Today's GII Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream Park is a puzzler and presents a handicapping challenge for the most seasoned of punters. A full field of 12 aspiring sophomores will face the starter, including **Court Vision** (Gulch), who makes his first appearance in the silks of

IEAH Stables, which purchased an interest in the well-bred colt from WinStar Farm in late January. He marks the second horse to bring the two groups together, the first being Sharp Susan, winner of the GII Lake Placid S. last summer. "Doing business with the guys at WinStar has been nothing but a pleasure and we can only hope to share in their good fortune," said Michael

lavarone, co-president of IEAH Stables. "If all the stars align and we find ourselves at Churchill Downs on the first Saturday in May, it will be a dream come true. I thank WinStar for giving us the opportunity to partner on such an outstanding horse and take part in such a successful operation. Court Vision has the pedigree, the class, and the ability to be a Classics winner." He's also got the race record to boot. Since suffering his lone career defeat in a Turfway maiden last September, Court Vision has reeled off three straight scores, including a powerful win over Halo Najib (Halo's Image) in the GIII Iroquois S. at Churchill Downs Oct. 28 and a game victory in the GII Remsen S. Nov. 24. He is the 3-1 morning-line favorite, but bettors must determine just how cranked up Court Vision is. "I don't want Sunday to be his absolute best. I want it to be something to build on, and see his best race down the road," trainer Bill Mott told Daily Racing Form. FOY cont. p3

ANOTHER SMART WIN FOR EINSTEIN

Victorious in the 2006 running of the GI Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup Turf, Einstein (Brz) (Spend a Buck) was forced to settle for a close third in his title defense last year, but was back in the winner's circle yesterday afternoon following a neck victory over a game Dancing Forever (Rahy). Owned by the much-beleagured Midnight Cry Stable, the striking dark bay overcame a world of trouble to win the GII Muniz Memorial H. last March, but dumped his jockey trying to avoid a fallen foe in the GII Dixie S. in May and went missing. He wired a stakes-quality allowance field in his Jan. 11 comebacker at Gulfstream, but could do no better than sixth to Spring at Last when trying the main track in the GI Donn H. Feb. 2. Einstein broke well and sat the garden trip as Thorn Song (Unbridled's Song) led from GI Breeders' Cup Turf runner-up Shamdinan (Fr) (Dr Fong). Eased out to the two path exiting the clubhouse turn, he pressed by the weakening frontrunner at the quarter pole and held sway late for the win. Dancing Forever made a nice middle move into contention on the backstretch, saved ground into the stretch and finished well for second money. "I wanted to sit in second, but it was slow going, so I went to the front," said winning jockey Jose Lezcano. "[Trainer] Helen [Pitts] told me he could come from anywhere. He was very nice to ride." 

Fourth to Cosmonaut in a Keeneland allowance Apr. 21, the dark bay made a positive impression in his first Golden State appearance, finishing runner-up in the 14-furlong Round Table H. at Hollywood Park June 16. Third in the GII Sunset H. July 15 and in the GII Del Mar H. Aug. 26, the homebred bested Isipingo (Horse Chestnut {SAf}) to take the GIII C. F. Burke H. over course and distance Oct. 28. He was most recently third to Sunriver and Champs Elysees (GB) in the GI Hollywood Turf Cup and was favored in his six-year-old debut. Patiently handled by jockey Garrett Gomez at the back of the leading group. Spring House commenced his rally on the turn. A bit short of room at midstretch, he was tipped out three wide and pulled clear as much the best. "Those were legitimate fractions they were going up front and this course is soft right now," the winning jockey said. "I was comfortable with where I was." The winner is possible for the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic Mar. 29. Defending champion Obrigado (Fr) (Enrique {GB}) was scratched due to the ease in the ground. He atoned for that defeat with a perfect-trip victory in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. at Churchill Nov. 24.

Cool Coal Man (Mineshaft), seventh at 5-2 in the Kentucky Jockey Club, returned to action with a good-looking second-level allowance win over Golden Spikes (Seeking the Gold) over course and distance Jan. 26. On the negative side, he loses John Velazquez to Make the Point (Menifee), who tries two turns for the first time off a 3 1/4-length allowance win over seven furlongs Jan. 24. The consistent Elysium Fields (El Prado {Ire}) added blinkers in his latest and took a nine-furlong maiden by eight lengths Jan. 19. The form of that race was franked when the runner-up Admirality graduated this past Thursday at Gulfstream. Z Humor (Distorted Humor) is back on just eight days' rest, having run a flat fifth in the Sam F. Davis S. at Tampa Feb. 16.

Chilean import Hussonet provided a Group 1 double for the Hunter Valley farm as Weekend Hussler franked his spring efforts with a dominant Oakleigh Plate win and Reaan gave trainer David Hayes a third straight Blue Diamond victory. Reaan, a A\$375,000 Inglis Easter purchase for Shadwell Australia, won on debut at the country track Bendigo Oct. 20 before finishing runner-up to Exceedingly Good (Exceed and Excel (Aus)) in the G3 Maribyrnong Plate Nov. 3 at Flemington. A last start winner of the Blue Diamond Preview Jan. 26 at Caulfield, the easy-going colt settled fourth from the rear here. He surged forward in the stretch to score by a long neck from well-backed stablemate All American. Jockey Dwayne Dunn has had four Blue Diamond rides and has won aboard all four, starting in 2005 with Undoubtedly (Aus), followed by the Hayes-trained Nadeem (Aus) in 2006 and Sleek Chassis (Aus) in 2007. "Reaan is a laidback horse who saves his best for race day," Hayes said. The top two will point for the Apr. 19 G1 Golden Slipper S.



Trainer Ross McDonald was relentlessly bullish in the lead-up to Weekend Hussler's 2008 bow, insisting that backing the imposing gelding was "better than bank interest." He added, "If you have got one house, put it on and you will have two. He is a super horse. I've said since he won the Ascot Vale that he is the best I've trained." The first three-year-old to win the Oakleigh Plate in 37 years, Weekend Hussler had captured the G1 Caulfield Guineas Oct. 13 and the G1 Ascot Vale S. Nov. 3. Favored while taking on his elders in his 2008 debut, he was with the tail-enders early. Jockey Brad Rawiller kept the leggy bay out of trouble, hooking out wide to avoid being boxed in as he flashed past the field to win in hand. "He was explosive," Rawiller said. "All week everyone tried to find a reason he could be beaten, but we had them covered a long way out." The winner has the G1 Newmarket H. at Flemington Mar. 8 on his immediate program, followed by the G1 Randwick Guineas Mar. 29 and the G1 George Ryder S. Apr. 19

Already a stakes winner twice at Kyoto, favored Admire Aura was beaten a neck when runner-up in a Group 3 event at the track Jan. 3 in his latest start. The bay colt rated off the pace while racing wide early this time. Frontrunning Silk Famous still had daylight on the field at midstretch, but Admire Aura hit his best stride in the final furlong, getting to the front in the shadow of the wire and edging clear. Admire Fuji closed late to get second. Vodka (Jpn) (Tanino Gimlet {Jpn}), winner of the Japanese Derby and a bang-up fourth in the G1 Japan Cup last year, bobbled at the break and was far back early. The four-year-old filly came running down the lane, getting her last three furlongs in :33.80, but came up short and had to settle for sixth.

CURLIN WORKS AT NAD AL SHEBA Horse of the Year Curlin (Smart Strike) tuned up for his 2008 debut at Nad Al Sheba yesterday morning, breezing a half in :50.50 under exercise rider Carlos Rosas. Scott Blasi, assistant to trainer Steve Asmussen, was on hand to supervise the move. "Curlin gets over the ground here really well," Blasi said. "And he's anxious to do something. He did things the right way [yesterday] morning, and I think Steve will be pleased." The Kentucky Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association is providing transportation to the rally. Earlier this month, newly elected Gov. Steve Beshear introduced a bill that called for as many as 12 casinos in the state, with seven at racetracks; the subcommittee countered with a revised proposal that would license nine casinos, five of them at the tracks.

ANTHONY DELPECH LEAVING HONG KONG

Jockey Anthony Delpech, who gained recognition for his partnership with the now-retired Vengeance of Rain (NZ), has requested an immediate release from his jockey's agreement with the Hong Kong Jockey Club, according to a statement from the Club. Citing the retirement of the 2007 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic win-

ner, and having ridden just 15 winners from 146 mounts during the current racing season, Delpech has requested an immediate return to his native South Africa to spend time with his family. A rash of suspensions has caused the rider to miss 22 of this year's 44 race meetings. "It has been very tough to get going at all this season and, with so many days of suspension, opportunities here have become few and far between, in the last year anyway," Delpech told South China's *Morning*

Post. "I did think about leaving last year, but I hung in mainly because of Vengeance of Rain. But now that he's retired, I think it's time to move on. There's no sour taste for me--Hong Kong has been great for me, but things do come to an end. It's given me the best horse I think I'll ever ride, some incredible moments, and the Hong Kong people have been fantastic. But I don't really see a light at the end of the tunnel as far as opportunities go." The request now goes before the Licensing Commitee of the Hong Kong Jockey Club for its consideration.
