Third in the Raise Heck S. Dec. 7, she trounced her rivals by six lengths in the Fiesta Lady S. Jan. 9 over the inner track and went postward here as the 4-1 second choice to Control System. Golden Dawn came away alertly to stalk defending champion Oprah Winney (Royal Academy) through fractions of :22.62 and :45.95. Surf Cat is back. The sparingly campaigned six-yearold summoned his back class and launched his rally up the center of the track for his first victory in 21 months. Winner of the GII Swaps S. at three, the Headley/Naify colorbearer captured this contest in 2006



and added the GII Potrero Grande H. in April and the GII Mervyn LeRoy H. the following month. He was sidelined thereafter, only returning to the races July 7, 2007, and missing by a neck in the GI Triple Bend H. at Hollywood. Second to Greg's Gold in the

GII Pat O'Brien H. Aug. 19 on the Del Mar Polytrack, the dark bay set the pace on the turf in the GII Oak Tree Mile Oct. 7, but faded to finish fifth, one of only two unplaced efforts in his career. Surf Cat came back Jan. 21 to run third in In Summation's track-recordsetting performance in the GII Palos Verdes H., and was the second choice here. Allowed to settle into stride, the six-year-old raced in fifth as Johnny Eves (Skimming) led through a :45.63 half from Greg's Gold. The latter took over in the lane and looked to be home free, but Surf Cat surged up the middle and came motoring to give trainer Bruce Headley his fifth victory in the San Carlos. "It's always better the last time you win, so I'd have to say this is better than all of them," Headley said. "It's been raining and it's been a hard season to train. He missed a couple of works, and he probably needed his last race. He had everything his own way [today]. He had a perfect spot, perfect position and he was ready to go." Headley indicated that Surf Cat's next start would likely by the 6 1/2-furlong GII Potrero Grande H. Apr. 5. Winning rider Solis added, "He's such a good horse. He's really been coming around the last two weeks. He's coming back to what he was...Bruce and I have been very lucky with sprinters." In addition to Surf Cat's win in 2006, Solis was also aboard Headley's San Carlos heroes Kona Gold (2001) and Softshoe Sure Shot (1995).




