



Mott Weighs Options for Court Vision...

Trainer Bill Mott outlined several options for IEAH Stables and WinStar Farm's Court Vision (Gulch) following a third-place finish in his most recent start in the GII Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream Feb. 24. Trainer Nick Zito confirmed that Robert LaPenta's Da'Tara (Tiznow) will make his next start in the GI Florida Derby at Gulfstream Mar. 29. The dark bay was third in a one-mile allowance here Feb. 22 after breaking his maiden going nine furlongs in his third career start Jan. 5. "He's better than you might think he is," warned Zito.

Texas Wildcatter Gets Blinkers for Gotham...

Texas Wildcatter (Monarchos), who is slated to contest Saturday's GIII Gotham S. at Aqueduct, will race for the first time in blinkers. "I've talked to Seth [Benzel, assistant to Todd Pletcher] and the exercise rider, and they tell me he's a lot more aggressive and 100 percent focused now," explained the colt's regular pilot Norberto Arroyo Jr. "Believe me, I've got so much confidence in this horse, and I think the blinkers are going to take him to the next level." A debut winner at Arlington Park last August, the colt was fifth behind Cool Coal Man in a Churchill allowance in November before closing out the season with a 10 1/2-length score in a Philadelphia Park allowance Dec. 28. A homebred by Stonerside Stable, the grey finished third behind Barrier Reef and Roman Emperor in his seasonal bow in the Whirlaway S. at Aqueduct Feb. 2.



NJ CASINO SUBSIDY RENEWED; HORSEMEN DON'T SEE AS LONG-TERM SOLUTION A deal

was reached Monday evening between casino operators in New Jersey and Governor Jon Corzine which will funnel \$90 million over the course of the next three vears into the state's horse racing industry. In exchange for the subsidy, which will be used to supplement purses and support the state's breeding industry, racing officials have agreed not to pursue Video Lottery Terminals (VLTs) at the tracks. "I'm pleased to announce that after extensive discussions we have crafted an agreement that will extend a three-year lifeline to the horseracing industry," Corzine said in a statement. "The announcement is the result of months of discussions involving members of the governor's office, the Assembly Speaker and the Senate President. Both the equine industry and the casino industry play important roles in New Jersey, from preserving open space to attracting visitors, and it was essential to strike a balance that will allow both industries to thrive." Horsemen groups had a lukewarm response to the announcement. John Forbes, vice president of the New Jersey Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, offered some historical context while opining on the issue. "[Former Governor Jim] McGreevey's position was, 'Casino gaming has hurt the horse industry,' and he said to them, 'Pick your poison: either I'm going to give them slots, or you're going to give them some money. Whichever you want," said Forbes. "So the casinos gave us the money. Corzine's position is, 'We're not going to give you slots, and we're not going to give you money.' So it kind of put the casinos in the driver's seat. But really, it's not enough money. At this point, with Philadelphia Park and New York in the region, we need to fund 141 days and have a daily purse distribution of between \$350,000 and \$400,000. The current deal gives us around \$300,000. So it's better than nothing, but it's not going to keep us competitive, especially if New York gets slots going and Philly Park continues to go the way it goes."

Kingston Park Stud has a colt by Argentine stakes winner Westbridge (Gone West) out of homebred mare Glacarium (Aus), whose dam is a half-sister to Scandinavia, the dam of G1 winner Magnus (Aus) (Flying Spur {Aus}) and the stakes-winning two-year-old Wilander (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}). Another from this draft is a filly by Kingston homebred, Fairy King sire King of Roses (Aus), out of fellow homebred G1 VRC Oaks winner Kensington Palace (Aus). Little Plains Stud also has an interesting draft with youngsters such lot 784, a Johannesburg filly out of a half-sister to Group 1 winner Unearthly (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}). Last year's Premier II recorded an average of A\$30,406, up 23 percent, for 85 sold, with a top price of A\$125,000 for a General Nediym (Aus) filly purchased by David Hayes' nephew Tom Dabernig.



EXCEED KIN TO ENTER STUD Enemy of Average

(Aus) (Fusaichi Pegasus--Patrona, by Lomond), a halfbrother to freshman sire sensation Exceed and Excel's (Aus) (Danehill), will stand at Kevin Pendergast's Riverdene Stud in NSW in 2008. An A\$800,000 Easter purchase for Scott Perrin of Billabong surfwear company fame, Enemy of Average won a listed event on debut in Feb. '06. But his career was hampered with a recurring back injury and he finished in the frame only once more in 10 outings, when second at Caulfield three starts later. He was a distant last in the G1 Ascot Vale S. won by Gold Edition (Aus) in 2006 and raced only once more, resuming in April 2007 but beating only one home. The bright chestnut retires with A\$49,450 earnings. The Kia-Ora Stud owned mare Patrona died in September 2006, aged 12, and in foal at the time to Elusive Quality after missing to Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) the previous two seasons. Before coming to Australia, Patrona produced SP Open Magnet (Honour and Glory), a winner in Puerto Rico. Champion sprinter Exceed And Excel (Aus) was her first Australian foal; purchased by trainer Tim Martin for A\$375,000 at Easter 2002 and was later secured by Darley for a reported A\$22 million. Patrona is also the dam of the \$120,000 Redoute's Choice (Aus) filly To Be Surprised (Aus), raced by Nick Moraitis to record three wins; and of Patronize, a A\$750,000 Easter yearling purchase for Martin who retired with two wins from four outings.

NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL

FARM BILL IN SPOTLIGHT THIS WEEK

House and Senate leaders have targeted this week to move on the Farm Bill, as the extension of the 2002 Farm Bill expires March 15. Senate Agriculture Chairman Tom Harkin (D-IA) and House Agriculture Chairman Collin Peterson (D-MN) have said they would favor a short-term extension if Congress has a basic deal by March 15, but has not worked out the details.

If the deal is not final by March 15, passage of the Farm Bill would likely be pushed into April, as Congress takes a two-week recess beginning March 17.

In early December, the Senate passed its version of the Farm Bill, which includes the Equine Equity Act (EEA). The House passed its version of the Farm Bill late last summer, without the EEA. The two sides are now working on a compromise of their respective versions.

EEA would lower the capital gains holding period for horses from 24 months to 12 months and accelerate and make uniform the depreciation of race horses from seven years (in most cases) to 36 months over four tax years.
