HE'S GOING THE DISTANCE AT GULFSTREAM

He has only been beyond a mile and an eighth once in his career, but Godolphin's **Palace Episode** (Machiavellian) should find the 11 furlongs of the GI Gulfstream



Park Turf S. well within his scope. The five-year-old faces nine rivals in Gulfstream's featured race today. After capping off his juvenile campaign with a victory in the G1 Racing Post Trophy going a mile, the dark bay was a 3-1 shot in his sophomore opener, www.bbc.co.uk the G2 Dante S. at York.

But he stopped badly in that

1 5/16-mile prep for the G1 Epsom Derby, and disappeared for the rest of the year. Transferred to the U.S. in 2007, Palace Episode captured a Saratoga allowance test in his second stateside outing, then finished a troubled third in the Sept. 29 GII Kelso H. going a mile. Off the board in the Oct. 28 GIII Knickerbocker H. at Aqueduct and the Nov. 23 GI Citation H. at Hollywood, he showed promise when closing for third behind Einstein (Brz) (Spend a Buck) in a one-mile optional claimer at Gulfstream Jan. 11. "He's a really good horse, but at a mile and an eighth or shorter, he just hasn't been able to get over the hump," said Rick Mettee, who oversees the Godolphin string on this side of the Atlantic. "He ran a pretty good third in his last race, and it sets him up well to see if he can prove himself at 11 furlongs." Mettee added, "He's been doing really well, and he's ready to try this trip." Palace Episode again faces Einstein, who won this race in 2006 and was third, beaten less than a length, last year. The six-year-old comes off a sixth in the Feb. 2 GI Donn H. GI Secretariat S. hero Shamdinan (Fr) (Dr Fong) makes his first start since running second in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf.

HALL OF FAME FINALISTS ANNOUNCED

The 2008 finalists for induction into Thoroughbred Racing's Hall of Fame were announced yesterday. They are:


Trainers: Carl Nafzger, Robert Wheeler Jockeys: Edgar Prado, Randy Romero, Alex Solis Contemporary Male Horses: Best Pal, Manila, Tiznow Contemporary Female Horses: Inside Information, Open Mind, Silverbulletday, Sky Beauty

Technically, Bob Baffert has been eligible for Hall of Fame consideration for the last two years--trainers need to have held a Thoroughbred license for 25 years--but he focused on Quarter Horses until the late 1980s. "In the case of Bob Baffert, he has trained at least one starter in a Thoroughbred race in each of 26 years and so he is declared eligible," Ed Bowen, the chairman of the Hall of Fame Nominating Committee, said in a statement. "However, he was primarily a Quarter Horse trainer for a number of years, and there were several years in which he had so few Thoroughbred starts that the consensus of the Nominating Committee was that his record does not meet the spirit of the eligibility requirement." There were a total of 81 candidates considered for Hall of Fame honors this year. The finalists will be voted on by the 180 members of the Voting Panel, and the top votegetter in each category will be inducted on Monday, Aug. 4 at the National Museum of Racing in Saratoga Springs. In the event of a tie, there will be more than one inductee in that category.

11 Niagara Causeway Giant's Causeway SCR SCR On the Acorn, who came close to going a perfect five-for-five last season, returns from a nine-month layoff. The seven-year-old gelding was claimed by Indizguys Stable and trainer Mike Mitchell for \$40,000 after a fifth-place finish at Hollywood in November of 2006. He tired to be ninth in his first start under new management the following month, but turned it around in his 2007 opener. The dark bay took an optional claimer going 10 panels on the Santa Anita lawn Jan. 13 and added a second win against similar competition going a mile and a half Feb. 8. Stepped up for last year's edition of the San Luis Obispo, he was carried wide while rallying down the lane and still hit the wire just a 1/2-length behind Obrigado in third. Placed second through the DQ of runner-up One Off (GB) that afternoon, On the Acorn returned to take the Apr. 22 GII San Juan Capistrano H., but was sidelined after adding the GII Jim Murray Memorial H. to his resume. The veteran was not seriously injured, according to Mitchell. "He got to where his feet were bothering him," he explained. "He was getting body sore." Obrigado, winless since his Obispo score, comes off a third in the Jan. 19 GII San Marcos H.



FAST TIMES AT FASIG-TIPTON The under-tack show for Fasig-Tipton's Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training took place under balmy conditions yesterday at Calder. A colt by Sky



Mesa, hip 62, blazed an eighth in :09 4/5 while out towards the center of the track; it was the fastest time on the day (video). The dark bay, purchased by Cleveland Wheeler for \$100,000 at Keeneland September, is the second foal from Canadian stakes winner Secondary School. The swiftest quarter-mile was recorded by hip 135, a powerfully built son of Pulpit who covered the distance in :21 (video). From the extended family of Valid Expectations, the

dark bay was acquired at Keeneland September for \$100,000 by Hoby and Layna Kight, who will lead him over Tuesday. "The important thing is that everyone came home safe," said Walt Robertson, president of the auction company. "We had 13 horses go in :10, and it was a good, safe show." In previous years, Fasig-Tipton conducted two under-tack shows, including a second preview Sunday, two days before the Tuesday sale. This year, however, Fasig-Tipton officials opted to have just one under-tack show, and moved it to Friday. "We all talked about it, and the bottom line is that it's the best thing for the horses," Robertson added. "This will give people plenty of time to look at the horses after [the breeze show]--three days, rather than one." The decision to have only one show was met with mixed emotions. "I liked it when the horses were here longer-that's more time that I had to get out to see them," said trainer Rick Violette Jr., whose Florida string is stable at Palm Meadows. "I'm sure that it's an effort to lessen the stress on the horses, but I have the feeling that there's going to be a lot of consignors who wish they had another chance to breeze after today." - <u>Hip # 143</u> worked a quarter mile in :21.2 (The best quarter was 21.0.). He's a colt out of Bashful Charmer, by Capote consigned by Murray Smith, agent. His dam is a stakes winner and is the dam of stakes winner SATURDAY'S CHILD. <u>Video</u>
- <u>Hip # 188</u> worked a quarter mile in :21.3. He's a colt out of Dance Darling, by Devil's Bag consigned by Paul Sharp. His dam is a half-sister to MISNOMER and DARLING DANZIG. <u>Video</u>



GOLDEN GLOVE By Lucas Marquardt

From the bullpen to the roundpen, Rob Murphy Jr. has made a seamless transition from successful majorleague hurler to successful owner and breeder. On



Sunday, Murphy's M375 Thoroughbreds, Inc. and partners may well witness a transition of another kind; they will find out if their three-year-old **Golden Spikes** (Seeking the Gold) can move from promising and smartly bred sophomore to legitimate Triple Crown contender.

Golden Spikes, a \$250,000 Keeneland September purchase by M375 on behalf of Murphy and partners Pablo Suarez and Paul Lo Duca, among others, won on debut

sprinting at Calder last July. He didn't race again until November, when he was a tired fifth in a first-level allowance at that course Nov. 22. But a smart 3 1/4length allowance victory Dec. 13 gave trainer Marty Wolfson and Murphy enough confidence to try him in graded company. Golden Spikes wasn't disgraced in the GII Hutcheson S. at Gulfstream Jan. 5, running fourth of eight, beaten 7 3/4 lengths by Smooth Air. The colt showed in his latest that routing might be his forte. Facing the well-backed **Cool Coal Man** (Mineshaft), another GII Fountain of Youth S. player, in a nine-furlong allowance in Hallandale Jan. 26, Golden Spikes led into the stretch before relenting to the favorite by a length.

Golden Spikes's pedigree is an interesting mix of stamina and sprint influences. His third dam, Surgery, is by the great Dr. Fager, while his second dam is the

Grade I winner and top broodmare Shared Interest (Pleasant Colony), who produced the speedball Forestry (Storm Cat) and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies heroine Cash Run (Seeking the Gold). Golden Spikes's dam, the A.P. Indy mare A.P. Interest, was a winner at seven furlongs. She is a half-sister to that talented pair, making Golden Spikes a 3/4 blood relative to Cash Run. With that sort of pedi-

gree, it's clear that, with a win in the Fountain of Youth, Murphy would have not only a Derby contender on his hands, but an attractive stallion prospect, too.

A Longtime Fan...

Before you think of Murphy, 48, as a neophyte to racing, just a retired ballplayer with some time and money to kill, think again. Murphy's got the pedigree and the past-performance lines to match up with most players in the business. Born in Miami in 1960, Murphy grew up around racing. His mother's father was a track announcer for 35 years. His mother was a chartcaller for the *Daily Racing Form*. His father's stepfather, Murphy said, was the jockey Fred Smith, who was aboard La Troienne's son Bimelech when that colt won the Preakness and Belmont in 1930. And Murphy's own father maintained a sizable racing stable in Southern Florida.

Need more proof? Take Murphy's nom de course, M375. When Murphy was in college at the University of Florida studying computer science, he created a handicapping program he called Slew--named after Murphy's favorite horse. One day, waiting at a printer, he kept coming across printouts, which emerged from the printer upside down, that read M375. It took him a few minutes to realize the printouts were indeed his; M375 was, numerically speaking, Slew spelled backwards.

"I immediately named everything M375," said Murphy.

But at that point, it wasn't horse racing nor computer science on which Murphy chose to focus. It was baseball. Or, more specifically, throwing one very hard with a great degree of accuracy.

In 1985, after a few years in the minors, Murphy broke into the major leagues as a left-handed relief pitcher. He spent time with the Cincinnati Reds, the Boston Red Sox, the Seattle Mariners, the Houston Astros, the St. Louis Cardinals and the Florida Marlins.

His second year in the league was his best, when he achieved a sparkling ERA of just 0.72 with the Reds. By the time he retired in 1995, he had thrown in some 623 innings and recorded an ERA of 3.64.

While he was playing ball, though, Murphy's love of racing never faded. Whenever the chance arose, he followed racing and even purchased a few horses here and there.

So when Murphy decided to hang up his glove after an accomplished 10 years in the majors, it was no surprise to anyone when he decided to get serious about horses. One of the first things he did was to go back and refine another program he had devised in college, one that created a model of what makes a successful racehorse--sire performance, dam performance, etc.--that could be used in the selection of sales yearlings.

"After creating this model, I had to validate it by going through past sales results," Murphy remembered. "The computer, looking at results from 1975 through 1983, approved less than one percent of the horses that sold as yearlings. And of that approved group, 20 percent became stakes winners, versus the industry average of about three percent."

Murphy, convinced he was on to something, found some investors who believed in his approach. And though M375 has operated on a small scale in terms of numbers, it has achieved success on a national level.

To date, M375's best horse has been Platinum Tiara, whom M375 bred in partnership with Gene McLean and raced with several others. A foal of 1998, Platinum Tiara, by Cozzene, was just a half-length adrift of Caressing when second in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies in 2000. By the time she was retired in

2002, Platinum Tiara had earned over \$600,000 and had been on the board in 17 of 28 starts.

Other stakes winners campaigned by M375 partnership includes Grade III winner Swing and Miss, stakes winners Z. Flash Gun and Mary Murphy, and graded performer Diamond Studs.

These days, Murphy says that M375 is primarily a breeding operation.

"If we breed a horse that fits all our criteria as it grows in age and gets to yearling time, I will then look to put it into a racing partnership," he said. "But sometimes we do go to the yearling sales looking to buy for a partnership."

Focusing on quality over quantity, Murphy currently has a broodmare band of just two: the aforementioned Platinum Tiara and her dam, Michelle's Monarch.

"Ten years ago, I had nine or 10 mares," Murphy said. "Stud fees started to build up and I wasn't happy with that many mares, so we decided to scale down."

The 17-year-old Michelle's Monarch had a Gone West colt last year and is due soon carrying a Quiet American foal. She's booked to Storm Cat for 2008.

Platinum Tiara, now 10, had an A.P. Indy colt last term. She is currently carrying a foal by Storm Cat and is slated to visit Unbridled's Song this spring.

Interestingly, Murphy has included another star baseball player on several of his horses, all-star catcher Paul Lo Duca. Lo Duca, who now plays for the Washington Nationals, owns an interest in Golden Spikes, and went into a foal share agreement with Murphy in 2007 with the two mares; Lo Duca purchased the seasons for Quiet American and Storm Cat.

Murphy was first introduced to Lo Duca by yet another baseball player. Murphy explained, "Paul has been around the racetrack ever since he was old enough to get into Turf Paradise. He had some horses with Doug O'Neill a few years ago and has been involved with some partnership groups.

"When Paul played for the [Florida] Marlins, the thirdbase coach at the time was Jeff Cox, who is now with the Chicago White Sox. Well, Coxie and I played together in the minor leagues, and we both liked racing a lot. We'd frequent the local establishments as we made our way around the double 'A' Eastern League back in '84, and we've been good friends ever since. So when Paul got traded from the Dodgers to the Marlins, Coxie said 'Murph, you've gotta meet Paul.' One day I was at the Calder press box, we recognized each other, and we've been great friends since. Amazingly, when we get together we almost never talk about baseball; we talk about horse racing."

And who knows? After this weekend, maybe the two ballplayers will be talking about the first Saturday in May, courtesy of an appropriately named colt named Golden Spikes.





Jara On the Mend:


