An evenly-matched field of 14 will line up for today's

Tiago (Pleasant Tap), winner of last season's GI Santa Anita Derby and GII Swaps Breeders' Cup S., looks poised for a big run following two in-the-money finishes. Racing over speed-favoring surfaces, the Moss homebred rallied to complete the trifecta in the GII San Fernando S. Jan. 12 and followed with a second-place finish in the GII Strub S. Feb. 2. After undergoing reno-

vations in early February, the Cushion Track has played more friendly to closers lately, and that should certainly help his cause here. "I haven't seen a track that he doesn't like," trainer John Shirreffs told Daily Racing



A Group 1 winner at this trip in his native country, Argentine champ Storm Military tries his luck at the highest level in the U.S. for the first time. The six-yearold is two-for-four on this side of the Equator, taking an optional claimer at Hollywood in November and, after running fourth in the Dec. 30 GII San Gabriel H., winning the Thunder Road H. over this course and distance Feb. 2. The dark bay is four-for-seven at a mile and sixfor-10 on the turf. Stablemate Out of Control makes his first appearance since capturing the Oct. 7 GII Oak Tree Mile by a nose. The five-year-old was four-for-eight last year, also scoring in the GII American H. at Hollywood in June and running second to After Market in the GI Eddie Read H. at Del Mar in July. Third in the GI Hollywood Turf Cup in 2006, Artiste Royal made just three starts last year. The ridgling took the GI Clement L. Hirsch S. going 10 panels at Oak Tree in his second start of the season, and was last seen running eighth in the Nov. 25 G1 Japan Cup. He tries a flat mile for the first time.



Bookmakers agree, figuring the five-time Group 1 winner can rally over her preferred trip of 1600 meters, and have installed her favourite at A\$4.50 despite the fact the bay has not won in her last six starts. Hayes regards Miss Finland as the pick of his Futurity trio, which includes perennial Group 1 placegetter Niconero, an unlucky second in the G1 Orr S. at his most recent run, and Molotov. Well-fancied Publishing is raced by high-profile owner Lloyd Williams and owner-breeder John Singleton. The colt has overcome two throat operations and other niggling problems to score an eye-catching win in the G3 Carlyon Cup over 1400 meters Feb. 23. The winner of three-of-four starts at Caulfield was initially slated to contest the Newmarket H. at Flemington Feb. 8, but came out of last Saturday's race in such fine fettle connections opted to back him up in the Futurity.


NEW APPROACH STRAIGHT TO GUINEAS

Trainer Jim Bolger has indicated Europe's champion juvenile New Approach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), winner of last term's G1 National S. and G1 Dewhurst S., will point straight to Newmarket's G1 2000 Guineas without the benefit of a preparatory outing. "New Approach is very well and I haven't had a two-year-old thrive like he has," the Coolcullen trainer told setantasports.com. "He's a massive-looking horse at this stage and he's put on a lot of weight. He has muscled up well, he's finished all his slow cantering now and he's ready to step it up. His mind is good and his body is good so I couldn't be happier with him. He'll go directly to Newmarket. I think he's both a Guineas and a Derby horse. He's well proven over seven furlongs, so I can't see that the Guineas trip is going to be any problem for him. Having trained the dam [Park Express {Ire}]--she got a mile and a half well--and given his sire obviously got a mile and a half well, it would be a surprise if he did not get a mile and a half. I don't really see anything that was behind him [last year] beating him in the future, providing we can turn him out well." Switching attention to G1 Phoenix S. and G1 Moyglare Stud S. victress Saoirse Abu (Mr. Greeley), the trainer revealed a similar plan of action. "She is also in at Newmarket, that's her big target at the moment. If she goes there, she will not have a run beforehand." Bolger also houses Parknasilla Hotel Goffs Fillies Million heroine Lush Lashes (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) at his Co. Carlow base and issued an update on another of his star distaffers. "[Lush Lashes] is quite a talented filly, but she's been lacking experience and will probably have a Guineas trial. We have to see whether she'll go to the Guineas at Newmarket or The Curragh. No prep run wouldn't really bother me--she was able to win the Goffs Million on her debut--and I think she's the only filly to win a million at her first attempt. I can see her getting a mile and a half and that opens up more possibilities for her."

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a \(\text{\text{\text{\text{will}}}} \) will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races. Purses for Canadian races are in Canadian dollars.

REMEMBERING RICHARD GALPIN

The passing earlier this week of Newmarket International's Richard Galpin has left a great void among friends and foes, colleagues and competitors. Here is a small cross-section of those sentiments:



"Richard Galpin was around the sales for as long as I've been around them, which goes back 30 years. Though I never worked with him myself, I know lots of people who did, and every good conformation judge I know regarded him as one of the greatest of his generation. He proved it right up to the end, unearthing horses like David Junior and Wilko. There are trainers who produce jockeys in what are essentially academies for riders; Richard Galpin was an academy for 'judges.' Besides his legendary status in that regard, on a personal basis I always found him someone who understood the game. He was a real character, and we'll miss him at the sales a lot. I would hope his contributions could be commemorated in some way."

1 Champs Elysees (GB) Danehill Dominguez 117


Champs Elysees (10-1) was a decent horse in Europe, has been about the same in his two U.S. starts, and at this point is overrated due to having faced the weak older horse turf division in California. He's never run fast enough to make a dent here, and with a grassy pedigree, there's no reason to think he'll jump up on dirt. We'll be looking to bet against this horse if he runs on grass outside California, and maybe even if he stays there.

2 Tiago <u>Pleasant Tap</u> Smith 119

Tiago (6-1) had both strong figures and pattern last year for a summer 3yo, but hasn't developed at all since then. He's co-highweight here, and once you adjust for the weight he will carry (five pounds equals one Thoro-Graph point), it becomes clear that he would need a significant new top to even have a chance of winning this. He'll probably break through at some point, but it's certainly not worth taking him as one of the favorites, since even if he does run a new top, it might not be enough.

3 Big Booster Accelerator M Baze 115

Big Booster (15-1) had been solid but not spectacular throughout his career, then threw a new top for Mitchell in the Goodwood before laying off. His comeback was okay, and this gelding could be set for a return to his top, which at the weights could get him a piece of this at a big price.



4 Medici Code (GB) Medicean (GB) Pedroza 115 Medici Code (15-1) was a solid grass 3yo, and his dirt try in Indiana was better than it looked. We do expect him to do well in the California turf division this year, but he would need a big jump here.

5 Awesome Gem Awesome Again Flores 117
Awesome Gem (4-1) started getting good late at three, and was extremely solid last year. He came off a three-month layoff with a decent effort, and it would be a real shock if he didn't at least return to his top, and possibly break through. With a good draw, this gelding is a strong contender.

6 Monterey Jazz Thunderello R Baze 119

Monterey Jazz (5-1) managed to win some races with modest figures, before last time blowing the doors off the Strub. If he runs back to the figure he ran that day he will have a big shot here, even at the weights, but off the big new top his pattern is screaming "bounce," and his ability to get the distance is suspect. As the favorite, he's definitely not for us.

7 Zappa Afternoon Deelites Rosario 114

Zappa (15-1) won a weak GII in January despite not running fast, and then ran up the track last time running the same figure. He's never run fast enough to be a factor here.

- 9 Celtic Dreamin Game Plan Solis 115
 Celtic Dreamin (20-1), like Monterey Jazz, was very solid as a 3yo before exploding last time out, though to not quite as big a figure. We actually think this colt has a slight chance to pair up, but even if he does it only makes him a borderline contender.
- 10 Heatseeker (Ire) Giant's Causeway Bejarano 116
 Heatseeker (8-1) is one of the few horses in history
 to improve after leaving the Frankel barn. In fact, two
 of his three races over the Cushion for Hollendorfer
 have been good enough to give him a very big shot
 here. Coming off a big effort on only three weeks rest,
 he's about 50/50 to bounce, but if he pairs up he will
 be very tough indeed. Strong contender.
- Student Council Migliore 117 Kingmambo Student Council (12-1) didn't really start racing until he was four, and then got very good last summer despite managing to lose four times in a row. At that point, we recommended his purchase to Millennium Farms, and he made us look good at Del Mar and Hawthorne before packing it in at the top of the stretch in Japan. His return in the San Antonio was far better than it looked--he was spotting weight, and raced outside both turns (3w3w, upper left). He should be set for top effort now, and with more reasonable weight (and hopefully with a better trip) Student Council is a strong contender.
- 12 Go Between Point Given Gomez 118
 Go Between (6-1) has always been solid, whether on grass or synthetics surfaces. In his last, he jumped forward to the best figure anyone in this field has ever run, which obviously means a repeat would give him a big shot, even drawn outside. But a bounce is more likely, so let's call this one a borderline contender.
- 13 Great Hunter Aptitude Espinoza 115
 Great Hunter (15-1) jumped to a new top behind
 Street Sense as a juvenile, but that effort took an awful
 lot out of him, and he hasn't been able to return to that
 level in the following 16 months. That is an extremely
 unhealthy pattern, and he's also not that fast.

14 Air Commander Point Given

Air Commander (20-1) turned a new top combined with a weight pull into a GII win last time. But even a repeat of that effort would leave him well short of competitive with these.

Bottom Line—Tiago and Monterey Jazz will be heavily bet, making this a very playable race. Awesome Gem, Heatseeker and Student Council are the main contenders.

Ok, let's get the obvious questions out of the way: Miramax chief Harvey Weinstein, the man who brought the world The English Patient? Thankfully, no, not *that* Weinstein. Second: Weinstein's uniquely named operation, Turtle Bird Stable? That one has a pretty simple answer.

"Well, we live in the country now, and I like turtles, and my wife likes birds," said a chuckling Harvey Weinstein, a Brooklyn-born and -raised New Yorker who now calls an upstate town near Woodstock home.

Haven't heard of Turtle Bird Stable? If Weinstein is correct, that will change in a few hours when his four-year-old colt **Sir Whimsey** (Jump Start), a \$75,000 purchase at the OBS March Sale in 2006, takes on four others in this afternoon's GII Gulfstream Park H.

"I know as the owner I'm biased, but I think he's the best horse in the race," Weinstein said Thursday night over dinner with his wife Bernice and trainer Jimmy Toner, who joined forces with the Weinsteins about six months ago.


Should he pull off the mild upset against the likes of graded stakes winner Fairbanks, Sir Whimsey would mark the quick ascension of Weinstein's Turtle Bird from a single-horse claiming operation three years ago to one which, Weinstein hopes, will be able to play at the sport's highest levels.


An investor in real estate and other ventures, Weinstein first got into racing in 2005 when his stock broker pitched the idea of claiming a race horse together. As it turned out, the stoke broker decided not to sidle up to that table, but Weinstein was game.

"I'm a gambler by nature, that's why I first got into it," Weinstein explained.

Weinstein claimed a horse, the appropriately named Initially, at Aqueduct for \$25,000. In his very first start for Turtle Bird, Initially stumbled and lost his rider and was claimed away \$35,000. Undeterred, Weinstein came back to claim Initially for \$25,000 in his next effort. Initially made his next seven starts for Turtle Bird, and while the Suave Prospect colt didn't win, he did stoke Weinstein's passion for racing.

"After that, I thought, 'Enough of this, I want to win the Derby!'," said Weinstein.


With a desire to build his stable into stakes performers, Weinstein went to work buying yearlings and two-year-olds in training. One of his first buys was Sir Whimsey, who broke his maiden in November of 2006 before hitting the board in both the Count Fleet and Whirlaway S. last year for trainer Mike Miceli. Subsequently moved to Toner's barn, Sir Whimsey ran second in the Don Rickles S. at Aqueduct Dec. 13 before a good-looking two-length allowance win at Gulfstream Jan. 16.

And while Weinstein hopes you'll be seeing plenty more of Sir Whimsey in graded stakes company, he says there is one place you're not likely to ever see the colt: in claiming company.

"When I got into this seriously, I said that if there's one thing I want to do, it's take care of the horses," he said. "If they can't compete in stakes company, then I'll retire them and find them homes. I want to be able to take care of them, and the only way to do that is to keep them out of claiming company."

These days, Turtle Bird boasts 18 horses. That includes a handful of three-year-olds, two four-year-olds and a five-year-old, with the rest yearlings. Weinstein's most recent purchase, on the advice of Toner, was a Sweetsouthernsaint/Potluck Dinner colt for \$150,000 at the OBS February Sale.


