GODOLPHIN DOZEN SET FOR DWC CARD

The 2007 Dubai World Cup program was the first that failed to include a single winner carrying the Godolphin blue. Looking to prove that result a fluke, Sheikh Mohammed's flagship stable will send out an

even dozen runners for Saturday's card. "The racing is so competitive this weekend, but we have several big guns to fire," said Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford. "I would nominate Elusive Warning [G2 Godolphin Mile], Cocoa Beach [G2 UAE Derby] and Diabolical

[G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen] as our best of the night." The fields for the six DWC races for Thoroughbreds, offering \$21 million in purses, were drawn yesterday. Horse of the Year Curlin (Smart Strike) will break from post 12 against 12 rivals in the \$6-million Dubai World Cup. His connections are confident that the outside draw will not be a problem. "I think the draw is OK, because of the configuration of the race track," said Scott Blasi, assistant to trainer Steve Asmussen. "He will put himself in a good position." Godolphin will tackle the North American champ with the \$9.7 million KEESEP yearling Jalil (Storm Cat). The four-year-old is a perfect three-for-three at Nad Al Sheba, with victories in handicap races Feb. 8 and Feb. 21 and in the Mar. 6 G2 Maktoum Challenge-Round 3. DWC cont. p2

JALIL HEADED TO U.S.

Whatever the outcome of Saturday's G1 Dubai World Cup, Godolphin's **Jalil** (Storm Cat) will then ship to the U.S. to continue his racing career. The dark bay was

unplaced in his only appearance at two, but has been first or second in every start since and is unbeaten in three starts on conventional dirt. However, Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford credits maturity more than track surface with the colt's improvement. "I think the change of

surface has helped him this year, but more than anything it is a question of him coming to himself--growing up and learning how to be a racehorse," Crisford said. "After he won at Ripon in the June of his three-year-old season [breaking his maiden on the grass], giving him an extended period of time off was the making of him." He added, "We all know he is going to be good on turf as well--he has only just learnt how to be a racehorse-but he will go to America and we will stick to the surface he seems to like at the moment." The \$9.7 million KEESEP yearling has four wins and two seconds from seven starts for earnings of \$327,188. Crisford hinted that Jalil would return to Dubai next winter for another tilt at the World Cup. "Whatever happens in the [2008] Dubai World Cup, this time next year he will be even better than he is now," he said.

BIG BROWN DRAWS OUTSIDE IN FLA DERBY

The connections of Curlin are not the only ones hop-

ing that 12 proves to be a lucky number. **Big Brown** (Boundary), the 3-1 morning-line favorite for the \$1 million GI Florida Derby, has also drawn post 12 for his Saturday engagement. The bay, who has won his two starts by a combined 24 lengths, makes his stakes debut in the nine-furlong test. Curlin will be the heavy favorite to pick up his fourth straight victory since that nearly forgotten defeat in the GI Haskell Invitational S. last August. But trainer Saeed bin Suroor believes that Jalil could take the G1 Dubai World Cup crown from him. "Curlin is a star and I have a lot of respect for him, but Jalil is getting better with every race, and he has climbed from a 95 horse [on the Emirates Racing handicap ratings] to a 118-rated performer," bin Suroor said. "He has adapted well to the dirt and has matured so much that I honestly think he has a sporting chance of beating Curlin."

Vermilion in the Pink...

Japanese invader **Vermilion (Jpn)** (El Condor Pasa) worked 1200 meters on the Nad Al Sheba main track yesterday, getting the distance in 1:11.47 with jockey Yutaka Take aboard. "His time was faster than I expected," Take said. "He did a very good job today. He



"Actually, he had a bit of a fever just after he arrived in Dubai this year, though when I saw him for the first time here, he had already recovered," trainer Sei Ishizaka said. "His condition was not a problem at all--today's gallop proved that."

He drew post 13 in the G2 Godolphin Mile. Once-beaten Chilean champion Cocoa Beach (Chi) (Doneraile Court), coming off a six-length score in the Feb. 28 G3 UAE Oaks, will take on colts in the G2 UAE Derby. "She has really thrived over the past couple of months, and she looked very good in winning the UAE Oaks last time out," trainer Saeed bin Suroor said. "The UAE Derby will be a much tougher race for her against the colts, but we think she is up to the challenge." PATINACK ATTACK AT MAGIC MILLIONS

Even a spectacular late afternoon summer storm failed to dampen proceedings at the third session of the 2008 Conrad Jupiters Magic Millions Yearling Sale, with newcomer Patinack Farm securing a further 19 yearlings for A\$5 million. The newly established farm,

whose principal is 31-year-old Brisbane-based mining magnate Nathan Tinkler, is the single most dominant purchaser in Australian history, spending A\$13,100,000 on 48 yearlings at Magic Millions to date. With director Roger Langley and trainer Anthony Cummings relentlessly bidding throughout the day, Patinack snared four

of the top 10 highest-priced yearlings, led by sessiontopping lot 467, an Exceed and Excel (Aus) colt bought for A\$730,000. One would-be buyer joked that she'd like to produce t-shirts featuring mugshots of those at the sale under the slogan "We were underbidders to Patinack Farm." Patinack's efforts shouldered the sale toward a session average of A\$157,944--down on last year's session three average of A\$184,353, but there were 166 sold Wednesday compared with 85 during the corresponding session last year. With one session-and a whopping 260 catalogued--remaining, 490 horses have changed hands for an average of A\$152,704-down on last year's A\$182,191 for 595 sold in total from a catalogue of 730. Patinack certainly dominated, but other domestic and international buyers were not entirely deterred. Prominent South African trainer Charles Laird, who has announced he will relocate to Flemington in Melbourne, secured nine horses for

A\$3,340,000. Denise Martin's Dynamic Syndications is enjoying a real purple patch on the racetrack, and Martin was active in the sales ring, outlaying A\$1,067,000 for 10 horses. Gai Waterhouse has spent A\$2,130,000 on nine yearlings, while the Hong Kong Jockey Club's Mark Player has been busy,

spending A\$2,092,500 on a dozen horses thus far. Redoute's Choice is easily the leading sire on average, with 15 going under the hammer for A\$596,000, selling off an advertised fee of A\$200,000. Encosta de Lago (Aus), selling off an advertised 2005 fee of A\$120,000, has had 26 go under the hammer at an average of A\$297,692.



Patinack Larger Than Life...

Patinack Farm emerged at Deauville last October, and director Roger Langley confirmed the nascent Hunter Valley-based breeding and racing operation has also acquired mares from the U.S. and Argentina in its bid to build a foundation band of 100 broodmares. Patinack gained momentum at Karaka as leading buyer with 24 purchased for NZ\$7,920,000 before the team set its sights on Inglis Premier. It was leading buyer at that sale, too, acquiring 24 yearlings for A\$3,635,000. Langley indicated that Patinack would be active during the final session of Magic Millions before focusing on the Inglis Easter Sale in Sydney, and then the logistics of a massive breaking and pre-training operation. "This is our initial year, so we are really laying the foundations, and our emphasis is on colts to graduate to stud and fillies to go to stud at the end of their third year," Langley said. "We have had a bit of a bollocking [with Nathan Tinkler, over the phone] over the ones we have missed out on, but he hasn't been able to be here himself because he has been in Sydney attending to his mining businesses. We are after value and we have pulled out on a number of horses, plus we have had a little bit of latitude on the ones we really like. This is an enormous catalogue for a premier sale and it has been a mammoth effort, a lot of time prior to the sale, inspecting horses. But this is a type sale, and on several occasions we've gotten what we think is terrific value."

Exceedingly Good Results...

Glenn Burrows and Joan Faras are a formidable team at boutique Willow Park Stud and have reaped sensational results on the racetrack of late with the stakes

performers Largo Lad (Aus), Sonic Quest (Aus), Black Minx (Aus), among others. Horses sold by Willow Park are invariably born and raised at the Upper Hunter Valley property, and Wednesday's A\$730,000 sessiontopper was a prime example of the Willow

Park polish. The colt, out of Group 2-placed Acupuncture (NZ) (Pins {Aus}), contributed to Exceed and Excel's average of A\$286,500 for 15 sold so far. Little wonder the young son of Danehill is among the leading sires by average at Magic Millions, with stakes-winners Exceedingly Good (Aus), Believe 'n' Succeed (Aus), Wilander (Aus) and Sugar Babe (Aus) putting him well ahead of nearest rival Lonhro (Aus) on the freshman sires' table. Exceed and Excel also had a winner in South Africa last Saturday when Her Excellency (Aus), a A\$380,000 Magic Millions graduate, saluted at Turffontein. Acupuncture is a half-sister to prolific winner and stakes-placed Fluffy Duck (Aus) (Tale of the Cat). The colt's third dam is outstanding racehorse and producer Mother Duck (Aus) (Luskin Star {Aus}). "He is a great first foal, just a really good type and he did nothing wrong; he has a great temperament," said Faras, adding that the mare had a weanling colt by Commands (Aus) and was back in foal to the sire. Patinack's Roger Langley pointed out the colt was from a half-sister to Anna Bek (NZ), a last-start fourth in a stakes race at Flemington and another Patinack acquisition. "He looks a real racehorse and he fit our criteria of a colt who could, with a bit of luck, become a stallion, and we picked him up quite a bit under the odds," said Langley. Willow Park is right down the back of the vast sale complex, but the Patinack team obviously found the trek worthwhile because later in the day, Langley went back to the same consignor, signing for a muchadmired Redoute's Choice (Aus) half-sister to Ascot Vale S. winner Innovation Girl (Aus) for A\$550,000. Patinackalso landed a bright chestnut colt with unusual but attractive face markings. The colt by Encosta de Lago (Aus) out of Battonage (Aus) (Kenmare {Fr}) hardly batted an eyelid as the centre of attention at Yarraman Park Stud's row. "He had a huge number of inspections, 16 x-ray hits which is guite a lot, and he was rated one of the better colts in the sale," said Yarraman's Harry Mitchell. "A\$660,000 is a fair price, and he is going to a good trainer in Anthony Cummings."

Successful Sale for Nicoll...

Magic Millions has been a happy hunting ground for BBA Ireland's Adrian Nicoll and he swooped to secure an Encosta de Lago (Aus)--Allez France (Aus) (Hennessy) filly for A\$625,000, having also purchased her stakes-winning half-sister Superfly (Aus) (Rock of Gibraltar (Ire)) for A\$430,000. "She is a bigger, stronger horse than Superfly, and [Julian Blaxland's] Blue Sky Thoroughbreds has 30 percent of her. Julian worked for me in Ireland, I was supposed to be his mentor," Nicoll said. He also purchased a Fastnet Rock (Aus)--Yvonne (Aus) (Last Tycoon {Ire}) filly for A\$525,000 from Duncan Grimley's Glastonbury Farm. "She is a lovely filly, as good a filly as you will find here," he enthused. South African trainer Geoff Woodruff has not been idle in his first foray to Magic Millions, with six yearlings purchased to date by sires including Flying Spur (Aus), Catbird (Aus) and Tale of the Cat. "They are expensive compared to our yearling prices, but the pedigrees we have bought would bring similar money in South Africa," Woodruff said, adding the yearlings would be syndicated upon export. "We tend to buy at home and in Argentina, but we have noticed the impact Australian horses are having; they are hard to beat in our racing, so if you can't beat them, you must join them. We have bought correct horses by proven sires from running families for less than we expected to pay. While Australian racing is all about two-year-olds and 'instant gratification,' we are looking for horses that will get 10 furlongs for our most prestigious races, the July, the Metropolitan and the J&B Met."

It's All White...

Magic Millions co-owner John Singleton and rugby league legend Andrew Johns bought the much-publicised white 3/4-sister to champion stayer Might and Power (NZ) for A\$270,000. "If it was a bay, she

would have brought A\$500,000, A\$600,000 or A\$800,000," Singleton said. "She's beautiful, there's nothing wrong with her." The snowy white filly will be trained by Kris Lees and used in conjunction with a Bluetongue Premium Lager promotion in the Hunter Valley. Singleton wasted

no time offering his new friend a taste of his favourite drop, and, fortunately, the filly liked beer. "Joey and I'll run a promotion in all the pubs in Newcastle," Singleton said. "We'll call it White and Power, no we'll call it Our Bluetongue," he said. "The new Brewery will be built in Jillaby, so Jillaby will be a good name."



Crown. The Airdrie homebred, heroine of the GII Matron S. at two, handed champion Indian Blessing her first defeat in the GII Fair Grounds Oaks last out Mar. 8. A daughter of Airdrie's Gone West stallion Proud Citizen-runner-up in the 2002 GI Kentucky Derby--the bay filly is slated to make her next start in the GI Ashland S. Apr. 5 at Keeneland. "[Trainer] Larry and Cindy Jones have her a very

happy horse right now and we really believe she's pretty special," said Airdrie owner Brereton Jones. "We have so much respect for [GII Louisiana Derby winner] Pyro, and the fact that she ran a better Beyer and Sheet Number than he did at the same distance on Louisiana Derby Day speaks very highly of her. Obviously, her sire ran a monster race on Derby Day, and we just want to keep all avenues open if she runs a big race in the Ashland." Pyro earned a 95 Beyer Speed Figure (100 BRIS) in winning the Louisiana Derby, while Proud Spell was given a 99 Beyer Speed Figure (102 BRIS) for her victory the same day over track and trip.

NO STEROID POSITIVES AT OBS, ADENA None

of the 12 juveniles tested for steroids after the OBS March Selected Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training last week returned positive, sales officials said yesterday. Additionally, the one horse tested following the Mar. 17 Adena Springs Two-Year-Olds in Training, administered by OBS, was also negative. Earlier this year, the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company instituted a policy restricting the use of anabolic steroids within 45 days of its twoyear-old in training sales. Buyers can request steroid tests on their purchases and, should a horses test positive, the transaction may be rescinded. At the OBS February Sale, a total of 21 horses were tested, or 23.6 of the 89 sold at the one-day event. At the two-day March Sale, 5.2 percent of the 233 horses sold were tested. Testing is done at the University of Florida at Gainesville.

All horses in the *TDN* are bred in North America, unless otherwise indicated

RMTC BOARD ADOPTS STEROIDS POLICY The Racing Medication and Testing Consortium, in consultation with the RMTC Scientific Advisory Committee, adopted a policy regarding anabolic steroids during its board meeting in Austin, Texas, Tuesday. The recommendations, which will be made available to regulators, horsemen and veterinarians, are as follows:

- When a state racing commission implements the RMTC and RCI Androgenic Anabolic Steroid Model Rule, there should be a 90-day grace period before the penalty enforcement begins; subsequent penalties should be in accord with the RMTC and RCI Uniform Model Penalties. The trainer and owner should be notified if there is an anabolic steroid overage during the 90-day grace period.
- The androgenic anabolic steroids boldenone, nandrolone, stanozolol and testosterone shall not be administered within 30 days prior to a race.

In addition, there is a provision whereby claimed horses can be tested for anabolic steroids, at the request of its new owner, and the claim will be voided if the test is positive. The cost of the test will be the responsibility of the original owner if it is positive, and the new owner if it is negative. RMTC Chairman Dr. Robert Lewis remarked, "This policy essentially imposes a prohibition on the use of all anabolic steroids within 30 days of a race. We recommend strict requirements for the administration of the four permitted anabolic steroids only by licensed veterinarians outside the 30-day prohibition period. I believe the use of anabolic steroids will be substantially reduced, which is what all of us are trying to accomplish."

BROTHER DEREK RETURNS FRIDAY MGISW

Brother Derek (Benchmark), unraced since finishing

third in the GII Strub S. nearly 14 months ago, will make his return in the seventh race at Santa Anita Friday. The five-year-old drew the rail in the \$68,000 allowance at a mile on the all-weather track. Alex Solis has the mount. "He'll be fresh and come out of there on the muscle," trainer Dan Hendricks told *Daily Racing Form*, adding, "He's had enough work and he

should be fit enough, but he's never been a horse that runs his best race first time out." Castillo was injured in the sixth race when he was thrown from his mount near the finish line. He underwent surgery on his right elbow Saturday evening. NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL

FARM BILL CONFERENCE CONTINUES

House and Senate Agriculture committee leaders last week proposed a Farm Bill framework that drew criticism from those in support of permanent disaster aid programs.

Senate Finance Chairman Max Baucus (D-MT) and Budget Chairman Kent Conrad (D-ND), who have championed a permanent disaster aid program, have labeled the proposed framework unacceptable as it would only provide \$2.2 billion for the program rather than the \$5.1 billion they are seeking.

Congress has extended the 2002 Farm Bill until April 18 while it continues to work on the new Farm Bill that is now in conference.

The Senate version of the Farm Bill includes the Equine Equity Act, which would lower the capital gains holding period for horses from two years to one and standardize depreciation for racehorses to 36 months.



GODOLPHIN OUTLINES CLASSIC PLANS Taking

a brief respite from the build-up to this Saturday's G1 Dubai World Cup, Godolphin opened the gates of its Al Quoz base in Dubai to the media yesterday, and racing manager Simon Crisford outlined early-season plans for the operation's European Classic aspirants. Particularly strong in the colts' division this term, Godolphin's main hopes of Guineas success rests with G1 Racing Post Trophy winner Ibn Khaldun (Dubai Destination), G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere hero Rio de la Plata (Rahy) and G1 Dewhurst S. runner-up Fast Company (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). "It is great that this year we have some really nice three-year-olds, last year we were lacking true Classic contenders," Crisford told www.godolphin.com. "Hopefully, two will run at Newmarket and one will go to France [for the May 11 G1 Poule d'Essais des Poulains]. At this stage, Rio de la Plata will go to France with Fast Company, and Ibn Khaldun will run at Newmarket [May 3 G1 2000 Guineas]. Ibn Khaldun is a fantastic colt and he has been working very, very well. I very much hope he plays a big part in the Guineas...certainly, over a mile, I would say he'd be the stable choice at this time. He has the right credentials and profile to be a great Classic colt. Rio de la Plata has had an excellent winter and he is moving well and training extremely well. We are very happy with him. We may well run him in the French 2000 Guineas if we choose not to run him in the English 2000 Guineas." Switching to the distaffers, Crisford highlighted former Peter Chapple-Hyam trainee Laureldean Gale (Grand Slam) who will be aimed at the May 4 G1 1000 Guineas. She ran second to Proviso (GB) in the G3 Prix du Calvados at Deauville last August and was a last-out eighth in the Oct. 7 G1 Prix Marcel Boussac. "The only 1000 Guineas filly we have is Laureldean Gale," Crisford said. "Her initial form in France last year with Proviso was top class, but her run in the Marcel Boussac was disappointing, as she got very wound up before that race and basically had lost the race before she even got to the start. She has been working nicely and will go straight to the Guineas and we hope she will give a good account of herself."
