'LIL DEVIL ON THE DIRT

Maybe all he needed was a change in surface. Godolphin's **Jalil** (Storm Cat), who was knocked down

to Sheikh Mohammed representative John Ferguson for \$9.7 million at the 2005 Keeneland September Sale, is looking more and more like a star in the making as he took his third straight start on conventional dirt in smart fashion. Jalil, sent off the second choice in yesterday's G3 Al Maktoum Challenge Round 3, part of Nad

al Sheba's Super Thursday in Dubai, tracked a few lengths off while four wide, then ranged up to join the favorite Lucky Find (SAf) (Rich Man's Gold) at the 300-meter mark before extending clear under the urging of jockey Frankie Dettori. Jalil's win puts him on track for the Mar. 29 G1 Dubai World Cup, where he'll likely meet U.S. Horse of the Year Curlin (Smart Strike). The victory also capped a huge night for Godolphin and Sheikh Mohammed, who was on hand to watch two of the stable's other stars, Diabolical (Artax) and Elusive Warning (Elusive Quality), win the G3 Mahab Al Shimaal and G3 Burj Nahaar, respectively.

Jalil Coming Around...

With a price tag a John Ferguson sneeze away from eight figures, all eyes were on Jalil when he made his debut as a two-year-old at Newmarket in October of 2006. He ran sixth that day, beaten three lengths, and wasn't seen again until the following May, when he came up a half-length short when second in a maiden at the same course. Jalil broke his maiden in his third career start, a 10-furlong Ripon event in June, but he was out another four months before returning to be beaten just a head in a Lingfield handicap in October-his first start on a synthetic track. Shipped to Dubai for the winter, Jalil turned a corner in the mild climes of the country, and especially over Nad al Sheba's dirt track. He made quick work of two handicaps on the main track, winning by daylight Feb. 8 and Feb. 21, and with yesterday's strong effort he spiced up what looked to be a one-horse affair in the Dubai World Cup. "He's learning to be a really good horse, and clearly loves the sand, and the further he goes, the better he is," said Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford. "We gave him a chance, as he needed time last year, and it's paid huge dividends now. He'll go straight to the Dubai World Cup, and we'll see Curlin there. He needs to improve again, but he hasn't stopped yet." Winning rider Frankie Dettori echoed those sentiments. "He's taken to the dirt really well, and keeps improving and maturing," said the Italian. "He's got to raise the bar again, but he's done nothing wrong so far, and fits into the Dubai World Cup field without any problems." 

Pace factor Jay Peg dug in stubbornly in the final meters, but was unable to keep Lord Admiral at bay. Vincent's son Charles O'Brien said, "That was a career best. We had planned to go back on Tuesday, but we'll have to re-evaluate now, and look at the [G1] Dubai Duty Free [Mar. 29]." Always prominent from the far side of the course, Diabolical responded when asked approaching the final furlong and was well clear the remainder. Afrashad (Smoke Glacken) was slow to begin and was never in touch, finishing 15th.

BIG PLANS FOR BIG BROWN Big Brown (Boundary), tabbed as a 🗘 "TDN Rising Star" 🗘 following a dazzling 12 3/4-length allowance victory at Gulfstream Wednesday, may start next in the GI Blue Grass S. Apr. 12 or the GI Florida Derby Mar. 29. IEAH Stables purchased a controlling interest from Paul Pompa, Jr. following the handsome bay's 11 1/4-length maiden tally over the Saratoga lawn at first asking in September. "We've been optimistic with this colt for quite some time, knowing the talent he has and what he showed in his debut win," IEAH Stables Co-President Michael lavarone said of Big Brown, who registered a 104 Beyer Wednesday. "We'd been looking forward to seeing him run, and this was exactly what we wanted to see--if anything, much more--in his first race back from a layoff. It certainly looks like he'll be on to bigger and better things, and we'll hope he can achieve as the competition gets tougher."

Hidden Brook? Not So Much...


Given its name, Hidden Brook Farm sure has been awfully conspicuous lately. Last week, the Kentucky-based operation, launched five years ago as the brainchild of five horsemen--Jack Brothers, Dan Hall, Mark Roberts, Sergio de Sousa and Danny Vella--was in the news when a colt it had purchased on behalf of Paul Pompa, Jr. as a yearling brought the top price at the Fasig-Tipton Calder Juvenile Sale in Florida. By Street Cry (Ire), the \$425,000 Keeneland September acquisition was knocked down to John Ferguson for \$2.1 million.

Then on Wednesday, another horse Hidden Brook originally purchased for Pompa--Big Brown--made a splash not in the sales ring but on the track, demolishing a field of Gulfstream Park allowance foes by 12 3/4 lengths.

Those successes follow on the heels of Backseat Rhythm's exploits. The daughter of El Corredor, yet another Hidden Brook purchase for Pompa, was second in last year's Gl Frizette S., third in the Gl Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and now is being considered for the Gl Kentucky Oaks. Backseat Rhythm was a \$75,000 KEESEP purchase who was later bought back at Barretts March Sale for \$240,000.

Now, nobody's suggesting (not *really*, anyway), that Hidden Brook change its name to Out-in-the-Open Brook, or something like that, but still...

"Well, anytime you show that you can step up and play in the big leagues, people tend to notice," Brothers laughed yesterday. "We've had a lot of success with our purchases from the start, and we've had a lot of support from a variety of clients. But selling the sale-topper at Calder was a step up, having Backstreet Rhythm get a couple of Grade I placings under her belt and emerge as an Oaks candidate, and now with Big Brown on the Triple Crown trail, it lets everyone know what we're capable of."







CAN YANKEE BRAVO PULL OFF THE BIG WHISKY INDIA NOVEMBER? By Lucas Marquardt

The three-year-old **Yankee Bravo** (Yankee Gentleman), whose name draws from the U.S. Military Alphabet, will try to keep his unbeaten record intact in Saturday's GII Louisiana Derby. Cheering him on will be two of his owners, David Bienstock and Charles Winner, business partners and friends who have been active in the horse business together for the last 15 years.

Bienstock runs Target Enterprises, a media buying and planning company. Winner owns and operates two companies: Winner & Associates, a strategic planning and crisis management company, and Winner & Mandabach Campaigns, the largest ballot measure company in the U.S. (the company handles the ballot initiative campaigns during elections).

As horse owners, Bienstock and Winner have quietly enjoyed considerable success on the track, and they've been good pals long enough to allow for exchanges like the following:

Interviewer: If you don't mind me asking, how old are you two?

Bienstock: Well, Chuck is a 112, and, to put it one way, I don't yet qualify for Medicare.

Winner: But you can go ahead and average our ages and say we're 40.

Chuck, er, Charles, in fact, is not 112--he's 67. Bienstock is 63. But when they're talking about their horses, both men might as well be in their forties. Or twenties. Their love of racing is plain to see and, as Bienstock says, "We're in it for the right reasons."

Winner bought his first horse back in 1986, eight years before Bienstock joined in. The first horse they purchased together was Fine N' Majestic, who captured the 1994 renewal of the (then GIII) California Derbythe same race that Yankee Bravo won in his last start.

"And of course after that I said, 'Hey, this is fun. Let's buy more horses!'" said Bienstock.

Since then, the men estimate, they've partnered on "hundreds" of horses together and have employed such top trainers as Bob Baffert, Bobby Frankel, Neil Drysdale and Kristin Mulhall.

However, it is a protege of their first trainer--Hall of Fame jockey Willie Shoemaker--with whom the majority of their racing stock is based. Irish expatriate Paddy Gallagher, a top assistant for Shoemaker, trains Yankee Bravo and has conditioned a good number of Bienstock and Winner's best horses.

That includes the multiple graded stakes winner Domestic Dispute, whom the pair bought, along with a few other partners, in a private transaction shortly before Funny Cide's Kentucky Derby victory in 2003. Domestic Dispute could do no better than 10th, beaten 9 1/2 lengths, in that year's Run for the Roses in his first start for the men, but returned in 2004 to capture the GII Strub S. over During.

The men, with an impish tip of the hat to hindsight, are more than happy to explain how they actually bought Domestic Dispute with the Strub in mind.

Now at stud at Northview Stallion Station in Maryland, Domestic Dispute has drawn Bienstock and Winner into the breeding game, too. The duo still own a significant share of the son of Unbridled's Song and have supported him with mares.

"We had a few before that, but we went out and purchased a lot of mares for him," explained Winner. "We've got a lot of his babies [now two-year-olds] this year. We'll race all over with them. I think we've got three in Pennsylvania, two in Maryland, two in Kentucky and six in California."



Other top racehorses Bienstock and Winner have owned, in whole or in part, include Grade II winner Walkslikeaduck, graded stakes winners Evil's Pic and Fantastic Spain, the good turfer Terroplane (Fr), and the very talented filly Three Degrees (Ire), a Grade II winner who was three times placed in Grade I company. Tragically, Three Degrees broke down in the shadow of the wire in last May's GI Gamely S. while still managing to cross the line a valiant fourth. The daughter of Singspiel (Ire) was euthanized on the track.

Bienstock and Winner's latest success, in addition to Yankee Bravo, is the emerging turf star Daytona (Ire), who is also competing Saturday at Fair Grounds in the GII Mervyn Muniz Jr. Memorial H. The men just recently bought into the four-year-old, a European import who recorded three graded wins last term, including a tally in the GI Hollywood Derby. Daytona, trained by Dan Hendricks, recently ran his winning skein to four with a relatively facile win in the GIII Fair Grounds Breeders' Cup H. in February.

While that effort will leave Daytona as the deserving favorite Saturday, Yankee Bravo has more to prove despite his unbeaten record.

A \$17,000 Fasig-Tipton July yearling in 2006, Yankee Bravo was sold twice as a juvenile in Europe: for 16,500gns to Gill Richardson Bloodstock and for £5,000 to Lawley Wakelin Bloodstock. Such modest prices don't catch the eye, but a six-length romp facing maiden auction foes on the turf at Redcar last September piqued the curiosity of California-based bloodstock agent Richard Duggan, who arranged for the private purchase of Yankee Bravo on behalf of Bienstock, Winner and the Canadian Richard Bonnycastle of Harlequin Ranches. Duggan also kept a piece of the horse for himself.

Moved to Paddy Gallagher in California, Yankee Bravo came through as the tepid 3-1 pick in his Stateside debut, the one-mile Eddie Logan S. on the grass at Santa Anita Dec. 29. The dark bay had to overcome traffic trouble that day, just as he did when he took his next, the Jan. 27 California Derby at Golden Gate. Yankee Bravo got off last in his first start on a synthetic track, but wove through the crowd and was up under Alex Solis to win by a length.

The victory was enough to get Yankee Bravo's connections thinking Kentucky Derby, but they recognize there are more questions than answers as the colt readies for his conventional dirt bow.

"So far, he's done everything we've asked him to," said Winner. "He's doing everything right, but we'll see how he does on the dirt. That's one of the primary reasons we picked this race; to find out how he handles it. He's raced well on artificial surfaces and on grass, and we need to see how he does on real dirt tracks."

Less of a concern in Winner's mind is Yankee Bravo's distance limitations. Though he's already a winner around two turns, Yankee Bravo is by the promising young sire Yankee Gentleman, whose forte in his racing days was blazing speed over shorter trips. Still, Winner is confident.

"I'd be very, very surprised if he can't go plenty long, just watching him work and watching his stride," said Winner. "We're not worried about distance."

And then there's the competition. In one of the deeper renewals in recent memory, the Louisiana Derby has drawn a Grade I-caliber field that includes likes of **Pyro** (Pulpit), **Majestic Warrior** (A.P Indy) and **Tale of Ekati** (Tale of the Cat). But again, Winner and Bienstock are philosophical.

"You have to assume, when you enter into these types of races, you're going to face tough fields," Winner explained. "If you can't beat them, you should shouldn't be running against them."

Bienstock and Winner are looking forward to the possibility of having another Derby starter, but are making sure they enjoy every step of the way, even if the path doesn't lead to Louisville.

"It's such a pleasure to have a friend to do this with," said Bienstock. "We've traveled all over the world together with our wives, and we're really in it for the right reasons. We just love racing."





The time away was partly by design and partly out of necessity. "She had a little setback, had a bit of a fever and it lasted a little longer than we expected," Adger explained. "But given the inconsistency of the track at Santa Anita, we just thought we'd slowwalk her early in the year." 

Pennsylvania Works to Eliminate Steriod Use in Horses:

After Pennsylvania's Horse and Harness Racing Commissions announced last summer that testing for anabolic steroids would officially begin Apr. 1, the state headed by Governor Edward Rendell, has been working to eliminating steroid use in horses and harness racing. To that end, the commissions took a sampling of horses raced over a two-month period that ended Feb. 22 in order to enforce the newly adopted policy. With 2,061 samples tested, 98.8 percent were negative for anabolic steroids. "We are the first state in the region to begin testing for anabolic steroids in racehorses, and we are setting a national standard by ensuring that our racehorses are clean of steroids and any other performance-enhancing substances," Rendell said. Following the most recent results, both commissions will perform additional testing in March and will provide trainers with the test results, in an effort to offer information and guidance prior to the Apr. 1 enforcement date. By July 1, any confirmed positive test of anabolic steroids will result in loss of purse, a \$2,500 fine, and a 45-day suspension. A second violation will be the loss of purse, a \$5,000 fine, and a 90-day suspension. A third violation would result in a revocation of the racing license

Dual Classic winner Funny Cide as well as a special program which allows the rehabilitation of prisoners through the care of retired Thoroughbred horses will be featured on HRTV, Sunday, Mar. 9 at 9 p.m. EST. The 2003 GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. winner currently serves as a stable pony to trainer Barclay Tagg. "He spent his whole life on the racetrack, standing in deep straw, eating nice hay, being pampered," Tagg said. "Everybody says, 'Why don't you turn him out in a field and let him be a horse again?' It would be like if I wanted to retire and they told me to go and live in a cave and be a person again." In association with the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation, prisons in Iowa and New York teach prisoners how to care for horses through hands-on instruction. "These guys, all their lives, have bullied or pushed their way to get what they want," stated Terry Mapes, a warden at the Newtown Correctional Facility in Iowa. "So when they come down to deal with the horses, these huge animals, they can pull them all they want, but the horse gives them only what they're willing to give. So, they have to learn other techniques to get them to comply with what they want done."

APPROACH HEADS GUINEAS ENTRY

Jim Bolger yesterday issued an upbeat bulletin on Princess Haya of Jordan's acquisition New Approach (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) as he is prepared for the G1 Stan James 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 3, for which he is among 92 entries. Unbeaten at two and successful in both the G1 National S. and G1 Dewhurst S., the chestnut will head straight to the 200th renewal of the £375,000 mile Classic, according to his conditioner. "New Approach is very well and has done exceptionally over the winter," he said. "He has put on a lot of condition and most of that has now been honed into muscle. He looks very well at the moment--a much stronger horse than last year. He has enough racing experience already and will go straight to Newmarket for the Guineas." Also in the list are the colts who followed him home in the Dewhurst, including the runner-up and third respectively in Fast Company (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), who will now race in the Godolphin silks, and Stonerside Stables' Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality). The latter was reported on course for the contest by trainer John Gosden yesterday, with a prep a possibility for the previously impressive G3 Solario S. "He could go for one of the trials--the G3 Craven S. [at Newmarket Apr. 17] or the G3 Greenham S. [at Newbury Apr. 19]. Or, if the ground isn't right, there is no reason why he couldn't do a good gallop and go straight into the Guineas. There would be no point in having a trial on soft ground. He was a powerful horse anyhow last year, but he has done what you would want him to do through the winter. He has grown a little bit, filled out and strengthened through his neck." Another notable is the G2 Norfolk S. and G2 July S. winner Winker Watson (GB) (Piccolo {GB}), who is also on target according to conditioner Peter Chapple-Hyam. "Winker Watson is very well and has lengthened more than he has grown," he commented. "In a couple of weeks' time, we will make a decision as to whether he will head straight to the Guineas or whether he will take in a trial first. I think he will need a trial as he has been off the track for such a long time." While Godolphin holds a strong hand with 12 entered including the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere hero Rio de la Plata (Rahy) and G1 Racing Post Trophy winner Ibn Khaldun (Dubai Destination), Aidan O'Brien has 10 entered including Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's G3 Killavullan S. winner Jupiter Pluvius (Johannesburg) and the G2 Coventry S. winner Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo). Magnier, Tabor and Smith may also be represented by the Tommy Stack-trained G1 Prix Morny scorer Myboycharlie (Ire) (Danetime {Ire}), while David Wachman has entered the inaugural Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf scorer Nownownow (Whywhywhy) to strengthen the Irish challenge.

CALL ON COURSE FOR DERBY

Last year's G2 Beresford S. winner Curtain Call (Fr) (Sadler's Wells) was yesterday reported on track for a tilt at the 229th running of the G1 Vodafone Derby at Epsom June 7. Featuring in the list of 125 sophomores headed by Princess Haya of Jordan's unbeaten Champion Juvenile New Approach (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) at yesterday's stage, Curtain Call is being geared towards a prep ahead of the mile-and-a-half Classic. Owned by a partnership including bloodstock agent Patrick Cooper, the now Luca Cumani-trained colt received favorable mention yesterday. "Luca's won the Derby twice before, so he was an obvious choice as a trainer," Cooper explained. "He'll have one run before lining up in the Derby, which will either be the [May 5] G2 Prix Hocquart at Longchamp or the [May 10] G3 Lingfield Derby Trial. It will be the trainer's call as to where he runs. He's settled in well at Luca's and has filled out a lot over the winter. He's never going to be a huge big horse and we think he will handle Epsom and get a mile and a half well." Last year's G3 Prestige S. winner featured among the 74 fillies entered for the £375,000 mile Classic at the latest stage and trainer John Gosden is happy with her progress. "If it suits, she can run in a trial but she doesn't have to," Gosden said. "If I think she needs another week or 10 days, she'll get it." Aidan O'Brien has a squad of seven headed by Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's G1 Fillies' Mile heroine Listen (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Diane Nagle and Magnier's G2 Rockfel S. winner Kitty Matcham (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), while Jim Bolger has six involved including Ennistown Stud's G1 Pheonix S. and G1 Moyglare Stud S. winner Saoirse Abu (Mr. Greeley) and his own Goffs Fillies' Million scorer Lush Lashes (GB) (Galileo {Ire}). "Saoirse Abu has wintered well and is well forward," the Coolcullen conditioner said yesterday. "She looks on target for the 1000 Guineas on May 4, which is also the target for Lush Lashes. She would have a Guineas trial beforehand, although I am not sure where that would be at the moment. She has wintered well and seems a much stronger filly this year--as you would expect." Alain de Royer-Dupre has entered His Highness the Aga Khan's impressive G1 Prix Marcel Boussac winner Zarkava (Ire) (Zamindar), while Pascal Bary will be represented by Stefan Friborg's G1 Cheveley Park S. heroine Natagora (Fr) (Divine Light {Jpn}).
