

In other UAE Derby news, Saudi hopeful Zain Alma Aenee (KSA) (K.J.'s Appeal) has been withdrawn on veterinary grounds.



for the \$5-million G1 Dubai Duty Free. "I wouldn't say I was confident going into Saturday's race, but I am very happy with her," he said. "She's really come forward since her last race--I'm at least confident of that." Manning added, "We weren't unhappy with that run. She went a lot fur-

ther than we expected, actually, given her lead-up. After a 25-hour trip to get here we had to be a bit soft on her and really couldn't push the work into her. She's done much better since that first run here, and we've been able to give her the sort of work we've wanted to without any worries." The seven-time Group 1 winner is a handy sort, according to Manning. "She always puts herself in the race regardless, but if you draw wide, you obviously have to do that much more work early, so we'd be happy if she gets a good draw and she can tuck up on the fence and be put to sleep," he said. "Racing forward means you eliminate the bad luck, but then it's in the lap of the gods after that. I don't know a lot about the opposition on Saturday, but I do know my horse is very well. We've had everything we've wanted here, the Dubai Racing Club has been great and the mare is in great shape. Now we just hope for the best. Let's hope she can run well and that we can come back here again at some time. With the ever increasing prizemoney in Dubai and the great facilities, I am sure we will see many more trainers from home coming here in the future." Seachange, bidding to become the first distaffer to capture this 1777-meter event since Ipi Tombe (Zim) in 2003, is one of five members of the fairer sex here. She is joined by a trio of 2007 European Group 1 winners--Darjina (Fr) (Zamindar), Finsceal Beo (Ire) (Mr. Greeley) and Majestic Roi (Street Cry {Ire})--as well as Japanese heroine Vodka (Jpn) (Tanino Gimlet {Jpn}).

Trainer Richard Dutrow Jr. paid a high compliment to **Big Brown** (Boundary) saying that, at this point in his career, he is further along and has flashed more talent tha Saint Liam, a horse trained by Dutrow to Horse of the Year honors in 2005. Big Brown, owned in partner-

ship by IEAH Stables and Paul Pompa Jr., tuned up for Saturday's GI Florida Derby yesterday, zipping five furlongs in :59 1/5 at Palm Meadows, the fastest of 41 works at the distance. "He went really good, we were really happy with that," Dutrow commented. "When [jockey Kent] Desormeaux

got off of him this morning, he said, 'Rick, I've got goose bumps." Big Brown broke his maiden at first asking by 11 1/4 lengths at the tail end of the Saratoga meeting, but popped a quarter crack while preparing for a possible start in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf, a race which Dutrow has previously said he would have won. Sent to Florida for the winter, Big Brown was sidelined and did little more than walk the shedrow for the entire month of January. After getting the colt back on a more regular routine, Dutrow began shopping around for a spot. "I went to the racing office and told them I needed a race, preferably at two turns, on the dirt or the turf, I didn't really care," the trainer explained. Big Brown was entered for a 1 1/16-mile turf race Mar. 5, but the weather gods intervened and the race was moved to the fast main track. Cont. p5

"Just the way that horse ran in his race, the way that he did it, it got us to thinking, 'Let's strike now.' If they would have kept it on the grass--I'd be guessing--his next race would have been at Keeneland [the GI Toyota Blue Grass]. Since he ran so big on this track, we decided to keep him here for that race. So far, we're hoping we made the right move." A.C.

#### Dogwood Dreaming with Atoned, Blackberry Road...

Dogwood Stable announced jockey plans and next starts for three-year-old colts **Atoned** (Repent) and

Tuesday's topper was produced by the top racemare Savannah Success (Aus). The colt's successful brother

Savabeel was himself a A\$400,000 purchase at the 2003 renewal of this sale by trainer Graeme Rogerson and syndicated by Dean Watt before the pair's well-publicised and acrimonious parting. Rogerson trained the dual Group 1-winning dam Savannah Success and gave

A\$1.55 million for Arlington (Aus) (Red Ransom), younger brother of Savabeel, in 2006; that colt has recorded two stakes-placings.

"This was the horse we wanted from the very beginning; I was involved in Savabeel and we liked Arlington, but did not value him as highly," said Watt. "He is nothing at all like Savabeel; he has thrown directly to the mare--he is a lot like [broodmare sire] Success Express."

Watt added the colt's page ultimately determined the purchase price.

"The Danehill--Success Express cross has produced Excites (Aus) and Gold Edition (Aus), and they are both Group 1 winners," Watt said. "Even if this horse never wins a race, he represents outstanding value in a limitless blue-sky market for stallions; this horse is recession-proof, and he is from arguably one of the best working female families in the stud book."

While Watt admitted to being sentimental about the colt due to his connection to Savabeel, he added that veterinarian Tim Roberts "took the emotion out," explaining, "It doesn't matter how much we love the horse; if Tim doesn't give him the stamp of approval, we don't bid. Tim has looked at 78 sets of X-rays for us. I am also very confident buying a horse from Gerry [Harvey of Baramul Stud]. Gerry is a realist; his investment is great for the racing industry, and the horses are raised naturally--they are quality horses with good bone."

Watt said Melbourne-based executive recruitment company owner Bill Vlahos, who was among the purchasers of Pillar of Hercules (Aus) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) for A\$1.8 million last spring, would take 25 percent of the colt and a 30-percent share would be syndicated to owners, including Bill Benson's Emerald Thoroughbreds. Within an hour, Watt further confirmed that Harvey had bought back a 25-percent interest in the colt.

Asked if he thought the colt would be an early twoyear-old, Watt said he envisaged pointing toward the 1200-meter G1 Golden Slipper or G1 Sires Produce S. over 1400 meters.

"Savabeel was competitive at two, but outstanding at three," Watt said. "We thought he would be a smart two-year-old and we trialled him in the first two-year-old trials of that season and he ran second. We drove home ready to kick the cat--but it turned out the horse that beat him in the trial was [subsequent two-year-old Triple Crown winner] Dance Hero (Aus)."

Rogerson, who trained Savabeel to a remarkable Cox Plate victory at three, said he did not bid on the colt.

"I didn't like him, to my eye he did not have the same quality as Savabeel and Arlington, but each to his own, and time will tell if I am wrong in my judgment."

#### Early and Often for Tinkler...

Principal Nathan Tinkler was absent, but that has not stopped fledgling Patinack Farm purchasing with near monotonous regularity. By 7 p.m., representative Roger Langley, flanked by trainer Anthony Cummings, had displayed relentless stamina to acquire 27 horses for A\$7.5 million. Among their more expensive acquisitions was an A\$800,000 colt by Redoute's Choice (Aus) out of the Timber Country mare Redwood (Aus), herself a half-sister to dual Group 1 winner Lotteria (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}). The colt, offered by Baramul Stud, is the second foal from Redwood, a daughter of Group-1 placed Rose Reward (NZ) (Sir Tristram {Ire}).

"He is a quality horse with size and scope, from a proven family," said Langley. "This is one of the best colts in the sale and he will be trained by Gai Waterhouse, who knows the family well. She says it is an exciting opportunity to build this colt into an exciting racehorse, and, with a bit of luck, into a stallion prospect."

Langley also signed for a A\$725,000 Redoute's Choice (Aus) filly from Strawberry Girl (Aus) offered by Strawberry Hill Stud. The filly is a half-sister to four winners, including Danroad (Aus) (Danehill).

#### A Familiar Pattern...

The more things change, the more they stay the same, or so the saying goes. And from the outset, it was evident that, despite the upheaval of a radically altered sale calendar due to the El outbreak, the sale was going to settle into a familiar pattern where yearlings by Redoute's Choice (Aus) and Encosta de Lago (Aus) dominated, with impressive cameo roles by freshman sires. By his own lofty standards, Redoute's Choice is having a quiet period on the racetrack, but the same cannot be said for Encosta de Lago, who is cementing his reputation as the sire of smart two-year-olds, Classic three-year-olds, milers and middle-distance horses.

bourne, with six yearlings averaging \$241,667. So far he is averaging A\$351,667. Coolmore, with Demi O'Byrne present, has been quiet on the buying bench, but signed for Lot 296, a filly by Encosta de Lago out of Smart Company (Aus) for A\$725,000 late in the afternoon.

## What They're Saying At The Sales...

#### Rob Ferguson, Magic Millions co-owner and breeder:

"We have got a lot more horses to sell, and at the moment the average is down and the quantity is up, but we are in the business of selling people horses and, given the increased numbers, the sale is moving along well, on par with our expectations."

#### Graeme Rogerson, trainer:

"It is very hard to buy right now because Patinack Farm is on most of the top horses and they are doing a good job; they have bought some lovely horses. Magic Millions is going from strength to strength--the two-year-old race is worth A\$2 million next year, and the year after that--it is anyone's guess. I don't think Gerry [Harvey] will rest on his laurels."

#### Marc de Chambure, owner of Haras D'Etreham, France:

"The idea is to buy and race these horses here in Australia; the animals we have seen are very nice. Australia has the whole package. In my opinion, it is very good here. There's a wide range of people who can buy horses, which in turn creates a very deep market, meaning you can find a buyer for horses from A\$10,000 up to and over a million dollars. There is definitely more awareness in Europe now about the Australian horse. It seems the level of competition in Australia has considerably improved in the last 15 years. People are more open-minded now; we are getting used to seeing the Australian horses winning in Europe."

#### Marc Antone Bergracht, M.A.B. Agency, France:

"The pedigrees of these horses continue to improve. I expect you will see more [international] people investing here, like Darley. I don't think Sheikh Mohammed is investing here just for fun--I think he expects a return. Australia seems to be a place where you can race horses and break even, or even make a profit."

#### Georges Rimaud, manager Aga Khan Studs, France:

"This is my first time on the Gold Coast, and calling it a 'fact-finding mission' is a good way to describe it. I'm trying to get a feel for the overall market."

#### Mark Player, Hong Kong Jockey Club:

"We want to continue to improve the quality of horses we offer our members. We have had great success with Australian horses and we intend to increase the number of horses we buy for both our International sale and the Subscription Griffin ballot. The style of horse that Australia produces--they excel in the sprinter-to-mile area--suits the Hong Kong style of racing, which means Australia suits our preference. We look at the strong influence of Danehill and the emergence of Encosta de Lago, but the range of international bloodlines on offer here are outstanding now. This is a very strong sale. Competition on horses we are looking at has been extremely strong."

The second foal from G1 Australasian Oaks winner Tully Thunder has drawn favourable comparisons with champion filly Miss Finland (Aus) as a powerfully built, athletic daughter of Redoute's Choice with tons of presence. We're optimistic, but ultimately she is here for sale," says Kitchwin Hills' manager Mick Malone. The filly is bred on the same cross as Group 2 winner Get Square (Aus). Tully Thunder's first foal, a filly by Reset (Aus), fetched A\$110,000 at Inglis Easter '07.

## 406, c, Elusive Quality--Upstate (GB), by Sadler's Wells Consigned by Darley

The third foal of consistent middle-distance mare Upstate has attracted plenty of admirers. "He is a nice, strong, well-grown colt with an impressive, loose walk," reports John Sunderland, stud manager for Darley Australia. Upstate is a half-sister to G1SP Lord of Men (GB) and Her Ladyship (GB), dam of SW Dignify (GB). Not covered in 2006, Upstate visited Darley resident sire Reset (Aus) last spring.

## 408, f, Exceed and Excel (Aus)-Valadon (Aus), by Woodman Consigned by Rothwell Park

Danehill's first-season sire Exceed and Excel is off to a cracking start with seven stakes performers from eight individual winners to date. This filly is out of a 3/4-sister to G1SP Timbourina (Aus) and G1SP Media (Aus). Valadon's first foal is a two-year-old Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) filly named Sail Rock (Aus), who was an A\$170,000 Inglis Easter buy. 
# FROM THE DESK OF... Bill Oppenheim



#### **PYROMANIA**

Going into this weekend's GI Florida Derby and G2 UAE Derby, not a single major two-turn prep race on the Kentucky Derby trail has been won by a threeyear-old running a Beyer figure above 100. This is worrying. It could be that this is a really weak crop of three-year-olds, but there is another possible explanation, which is actually more likely. We already know that the advent of all-weather surfaces has resulted in a shift in jockeys' riding tactics, from the hell-for-leather, go-from-the-gate style which has characterized American racing from time immemorial, to a more 'European' style, where strong finishers actually run faster at the end of a race than they do at the beginning. But speed figures are a more reliable gauge of a horse's ability when the pace is flat out from the start, or at least even. If it's a crawl, no matter how fast a horse finishes, it won't make up the time. Very likely, that has been the case in some of the key preps so far this year.

Though Pyro (Pulpit)'s two ultimately decisive wins in New Orleans, the GIII Risen Star and the GII Louisiana Derby, were not run on an all-weather track, they almost could have been. The pace in both races was slow-to-dawdling, so for Pyro to get up at all is probably impressive enough. The Beyers were slow: 90 in the Risen Star, 95 in the Louisiana Derby, but in both cases you could see how slowly they were going, and the splits confirmed it. Pyro had already run Beyers of 100 and 105 when second to War Pass in the GI Champagne and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, respectively, so it's far more likely that his two Louisiana Beyer figures require mental adjustment to accurately reflect his ability (if not, in these cases, his speed). We do have one important clue: Visionaire (by Grand Slam; what a tear he's on, winners everywhere, and up to seventh on the 2008 General Sire List), ran only a Beyer 85 when he was third, beaten 2 3/4 lengths by Pyro in the Risen Star, but bounced back to win the GIII Gotham at Aqueduct, running a Beyer 98--a 13-point improvement from the Risen Star. It's not as simple as this, but if Visionaire actually didn't improve 13 points, the slow pace suppressed the Risen Star figure (which I think it did), you could make a case that Pyro's 'practical' figure in the Risen Star was 90 + 13, or a Beyer 103. If you then take another leap of logic, that a similar slow pace compromised the Louisiana Derby figure in exactly the same way, Pyro still ran five points higher than he did in the Risen Star, arguably a 108. Street Sense won the GI Kentucky Derby with a 110 last year; Curlin won the GI Preakness in 111. It's not the biggest reach in history to say that Pyro might already have done enough to win the Derby.



Interestingly, Pyro's final prep is scheduled to be the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland Apr. 12, where he is due to clash with GII Fountain of Youth winner (in a Beyer 98) Cool Coal Man, from Mineshaft's first crop. Carl Nafzger proved with Street Sense last year that you don't need to win the Blue Grass to win the Derby, you just have to perform well. I had first been told this 26 years ago, by the late, great Eddie Gregson, when he was preparing to ship Gato del Sol east for the Blue Grass. At that time, of course, Keeneland was the old dirt surface, which invariably favored inside speed. Gregson knew his late-closing stayer would be at a disadvantage, but he said then, these exact words, which I've never forgotten: "You don't need to win the Blue Grass, you just need to run well in it. The timing is right, and you're already in Kentucky." So Pyro doesn't even need to win the Blue Grass; he can run another figure in the 90's, get beat, and still win the Derby with a 108 on May 3. Cool Coal Man is owned by Robert LaPenta and trained by Nick Zito, as is last year's juvenile champion War Pass, the obvious Derby favorite until he forgot the script in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby. Cool Coal Man goes to Keeneland, while War Pass will try and redeem himself in the Apr. 5 GI Wood Memorial, where he is scheduled to clash with the horse I rate as the number two Derby favorite right now, Oaklawn's GIII Southwest S. winner Denis of Cork, who is from Harlan's Holiday's first crop. His Beyer number when winning the Southwest was a 96, but there is reason to believe that underestimates him, too. Both the second and (deadheat) third, Sierra Sunset and Liberty Bull (Holy Bull), came back and won their next starts, improving their Beyers by six and four points, respectively. Sierra Sunset (Bertrando), unfortunately since injured and off the Derby trail, won the GII Rebel, running a Beyer 99, while Liberty Bull won the WinStar Derby, worth \$600,000 at Sunland Park, running a 95. Using these figures it isn't hard to project that Denis of Cork probably actually ran a Beyer 102 (96 + 6) in the Southwest. So I make Denis of Cork my number two Derby prospect with a projected 102, and Cool Coal Man number three, with his actual 98.

#### Left Coast Candidates...

The Derby preps at Santa Anita have all been run on their AW Cushion Track surface this year, so no one really knows yet whether or to what extent their form will transfer to the dirt track at Churchill Downs. The three leading Derby candidates from California figure to meet in the April 5 GI Santa Anita Derby. Georgie Boy (Tribal Rule) has won both his starts this year, the GII San Vicente at seven furlongs in January (Beyer 102) and the GII San Felipe S., at 8 1/2 furlongs earlier this month (Beyer 92). That 92 won't win the Kentucky Derby, so we'll have to see another race before we know if the San Felipe was another flukey slow time, or whether Georgie Boy is slowing down as he stretches out. Last year's GI CashCall Futurity second Colonel John (Tiznow) defeated GII San Rafael S. winner El Gato Malo (El Corredor) in the Mar. 1 GIII Sham at nine furlongs, but the Beyer was a desultory 85. However, El Gato Malo recorded a 100 Beyer when winning the San Rafael, so there's reason to hope the 85 was another impossibly slow fig. The Santa Anita Derby should hopefully clarify the picture out west. Cont. p11





This Saturday's two Derby preps are, as mentioned, the GI Florida Derby and the G2 UAE Derby, both nine furlongs on conventional 'dirt.' The latter will be interesting, not just because Godolphin will try to uncover any candidates for Kentucky, but also because Zayat Stables has sent Massive Drama, from Kafwain's first crop, to contest the \$2-million race. Third to Into Mischief and Colonel John in last year's CashCall Futurity, Massive Drama has run twice in California this winter, finishing third both times, to El Gato Malo in the GII San Rafael, then to Georgie Boy in the GII San Vicente. He makes his first start here for new trainer Dale Romans. But they all look up against it with the two 3 1/2-yearolds trained by Mike de Kock in the race, Royal Vintage (SAf) (Rich Man's Gold) and Honour Devil (Arg) (Honour and Glory). They were one-two in the Listed Al Bastakiya over nine furlongs at Nad Al Sheba earlier this month.

In the absence of Cool Coal Man, Saturday's GI Florida Derby looks unusually wide open. GII Fountain of Youth runner-up Elysium Fields (El Prado {Ire}), still a 'non-winner of one other than,' will be well supported, as will up-and-coming recent impressive allowance winners Hey Byrn (by my favorite new find, Put It Back) and Big Brown (Boundary). Elysium Fields ran a Beyer 97 in the Fountain of Youth; Hey Byrn's last allowance win was also a 97, and Big Brown's near-13 length romp earned a 104. You'd hope the winner here can break 100. Incidentally, with last weekend's GII Lane's End S. one-two Adriano (A.P. Indy) and Halo Najib (Halo's Image) having been ninth and sixth, respectively, in the Fountain of Youth, and with the race being won with a Beyer 92, it doesn't look like the Lane's End is going to have much impact on this year's Derby.

#### **SHE WUZ ROBBED**

Irish Field editor Leo Powell and I were very honored to be included on a seminar panel during the wildly successful Irish Thoroughbred Breeders' Trade Fair, held at Goffs at the end of January. The panel also included Horse Racing Ireland chairman Denis Brosnan, and the CEOs of British and Hong Kong racing, respectively, Nic Coward and Winfried Engelbrecht-Breges. One of the topics that came up was the attempt, in which Britain and Hong Kong are both involved, to construct an international racing program which would attract top horses to top races around the world. But what to do about the Americans, they wondered? There's the drug issue, the fact that the Breeders' Cup won't consider trying to really become a World Championship day by moving outside of North America (or at least doing more to attract top European horses away from Japan and Hong Kong), and that, generally, Americans are relatively unconcerned about what goes on outside their shores. How can they be incorporated into the ideas being discussed? They sort of directed the question at me, since I still claim to be American.

The answer I gave them was "then drop them. The rest of the world should just set it up in the most sensible way possible, and if the Americans can't figure out if or how to be involved, just go on and set up your program without them." There was an audible gasp: do it without North America? But why not? If American racing can't survive without drugs, and if American racing finds it impossible to unite because most of it is administered by the states, not federally, why should a great idea for the rest of the world languish because North American racing won't make the effort to belong to the club?

Now we have the Green Girl debacle. You remember the case: Green Girl tossed her jockey twice before making it to the gate for the Feb. 3 GIII Suwannee River H. The jockey got back on in the gate, and she went on to win the race. The owner of the second objected, citing a 'pillar-to-post' rule (the jockey must be on board from pillar to post, with some exceptions) which some bright spark thought up, ostensibly to somehow protect gamblers from the "unfair advantage" of not having a jockey on board. Heaven knows what this was even doing in the rule book; anybody who has been around a horse can figure out a jockeyless horse running loose on a racetrack for three-eighths of a mile is just as likely to be freaked out as it is to benefit from not having the jockey on its back. You can't blame arbiter Bill Greely: he read the rule and said, 'Yep, this is what the rule says.' But it is a stupid rule, and should be excised from the Gulfstream House Rules as soon as possible. There is no way Green Girl deserved disqualification, but that ship has sailed. Meantime, the aggrieved owners of Green Girl have good reason to be disgusted with American racing. With this kind of unsportsmanlike insistence on winning a graded race on a technicality, it just makes American racing look ridiculous to the rest of the world. Maybe American racing really doesn't care what the rest of the world thinks, but it's this sort of behavior which should be disqualified, not the deserving winner. At this rate American racing won't just be a difficult relative for the rest of the world, it will be a laughingstock. Cont. p12

The European turf racing season is just getting underway. There was a very interesting listed race for threeyear-olds run at Saint-Cloud on Monday: the Prix Omnium II, traditionally the first real look at the new Classic generation in France. It was won by Gris Tendre (Slickly), winning his third consecutive race this year, following two successes at Cagnes-sur-Mer, by a dirty nose from seasonal debutant Arcadia's Angle, from Aldebaran's first crop. It was Aldebaran's second stakes horse this month, following a six-furlong stakes winner in Japan. Slickly is an interesting one, too. A son of former French champion sire Linamix, Slickly won the G1 Prix Jean Prat when it was still a 10-furlong prep for the old French Derby (G1 Prix du Jockey-Club), but ultimately proved best at a mile, winning three subsequent Group 1s at that trip. His oldest are four this year, and hadn't cut much ice up until now, but he has already had three individual listed winners this year. The corresponding fillies' race, the Listed Prix La Camargo, saw a second stakes win for Trip to Glory, from the first crop of Danehill Dancer's son, Where or When. Both winners were trained by Jean-Claude Rouget.
