FRIDAY IS LADIES' DAY AT BREEDERS' CUP

In a major change in format, the 2008 Breeders' Cup World Championships will feature all five of its races for female horses on the Friday card, it was announced Wednesday. The two-day Breeders' Cup event will be held this year at Santa Anita on Friday, Oct. 24 and Saturday, Oct. 25. The Breeders' Cup also announced that it has renamed the GI Breeders Cup Distaff the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic, which will be the premier race on the Breeders' Cup Friday program. It marks the

first time a major Thoroughbred event in North America has focused an entire day on female championship racing. In addition to the championship events at the track, the Breeders' Cup plans to develop a series of festivities designed to promote the new Friday format, including cause-related programs focused Ginger Punch, final winner on women's health. Friday's lineup will now include the \$2-million A Coglianese GI Juvenile Fillies, \$1-million Ju-

venile Fillies Turf, \$1-million F/M Sprint and \$2-million GI F/M Turf. "The initial response from the Breeders' Cup family, including ESPN, our marketing partners, nominators and trustees, has been extremely supportive and enthusiastic," said Breeders' Cup President and CEO Greg Avioli. "By shifting some of our traditional Saturday races to Friday, we ensure that Friday stands on its own as an international competition of the highest level. This new format provides a great stage to showcase the talents of the best female Thoroughbreds in the world." Breeders' Cup officials are in discussions with several prominent non-profit women's organizations and expect to announce partners in March. The 2007 renewal of the Breeders' Cup was the first conducted in a two-day format. In December, three races were added to the program: the \$1-million Turf Sprint, Juvenile Fillies Turf and \$500,000 Marathon. The Juvenile Turf and Dirt Mile, run on Breeders' Cup Friday in 2007, will now be run on Saturday.


WALDROP TESTIFIES BEFORE CONGRESS Alex

Walrop, president and chief executive officer of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, testified before the United States House of Representatives Wednesday about performance-enhancing drugs in



horse racing. Waldrop spoke in front of the Energy and Commerce Subcommittee on Commerce, Trade and Consumer Protection in a forum called "Drugs in Sports: Compromising the Health of Athletes and Undermining the Horsephotos Integrity of Competition."
Waldrop was part of a panel

that included speakers from the U.S. Olympic Committee and the National Collegiate Athletics Association, among others. In his testimony, Waldrop presented a Thoroughbred racing community which was generally unified against performance-enhancing drugs in competition, and addressed the current hot-button issue of steroids in racing. He commented, "In 2007, the [Racing Medication and Testing Consortium] and the [Association of Racing Commissioners International] completed development of a model rule that will effectively prohibit the use of anabolic steroids in racehorses. While FDA-approved anabolic steroids may have some therapeutic value in treating racehorses, horsemen, tracks and breeders all agree that racehorses should not compete on anabolic steroids." He added, "The model rule has been or is being adopted by Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Delaware, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, New York, Pennsylvania, Virginia and Washington. Florida, Kentucky, Maryland and Texas are among the many other states that are expected to support the model steroid rule, as well. We continue to work with the remaining jurisdictions to secure their support." Waldrop fielded questions from two U.S. Representatives, including committee member Ed Whitfield (R-KY). Whitfield noted that the racing industry actively urged congress to pass the Interstate Wagering Act, allowing for simulcast wagering among states, and asked Waldrop if he thought it was unreasonable for Congress to require racing jurisdictions to adopt a uniform policy by a certain date to be included under the act. "No, it would not," Waldrop responded. Waldrop later elaborated on the issue when a similar question was posed by another representative, saying that he felt federal intervention on the issue was unnecessary. "We think we're getting that confluence of an active group of states getting behind a model rule, not because of Congress, but because of our owners, who spend billions of dollars on horses, and horseplayers, who wager billions and want the sport to be on the up and up." NO REGRETS FOR RAYMAN At two-year-old auctions, speed is usually king. In many cases, a swift breeze translates into high six- and seven-figure price tags. Owner Drew Rayman threw caution to the wind at Tuesday's Fasig-Tipton Calder sale, offering a trio of juveniles which merely galloped under tack, or "Zephyrbreezed," instead of being asked for a top effort. While Rayman elected to buy back all three horses--he withdrew a fourth horse prior to the sale--he sees Tuesday's results as something other than an abject failure. "I am not at all disappointed," said Rayman. "I didn't expect much more than what happened here. People got to see something a little bit different and I think that it'll stick in their minds if next year we come to the sale and do the same thing and the horses that we slow-breezed the first time turn out to be nice horses." Employing the services of trainers John Kimmel and Ken McPeek last summer, Rayman purchased three youngsters at the Fasig-Tipton July sale and added one to his portfolio at the Saratoga sale (see graphic below). Following his purchase of the Candy Ride filly last summer, Kimmel, a veterinarian, reasoned that too much is asked of young horses leading up to the juvenile sales and that Rayman would be experimenting with this new approach at the 2008 juvenile sales. With results now in hand, Rayman remains committed to his philosophy. "A lot of people said to see the horse in its natural gait was nice--they enjoyed it," Rayman stated. "Everyone comes to the show to see a breeze, so they were a little taken aback. It might take a year or two for it to catch on." He added, "I think it went well. I bought back all the ones that Zephyr-breezed to race and they're all doing extremely well and they're mentally perfect and I'm going to go on and race them all. I've got a feeling that I've got a couple here that are going to go on and do very well." Rayman, who races under Rayzin the Bar Stable, said that the Menifee colt would be turned over to McPeek. The three fillies will be split between Kimmel and Christophe Clement.



Committee Approves Casino Bill:

A proposed constitutional amendment that would allow up to nine casinos in Kentucky was approved yesterday on a 7-2 vote by the Committee on Elections, Constituational Amendments and Intergovernmental Affairs. The approved version of the bill would not guarantee a certain number of casino licenses to horse tracks, as Governor Steve Beshear's original proposal did. Under the committee-approved measure, up to five casinos could be located at Kentucky race tracks. The proposal now goes to the full House for consideration. If passed by both the House and Senate, the measure would be placed on the ballot for the approval of state voters.
