OBS MARCH HOPES TO SUSTAIN MOMENTUM

The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company begins its two-day 2008 March Selected Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training this morning at 11:00 a.m. Long viewed as a 'racehorse' sale, a place to find hard-knocking runners for good value, March has evolved into an auction that the major players can't afford to miss. That's evidenced by the eight Grade I winners in 2007 who got their

beginnings as OBS March prospects. Chief among that group, and featured prominently on the cover of the March catalog, is last year's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint hero and Eclipse Award winner Midnight Lute (Real Quiet). The now five-year-old was offered by consignor Eddie Woods at the 2005 renewal, but

was bought back for \$290,000. The champion sprinter has now earned over \$1.6 million for owners Mike Pegram and Watson & Weitman Performance. Two graduates from last year's sale won Grade I stakes later in the season. The B. Wayne Hughes-owned Into Mischief (Harlan's Holiday), who was sold by M & H Training and Sales for \$180,000, won the GI CashCall Futurity. Irish Smoke (Smoke Glacken) was purchased by Buzz Chace on behalf of West Point Thoroughbreds for \$285,000 and went on to annex the GI Spinaway S. at Saratoga. Scanlon Training Center consigned Irish Smoke, who was later sold as a racing prospect for \$775,000 at the Fasig-Tipton November Sale. In addition Goshawk Ken (Bernstein) was named champion juvenile colt in Japan in 2007. The M & H Training and Sales consignee was sold to Durham Co. Ltd for \$160,000. The OBS March Sale really hit its stride two years ago, when the average eclipsed the six-figure mark for the first time. In 2007, the average was \$108,545, up 33 percent from the previous year, and that figure held well last year when the average was \$104,905. Though that figure was down 3.4 percent, March established a new record median of \$82,000, a healthy 9.3-percent boost from the previous year's record. OBS March cont. p2; Adena Springs sale ATW p1

CURLIN MARCHES TOWARD DWC

Having his final serious prep for the Mar. 29 G1 Dubai World Cup, **Curlin** (Smart Strike), with regular exercise rider Carmen "Carlos" Rosas in the irons, worked six furlongs in 1:13.54, at Nad Al Sheba Racecourse yesterday morning. Scott Blasi, assistant to

trainer Steve Asmussen, said the goal was to get the first furlong in :13 and change and the last in :12 and change, noting, "that's exactly what he did." The powerful chestnut, who began the move with an opening eighth of a mile in :13.40, completed his task with a

final furlong in :12.19. "That was his major move for the Dubai World Cup, and I couldn't be happier with how he went and the rhythm he is in," explained Blasi. "It was exactly what we had in mind, and he galloped out strong." The reigning Horse of the Year was a physically imposing colt during his three-year-old season, and Blasi indicated that the four-year-old has improved since his GI Breeders' Cup Classic triumph. "He's just a stronger, more mature horse," he said. "He's thicker-and he's put on weight in all the right places. He was a big horse as a three-year-old, but he's a lot bigger now." According to Blasi, Curlin will have one more timed workout before the Dubai World Cup, but it will not be as demanding as Monday's six-furlong drill.

Behind Candy Store, a Sweet Heart...

It can't be said that Katie O'Connor doesn't have her priorities straight. For the horsewoman, family comes first, everything else second. Just about a dozen years ago, O'Connor, then a full-time trainer at Woodbine, learned her 1 1/2-year-old daughter Allison had juvenile diabetes. Diabetes is always a serious condition, but in young children, the situation can quickly turn dire should they slip into hypoglycemic shock.

For O'Connor, it was a no-brainer. A day after learning the diagnosis, she decided to give up her training career at Woodbine and instead shift to a job that was less transient and time-consuming and one that allowed her to more closely monitor her daughter's health. She moved to Ocala soon after and began breaking and training yearlings. Later, she short-listed yearlings for pinhooker Donna Wormser and started to resell a few horses herself each year through other consignors, notably Hartley/DeRenzo.

Fast forward to 2004. O'Connor, a native of Canada who was initially exposed to the industry through show horses, had finally launched her own juvenile pinhooking operation when a series of serious family illnesses required her time and attention. Selflessly, she pulled the plug on her young venture and for two years focused on her kin once again. Cont. p3

"Whatever you're in, you have to be in 100 percent," O'Connor explained. "If not, then you don't do justice to the people you work for or the horses you have; certainly if you're looking after people, you have to be in that 100 percent, or they don't get the care they need."

But O'Connor is back on her own now and is doing business as the quirkily named The Candy Store ("The candy is the horses. See? They're sweet. And this is the store," O'Connor explains.)

If karma accounts for anything, the future certainly should be bright.

The Candy Store comes to the March Sale with a small three-horse draft, but O'Connor has been pleased with the action around her stalls in Barn 2. The probable standout is hip 191, a colt by Pulpit out of Arabic Song (Ire) (Alhaarth {Ire}), a stakes-winning and multiple Grade II-placed mare. O'Connor purchased the colt, named Alli Kat, for \$50,000 at the Fasig-Tipton October sale. Alli Kat is the combination of her and her daughter's names.

"He's a really cool horse," said O'Connor. "We've had some obstacles with him. When he got here, he got a sliver on his face. But I was real happy with his work. He worked in :10 3/5, galloped out in :21 4/5 and pulled up in :34 (video). He's a big, two-turn horse, and I would imagine he's turf or dirt. He's stretchy and pretty and by the right sire."

Today, O'Connor is still thinking of others, and hopes The Candy Storm can be a means of helping those affected by diabetes.

"I hope someday to do well enough to pledge the proceeds from one horse at each sale to the Diabetic Association," she said.

And horses aren't the only O'Connor animals helping to fight diabetes. Allison, who turns 13 on Apr. 7, is a breeder of Jack Russell terriers. A portion of her proceeds go to the Association, a bit goes to Allison for her hard work, and the rest, Katie O'Connor said proudly, "Goes into the college fund." -L.M.

What They're Saying At The Sales...

Mike Mulligan, Leprechaun Racing, on the depth of his consignment:

"I don't remember any one consignment having a better breeze show than this for as long as I've been doing this, and we certainly haven't had one this consistent from top to bottom. We really stopped buying that lesser horse and really went for the physical. We gave up a little bit on pedigree and sire power on some of the horses, but of my 12 syndicate horses, they cost \$800,000--so they weren't cheap. We've got a \$77,000 Trust N Luck, a \$150,000 Forest Camp, a \$75,000 Rainmaker, a \$77,000 Scrimshaw--so they're supposed to be fast. They're gorgeous, and probably outsold their pedigrees as yearlings."

Consignor Hoby Kight on OBS March and the company's new SafeTrack surface:

"Personally, with the SafeTrack, I think it's getting harder for the buyers to distinguish the good ones from the other ones. It may be better in the end as far as getting more horses sold, but I think you're not going to see as many breakout horses, because you're not going to have all these people landing on the same horse. In the past, everybody would land on the best few horses in the sale, and that's what would drive the process. Now, I think the money's going to get watered down a little bit, and you're not going to have all the guys going at it. For us [pinhookers], you counted on that, on having one or two of those horses, and the rest of them you just got sold. You're only going to buy so many good horses."

Consignor Dean DeRenzo on the state of the market:

"It's like the other sales this year; it's been pretty busy. I don't think the prices are quite as high as in the past, but I think the sales results as far as RNAs have been pretty consistent."

On the SafeTrack, which has seen a concentrated grouping of horses which have worked fast:

"I think it's a little confusing for the buyers. It used to be the top horse would stand out after going in :10 flat. And now, you might see one consignment have nine :10 flat works. You can't have one consignment and have nine great ones; it just doesn't happen (laughs). I think the buyers will have to readjust their ways a little bit, and they will. They'll figure out which ones they like by pedigree and conformation, as well."

Consignor Eddie Woods on traffic around the barns:

"I think it's been pretty steady and pretty normal for what we see in this place. I don't know if there are any buyers missing. If there are, we'll know after the fact."

What They're Saying cont.

Consignor Barry Eisaman, when asked about the new SafeTrack, and whether any of his horses moved significantly up or down over the surface:

"It's been a wonderful addition to the sales company. I don't think it takes a poor horse and makes him into a superstar. For example, in our consignment of 25, the way they filtered down from best to worst on the farm is about the way they worked here. We didn't have an Average Joe that suddenly became a star. Buyers that are strictly numerically inclined will have a tougher time, but those who use their other horsemanship skills and other tools--the way they go, physicals--you can separate those horses."

Consignor Kevin McKathan when asked if he and brother J.B. try to single out Classic-looking horses as yearlings:

"No, we pretty much just buy physical horses. Obviously, a horse that can get around two turns, buyer can maybe be a little more aggressive on and you can get a little more money."

Pletcher will also be represented by **Duke of de Buqe** (Dixie Union), a New Yorkbred half-brother to Balto Star, winner of the race in 2001 when run as the Spiral S.

The bay colt is owned in partnership by Jerry Carroll, owner of Turfway Park from 1986 to 1999.

Big Truck Possible for Holy Bull...

One of the major changes officials at Gulfstream made to its stakes schedule this season was to push back the GIII Holy Bull S. from the beginning of the meet to two weeks after the Florida Derby. The race, also lengthened this year to 1 3/16 miles, may attract Big Truck (Hook and Ladder), who upset War Pass in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby Mar. 15. Trainer Barclay Tagg, who sent out Nobiz Like Shobiz to win the 2007 Holy Bull when it was contested at a flat mile, says the New York-bred is doing well following his weekend effort. "He's been going and going since last fall, but he's none the worse for wear," said assistant trainer Robin Smullen. "If he makes another start before the [May 3 GI] Kentucky Derby, it would only be in the Holy Bull. But Barclay could train him up to [the Derby]."



Thursday's ninth race at Oaklawn Park was declared a non-race because of a mechanical malfunction at the start of the race. According to track officials, the tractor pulling the starting gate inoperative. As the horses turned into the homestretch in the 1 1/16-mile race, the jockeys were alerted that the starting gate was stuck on the track, and pulled their horses up. The stewards immediately declared that the race, a \$35,000 allowance for three-year-old fillies, be declared a non-race. 

For any breeder whose budget puts the top-tier stallions well out of reach, there's an important question to answer. Would you prefer to use a highly accomplished racehorse with a less-than-fashionable pedigree, or a blue-blooded horse, which, for one reason or another, failed to become a graded winner?

Many breeders are happy with the latter approach, especially if the stallion in question is by the most sought-after sire of his generation. Arguably the best advocate for this approach was the late, great Northern Dancer, as several of his non-group/graded winners hit the Grade I target as stallions. Of course, the finest examples were Danzig, with around 200 stakes winners to his credit; Vice Regent, who numbered the champion sire Deputy Minister among his 105 stakes winners; Fairy King, who supplied winners of the Derby, Arc and Japan Cup; Night Shift, sire of a wide variety of Group 1 winners; and Sovereign Dancer, whose legacy included Louis Quatorze, Gate Dancer and Priolo.

Mr. Prospector has also lent some support to this type of strategy, with such sires as Allen's Prospect, Crafty Prospector, Hussonet, Not For Love, Our Emblem, Silver Ghost and Two Punch all showing that a graded win isn't essential to stallion success (Two Punch is the only member of this collection to have even won a stakes race).

Inevitably, breeders were also keen to give Storm Cat's sons every chance at stud--even the ones which fell some way short of Grade I standard or failed to show the precocious talent for which Storm Cat's name has become synonymous.

Storm Boot, a non-stakes winner who didn't race at two, was among the first to reward breeders for their leap of faith, and he was soon followed by Forest Wildcat. Although Forest Wildcat did manage to win a pair of Grade III sprints, he didn't do so until he was five and not before he had been sold for a modest \$57,000 at the end of his third year on the track. He has justified his chance by siring four Grade I winners. Stormin Fever, another Grade I sire, also won nothing more important than a Grade III race.

It has been a similar story with Stormy Atlantic, whose early career was limited by injury to just one start each at two and three. Finally able to have a full campaign at four, he won a pair of sprint stakes, but was still without any black type at the graded level by the time he retired to stud in Florida. The fact that he is standing the current season at \$45,000 in Kentucky tells its own story. A further example is Catienus, who finally became a stakes winner (not at graded level) as a five-year-old. As the sire of Precious Kitten, Dawn of War and Talent Search, he is steadily earning himself better and better opportunities.

Devon Lane, yet another son of Storm Cat, earned only \$6,317 in winning three very small races as a three-year-old, yet his daughter River's Prayer sold for \$1.5 million at the end of a 2007 campaign which saw her become a Grade I winner with earnings in excess of \$900,000.

The latest name to be added to this collection is that of Tribal Rule, whose son Georgie Boy is on target for the Santa Anita Derby, following his all-weather victories in the GI Del Mar Futurity and GII San Felipe S.

Tribal Rule clearly had his problems as a young horse, as he never made it to the track at the ages of two or three. Indeed, it wasn't until the November of his four-year-old season that he finally made his debut, when second over six furlongs at Santa Anita. Even then it was another nine months before he was seen in action again, but he proved well worth the wait, as he achieved Beyer ratings of 109 and 106 in collecting a pair of sprints at Del Mar in August 2001.

The Blood-Horse recorded that:

"Not since Kona Gold ripped up the seaside three years ago has an older sprinter caused a stir at Del Mar like Pam and Marty Wygod's Tribal Rule. The five-year-old son of Storm Cat was at it again on Aug. 24. After steamrolling maidens three weeks ago, he dusted off initial-level allowance company just as easily, galloping six furlongs in 1:09.09. Tribal Rule has made just three starts, but the Wygods and trainer Julio Canani are thinking Breeders' Cup Sprint."

Unfortunately, Tribal Rule's troubles continued. It was July 2002 before he managed to make his fourth start, when a narrow second in another fast time at Hollywood Park, and he came out of the race with a sesamoid injury. The Wygods quickly announced that the six-year-old would retire to their River Edge Farm in California, at a fee of \$5,000 in 2003. He was no doubt made all the more welcome on account of his dam Sown being a half-sister to Pirate's Bounty, who sired over 60 stakes winners during a successful career in California, at River Edge.

Although Tribal Rule obviously had soundness issues, plenty of California breeders were prepared to take the risk, no doubt keen to use a fast Storm Cat horse with the added attraction of being a half-brother to Key Phrase, a Grade I seven-furlong winner. Incidentally, Key Phrase had also produced a colt by Storm Cat and this colt--Yankee Gentleman--also developed into a smart sprinter at four in 2003, when he landed the Pirate's Bounty H. in very fast time.

Tribal Rule has achieved an encouraging percentage of stakes winners with the runners from his first two crops, but he has only 39 named juveniles this year and a small yearling crop. However, his early stallion success brought him a book of 132 mares in 2007 and he will no doubt be very popular again this year. In other words, he should have the ammunition to take his career to another level from 2010 onwards.

Georgie Boy settled very well before producing a telling burst of finishing speed in the San Felipe over 1 1/16 miles, but will he be as effective over 1 1/8 or 1 1/4 miles?

As I said, Tribal Rule and his close relative Yankee Gentleman showed excellent speed over six furlongs, so it is to be hoped that there is some stamina in the bottom half of Georgie Boy's pedigree. There is, in the form of The Minstrel, but this excellent mile-and-a-half performer occasionally sired a high-class sprinter, a good example being Peterhof, Georgie Boy's broodmare sire. Despite being by a Derby winner out of a halfsister to a Derby winner (Mill Reef), Peterhof showed none of the expected stamina, perhaps because he was very small, with a short action. Both his group wins were gained over five furlongs at two.

Georgie Boy's first three dams were all stakes winners, but were all by stallions based in Washington State. His dam Ippodamia and second dam Timely Bet were sprinters, the latter being a daughter of Just the Time, winner of the GI Futurity S. over 6 1/2 furlongs at two. The third dam Missa Bet did win over a mile, but there's little encouragement here for thinking that Georgie Boy is going to be better suited by a longer route.





MARCH MADNESS AT ADENA As March Madness descends upon the sports world beginning this evening, it seems only appropriate that a group including a pair of prominent names associated with the world of basketball would make headlines at last night's Adena Springs Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training at Frank Stronach's Williston, Florida, farm. Bidding on behalf of University of Louisville basketball coach Rick Pitino and partners Ol' Memorial Stable, trainer Cam Gambolati was extended to \$380,000 to acquire a colt by A.P. Indy which is the first foal produced by six-time gradedstakes winner and Grade I-placed Smok'n Frolic (Smoke Glacken). Others involved in the partnership include former University of Kentucky and pro hardcourt star Jamal Mashburn, Rick Avare and Chris Sullivan. "He was just a big, magnificent colt," Gambolati commented. "How can you get a pedigree like that for that kind of money? He's just a grand looking individual. He's going to need time because he's not going to be a sprinter." Adena Springs acquired Smok'n Frolic for \$1.25 million out of the 2004 Keeneland November Breeding Stock sale. The nine-year-old is also the dam of a yearling colt of 2007 by Stronach's Horse of the Year Ghostzapper. Gambolati and crew have played with success in the past at the Adena sale. In 2006, the group paid \$190,000 for a colt by El Prado (Ire)--Perfect Six. Now known as Buffalo Man, the four-yearold was a dual stakes winner in 2007 and added a victory in this year's GIII Appleton H. at Gulfstream Park.

The colt's second dam is GI Spinster S. winner Hail a Cab. "He's just a great looking Awesome Again and Awesome Again is doing so well right now it's hard to overlook," said Hidden Brook's Chris Brothers. "He's just a big strapping colt and he looked great on the track." Brothers said the colt is likely to end up in New York, where Pompa's horses are trained by Pat Reynolds. Pompa also bought hip 55, a filly by Holy Bull, for \$170,000.

Hip 66 an Elite Purchase...

Combining the collective forces of Ben McElroy and Gabriel Duignan, Elite Horse Racing was the winning bidder on hip 66, the top-selling filly on the afternoon. A daughter of 2000 champion two-year-old and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Macho Uno, the bay was produced by Lil Punkindo (Maria's Mon), a stakes winner of \$115,620. "[Macho Uno] has gotten off to a very good start at stud," McElroy offered. "She's very athletic and it looks like she'll be early enough."




