He seems fine, although he did have some cuts on his Equi-Photo left leg...that he probably sustained



when jostled around leaving the gate. We'll take some X-rays and run some additional tests and see what happens this week. If everything passes, we'll go on from there." The colt could still make his next engagement in the Apr. 5 GI Wood Memorial at Aqueduct. "If all the tests are negative and he's doing okay, he'll go back into training and work, and if he doesn't work good then forget about it," Zito added. She edged closer on the far turn and was cutting into the winner's advantage late. The two could meet again in the May 2 GI Kentucky Oaks.

Eight Belles boasts no less than champion Straight Deal as her fourth dam. The rugged mare started an amazing 99 times, won 21 races and earned \$733,020. She captured 13 stakes races while competing on turf and dirt, and was the top older mare on both surfaces in 1967. Straight Deal's descendants include Grade I winners Desiree, Adored, Qualify and Scorpion, and top sire Belong to Me.



Freddy Nossar's Deepak, pegged by the fans as the slight choice in the international field of 12, posted an impressive wire-to-wire victory in South America's prestigious G1 Latinoamericano. The four-year-old gave Peru its fourth victory at home and sixth overall in the 24th renewal of the multinational race. Under a perfectly executed ride from the stables top rider Carlos Trujillo, the gray colt was sent to the front on an unchallenged lead and proved to have enough left in the stretch to win convincingly. George Strawbridge's Chilean St. Leger winner Kurbat closed ground late to earn second. Peruvian representative Polizonte was a distant third. A prominent Peruvian owner, Nossar is a two-time winner of the prestigious G1 Carlos Pellegrini with Laredo (Per) in 1993 and Fregy's in 1996. Nossar also campaigned Argentina's 1996 Copa de Plata winner Kimba (Per) and Peru's 1988 Horse of the Year and champion turf horse El Duce (Per). An estimated crowd of more than 40,000 fans were in attendance Saturday, including Adena Springs' Andy Stronach, and members of the Keeneland Association, co-sponsors of the race. Sao Paulo's Jockey Club Hipodromo Cidade Jardim will stage the Gran Premio Latinoamericano in 2009.



"There's no doubt this horse has the talent to ship all over and win a lot of money," said Stutts. "We're of course looking to do well in the Florida Derby, and if he can win that, you know where we're going next." Also pointing for the \$1-million Florida Derby, Face The Cat (Tale of the Cat) went five-eighths in 1:00 2/5 at Palm Beach Downs yesterday. The chestnut colt won a maiden race at Gulfstream Jan. 4 and added an allowance score Jan. 30 for owners David and Marilyn Randal and trainer Helen Pitts before being sold privately to Satish Sanan's Padua Stables. Padua, of course, was one of the connections that acquired Curlin from Pitts and Midnight Cry Stable last winter. Face The Cat has been transferred to trainer Todd Pletcher. The Randals still hold a minority share in the three-year-old.



MIDTERM REPORT CARD

On the eve of the OBS March Selected Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training, and with three major sales already in the books, this year's juvenile season is in full swing. And compared to last year's figures at the same point in time, the marketplace appears not to have changed much in 12 months. A total of 428 horses have collectively gone through the ring at the OBS February Sale, Fasig-Tipton Calder Sale and Barretts March Sale, 68 fewer than in 2007. Of those, 264 horses sold for \$62,126,000. That equates to an average of \$235,325 per horse, a mild 4.4-percent dip. In March of 2007, consignor Hoby Kight's The Leopard (Storm Cat) was, and would remain, the season's top price on Coolmore's \$2.5-million offer. A year later, it is Coolmore rival Darley which has paid the most for a juvenile in training. Sheikh Mohammed's team landed a Street Cry (Ire) colt for \$2.1 million. Both horses sold at Fasig-Tipton's Calder Sale in Miami.

One of the things several consignors have mentioned in recent days is the noticeable decline of 'breakout' horses--those two-year-olds who find themselves at the center of spirited bidding duels between three or four, or even more, interested parties. The stats seem to bear this out. For example, at last week's Barretts March Sale, three horses realized \$500,000 or more. In 2007, nine eclipsed the mark. Fasig-Tipton's boutique Calder event saw four horses reach the seven-figure plateau, down from seven in 2007. The OBS February Sale, however, seemed to buck the trend; this year, 15 horses realized \$250,000 or more, up from 13.

One thing, of course, that the cumulative figures don't speak to is the tale of each sale. OBS February enjoyed robust gains, with its average jumping 18 percent and the median soaring 25 percent. Weirdly, those numbers where mirrored almost exactly by the Barretts March Sale. But at Barretts, the figures were down, not up (see box below).

The 2008 Fasig-Tipton Calder Sale, which outgrossed the other two sales combined and thus has the biggest impact on cumulative figures, was the sale most congruent with its 2007 counterpart: average was down a negligible 2.2 percent, while median took a more significant hit of eight percent.

One thing is for sure: with 460 youngsters cataloged for the OBS March Sale, we'll know a lot more about the current state of the juvenile market by the end of trading Wednesday.

W.D. North Joins Forces...

W.D. North has enjoyed plenty of success on his own, having consigned horses like MGSW and G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen hopeful Diabolical, as well as Mutanabi, a Wild Rush colt who sold for \$1.6 million in 2004. But North recently has been joining forces with fellow consignors Niall Brennan, Tony Bowling and Bobby Dodd and Halcyon Hammock.

"The business is getting really tough, so I've been partnering with other agents if I land on the same horse that they do," the 34-year-old commented. "Instead of bidding against them, I decided to join them. I like my business to be up front. The reason why everybody knows that I'm partners with everybody is that I insist when I own a horse that my name is attached to that horse. I doubled inventory this year--a lot of times two heads are better than one."

North purchased two horses with Brennan last year, including hip 448, a daughter of Yonaguska who worked a bullet quarter mile in :20 4/5 at the second under-tack show.

"I like the way Niall conducts his business and how he trains horses, so we decided to buy a couple of horses together," North said. "One we sold [at OBSFEB, a Pure Precision colt for \$100,000] and made a profit on, and we got the fastest work at this sale with the other one."

He also acquired a pair with Bowling and Dodd. The first of the duo, a Hold That Tiger colt out of French Factor, sold for \$400,000 at OBSFEB to Steve Klesaris, agent for Puglisi Racing. The other, a daughter of Posse, is consigned as <a href="https://doi.org/10.1036/jns.1056/jns.1

North has also teamed with Halcyon Hammock on six horses, including hip 114, a son of Good and Tough. The chestnut worked a quarter mile in :21 3/5.

"Halcyon Hammock will be selling six horses in our partnership this year," North said. "They have them and are training them. They have one in this sale and the rest will be selling in April."

North got his start in the pinhooking business through Ricky Leppala.

"My dad was a horse trainer and I went to work for him and with Ricky," the second-generation horseman explained. "When I was younger, I sold horses through him that we owned together, and I kind of came up working with Ricky and [his ex-wife] Stacy. They hooked me up with Norman Adams, my first partner that put up money to buy horses."

Along with Leppala, North sold subsequent MGISW and stallion Delaware Township at the 1998 OBSFEB sale for \$110,000.

"Diabolical was probably the second best horse I've sold," he explained. "I owned half of Delaware Township with Ricky Lepalla. It doesn't show it in print, but I actually trained Delaware Township and Ricky sold him for us. We were partners on him, 50-50."

North and Leppala continue to sell horses together and offer hip 217, a daughter of Chapel Royal who worked a quarter mile in :21 3/5.

M & H Training Has it Covered...

Take a quick glance at the cover of the OBS March catalog, and it's easy to see the sale is coming off a big 2007. No fewer than nine March graduates secured Grade I victories last term, and two earned championships.

Flip in a page or two to the photo credits, and you'll learn that one operation--David and Katie McKathan's M

& H Training and Sales--consigned not one but three of the featured horses: 2007 grads Into Mischief, winner of the GI CashCall Futurity, and Goshawk Ken, the dominant winner of Japan's Asahi Hai Futurity S.; as well as 2006 grad Dominican, who posted the narrowest of upsets when he defeated Street Sense in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S.

David McKathan is quick to point out, however, that while Into Mischief, Goshawk Ken and Dominican were broken and trained by M & H, they were

purchased as yearlings by bloodstock agent Buzz Chace, who does the majority of the shopping for Terry Finley's West Point Thoroughbreds.

"It's embarrassing, but everything on that cover is his," McKathan laughed last week. (Chace, it should be mentioned, also purchased as juveniles two more of the cover horses, West Point's Grade I duo Lear's Princess and Irish Smoke, giving Chace a hand in five of the nine.)

M & H breaks and trains the West Point Thoroughbreds fleet, and when Finley jumped into the pinhooking game with Lewis Lakin (they operate as L&F Stable), M & H began training those horses, too. Into Mischief and Dominican were products of that partnership, McKathan said.

Ironically, one of the horses that Finley and Lakin failed to sell as a two-year-old has become one of West Point's biggest stars.

Last year, McKathan brought a son of El Corredor to the March Sale, where the \$95,000 yearling purchase failed to raise many eyebrows after two :10 3/5 works, explained McKathan.

Subsequent bidding never got past the \$95,000 mark, and the horse was led out of the ring unsold.

"And he turned out to be El Gato Malo," McKathan said.

Given his last name, McKathan's latest successes might be viewed as simply doing what his family does best.

Originally from Alabama, David, 55, is the nephew of longtime horseman Luke McKathan, a prominent pinhooker who is credited by David as the person who provided his schooling in the business.

"He taught me the ropes," McKathan explained. "We raced all over the country before we came here. He actually came to Ocala first, and I followed because, well, he was doing so good."

David's cousins--Luke's sons--are J.B. and Kevin McKathan, who also operate a successful pinhooking venture and who are associated with two Kentucky Derby winners in Silver Charm and Real Quiet.


Prior to settling in Ocala to focus on pinhooking, David held a wide assortment of jobs on the backstretch. He obtained his trainers licence at the age of 20 and trained for many years, and was even an outrider for a stretch on the South Florida circuit.

When he was about 40, McKathan launched M & H Training and Sales with his future wife Katie Haymanhence the M & H.

"She's from Ocala; she's a Florida-bred," David said of his wife.

Past horses that have sold out of the M & H draft include Grade I winner Lucky Roberto, Grade II winner Summer Note and GSP Atswhatimtalknbout, a \$900,000 juvenile who went on to be a fast-closing fourth in Funny Cide's 2003 GI Kentucky Derby.

Looking forward to the March Sale, McKathan says he has a good, well-balanced group, highlighted by a trio of L&F Stable pinhooks. They include hip 43, a colt by Read the Footnotes; hip 326, a colt by Pure Prize; and hip 407, a filly by Peace Rules. -LM

'HOOK' OFF TO A GOOD START

The website urbandictionary.com defines the phrase 'off the hook' as: something fresh and new (ie. literally right off the store shelf or hanger--the hook).

That's an apt description of the pinhooking operation that has chosen the phrase as its moniker. Off the Hook

is the burgeoning partnership between native New Yorker Joe Appelbaum and Venezuelan Carlos Morales. Launched in 2005, Off the Hook has grown in size and scope in the past three years, and last season was the seventh-leading consignor at the OBS March Sale with seven horses bringing \$1,046,000-a solid average of nearly \$150,000 per horse that put

them near the top among consignors in that category. Off the Hook hopes to continue the momentum this year with a draft that includes juveniles by the likes of Giant's Causeway, Lemon Drop Kid and Johannesburg.

But how did a horse-loving handicapper from New York with no actual hands-on experience with horses, who plied his trade as a football coach and then working with children's organizations, hook up with a trainer who was a dominant conditioner in his native country but who was a relative unknown in the States?

As is so often the case in racing, it was serendipity more than anything that drew Appelbaum and Morales together. Or, more accurately, a sizeable winning Pick 6 ticket.

Born and raised in New York City, Appelbaum began going to Belmont Park with his buddies as a teenager. In the summer, he and his pals would rent a house in Saratoga. After graduating Yale University, where he played football as a strong safety, Appelbaum began coaching college pigskin. He skipped around to a few universities as a quarterback and receivers coach, including Hofstra, where he tutored a small but gritty sophomore wide receiver--and future NFL star--named Wayne Chrebet. But as the Off the Hook website explains, "it became clear that August training camp was cutting into too much of the Saratoga meet."

Appelbaum switched careers, eventually becoming the president of Kids Interest Development Services Inc. before founding Oasis Children's Services LLC, businesses that provided school, camp and after-school programming for children in the Northeast. But he was still taking those trips to Saratoga.


It was during one of those vacations at the Spa that things took a turn for Appelbaum. One afternoon, he and a couple friends invested \$1,000 in a Pick 6 ticket. One by one, their horses began winning. And winning. And winning. And when the last race on the card was declared official, Applebaum and his friends had a slip worth \$110,000.

In a pragmatic move that would make the parents of any young 20-something proud, Applebaum and his friends invested a large portion of the winnings in claiming a racehorse. That claimer led to another, and for the next few years Applebaum was in and out of the racing business.

About six or seven years ago, he was in the hunt for a new conditioner when he met Carlos Morales, who, by the time he was 30, had several times claimed the leading trainer title in Venezuela before moving tack to Calder Race Course in the U.S.

Morales had reached a level of recognition with Yankee Victor, a son of Saint Ballado who Morales had purchased as a two-year-old in training for \$75,000. Yankee Victor won eight of 19 races, including the GI Met Mile, before being retiring to stud.

But when Appelbaum approached Morales, the trainer wasn't sure about training claiming horses.

"He said, 'Look, I don't know much about them, but I know I can find good young horses and develop them. We should go to Keeneland and I'll buy a yearling,'" said Appelbaum. "So that's what we did. We wound up selling the claimer off, put some money together and went to Keeneland September and bought a Siphon (Brz) filly."

The filly, later named Blitzen, cost them \$60,000 and was sent to Nick de Meric in Florida to be broken.

"A couple months later, Carlos called me and said that de Meric thought we should enter the filly in the Keeneland [April] Sale," explained Appelbaum. "I knew about two-year-old sales, but didn't really know anything about pinhooking. So I told him that we really wanted to race and weren't that interested. He said, 'Listen, I'll put up the entry fee, but you have to keep it open as an option.'"

That proved to be a smart move when, after being brought to Keeneland April, Blitzen turned in the fastest breeze for a filly at the first under-tack show. Buyers swarmed, and before Appelbaum knew it the hammer fell on bloodstock agent Buzz Chace's \$500,000 offer.

"And that was that. We were in the pinhooking game," said Appelbaum.

These days, Off the Hook has grown into a sizeable outfit based in Ocala--though Appelbaum still calls New York City home. Off the Hook has a 44-stall barn as part of the Eclipse Training Center, where Nick de Meric and Murray Smith, among others, are stabled. Off the Hook also boasts a 64-acre breeding facility, where it keeps and manages broodmares for itself and for outside clients.

After skipping both the OBS February Sale and Fasig-Tipton Calder Sale, Off the Hook will offer around 25 two-year-olds for sale this spring, including 10 here.

Of the decision to wait until March, Appelbaum explained, "We like giving them some time, and we often buy April and May pedigrees, and they can use some time. Plus it fits with Carlos's training. Because he came from the race track, I think, he's a very patient trainer."

Appelbaum added that Off the Hook has focused not only on yearlings with late birth dates, but also on late-developing pedigrees, too.

"One thing that I think sets us apart a little bit is that we generally look for horses, in pedigree especially, that are going to have some distance in them," he said. "We look for a more Classic-looking pedigree. If you look in our consignment for the March Sale, we have horses by Lemon Drop Kid and Giant's Causeway; horses you might not normally associate with pinhookers. Part of our philosophy is that A), we want our clients to be able to compete in the top races, which are often at a distance. But also, if those horses aren't the super quickest, you can understand why because they're not bred to do that."



"In the past few years, we had difficulty pinhooking the horses we bought for under \$40,000," Appelbaum explained. "So we wanted to cut them out of the portfolio. And there were some that cost us a little more that we wanted to take a shot on. But there were a couple at both Fasig-Tipton and Keeneland September that we were able to get early in the sale because, I think, guys were maybe a little reticent to buy that early. We were able to get some pedigree power that we wouldn't have been able to go after in the past."

One of the standouts in Off the Hook's March consignment is hip 196, a Lemon Drop Kid colt who was produced by MSW and GSP August Storm (Storm Creek). Procured for \$150,000 at Keeneland September, the colt wasn't extended to post a one-furlong breeze in :10 1/5 (video) at the first under-tack show.

"He's a beautiful horse," Appelbaum said. "He's got a pedigree that looks like he'll run on any surface and get a distance, but he's really quick. I thought his breeze was really impressive."

Another to keep an eye on, according to Appelbaum, is <u>hip 167</u>, a bay colt from the second crop of the Hennessy stallion Cactus Ridge.

"He doesn't have as much pedigree power as some of the others, but he's a New York-bred who went :21 2/5," said Appelbaum. "Since we got him, he's been any surface, anytime and anywhere. He's been a runner."





The Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup was billed as a "meetme-in-the-middle" event featuring Sacred Kingdom, winner of the G1 Hong Kong Sprint over six furlongs and Good Ba Ba, hero of the G1 Hong Kong Mile. The race didn't disappoint the Sha Tin faithful, but the same cannot be said for the connections of Sacred Kingdom, who watched helplessly as the world's top-rated sprinter never got a chance to run until it was too late and missed by a half-length. Good Ba Ba, in contrast, sat a wide trip from an outside draw and found no traffic whatsoever. "I wouldn't want to meet Sacred Kingdom again, so I hope he stays in the sprints!" winning trainer Andreas Schutz said. "Good Ba Ba is better over a mile, so to win today against such a great rival is tremendous." The winner goes in search of a fifth straight win in the G1 Champions Mile Apr. 27, while Sacred Kingdom may have raced for the final time this season. Click for a video replay: modem or broadband.
