned APEX ratings (they have to have had 10 or more three-year-olds of the last year covered to be rated).

Opinion is rather sharply divided on Giant's Causeway. I've been in the supporters' camp for the last couple of years, partially because of his consecutive third- and fourth-place finishes on the General Sire List in 2006 and 2007. There are two knocks against him: a shortage of Grade I winners and the fact that he had well over 500 foals in his first four Northern Hemisphere crops. Anything short of superstardom spells failure according to those premises, but I think that is a serious misjudgment.

But 20 years of studying APEX ratings also convinces me that any sire with this many horses who are nearly that good is eventually going to end up at the top of the tree; Smart Strike, for example.

What is very interesting about Giant's Causeway is that he, along with Unbridled's Song, absolutely stand out on this list for having had a high proportion of first time four-year-old A Runners last year. Eight of Giant's Causeway's 14 new A Runners were four year olds (57 percent), more than double the 24-percent average for the top 20 sires of new A Runners; Unbridled's Song was even higher, by the way, with seven out of nine (78 percent).

It's most significant in Giant's Causeway's case because his first two crops (last year's four-year-olds were his second) were sensational, while his third crop (three-year-olds of last year) had pretty poor percentages; we shall have to see about his fourth crop, now three-year-olds. If the third crop was a blip, and he's really the sire his two oldest crops suggest he is, I'll make a bold prediction here: he'll top the North American General Sire List at least once in the next two or three years.

That depends on his fourth, and subsequent crops, being better than his third crop. But so far, the cumulative evidence suggests that Giant's Causeway is a sire who gets a high percentage of very good horses. How is that not a successful sire?

Lane's End's A.P. Indy, with 13, was number four on the New A Runner list last year, followed by Distorted Humor with 11, of which eight (73 percent) were three year olds, versus 46 percent for the top 20 as a whole. The top 20's age breakdown was 16-46-24-14 percent for first A Runner year being two-three-four- or five-plus, respectively. Four horses had 10 new A Runners each: Juddmonte's pair of Dansili and the late Chester House.

Chester House, Empire Maker's half-brother, looked like he was going to make a surprisingly good sire in spite of his and his family's noted temperament issues.

Coolmore and Lane's End each had one sire with 10 new A Runners, Rock of Gibraltar and Smart Strike, respectively. There are very interesting points about both. Eight of Smart Strike's 10 new A Runners were three-year-olds, including, of course, Curlin (who didn't even start at two). However, he had no new four- or five-year-old A Runners in 2007, whereas the top 20 sires had 38 percent between them.

However, that may have just been an anomaly in Smart Strike's case, since generally his numbers are quite good for older horses. I have to call Rock of Gibraltar a little bit of a remarkable success story. Sure, he had big crops again--and in his case, he also inherited a lot of Danehill's mares in 2003, which were right at the top of the tree. Opinion was that he hadn't upheld the huge shot he'd got, and he was packed off to Japan for the 2007 season.

They should be glad they brought him back; he's not just the only F2004 sire (first three-year-olds 2007) to make this top 20, he was the only sire from either the 2003 or 2004 sire class. No F2003 sire, not even top-of-the-crop Galileo (seven), had as many as eight new A Runners, yet Rock of Gibraltar had 10. He didn't let down the mares he inherited from Danehill that much, at least, that's what my figures say.

Among the eight sires with nine new A Runners in 2007 were two more from Coolmore (the deceased Danehill and Ashford's Tale of the Cat), and two more from Lane's End (Kingmambo and his now clearly very useful son, Lemon Drop Kid).

Unlike Giant's Causeway (same sire class, 2002), Lemon Drop Kid had a very good group of three-year-olds, which provided seven of his nine (78 percent) new 2007 A Runners. It doesn't mean their world domination will continue, but, in 2007 anyway, and using these figures, Coolmore and Lane's End can rightfully claim to have as many top 20 sires between them as the rest of North America and Europe put together.





BROODMARE SIRES: RED WHO?

It's no wonder we veteran breeding sector professionals consider the 1984 G1 Prix du Jockey-Club the most influential European Classic of modern times: that was the day three future great sires and broodmare sires ran one-two-three. Darshaan won it, with Sadler's Wells second and Rainbow Quest third. Twenty-three years later, the three are now the damsires of 278 A Runners combined: Sadler's Wells now has 125 A Runners as a broodmare sire to go with his 219 as a sire (17 of which are out of Darshaan mares), adding up to a combined 344 A Runners either by Sadler's Wells or out of Sadler's Wells mares. That makes him, hands-down, the most influential sire, in APEX terms, of the last 20 years.

Darshaan is now the damsire of 91 A Runners, while Rainbow Quest has 62. Appropriately enough, Darshaan and Sadler's Wells tied for the lead among sires of new 2007 A Runners, with 16 each; Sunday Silence, the best sire ever to stand in Japan, was third with 15.

A total of 23 stallions sired the dams of eight or more new A Runners each in 2007, including plenty of household names, like Mr. Prospector himself (11), and his sons Seeking the Gold and Woodman (13 each), Gulch (nine), and Gone West and Forty Niner (eight each).

The Northern Dancer line also provided (besides Sadler's Wells) Deputy Minister and Storm Cat (13 each), plus Dixieland Band (12), and Caerleon and Danzig (10 each).

The top American sire A.P. Indy added eight, to take his total to 27--all since 2002, when his first foals were just eight (even now, they are just 14). Roberto's son Dynaformer, who has been steadily improving in this department, had nine new A Runners as a broodmare sire last year, taking his total to 30.

But the real surprise package on the list of leading new damsires in 2007 was another son of Roberto, Red Ransom. He had 12 new A Runners as a broodmare sire last year, taking his total to 30 as well. Four-year-old (of 2007) Chatain (by Forest Wildcat) is perhaps the best known among them, but I did notice that Red Ransom was the dam of new A Runners last year by A.P. Indy, as well as two of his sons, Stephen Got Even and Mineshaft. Perhaps there is a little nick--a nickette, perhaps we should call it, or an affinity--happening there. In any case, this puts Red Ransom on our radar screens as a broodmare sire.




