SHEIKH MOHAMMED BUYS INGHAM LOT

In a blockbuster deal announced early Monday in Australia, Darley's Sheikh Mohammed has agreed to purchase the entirety of the Ingham family's bloodstock operation, the country's largest. Financial details were not disclosed. Included in the purchase, subject to

approval by the federal government's Foreign Investment Review Board, is the 6,200-acre Woodlands Stud at Denman, home to 10 stallions--including Octagonal (NZ)--and about 600 mares; Woodlands at Cootamundra in southern NSW; the Crown Lodge training complex in Sydney; and Carbine Lodge stables in Melbourne; as well as all bloodstock owned by the Ingham family, some

1,200 horses. Jack Ingham, who died in August 2003, and his younger brother Bob began their breeding empire in 1953. They purchased Woodlands in 1985 and founded the biggest privately owned breeding and racing operation in the Southern Hemisphere. "The sale of the bloodstock business was not something I was contemplating," Bob Ingham said. "Once approached by Darley, I decided it was an opportunity that I should accept. I will, however, be keeping our racing colors and will continue to race horses." Woodlands Manager Peter Flynn, Crown Lodge trainer Peter Snowden, Lobb and an estimated staff of 6,000 will stay on under the new ownership. Sheikh Mohammed quote, p2



Last Wednesday, Gulfstream Park official William Greely ruled that Ronchalon Stable's Green Girl (Fr) be disqualified from her win the GIII Suwannee River H. because her jockey was thrown during the post parade and had to dismount behind the gate to avoid being thrown again, and therefore she did not carry her assigned weight from paddock to post, as required by track rules. This decision overturned a Feb. 15 ruling by Gulfstream stewards in Green Girl's favor. The following is a statement from Ronchalon manager Patrick Cooper on Wednesday's ruling:

"As is to be expected we are disappointed, but not surprised, at the outcome of the enquiry into the running of the Suwannee River H. William Greely has applied the strict letter of the law to a ridiculous and simplistic rule. We have been the victims in what was essentially a dispute between Gulfstream Park and a disgruntled owner.

"Having won the race by virtue of having the best racehorse, we have since had to spend a considerable amount of money on legal fees in a dispute in which we were unwilling participants. Twice the stewards ruled in our favour, firstly by letting Green Girl run and secondly when we won the appeal of that decision. We lost the third decision. So despite being 2-1 ahead, we are disqualified with no options but to go to the law to have it overturned, if we were so minded.

"No doubt, Gulfstream Park will now quietly change the rule under which we have been disqualified, which will be to the benefit of everyone in racing, but too late for Green Girl. We have read Mr. Zwerling's platitudes about defending the betting public and his attacks on the Gulfstream Park stewards. His filly may be the winner on paper, but never will be in any photograph. A good horserace and an exciting occasion have been ruined by the manipulation of the rules.

"We will abide by the latest ruling as we did with the other two decisions that went in our favour. It has been a bad day for horsemen and a sad one for sportsmen."



Biggest thrill in racing: Winning the GI Del Mar Futurity and having Kathy Walsh be the first women trainer to do so.

Favorite vacation spot: The Orient--they are going 24/7. What's in your CD player right now: The Supremes.

Funniest movie: "European Vacation," with Chevy Chase.

Childhood Ambition: To be in foreign trade, to travel and import and export goods from around the world.

If you could have dinner with one historical figure, who would it be, and why: Ronald Reagan; he did a great job as president.


