ALEC WILDENSTEIN LOSES CANCER BATTLE

Leading owner and breeder Alec Wildenstein lost his long-fought battle with prostate cancer and passed away Sunday evening. He was 67. Wildenstein, the

fourth generation of a renowned family of art dealers, had been involved in the family breeding and racing operation since his youth and took over the management of the stable upon the death of his father Daniel in 2001. The family's long association with racing dates back to

1922, when Georges Wildenstein, Alec's grandfather, purchased his first yearlings and registered the blue, with light-blue cap, silks. They were first carried to Classic success when Kant (Fr) won the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains in 1935. The family went to live in New York during World War II, and there were no Wildenstein runners on French racecourses between 1941 and 1947. Daniel took over the operation in 1947, and Beau Prince (GB), winner of the 1954 Grand Criterium, was his first major runner. The colt ran second, as a three-year-old, to the great champion *Ribot in the 1955 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. Since then it has been a permanent flow of top-class runners such as Faraway Son, Allez France (who was named by Alec), Flying Water (Fr) and Pawneese (Ire). Recent additions to the honor roll include Sagace (Fr), Aquarelliste (Fr), and Peintre Celebre. The latter finally claimed a first G1 Prix du Jockey-Club for the the family in 1997. Longtime trainer Elie Lellouche said, "Alec Wildenstein was a wonderful person to be around and, over the years, we developed a friendship which went far beyond the owner-trainer relationship. Like his father, he was an exceptional man. He was very straightforward and it was a real pleasure to work for him." He added, "I trained about 60 horses for him and I don't yet know what will happen. I am very sad, and he will be sadly missed." Plans for the stable's future remain uncertain, but it is widely hoped that Alec's children and brother Guy will maintain the family's racing tradition. Cont. p2

back to get up for a 3/4length score. The Florida-bred came back in a Fair Grounds allowance test going a mile and 40 yards Jan. 19 and, encountering a sloppy track and a slow pace, sat closer to the pace before rallying to win by a head. The pace was rapid yesterday, and Denis of Cork was nearly 10 lengths off the lead at the quarter pole, but he hit the gas as they straight-

Alec Wildenstein cont. Carrying On in the Steps of His Father...

Following the passing of Daniel Wildenstein in 2001, Alec Wildenstein took control of the racing stable and

renamed it Wildenstein Stables. It was a nearseamless transition, highlighted in 2002 by the victories of Aquarelliste (Fr) in the G1 Prix Ganay and G2 Prix Foy and Bright Sky (Ire) in the G1 Prix de Diane and G1 Prix de l'Opera. Both were Alec Wildenstein at Chantilly named French champions that season. In 2003, the

stable was represented by Westerner (GB), winner of France's two major events for stayers, the G1 Prix Royal Oak and the G1 Prix du Cadran. He doubled up in those races the following season. Twice named European champion, Westerner remained in training through 2005, when he annexed the prestigious G1 Ascot Gold Cup and was runner-up in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. Vallee Enchantee (Ire), a daughter of Wildenstein's Arc winner Peintre Celebre, capped a successful 2003 campaign by taking the G1 Hong Kong Vase. The stable managed a pair of group wins in 2006, courtesy of G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly hero Policy Maker (Ire) and Vendangeur (Ire), the G2 Prix du Chaudenay victory. Loup Breton (Ire) took the G3 Prix Daphnis last season, while Argentina (Ire) was runnerup in the GI Diana H. and in the GIII Cardinal H. in the U.S. Patrick Biancone had a long and successful association with the Wildenstein family, conditioning All Along (Fr) and Sagace (Fr) to back-to-back wins in the Arc in 1983 and 1984. He reflected on Wildenstein's passing. "It's a very sad day," he said. "For me, this marks the loss of a great friend. We had a lovely cooperation together during the time that I worked for [the Wildenstein family], and Alec was very involved in all of the success they had. He was a great man for racing, a very good horseman, and he will be missed."

It was his closest finish yet, but Bustin Stones ran his record to a perfect five-for-five with this game score. The New York-bred chestnut made his first four starts in restricted company, following a maiden win at Aqueduct last march with a 4 1/4-length tally in the Apr. 22 Times Square S. The speedy colt went to the bench after taking the May 9 Screenland S. at Belmont, returning after two knee surgeries to make it four in a row in the Jan. 21 Promonroe S. He was favored in his graded-stakes debut. Sent right to the lead by jockey Ramon Dominguez, Bustin Stones was pressed through a half in :46.37. He opened up daylight at midstretch, but was all out as Lord Snowdon closed late, hanging on to take the photo. "He is a dream horse to ride because he is like a Quarter Horse coming out of the gate," said Dominguez, who has been aboard for all but one victory. "By the second jump, he is listening to you. He would go in :21 with no problem, but as soon as you put your hands down he relaxes. I could hear the commotion behind us and I really did not know how close they were or who it was, but he knew someone was there and kept on digging." Fourth in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches while still a maiden, Costume graduated at Ripon last June, then was third in the Listed Sandringham H. 15 days later. She ended her Euro stint with a close-up second in the Aug. 3 G3 Oak Tree S., but was fourth in her first four stateside tries. The bay missed by less than a length in the Sept. 8 GI Garden City H., and filled out the superfecta in the Oct. 13 GI QEIII Challenge Cup, Nov. 10 GII Mrs. Revere S. and Jan. 14 GII San Gorgonio H. Dropping back to a mile here, she settled in second through six furlongs, inherited the lead when Alexandra Rose (Caesour) took a right turn at the top of the lane and held off the hard-charging Black Mamba for her first stakes score. "[Alexandra Rose] was to my outside when we turned up the backside, and it looked like she was pulling pretty hard," jockey Garrett Gomez said. the announcement [about the loose horse] because of the wind, but the outriders let him know," trainer Steve Asmussen said. "[Pyro] went outside and the loose horse stayed on the rail." The three-year-old went on to complete his eventful five-furlong move in 1:05 3/5.

CURLIN TOUCHES DOWN IN DUBAI Reigning Horse of the Year Curlin (Smart Strike) arrived in Dubai Sunday evening following a flight from Florida via Lon-



don. The trip "could not have gone any better," according to Scott Blasi, assistant to trainer Steve Asmussen. "My hat's off to whoever orchestrated all this," Blasi said, praising the Janah Management Co. Ltd. of Newmarket, England, which dispatched skilled traveling groom Chris Webster to help tend to Curlin. The GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero is slated

to remain in quarantine for the next 48 hours before beginning his serious work in advance of his intended start in a 2000-meter handicap at Nad Al Sheba Feb. 28. That race will serve as Curlin's prep for the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 29. "Curlin is pretty smarthe knows he's here to do something," Blasi said. "He's got quite a bit of pep in his step, so I'll be anxious to get him to the track." Blasi indicated that the strapping chestnut colt would have an official workout sometime early next week. Regular rider Robby Albarado is scheduled to arrive in Dubai Feb. 26, while Asmussen will surface the following day.

As the Stones reminded us long ago, you can't always get what you want--or even what you plan for. What Brian S. Dance appeared to want in 2003, when he sent his homebred mare Paved In Gold to Hennessy, was a horse with the speed and precocity to make an immediate impact as a two-year-old, with Saratoga's juvenile stakes a viable pipedream.

Paved In Gold, after all, had raced eight times for Dance as a juvenile and had won five times. The quick-maturing filly had recorded her first stakes victories in July, taking the six-furlong Critical Miss at Philadelphia and the 5 1/2-furlong Colleen S. at Monmouth.

The daughter of Carson City continued to hold her own as the better quality two-year-olds started to emerge. Although she found Appealing Philly too strong in the GIII Sorority S., Paved In Gold ended her first campaign with victory in the GII Astarita S. over 6 1/2 furlongs in October.

In winning the Astarita, Paved In Gold underlined Carson City's prowess as a sire of fast-maturing juveniles. When Sir Gerry won last year's G2 Gimcrack S. at York, he became no less than the 14th group/graded juvenile winner by the former Overbrook stallion. For the record, the other 12 were Cuvee (GI Futurity S.), City Zip (GI Hopeful S. and three other graded races at two), City Band (GI Oak Leaf S.), Boone's Mill (GII Sapling S.), Chace City (GII Saratoga Special), Classic Elegance (GII Schuylerville S.), Leelanau (GIII Kentucky Breeders' Cup S.), Moonlight Sonata (GIII Arlington-Washington Lassie S.), Dublin (G3 Vintage S.), Dont Tell The Kids (GIII Sapling S.), Effectual (GIII Debutante S.) and Imperfect World (G3 Prix du Bois).

Few stallions prove as effective in this specialized field as Carson City, but then he had every right to be a reliable source of precocious talent. A rather small, neat individual, he recorded his first stakes success in the GII Sapling S. over six furlongs in the August of his first season.

Significantly his grandsires were two stallions who also wasted no time in demonstrating their considerable ability. His paternal grandsire, Raise a Native, made a winning debut over three furlongs at Hialeah on Feb. 28 before going on to head the Experimental Free Handicap. It was a similar story with Carson City's maternal grandsire, Blushing Groom, who gained his first success in early summer before achieving a clean sweep in France's quartet of top juvenile events.

To be fair to Carson City, he wasn't just a quick-maturing juvenile. Despite his lack of size, he trained on so well that he gained a further four successes as a three-year-old, including a victory under 131 pounds in the GII Fall Highweight H. His daughter Paved In Gold also held her form well--well enough to add two more stakes successes to her tally in the spring of her sophomore season. She also finished a creditable second to Oh What A Windfall in the GIII Nassau County S.

You'll find more precocity in the bottom half of Paved In Gold's pedigree. Her second dam, Gemellion, was a smart Canadian juvenile by Up Spirits (a half-brother to the sire of Blushing Groom). When Gemellion's second dam, Fitz's Fancy, was mated to Up Spirits the result was Choucri, who was winning for the third time when he landed the G1 Prix Robert Papin in the July of his iuvenile season.

Paved In Gold's owner seems to have sensibly come to the conclusion that the best policy is to try to reinforce his mare's speed and precocity, sending her to the likes of Stravinsky, Hennessy and More Than Ready.

The choice of Hennessy may have been influenced by the fact that his dam, Island Kitty, had visited Carson City to produce the GI Ballernia H. winner Pearl City (and Blushing Groom to produce the multiple Grade III winner Shy Tom). But Hennessy must also have appealed as a member of a male line with an unbroken record of excellence at two. The first four stallions in Hennessy's male line--Nearctic, Northern Dancer, Storm Bird and Storm Cat--collectively won 22 of their 33 juvenile starts.

D. Wayne Lukas clearly decided it was best to mine this rich vein of juvenile ability in Hennessy's pedigree. Adopting the Hirsch Jacobs strategy of it being better to let Hennessy wear out than rust away, Lukas kept him busy.

Hennessy was ready for action as early as June 3, when he suffered a narrow defeat, but he established himself as a possibly leader of his generation with a rapid sequence of four impressive victories.


The first came over five furlongs at Hollywood Park in early July, when Hennessy stormed home over six lengths clear in a time of :57. This display was impressive enough to make Hennessy a hot favorite in the GII Hollywood Juvenile Championship. Gary Stevens never had to ask Hennessy a serious question as the colt smoothly drew 5 1/2 lengths clear.

Hennessy was then switched from California to contest some of the big juvenile events on the East Coast, starting with the GII Sapling S. at Saratoga. The *Daily Racing Form* report recorded that Hennessy "simply won as his rider pleased" and his winning margin was nearly 10 lengths, so Hennessy had won his last three races by a total of almost 22 lengths.

The next move was for Hennessy to step up to Grade I company in the Hopeful S., and the transition again went smoothly, with the Storm Cat colt comfortably accounting for such as Louis Quatorze and Maria's Mon. Although Hennessy was never to win again, he lost little caste in defeat in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Ridden by Donna Barton, Hennessy battled it out all the way up the stretch with Unbridled's Song, conceding victory only in the closing stages. After two more starts, Hennessy apparently wore out and he never raced at three. He has, of course, gone on to sire some very good performers, none better than Johannesburg, a Group 1 winner in four different countries as a juvenile.

So, mating Paved In Gold to Hennessy produced a pedigree steeped in two-year-old talent. Unfortunately, the resultant foal, Golden Dawn, appears not to have read the script. She never even made it to the races at two and won only a maiden race at three. However, she is now showing the speed--if not the precocity--expected of her bloodlines. Having won the Fiesta Lady S. on her four-year-old debut, she was impressive in taking the GII Barbara Fritchie H., raising the possibility that, in time, she could develop into another Harmony Lodge or Madcap Escapade for her sire.

SID WATTERS JR. DEAD Trainer Sidney Watters Jr., elected to Thoroughbred Racing's Hall of Fame by the Steeplechase Committee in 2005, died Feb. 14 in Maryland after a brief illness. He was 90. Watters, who started out as an amateur steeplechase rider, took out his training license in 1947 and won six titles as the top jumps conditioner, guiding the careers of champions Amber Diver and Shadow Brook. The Baltimore native was also successful with flat horses, developing champions Hoist the Flag, the champion two-year-old of 1970; and Slew o'Gold, the Eclipse winner as top threevear-old in 1983 and top older horse in 1984. The favorite in the inaugural Breeders' Cup Classic, Slew o'Gold was caught between Wild Again and Gate Dancer as they raced down the stretch and was roughed up as they raced to the wire, crossing the line in third. The stewards opted to disqualify Gate Dancer from and moved Slew o'Gold into second. Slew o'Gold retired with 12 wins from 21 starts and more than \$3.5 million in earnings. Watters also trained Grade I winners Love Sign, Musical Lark and Love Sign before retiring in 1999. Arrangements are being handled by Henry W. Jenkins and Sons Funeral Home in Monkton, Maryland, but no memorial service has yet been planned.

Winning Colors earned the Eclipse Award as top three-year-old filly in 1988, but could not reproduce her Grade I form at four. She retired with a record of 19-8-3-1 and earnings of \$1,526,837. The mare produced 10 foals, including SP Golden Colors (Mr. Prospector). She has a yearling filly by Mr. Greeley and a two-year-old colt by Orientate. Winning Colors was buried at Greentree Farm, a division of Gainesway. "Winning Colors was always a champion, she had great physical prowess and athleticism, she was one of my father's favorite horses, and everyone at Gainesway is saddened by her passing," said Gainesway President Antony Beck.


