sixth to War Pass in the GI Champagne S. Oct. 6, and emerged from that race with a minor injury to his left front foot. "He's ready," trainer Bill Mott told *DRF*. "I think he's doing good. Of course, there's a couple of others going to that race who are doing pretty good, too." Mott added, "I like the racetrack. It's a pretty fair racetrack. You can close

ground. Pyro's there, but any race you go to at this time of year is not going to be a giveaway. They're all going to be competitive. You shouldn't be ducking any one horse. My horse has held his own against good company. I don't think we want to be in the position of ducking and diving. We've got to pick our spot and hope it works out."

Denis of Oaklawn...

Mr. and Mrs. William Warren's Denis of Cork (Harlan's Holiday), an impressive winner of the GIII Southwest S. at Oaklawn Monday, will return to the Arkansas oval for the GIII Rebel S. Mar. 15. The blaze-faced bay has already shipped back to his New Orleans base. "I'll probably breeze Denis twice at Fair Grounds, then bring him back to Hot Springs four or five days before the Rebel, and hope [trainer] Larry [Jones] will give us the same stall," said trainer David Carroll. "If all goes well, then we'll think about the [GII] Arkansas Derby [Apr. 12]. He needs racing." Jones, who saddled Eight Belles (Unbridled's Song) to an overpowering score in a division of the Martha Washington S. Sunday at Oaklawn, offered Carroll a spot in his barn. Denis of Cork's stall was back-to-back with the big filly. "I'm thinking,...that Eight Belles maybe knocked on the back wall, and told Denis of Cork how easy it was," Jones guipped yesterday morning. FROM THE DESK OF...

BLINDED BY THE LIGHT

A few weeks ago I was privileged to be included among a panel of speakers at the ITBA Trade Fair at Goffs. It was a heavyweight lineup, too. I'm sure my journalistic colleague and co-panelist Leo Powell, editor of *The Irish Field*, won't be offended when I say he and I were rather wondering what we were doing up there on the platform with Denis Brosnan, Chariman of Horse Racing Ireland; Nic Coward; and Winfried Engelbrecht-Breges, CEO's of the British Horse Racing Authority and the Hong Kong Jockey Club, respectively. Needless to say, Leo acquitted himself brilliantly, and the other speakers were as interesting and thought-provoking as we'd expected.

The Trade Fair was sponsored by the Irish Thoroughbred Breeders' Association, chaired by Joe Hernon, and it was coordinated by Eddie O'Grady's daughter, the excellent Amber Byrne. There were 85 booths, and Goffs was teeming with people. It's an amazing country, Ireland. It's the only place I know where, when somebody happens to make some serious money (which quite a few Irish have been doing over the last decade), the first thing they think about buying is a horse. We could use a few dozen more countries like that.

One of the most popular booths at the Fair, by all accounts, was that of the G1 Goldmine pedigree website manned by Australian software developer Leo Tsatsaronis. Unfortunately I didn't have a chance to see the seminar he presented, but there were so many people trying to get in they brought him back for an encore the next afternoon. I was sorry I didn't get to meet him; there's always room for good information, and by all accounts the information their website provides is very good. In fact, there's an interesting review by Nancy Sexton, in Monday's *Racing Post*, of G1 Goldmine and the new *Blood-Horse*-sponsored Truenicks, co-produced by another Australian, Byron Rogers, with Alan Porter.

Both products do represent advances in certain respects, as far as I can tell, certainly in the range of the databases they tap into. But, as somebody who also works in the field of pedigree analysis, I'm not convinced that either or both is the Holy Grail they're being cracked up to be. I'm probably somewhat biased, being a competitor, or at least a rival of sorts, but the truth is I'm not at all convinced this rush to measure and index opportunity, in the one case (Truenicks), or indexing individual crosses, as is cited in Nancy's article about the other, really are 'the answer.' I realize both programs do a lot more, and I'm sure both are very useful tools.

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But is "Compton Place over Night Shift" (index 71.93) really a better cross than "Sadler's Wells over Darshaan" (index 2.26)? It's simply that Compton Place has had several early successes over Night Shift, from a very small sample size. Sod's Law, as well as the Law of Averages and the Laws of Probability, virtually guarantee that the next 50 times it's tried, the results won't be as impressive.

It's the same sort of rush of fashion as we saw when Believe It had early successes over the Raise a Native line, or when Storm Bird had Storm Cat (in his first crop) out of a Secretariat mare. Storm Cat was a foal of 1983, and in 1987-1988 Storm Bird had three more A Runners out of Secretariat mares, including Summer Squall (whose dam produced A.P. Indy two years later) and Mujadil. I don't know how many Secretariat mares were bred to Storm Bird in his ensuing 11 crops, but I can tell you how many more A Runners there were bred on that cross: zero. And that's my problem with measuring opportunity: when the sample size is so small (evidently, too small), early successes may mean not that this is a great nick, but that whatever successes this cross was going to have happened to come early. I have no doubt success rates drop as the numbers bred on that cross increase, and these raw measurements of opportunity don't take that into account, since as far as I know nobody has done that research (yet). Moreover, when you consider even ABC Rrunners are only 8 percent of the population, the odds are stacked against success. It's no wonder the trend lines flatten as the number of cases increase.

The Bright Young Things...

All this is also by way of explaining why we don't do APEX ratings on freshman sires; those early successes can be misleading. Even doing them on sires with threeyear-olds and four-year-olds, we routinely see sires ring up huge early numbers, which then naturally contract as they have more, and more older, runners. The first year A.P. Indy was rated, his A Runner Index was over 9.00. Eventually it has settled to around the 5.00 mark, which is still the best there is. Distorted Humor, whose oldest foals were seven in 2007, has now dropped below 4.00 for the first time. Significantly, though, even as the numbers (usually) fall, the top sires tend to hold their positions among their 'sire classes' (sires with first foals the same year).

Consequently, we find with the younger sire classes-in this case, sires with first foals 2003 (oldest fouryear-olds of 2007) and 2004 (oldest three-year-olds)--it is as important to look at their total numbers of 'A' and 'ABC' Runners as at their indexes. So we present eight 'Top 20' tables in this issue, four each for F2003 and F2004 sires: number of A and ABC Runners as well as the leaders by A Index and ABC Index. Tables p8-11

In terms of number of A Runners and ABC Runners 2005-2007, Galileo, Broken Vow, and City Zip rank one-two-three on both lists, in that order. The two leaders by A Runner Index are two Florida sires (each

with roughly half the number of year-starters as Galileo): Exchange Rate (3.55), who has now emigrated to Three Chimneys Farm in Kentucky; and Put It Back (3.42). The latter, who is surely the biggest bargain in Florida this year at \$7,500, leads the list by ABC Runner

Index (2.23), over two sires whose runners have all been sired in New York to date, City Zip (2.17, now at Lane's End in Kentucky), and Giant's Causeway's little brother, Freud.





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

In what looks like a pretty salty group of F2004 sires, Coolmore sires Johannesburg (12) and Rock of Gibraltar (10) head the list, perhaps not surprisingly, considering they are the two with the highest number of runners. Darley's Street Cry (nine) comes next, followed by Officer and Invincible Spirit (eight each), and Orientate (seven). In terms of A Runner Index, the list is led by the unheralded Val Royal (3.62), still only a £10,000 stallion at The National Stud in Britain, when he gets back into service, followed by Street Cry (3.33), Pure Prize (3.16), Sakhee (2.86), Officer (2.80), and E Dubai (2.72). Johannesburg, Rock of Gibraltar, and Invincible Spirit (all with more year-starters) also rate in the 2.00's. Invincible Sprit and Rock of Gibraltar are tied for the lead by number of ABC Runners, with 28 each, ahead of Officer and Johannesburg, each with 24; Include (21); Orientate (20); and Street Cry (19). E Dubai (2.17) is tops by ABC Runner Index, ahead of Officer (2.10).

National Sales Manager, William Inglis & Son Are large stallion books good for the industry?

It would be populist to say "no they are not good for the industry," but I am sure that is the wrong answer. I think from a genetic viewpoint there is not a lot to worry about. Any suggestions about narrowing of the

gene pool is plain fear-mongering by the uneducated as the Thoroughbred is a long, long way off having any problems with lack of genetic diversity. Any geneticist will tell you that. Actually the internationalisation of the Thoroughbred has done a good job in creating a fairly diverse gene pool and the free market does a great job in regulating itself. In Australia for example, the commercial

gene pool is really reaching saturation with Danehill/Danzig blood, so you are seeing 1) breeders only wanting to buy mares that are not from this sire line so they can send them to the Danzig line; and 2) stallion owners desperately looking for a "foil" to Danzig. The same is occurring in Japan with Sunday Silence/Halo. It will sort itself out.

The common argument that "the next Danzig/Red Ransom wouldn't get an opportunity in this day" is also popular but far from reality based. The reality is that a lot of stallions that got mares in the past really don't deserve the mares that they got.

As the bar to become a top commercial stallion rises, then naturally the bar for the lesser commercial and regional areas rises as well as instead of these areas getting the unraced half-brother to the good stallion, they are getting a Grade 3 winner or a Grade 2 winner. They are getting a better horse to start with so from that viewpoint I think that bigger books are actually helping the industry breed a better horse overall. At any rate, if the stallion truly upgrades he will prove it despite the market's best efforts to deny him.

One matter I would raise as a concern is that because an increasing number of foals are entering the sale ring as opposed to being bred to race, from a product differentiation viewpoint we are starting to enter dangerous territory. As a sire serves bigger books, the uniqueness of the product is lost. When you went to a sale a decade ago and wanted to buy a Seattle Slew, you knew that there were probably going to be about 10-20 of them offered each year at the most, and that you would have to work hard to get one.

Now you know that there are probably going to be 40-50 of them offered (and some times up to 100) which is a little different. There is not that sense of desperation to buy, but rather comparison to buy as buyers start grading each foal by a sire more extensively than they would have in the past. This is not "good" for breeders as they are the ones that are taking the product to sale and subject to this arbitrage by the marketplace.

Will book size continue to grow?

Absolutely. Large stallion books will continue in a natural fashion because we are seeing across the world that there are less and less stallions to go to. The bar to be a stallion in any country is being raised each year as the market expects the stallion to provide more (or at least that is how the market is being marketed to believe!). Twenty years ago in Australia, there were some 2,000 stallions serving 25,000 mares; last year, there were a little over 700 serving the same number. The same is occurring in North America and Europe. Go and take a look at the stats from The Jockey Club. This is not a bad thing, either. More mares are tending, and tending is the key word, to go to better-class stallions, so the bar of what is being bred is rising.

The flip side to the coin is, of course, that stallions who ultimately turn out to be bad stallions get a lot more chance at stud than in hindsight they probably deserve. By the time we find out that a stallion should have been gelded for disservice to the breed, there are 400 + of his foals running around that, in the case of fillies, we then decide are good enough to breed from. Again, this is not the ideal, but you can't have it both ways, and ultimately the marketplace and the winning post decide who survives as far as stallions are concerned.

The more pertinent question is that while we are now applying a fairly severe genetic, conformation and performance test on the stallions that retire to stud, why are we not applying this test to the other side of the equation--the mares? It seems to me that we are quite happy to breed out of a mare that proved herself completely useless as a runner and can have next to zero pedigree to her--she still gets a chance to prove herself a useless breeder also, and of course we blame the stallion if her foals are useless.... Does this count as a win for the feminists?

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LETTRE SPIRITUELLE TOPS ARQANA MIXED SALE

Following last year's record gains, trade returned to a more somber level at Argana's one-day February Mixed Sale at Deauville yesterday. There was an international presence once again as California-based agent Francoise Dupuis landed Hip 185, Lettre Spirituelle (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), for a session-topping €100,000. It was the only six-figure transaction of the day. Presented by trainer Valerie Dissaux, the three-year-old filly enhanced her value with a hat trick of all-weather wins at the end of last year and her page received an additional boost with the Grade 2 hurdle success of halfbrother Aigle d'Or (GB) at Cheltenham last month. She is set to further her career in the States. Second highest price of the day, €67,000, was paid by BBA Ireland for the three-year-old Kappa (Storm Cat), a full-brother to G1 Prix Marcel Boussac heroine Denebola from a deep Niarchos family page. Offered out of training as Hip 155 from Pascal Bary's Chantilly barn, the unraced colt is a son of G1 Prix Morny and G1 Prix de Salamandre victress Coup de Genie, a daughter of Coup de Folie and a full-sister to Machiavellian and Ocean of Wisdom. The highest price achieved by the Ecurie Cohen dispersal was realised by the winning seven-year-old mare Winding Road (Fr) (Barathea {Ire}), who went the way of Francois Rohaut for €60,000. Offered as Hip 103, she was sold with a five-week-old Aussie Rules filly at foot and hails from the immediate family of Ecurie Wildenstein stalwart Westerner (GB). Despite wholesale drops on last year's impressive figures, the returns registered a significant improvement on the 2006 comparatives. The €8,460 average, down over 62 percent on last year's equivalent, boasted an increase of almost 43 percent on the previous year. The €3,500 median experienced the same rollercoaster effect, down 56 percent on 2007, but up almost 17 percent on 2006. "The aggregate at today's sale was much the same as at last year's February sale if you take out the dispersal from the Haras de Saint Pair du Mont, which enabled us to achieve a record result in 2007," said Argana President Eric Hoyeau. "All of the sale's statistics are well up from previous years, so [it is] a satisfactory result for a sale appreciated by many vendors." Full results can be viewed at www.argana.com.

SHIROCCO'S DAM SO SEDULOUS EUTHANIZED

Baron Georg von Ullmann's high-class producer So Sedulous (The Minstrel--Sedulous {Ire}, by Tap on Wood {Ire}) has been euthanized following a severe illness. The bay 17-year-old proved herself a star in the Baron's broodmare band by producing numerous stakes winners by stellar sire Monsun (Ger). The very best of these is Darley sire and international champion Shirocco (Ger) whose major victories include the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, G1 Coronation Cup, G1 Deutsches Derby and G1 Gran Premio del Jockey Club. His brother Subiaco (Ger) was a top stayer and won four group races as well as running second in the Deutsches Derby, while another stakes-winning brother Storm Trooper (Ger) ran third in Germany's premier Classic. The fourth stakes winner from this combination is listed scorer September Storm (Ger), who maintained So Sedulous' 100 percent record by becoming her fifth son to contest the German Derby; half-brother Satchmo (Ger) (Surumu {Ger}) being the first to do so in 1999. So Sedulous has the nine-year-old Shoah (Ger), a winning daughter of Acatenango (Ger), as well as two Monsun fillies, So Squally (Ger) and Swish (Ger), to secure the line. Her last offspring is another Monsun colt, a yearling who has already been named Slash (Ger).

POMELLATO INJURED

Gestut Ittlingen's **Pomellato (Ger)** (Big Shuffle), Germany's leading juvenile colt of 2007, has sustained an undisclosed training injury which will keep him off the track for most, if not all, of the forthcoming European turf season. Trained by Peter Schiergen, Pomellato improved off a debut win at Frankfurt in August to garner the Aug. 31 G3 Maurice Lacroix-Trophy at Baden-Baden later that month. He suffered his only defeat when fourth in the G1 Gran Criterium at Milan's San Siro in October and closed his freshman campaign with an impressive score in the G2 Criterium de Maisons-Laffitte at the beginning of November.



SEACHANGE ARRIVES IN DUBAI

Champion New Zealand mare Seachange (NZ) (Cape Cross (Ire)) has arrived in Dubai after a 25-hour journey via Singapore. The six-year-old Seachange, a seventime Group 1 winner in her homeland, will now likely use the Mar. 6 Jebel Hatta S. as a prep for the \$5million G1 Dubai Duty Free Mar. 29. Both races are 1777 meters on Nad Al Sheba's turf course. Seachange is set to be the first Kiwi to run at the Dubai International Racing Carnival, the prelude to Dubai World Cup day. Her groom and regular track-work rider, Jayne Ivil, said the mare endured the grueling trip as well as could be expected. "It's taken us more than 24 hours to get here, whereas before, the furthest she had traveled was three hours to Australia," said Ivil. "So naturally, she's a little quiet and is taking it all in, in her own time. I think she'll perk up once we start getting her into a routine again, and we'll take her to the track tomorrow morning. We'll probably give her a serious workout on Saturday morning, and continue to work her pretty hard." Trained by Ralph Manning, who arrives in Dubai on Friday, the star mare will be hoping to fare even better than her compatriot Sunline (NZ), who finished third in the 2001 Dubai Duty Free. "She is the best New Zealand horse since Sunline," Ivil added. "She tries her heart out each time she races. The only doubt is the distance which may be a touch beyond her, but she will not let us down."

"I am not suggesting that she had the brilliance of her sister, but she always promised that much more than she delivered on race day." The sophomore won once in 10 starts and placed in the Listed Talindert S., earning A\$25,430. Knocked down to Demi O'Byrne, the filly was raced by the Coolmore Syndicate, the Freedman family's Markdel Syndicate, E. J. Lucas and Yarraman Park Stud, which offered her for sale.
