COOL COAL MAN SPRINGS YOUTH UPSET

With the big horse still in the barn, Robert LaPenta's Cool Coal Man (Mineshaft) came from just off a moderate early pace, leaving Court Vision (Gulch) and favored Monba (Maria's Mon) in his dust in Sunday's GII Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream Park. While War Pass

was getting ready to tackle allowance foes one race later on the card, Cool Coal Man represented the smoking hot team of LaPenta and trainer Nick Zito in the day's main event and got the job done with a narrow victory over Elysium Fields (El Prado {Ire}). Reserved in fourth behind pedestrian early splits of :23.56,

:46.93 and 1:10.80, the bay--partnered by Kent Desormeaux--launched his attack at the top of the lane, took over a sixteenth out and strode clear of Elysium Fields (El Prado {Ire}). Drifting out late, the colt was good enough to hold off that rival for a half length score. "We all really hustled for position going into the first turn," explained Kent Desormeaux. "We were fortunate to get in good position. I had to encourage him to stay on the rail. When he got the lead he started to look around and he idled. I stopped hissing at him for about 40 yards, and when I started back, he took off again. I was concerned about [Elysium Fields]. It's hard to sustain that kind of speed for a long time, but when we were galloping out after the wire he moved out again once he felt the other horse come up to him." Concerning the colt's next start Nick Zito said, "I can't say where or what race [Cool Coal Man] will run in, possibly the [GI] Florida Derby [Mar. 29]. He's not a big horse. He'd need to have a good 30 days from now. We'll see." Court Vision rallied from last to be an even third. Monba, squeezed near the start, never threatened the front rank and trailed home 12th. cont. p2

Relishing the wet track while going past a mile for the first time at Delaware Oct. 10, the \$200,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase galloped home an easy 10 1/4-length winner over the well-regarded colt Roman Emperor. Back in the winner's circle following a Churchill Downs allowance score Nov. 3, Cool Coal Man pressed the early pace, but faded to finish seventh in his

seasonal finale in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. Nov. 24. Given some time off following that effort, the sophomore kicked off 2008 in a nine-furlong allowance over this track Jan. 26. Settled in a tracking third early that day, he was all out to post a one-length victory as the 3-2 favorite.





"He's right on target for Dubai," trainer John Moore declared of the horse he says is the greatest he has handled after more than 20 years and almost 1,000 winners as a Hong Kong trainer. "The task now is to hold him at this level of form. If we can do that, he will have a good chance in the Sheema Classic." Viva Pataca is set to depart for Dubai Mar. 18. 



FUN IN THE SUN

Maybe they can print out a supplemental catalogue cover. Three graded-stakes winners have already emerged from the 2007 Calder Sale,

and yesterday's GII Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream added a fourth as Cool Coal Man (Mineshaft), an \$850,000 RNA from Kip Elser's Kirkwood consignment, came through for Robert LaPenta and trainer Nick Zito. Finishing third was Court Vision (Gulch), last year's GII Remsen S. hero, who was purchased out of the Scanlon Training Center draft for \$350,000. Both colts had been purchased by LaPenta's Whitehorse Stables as yearlings at KEESEP, along with A. Coglianese another colt you may have heard of:



War Pass

War Pass (Cherokee Run). Last year's unbeaten juvenile champion made it a late double at Gulfstream for LaPenta as he strolled home in a mile allowance.

War Pass and Court Vision were both prepped by David Scanlon, but the former was withdrawn prior to this sale last year. "He got an ankle chip getting ready for the sale and we wound up taking him back, doing the surgery and taking care of him," Scanlon explained. "Turned out to be a blessing in disguise." He added, "We're fortunate to have a lot of horses on the farm, so we've got a pretty good measuring stick, and we've a lot of good clients. The group we had last year we were pretty high on. War Pass, he was an absolute nobrainer. There were some non-obvious horses like the Gulch colt [Court Vision]. He was always a nice horse, he was consistent. There's always a lot of hoops to jump through, and it's always nice to see it turn out."

While War Pass may have missed his date in the Calder ring, his baby brother by Monarchos will sell as hip 113. "He's a nice colt--a little bit different, being by Monarchos, and being a May foal he's still a little young," Scanlon continued, "but I'm kind of amazed, being that young, how he's gotten to the sale and continued to thrive, and is going in the right direction." The son of Vue (Mr. Prospector), the May 3 foal sold for \$200,000 as yearling to Zito, as agent, and breezed in :10 2/5 Friday (video). "It's very hard to be a War Pass, but I think he's going to be a very nice horse," Scanlon said. "This is probably one of the best [consignments] that I've ever brought down. Hopefully, at the end of the day, next year I'll have a few more superstars to talk about."

Many buyers are probably thinking the same thing. The Scanlon barn was in a constant state of activity Saturday. "We all agreed was the busiest day that we've ever had in our lives," Scanlon admitted. "There were a lot of people out, and I think the new format is encouraging people."

As far as having one breeze show, Scanlon offered, "You know, it's tough. Everybody, I'm sure, if you didn't go fast, wants a do-over, but it's very fair. It's good on the horses, and I think it's actually good on the buyers-they can get their work done; it's very convenient. It fits them, and it fits for the horses, too, and that's the main thing. Whatever benefits the horses, benefits us."



Success Breeds Success...

At last year's Calder sale, Hoby Kight led over a twoyear-old colt by Storm Cat that had been acquired as a yearling for \$1 million. That colt wound up topping the

sale at \$2.5 million and, doing business as The Leopard for owners Derrick Smith and Michael Tabor and trainer Todd Pletcher, capped 2007 with a win in the GIII Generous S. at Hollywood. It's been a pretty good run for Kight and his wife, Layna, over the past few years at this sale. Forest Danger, sold by the couple for \$900,000 in 2003, became a Grade I winner for Aaron and Marie Jones, as did Diplomat Lady, a \$400,000 purchase by Chris Paasch from the Kights in 2005. MGSW Tiz Wonderful headlined the 2006 draft, selling for \$475,000 to

Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Stables. It's usually a small but select consignment for the Kights.

"I sell 12 or 13 horses a year, not 40 or 50," Kight said during a rare quiet moment at his barn Sunday morning. "To me, this is the premier sale to buy racehorses in the world--and not just two-year-olds--because you get to see them move. You've got the pedigrees; no one brings fixer uppers here. Them days are over."

Kight continued, "A horse has got to look good, be correct, vet good and work good, or you don't get nothing for 'em. So the days of deals are behind us. It's like Jimmy Gladwell said last year, 'Everybody left standing was good.' That's why this sale is so good-there are so many good horses. There are horses for different tastes--some people don't like this, some don't like that, but they all work fast."

A veteran pinhooker, Kight explained a bit of what he looks for at the yearling sales. "I want a racehorse body with a lot of leg," he said. "I know that's what everyone says, but I want a fast horse with leg--that's what I want. Because most of the time, those horses can carry their speed. I want a big horse; I don't really buy little horses anymore. It just works for me. I always work quarters--I want them to work good, gallop out good; for me, it's just easier to do that."

Indeed. Kight's hip 135, a Pulpit colt out of Actceptional, earned a bullet for his quarter-mile work in :21 at Friday's breeze show (video). "All year long, he's just been one of those horses that thought he was terrific--he just thinks he's hot stuff," said Layna Kight, who's had a leg up on all of the members of the consignment. The Pulpit colt cost the Kights \$100,000 at KEESEP as part of a slightly new approach by the couple.

"Hoby and I were going to buy some horses ourselves, but we were not going to spend a lot of money," she explained. "In the past, we've had partners on every horse."



A certain chestnut filly, though, made them change their minds. "Hoby is crazy about the Storm Cat filly," said Layna. That Storm Cat filly is hip 102, a daughter of the Alydar mare Trail Robbery, making her a half-sister to GISW Pohave.

"Don and Pam Mattox--well, really, Hoby and Don--decided that they wanted another horse for sure that they felt would bring over a million dollars when they sold it," Layna added. "That's why they ended up paying that much for a horse [\$450,000]." Hoby added, "I was thinking I was somewhere between [\$400,000 and \$500,000]; it's just hard to give north of [\$500,000] for a filly to bring to a two-year-old sale. Now, if it was a colt...

"But she's as good a filly as I've ever had or been around. She's fast, real classy and has lots of pedigree--there's no reason she shouldn't be a stake horse and go on to be a mama to some great horse one day."

Produced by a full sister to the dam of GISW Cat Thief, the attractive chestnut completed her quarter-mile breeze in :21 3/5 Friday at the breeze show.

In Case You Were Wondering...

When asked to tab his best prospects for Tuesday's sale, Dean DeRenzo didn't hesitate. "We have, I think, the best colt and the best filly in the sale," he stated genially Saturday afternoon.

"Hip <u>228</u>, the Speightstown colt out of Holiday Runner, is one, and the other one is [hip <u>129</u>] Elusive Quality filly out of Xtra Heat--that's her right there," DeRenzo added as the attractive dark bay stood up for a prospective buyer. "They've done everything right, they're quality horses, and we brought them here to be at the top of the market. Everything's worked out--the one breeze show was wonderful; it made it a lot easier on the horses, so we're happy about that."

It's no secret that everyone on the grounds loves Speightstowns, but this flashy chestnut has a tough act to follow. He is the second foal from his graded-stakes-placed dam Holiday Runner (Meadowlake). Her first, a filly by Street Cry (Ire), brought \$1 million at this venue a year ago.

"She had her first start a couple of weeks ago [finishing third for Darley], and Kiaran McLaughlin thinks she might be the best filly he's got," DeRenzo said. "She wants to go long. So we brought him here, and he's as good or better than her; it's kind of nice that this mare is throwing these kinds of foals. She has a good Ghostzapper [yearling filly] coming up, and she'll be carrying a Dynaformer this year."

Holiday Runner is owned by SJB Stable, but is part of a foal-share arrangement with DeRenzo and partner Randy Hartley.

"We put up the stud fee, so actually we own half of the babies, but not the mare," he explained.

Bred in the name of Gibraltar Group, hip 228 went through the ring at KEESEP; Hartley/DeRenzo signed the ticket for \$400,000.


"With this colt, we just bought out the partners," he added. "That way we can come to the two-year-old sales with some really quality horses."

There's certainly no denying DeRenzo's affection for Speightstown, the 2004 champion sprinter and a freshman sire this year. "I'm a big believer in him--I wish I owned a share in him because I plug him pretty good," he admitted. "But they're so consistent--with five of them, we have a good measure. They're all very similar horses."

DeRenzo continued, "I think they've kept that stud fee tremendously reasonable. We even took another season this year from WinStar when we didn't have a mare--we were going to go buy a mare for him, that's how much we liked him. We said, 'We'll go get a mare for him, just please give us a season.'"

Hip 228 went his eighth Friday in :10 (video).

The Xtra Heat filly is special to DeRenzo as well. "We had Xtra Heat--bought her as a weanling, sold her as a yearling, so she holds a special spot for us," DeRenzo said about the champion by Dixieland Heat. "We look at her foals every year, and this is the only one that we liked so far."



He added, "She's great looking. She cost us a lot of money--we paid \$425,000 for her as a yearling, which

is the highest we've ever paid for a filly. But we really went after her because she fit our profile perfectly. She's a late foal, Apr. 30 foal, but she's big, she's robust. We knew at the farm that she would be at the top, and I think we've talked to enough customers--buyers--early

on in the year, and she met their expectations."

Like the Speightstown colt, the filly went in :10 (video). DeRenzo continued, "I thought the breeders of [the] Xtra Heat [filly] were brilliant going to Elusive Quality--that really makes things happen for that family; it's a great, great cross. Everything really came together--we thought, 'We've got the right sire line for this mare, we've got the right racemare, we've got the right individual--we're going to have to reach in and buy her.'"

He added, "We were fortunate that [the bidding] was able to stop at \$425,000 for it be a good buy for us."



Buzz Word at the Juvenile Sales...

Bloodstock agent Buzz Chace is no stranger to the two-year-old in training sale's game. Responsible for purchasing GI Carter H. winner Forest Danger for

\$900,000 on behalf of Aaron and Marie Jones at the Calder sale in 2003, the New Jersey-based agent also secured MSW Amazing Buy for \$350,000 for Ernie Paragallo's Paraneck Stable at the venue in 2004. Chace and Paragallo have also teamed up to make their mark while pinhooking at the juvenile sales. The collaboration started in 1997, when Chace selected a son of Kris S. from Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga Sale. The colt, later named Adonis, was acquired for \$285,000, but went un-

sold for \$475,000 at Calder one year later. Paragallo held on to him and, carrying Paraneck's black-and-red silks, Adonis went on to score in the 1998 GI Wood Memorial S. Three year's later, Chace led all buyers at the 2000 Fasig-Tipton Maryland yearling sale. Among his purchases was a small, compact dark bay by Wild Again, bought as a pinhook prospect for Paragallo. Secured for \$190,000, the colt was offered at the 2001 Fasig-Tipton Calder sale and recorded a solid profit, selling for \$250,000 to agent Richard Galpin. That price proved to be a bargain when the Kentucky-bred, named Sarava, went on to score in the following season's GI Belmont S. "In my mind, Ernie Paragallo was the first to step up and buy expensive yearlings to

pinhook," Chace said.
"At the time, people
were still buying less
expensive horses and
making small profits. He
paid top dollar so he
could get a top return.
He really changed the
game." The agent added,
"I've bought a lot of very
nice horses from the
two-year-old sales. Consignors have really



stepped up and refined their techniques, and the quality of horses at these sales has really improved." Chace has plucked a solid string of Grade I winners out of the two-year-old sales, including a quartet of runners for Terry Finley's West Point Thoroughbreds: Dream Rush, Flashy Bull, Lear's Princess and Irish Smoke. "I've been fortunate to work for very good people like Terry Finley and Lewis Lakin," he said. "We've done very well, so we will keep coming back."








An Officer and a Gentleman...

Bruno Deberdt and Rudy Delguidice's Excel Bloodstock has a pair of colts catalogued Tuesday, including hip 141, a son of Officer who sped an eighth in :10 Friday (video). "While we were pleased by his performance [Friday] we weren't surprised by it," Deberdt said. The partnership picked him up for \$85,000 at KEESEP. "Initially, we thought to put him in a sale in California," Deberdt explained. "I'm from the West Coast, and we like to target both coasts. He's by Officer, so we thought that would work. But he just showed so much ability, so early, that when Fasig-Tipton was coming out doing inspections, they said, 'We really like this colt, we'd like you to consider putting this colt in this sale; we think he'd fit.'Deberdt added, Rudy's had him from day one [for breeder Sabine Stables] and he's always been such an honest horse." Delguidice added, "He's just genuine. You don't go over there hoping--they are what they are." The scopy bay, produced by the Black Tie Affair (Ire) mare Arctic Affair, is a half to stakes-placed Nootka Island. While his drill went smoothly, the other Excel colt, a son of Van Nistelrooy, wound up going in :10 3/5 (video) after a bit of a mishap. Still, Delguidice remains in favor of the one-breeze format. "We had a misfortune--one horse got away, but I'm still all for one preview. They're hard enough on horses. I was around when there was only one preview, and everything worked out good." There's been plenty of action at the barns. "I'm not sure if there are morebuyers," said Deberdt, "but it's been busy. You've got the right people here, anyway. You've got a lot of good horses comingout of here, and that attracts the buyers."

GI Frizette S. heroine Adieu, purchased by Team Coolmore for \$300,000 at the February sale in 2005, Mike and Britt Mulligan didn't waste any time resting on their laurels, returning to Calder the following year with an equally gifted filly, a daughter of Johannesburg, Coolmore, with agent Demi O'Byrne again at the trigger, was back, and this time

went to \$1.1 million to aquire the athletic filly. Their backing proved to be well justified. Named La Traviata, she rolled to victories in her first three starts, including Monmouth's Post Deb S. and the GIII Victory Ride S. at Saratoga, before tasting defeat for the first time in the Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint over a rain-soaked Monmouth oval Oct. 27. "We thought [La Traviata] was very fast and she performed well here," said Mike Mulligan of the filly, who covered an eighth in :10.1 before the sale. "We've had several good horses here and, with most of our better horses, we knew they were nice all along. She was one of those." Does Leprechaun have a diamond in this year's consignment? "We're really excited about the group of horses that we have here," he said. "We had a very solid sale at OBS [February], and we felt we had a very solid group of horses coming down here. They performed extremely well on the racetrack, and also seem to line up on the shank very

well. They're being very well received." One of those is hip 254, a colt by first- crop sire Speightstown out of the Holy Bull mare La Comete, "I think that's the obvious horse," Mulligan said. "I'm pretty confident; he galloped out three-eighths faster than any horse in the sale." The flashy chestnut, who is a grandson of GISW La Guerieire, negotiated a furlong in :10 flat Friday (video). "We knew that he was special," explained Mulligan of Horsephotos the colt, who was bought for



\$150,000 at the Saratoga sale last August. "He is going to be a very serious horse." According to Mulligan, the operation's primary mission is to produce legitimate runners, and not just those that look flashy leading up to the sale. "Usually our horses that perform well on the racetrack go on and run well," said Mulligan. "Our motto is 'Performance After the Sale.' Not only do we want our horses to perform well in the breeze show to maximize the financial opportunities for our investors, but we also want horses to run on for our buyers. If you talk to most people around here, I think we have a good reputation that we've earned over the last decade. We try to maintain that by selling quality racehorses, by continuing to sell runners."
