

RECORDS TUMBLE AT OBS MARCH

Following two action-packed days of trading at the OBS March Selected Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training

in Florida, officials were grasping for superlatives as the sale established new marks for average (\$143,262), median (\$100,000) and gross (\$33,380,000). That sale was so strong that the gross easily bested the 2006 figure of \$31,044,000, despite 53 fewer horses selling. Topping yesterday's action was a son of More Than Ready who elicited a bid of \$650,000 from trainer Bob Holthus on behalf of Dave Clark's Iron Horse Stables. "It

was spectacular," said OBS General Manager and Director of Sales Tom Ventura. "It was really beyond our expectations."

Ready for Love...

On Sunday, as she was showing a handsome, muscular son of More Than Ready from her husband Nick de Meric's consignment, Jaqui de Meric told a prospective buyer, "You know, I did something I've never done before. When we saw this horse last September, I put a big heart on his catalog page. I just loved him, and he isn't even my type of horse."

Jacui's love for the chestnut perhaps went to another level yesterday when the colt, cataloged as hip 373, touched off a spirited bidding duel that ended with a bid of \$650,000 from trainer Bob Holthus. That would turn out to be the top price paid for any horse during OBS March's two-day run. Buzz Chace was the immediate underbidder. Holthus sat inside the sales pavilion alongside Dave Clark, for whom he purchased the colt, and both men said they were equally enamored.

"I really loved the colt," said Holthus, before adding with a smile, "But I didn't think we'd have to give that much for him. But that's the way the sale has been: it's either sky high or you can't give them away. I thought he'd go for between \$350,000 and \$400,000."

From Flagfall to Finish...

On Tuesday, three of the first nine horses through the ring made \$300,000 or more. Yesterday, three of the final seven horses made at least that, with one over the \$400,000 mark and the other at \$500,000. From start to finish, action was brisk at OBS March and that was reflected when the final calculations were done.

In all, 233 horses were sold for a record gross of \$33,380,000. The average price for a juvenile was \$143,262, which was up 36.6 percent from last year and crushed the 2006 record of \$108,545 by 32 percent. For the first time in the sale history, the median hit the six-figure mark. The sale median was an even \$100,000, spurred on by a median of \$140,000 on the second day of trading. The previous record median was \$82,000, established last year.

"In this business, and in my position, you try to keep an even keel," OBS' Tom Ventura said after the sale's completion. "Because the highs are high and the lows are low. So you try not to get overexcited, because when things are going good, something can come along an knock you down in the dumps. But it's hard to contain the thrill, really. It was that big of a sale. The consignors stepped up. We got the A string from guys that we used to get the B and C strings from in the past, and it bore itself out in the end."

Asked what made the sale such a must-attend event for buyers, he said, "Well, of course the horses we had this year. But I think the racing performance of the graduates. I think when you can put eight Grade I winners on the cover, you can't buy that kind of advertising."

The March Sale built on strong gains at the OBS February Sale, both of which bucked the trends at the other two major auctions. Numbers were relatively even at Fasig-Tipton Calder, while Barretts March experienced declines. Ventura is optimistic the March Sale can continue to improve in the coming years.

"A few years ago, we made a big jump, then held our own through some tough times, then made a big jump again," he said. "I didn't expect this kind of jump in this economic climate, so I certainly think we can go forward from here. Especially because I think the consignors will be even more willing to bring their high-end horses here." -L Marquardt

Ready to Fly...

Sutton, the horse transportation business. According to the company website, it was Tex Sutton, the founder of the company who sold it to his friend Clark in 1998, who originally turned Clark onto racing. Not, of course, by encouraging him to get involved, but by warning of the risk in the sport.

Sutton, who passed away in 2000, might be shaking his head at his old friend right now after Clark went to a sale-topping \$650,000 for hip 373, a colt by More Than Ready. While Clark admitted it was more than he

expected to have to pay, he was intent on taking the horse home with him.

"I'm an easy catch," he chuckled. "Once they get me in the game, I keep going."

Clark, whose son Rob Clark now runs the day-to-day operations of Tex Sutton, said the colt's breeze was a major selling point. The chestnut registered a one-furlong move in :10 flat (video).

"He was just very athletic and breezed well within himself," Clark added. "He had a nice, powerful long stride. But we'll find out when he runs."

Clark has about four two-year-olds now, with another four of racing age. Of future plans, Clark said, "What I'd like to do is get him settled in at Oaklawn with Bob [Holthus]. Then go up to Keeneland and then we'll stable at Churchill and run there."

For consignor Nick de Meric, the sale represented a choice pinhooking success. Originally a \$97,000 Keeneland November weanling, hip 373 was acquired by de Meric for \$110,000 at the Keeneland September Sale.

Often times, horses blossom into stars in the time between the yearling and juvenile sales, but de Meric said that wasn't the case with the youngster.

"You know, he was a great-looking yearling, and he's a great-looking two-year-old," said de Meric. He added, "In my career of selling two-year-olds, which is about 25 years, I've sold three horses that have worked in :10 flat, and he's one of them. So it's pretty unusual for one of mine to do that. They need to be a little bit special for them to do that out of my consignment. He was just about the most beautiful mover you've ever seen. It just looks like he's hovering above the ground about eight inches. He's got tremendous reach for a horse his size, tremendous power and strength, and all the balance and athleticism that you could ask for in a two-year-old. And I think people recognize what kind of versatile and useful sire More Than Ready already is."

De Meric said he expected the colt to shine later this year, and perhaps beyond as the distances get longer.

"I think he'll be able to do whatever you want him to; I don't see anything standing in the way of him going two turns," said the Englishman. "But I'll think they'll have some fun with him at two before he needs to do that." -L Marquardt

Darley went to \$550,000 to secure a filly by Trippi from the family of Horse of the Year Curlin (Smart Strike). Among the bidders on the filly were Jeff Puglisi

and Steve Klesaris, as well as Reynolds Bell. Out of the unraced Silver Hawk mare Chi, she is a granddaughter of Barbarika (Bates Motel), who produced Sherriff's Deputy (Deputy Minister) -- the dam of the G1 Dubai World Cup hopeful, Bred by Brad and Shirley Gay, the Florida-bred filly was consigned

by Bryan Rice's Woodside Ranch, agent for New Bridge Bloodstock, as hip 242.

"Both [also purchased hip 12, a \$550,000 Pure Prize colt yesterday] were very similar types," said Jimmy Bell, who signed the ticket on behalf of John Ferguson. "She had a lovely disposition. Sheikh Mohammed was happy to receive these two, and we were fortunate enough to be able get them. With horses that are not be asked for everything, it should look like they have something in reserve. That really is the distinguishing mark. John's feeling was that she had answered all the questions and her physical prowess on the racetrack is what really persuaded him to want to follow her to the end."

It was guite a pinhook for Rice's operation, who purchased the dark bay for \$60,000 at OBSAUG.

"She's been a beautiful filly the whole time we've had her," Rice offered. "She finished out nicely coming into the sale. I think that everything about her--her frame, her mind, her walk, her breeze--everything was right on the mark, and she really represented herself well."

The registered Florida-bred zipped an eighth in :10 at the first breeze show.

"She's just professional," Rice continued. "She just went about it smoothly and zipped down through there just like you'd hope for her to, and her gallop-out was big. She is just a true professional."

Bell Rings One Up For Exchange Rate Filly...

Shut out on the session-topping Trippi filly, bloodstock agent Reynolds Bell rallied the proverbial troops and was back to land hip 276, a filly by Exchange Rate,

for \$490,000. It was the fourth-highest price on the day. Bell was on his cell phone in the rear walking ring during the bidding, nodding to the bidspotter as a foe out front fought gamely. There was a lengthy pause after Bell's \$470,000 bid, and the spotter offered an exasperated laugh when the bidders in front-reportedly representatives of WinStar-finally responded at \$480,000, but Bell's next bid was the winning one. Bell said

afterwards that the filly's blistering :9 4/5 work--cofastest of the sale--helped distinguish her.

"She had a great work, did it easily," Bell said. "The consignor liked her a lot, and I like the consignor."

The consignor in question is Niall Brennan, who purchased the filly as an OBSAUG yearling for \$70,000 last year. The filly previously was a \$32,000 OBSOCT weanling purchase by My Eye Stable.

"We're very happy with the price," Brennan offered. "She's a beautiful filly and obviously caught everybody's eye. She's got the physical to go with her athleticism, and her work was super. She did have a tiny little vet issue that might have affected a couple of buyers, but she still sold really well. I'm delighted and we wish them the best. I think they bought a special filly, and I've had enough of them to go through my hands to know. She's very talented and has a super disposition."

Bell said he was buying the filly for an unnamed overseas partnership headed by trainer Jeremy Noseda.

"The price came as no surprise," said Bell. "For us, she was one of the top two fillies in the sale."

Born on the Ides of March, the filly was produced by the winning Dispersal mare Disperse a Star, a half-sister to the very good Japanese MSW and \$4.5-million earner South Vigorous (End Sweep). Bell said he was a fan of the filly's sire, the Danzig horse Exchange Rate. cont. p5

Dixie Union Filly Ends OBS With a Bang...

With only a few juveniles left to enter the ring, a Dixie Union filly out of the A.P. Indy mare Open Flirt brought \$500,000 from Mike Ryan, agent, on behalf of Mr. and Mrs. William K. Warren, Jr.

"Her class, her demeanor and her pedigree," Ryan said when asked what landed him on the dark bay. "She reminded me of the Seattle Fitz (Arg) at Barretts [\$600,000 Seattle Fitz colt purchased by Ryan for Warren at last week's Barretts Sale]. She went down there in a high gallop, just unbelievable. She'd look good with me on her back. She went down there in :11 and didn't draw a breath."

Ryan and Warren have also teamed up on the unbeaten sophomore Denis of Cork (Harlan's Holiday), who was acquired at the 2007 Barretts March Sale for \$250,000. Ryan has bought only two other fillies for Warren, including GSW Carolyn's Cat (Forestry).

"He's enjoying the game right now," Ryan said of Mr. Warren. "He's had a lot of luck lately, and he's a great participant in the sport."

Open Flirt was acquired by Dark Hollow Farm for \$230,000 at the 2005 Keeneland November Sale carrying this filly. The juvenile was bred in Maryland by Dark Hollow Farm, Fast Kitty Farm, Arnold Davidov and Mr. and Mrs. David Schwaber. This cross has been tried eight times, and has produced GSW High Cotton and some others.

David Hayden of Dark Hollow commented, "We bought the mare at Keeneland carrying this filly. For a lot of my partners, this is the biggest score of their lives. We're friends. I'm excited! Last May, when they were taking the entries for the Keeneland September Sale, Dixie Union was a little cold, so we decided to wait until the two-year-olds sales."

The dark bay, a granddaughter of GSW With a Wink (Clever Trick), was consigned by Niall Brennan Stables, Agent XVI, as hip 456. Alex Solis of Alex Solis Bloodstock was the underbidder.


"Exchange Rate's an up-and-coming sire," he said.
"He's moved up from Florida and is in Kentucky now, and he did very well down here with Florida mares, and I think he has the potential to be an exceptional sire."

Just minutes after securing the Exchange Rate filly, Bell jumped back in and purchased hip 284, a filly by Stormy Atlantic, for \$200,000. He said it was for a different American client, but declined to named the buyer. The dark bay hailed from the M & H Training and Sales draft.

Bell was quick to praise his associates at Reynolds Bell Thoroughbred Services, in particular his Florida scouts.

"I've got a great team down here," he said. "Julie Cauthen heads it up. She's here most of the winter and finds nice horses, and we expect to be in against other people who also find nice horses."

Bell added that it had been tough sledding trying to land his top prospects during the two-day sale.

Dixie Union Colt to Hughes...

B. Wayne Hughes went to \$400,000 to land a Dixie Union half-brother to ill-fated millionaire Super Frolic (Pine Bluff). Consigned as hip 398 by Peacock Ridge (Becky Boyd), Agent I, the son of Lindsay Frolic (Mt. Livermore), GSW, \$422,665, worked three furlongs in :34 3/5.

"He has good breeding and he's a good-looking horse," said Seth Semkin, racing manager for B. Wayne Hughes. "We like the sire. I like the way he worked. It wasn't particularly fast--they breezed him three-eighths--but he galloped out really well. He galloped out at a steady-going pace, like a route horse. I liked the look of the horse. He's made more like a route horse and he traveled that way. With that much family, it looked like a good way to go."

The half-brother to MSW & GSP Stormy Frolic (Summer Squall) will head to Hughes's Spendthrift Farm in Lexington, Kentucky. He will likely join trainer Richard Mandella's barn after receiving some downtime.


"The way that Mr. Hughes does it, after we've gotten all the two-year-olds broke and all the two-year-old sales done, he lets Richard go and look at all of them and choose," Semkin added. "Richard did like the horse, too. He left [Tuesday], but we talked about the ones that went through today."

Puglisi and Klesaris Hit Early and Often...

Owner Jeff Puglisi and trainer Steve Klesaris were largely absent from the two-year-old sales over the past two years, but have returned with a vengeance in 2008. Nowhere was that more evident than at the OBS March sale, where Puglisi and Klesaris teamed to purchase no fewer than 11 horses for \$2.03 million. The average cost was \$184,545.

The lot included hip 232, a daughter of Proud Citizen who made \$320,000, the top price paid by the men at March. The Feb. 25 miss is from the family of Praying For Cash and was consigned to the sale by Parrish Farms, agent. The prices of the rest of their purchases, almost exclusively fillies, ranged from \$110,000 to \$250,000.

Despite the fact that 10 out of their 11 purchases were fillies, Klesaris said that the plan wasn't to target the fairer sex. There were simply a better supply of good fillies, in his opinion.

"Overall, I just saw a better group of girls at this sale," he said.

The sentiment was echoed by Puglisi, president and CEO of Puglisi & Co., a New York-based broker dealer that specializes in investment banking, institutional sales and equity trading.

"We thought from day one, as we reviewed the inventory, that this was going to be a very strong filly sale," he said. "We saw a lot of nice horses, a lot of good-movers. With the SafeTrack, that threw a little curveball at you in terms of times, but movement is something Steve is really into, and there were a lot of classy individuals."

One of the fillies that got away was hip 242, the Trippi filly, who John Ferguson bought Wednesday for \$550,000. Puglisi said they were the direct underbidders on the dark bay.

"She was another really nice individual, but she was a little higher than we wanted to go," he said.

Sale officials were understandably happy to see Puglisi and Klesaris returning to the marketplace. Puglisi scaled back in recent years because of family matters, but last summer made a commitment to be active once again in 2008.

"Jeff actually called me back in July to find out the dates for the breeze shows in 2008," said OBS' Tom Ventura. "It was right around the time he sold Diabolical, and he just wanted us to know that he was going to be back in earnest."

Ventura added that Puglisi and Klesaris had enjoyed success at the two-year-old in training sales, and for good reason.

"Jeff and Steve are maybe the hardest working guys at the sales," Ventura said. "They were probably here for 10 days during the [February] sale, and were here, I think, for the entirety of this sale, from the first breeze show [Mar. 9] right on through."

Puglisi said that instead of targeting a certain number of individuals he plans to buy each year, he allots a certain dollar amount.

"It's more about a pool of money you can spend or risk," he offered. "The prices we've paid are, on average, about were we want to be. Sometimes you have to pay more, but it all averages out."

Of the aforementioned **Diabolical** (Artax), a \$300,000 OBSFEB purchase and winner of the GII A.G. Vanderbilt S. at Saratoga last year, is one of the favorites for the Mar. 29 G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen on World Cup Day. Puglisi sold Diabolical to Shiekh Mohammed's Godolphin following the colt's win in the Vanderbilt.

"We're very excited; we're going to Dubai to watch him run," said Puglisi. "We're leaving Sunday night. We'd love to see him go out and win the [G1] Golden Shaheen and for Godolphin to bring him back and run him in the Breeders' Cup." -L Marquardt

CONTESSA PUTTING IN WORK AT THE SALES

Trainer Gary Contessa, who broke Frank "Pancho" Martin's record of New York winners with 159 last season, is certainly no stranger to the winner's circle, but the Aqueduct-based horsemen has also done plenty of damage in the sales ring, purchasing inexpensive quality horses at the two-year-old sales and turning them for a profit.

"My thing is to come to the two-year-old sales, get here a week before, and stay a week after," he explained. "I really do my homework. I see things in horses that not everybody else sees. I look for the same traits of the horses that top the sales in other horses that didn't show it, but could have. I look for a horse that the guys who have more money to spend than me miss. Those same guys buy that horse from me after I get him to the races. I would call myself a second-level pinhooker. I take horses to the track and then sell them after they make their first start. I've always been very good at it, and I'm getting even better with age."

In 2002 Contessa acquired subsequent MGISW Peace Rules (Jules) for \$35,000 at OBSMAR. The chestnut made three starts for Contessa before being sold privately to Edmund Gann. Peace Rules, third in the 2003 GI Kentucky Derby, went on to win the GI Blue Grass S., GI Haskell Invitational H. and the GI Suburban H. while sporting Gann's colors. The son of Hold to Fashion (Hold Your Peace) posted more than \$3 million in earnings before retiring to Vinery in Summerfield, Florida, for \$12,500. His first crop will race this year.

"Peace Rules did what I like a two-year-old to do," the conditioner explained. "He found himself late in the work, and really evened out. He wound up having a really good work. The latter park of his work was excellent, the early part was so-so."

Contessa has also hit a pair of homeruns recently with Lovely Isle (Double Honor) and National Pride (Macho Uno). Lovely Isle, a \$20,000 OBSAPR graduate, was purchased privately by Michael Bello following a 16 1/2-length starter allowance win at the Big A in December. Shipped to the West Coast and transferred to Bobby Frankel following a disappointing effort in the GII Old Hat S., she recently placed second in the GI Las Virgenes S.

The highly regarded National Pride, a \$60,000 OBSMAR graduate, was acquired by Godolphin for a reported \$1.5 million following his impressive debut win over Saratoga Russell at Aqueduct Nov. 17. The *TDN* Rising Star has yet to start for his new connections.

"I've sold 36 horses in my career for at least 10 times what I paid for them," Contessa said. "Some of them have gone on to do great things; I like having that on my resume. When I sell a horse, I want them to do great so I could put that on my resume that I'm a seller of good young horses."

During the two-day OBS Sale, Contessa purchased hip 15 for \$60,000, hip 25 for \$90,000, hip 256 for \$125,000, hip 251 for \$105,000, hip 336 for \$75,000 and hip 450 for \$65,000. He also signed the ticket on a pair of juveniles at Monday's Adena Springs Two-Year-Old Sale. --S. Sherack

What They're Saying At The Sales...

Seth Semkin, racing manager for B. Wayne Hughes on the market/sale:

"It's strong. It actually caught me by surprise a little bit Tuesday. We got outbid quite a bit. This is a great sale--They always have good horses here. There's a lot of good horses here this year. We did real well on our vet reports; we didn't have many that didn't pass the vet. It's a very good sale."

Ken McPeek, Trainer/Bloodstock agent:

"We bought one yesterday [hip 117, \$120,000 Werblin filly] and one today [hip 394, \$100,000 Medaglia d'Oro colt]. I had a pretty good budget with a couple of good people. It's a better sale than last year's--obviously the numbers are saying that-but the depth of the market, the number of people who want horses. You still just can't lead a horse up and sell it. Anything that looks like it could get around a race-track reasonably has a home here. This is a solid horse sale and it's good to see in this business that people want horses."

Zayat Stables Sohby Sonbol:

"We've got 70 three-year-olds here (in Florida) that are already with the McKathans. So we don't need another two-year-old; we've got enough. But I want to make sure I'm not missing something. To me, I'm out there trying to look for the ones who are going to come up and beat mine. So if there's something out there I think is really good, I'll pay for it. Sometimes, when you go out there and buy all these two-year-olds and year-lings and you have a great crop, there's that *one* horse that comes up and beats you."

Auctioneer Ryan Mahan, on the reasons why the OBS March Sale was such a success:

"The horses were great, I think the race track helped, and God knows I was brilliant."

Purchased by Buzz Chace, agent for Lewis Lakin & West Point TBS Maria's Mon's yearling average was \$77,449 in 2007 and Albert Davis didn't have to stretch the purse strings that far to secure this filly. Purchased for \$67,000 at last year's Keeneland September, the grey--from the family of GSW Region of Merit--realized almost 4 1/2 times that amount at two, a far cry from the stallion's highest-priced juvenile of last season who sold for \$80,000.

Kafwain, whose first foals are three-year-olds of 2008, had a yearling average of \$32,328. Eisaman Equine paid \$40,000 at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky last October for this bay colt.
