CURLIN "BIGGER AND BETTER" THAN EVER

In the span of just eight months in 2007, **Curlin** (Smart Strike) went from being a maiden to winning the GI Breeders' Cup Classic and being anointed champion of his generation and Horse of the Year. When you're at the top, there's often nowhere to go but down, but if

you ask jockey Robby Albarado, who'll be charged with guiding the chestnut colt in today's \$6-million G1 Dubai World Cup, his mount is ready to achieve new heights. "We always like to say that they always get better as they get older, and Curlin's probably a perfect example of that," he said earlier this week. "I think he's gotten more mature. He's gotten bigger obviously. He's gotten serious about horseracing." *That is a scary thought.*

Following a somewhat disappointing third-place effort in the GI Haskell Invitational S. at

Monmouth Park last August, Curlin bounced back to defeat older rivals, including subsequent champion older horse Lawyer Ron, in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Sept. 30. No better than the fourth betting choice on Championship Day, he answered all his doubters in unequivocal fashion, thrashing a quality field in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic by 4 1/2 lengths. So, what's it like to be on his back? "I wish everyone had that opportunity, just to sit on it and feel it," Albarado explained. "Just so many things, so much power, so much confidence, so much, I mean, ability. He's like a finely tuned athlete, you know, he's just--he's unbelievable. And he's so deceptive in his stride. Things that he does so easy, effortless. I mean, not many horses are like him."

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?

The question might actually read what can't **Big Brown** (Boundary) do? Flawless in two career starts, the Richard Dutrow Jr. trainee looks to earn his way into the GI Kentucky Derby as the lukewarm 3-1 favorite in this afternoon's \$1-million GI Florida Derby at Gulfstream Park. Bred top and bottom to excel on the turf, Big Brown debuted over that surface at the tail end of the Saratoga meeting and absolutely crushed a field of maidens, scoring by 11 1/4 lengths while covering the 8 1/2 furlongs in a snappy 1:40 1/5. Fol-

lowing that effort, IEAH Stables acquired an interest in the colt and transferred him to the Dutrow barn with an eye on the inaugural Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf. Forced to miss that race with a quarter crack, Big Brown was sent to Palm Meadows, where Dutrow began training him towards a return on the turf. But the conditioner had a change of heart after the colt outworked MGSW Diamond Stripes. "For this horse to outwork him on the dirt, I know that he can run on the dirt as well," he said. Big Brown demolished the field in a one-mile race taken off the grass Mar. 5, earning his date with destiny this afternoon. **Florida Derby cont. p2**

Money Crunch...

Big Brown needs at least a runner-up effort this afternoon to gain a chance to race in the Kentucky Derby, as does **Elysium Fields** (El Prado {Ire}), who graduated by eight lengths in a course-and-distance maiden Jan. 19. That colt proved he belongs with this kind with a solid runner-up effort behind Cool Coal Man in the GII Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 24. "He's the perfect type for the Triple Crown," trainer Barclay Tagg told *Daily Racing Form*. "He's got the breeding, size, strength, and the way he moves gives him all the attributes for Triple Crown races." **Hey Byrn** (Put It Back) was a maiden winner and was stakes-placed in four starts at two, but has really blossomed this season for trainer Eddie Plesa Jr. The bay drilled entry-level allowance foes by 14 1/2 lengths going a mile Feb. 10 and negotiated the next step with aplomb, taking a nine-furlong allowance by six lengths Mar. 2. Owned by long-time Plesa client Bea Oxenberg, Hey Byrn is also in desperate need of graded-stakes earnings. **Fierce Wind** (Dixie Union) is perfect in three starts around two turns, culminating with a half-length victory over subsequent GIII Tampa Bay Derby winner Big Truck in the Feb. 16 Sam F. Davis S. He has been acquired privately since by owner Halsey Minor.

The five-year-old mare, on the board in each of her last 10 starts, capped off 2007 with a win in the Very Subtle S. at Churchill Nov. 4. Handed over to trainer Brian Lynch after that effort, she opened 2008 with a 2 1/2-length score in the Jan. 13 GIII First Lady H. at Gulfstream, then romped to an 8 3/4-length triumph in the Feb. 17 GIII Hurricane Bertie H. She totes top weight of 124 pounds. **Baroness Thatcher**, third in the GI Darley Test S. and second by a nose behind champion Maryfield in the GI Ballerina S. last year, makes her second start of the season. SPANNING THE GLOBE

A total of 87 horses from all over the world is entered for their chance at purse money of \$21 million for tonight's G1 Dubai World Cup program at Nad Al Sheba Racecourse. While reigning U.S. Horse of the Year **Curlin** (Smart Strike) is the undisputed star attraction in the \$6-million World Cup, each of the six Thoroughbred races, and even the G1 Dubai Kahayla Classic for Arabi-

ans, has a great deal of intrigue. The \$5-million G1 Dubai Duty Free S. has attracted an outstanding cross-section of top milers and middle-distance horses from Australia, New Zealand,

Ireland, France, Hong Kong, Japan and South Africa, as well as the United States and Dubai. A case can be made for a majority of the field, though a slight edge may go to **Literato (Fr)** (Kendor {Fr}), who is having his first run for Godolphin and will be dangerous if ready. A full field also lines up for the \$5-million G1 Dubai Sheema Classic. **Viva Pataca (GB)** (Marju {Ire}) could go off a slight favorite to give Hong Kong its second consecutive win in the event, but he faces an accomplished group of stayers, including **Oracle West (SAf)** (Western Winter) and **Youmzain (Ire)** (Sinndar {Ire}), last year's runner-up and third-place getter, respectively; Germany's **Quijano (Ger)** (Acatenango {Ger}); and the top-class mare **Sun Classique (Aus)** (Fuji Kiseki {Jpn}), representing South Africa. American-breds have dominated the \$2-million G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen in the past, and that trend looks certain to continue, though **Diabolical** (Artax) may be the one to give Godolphin its first win in the 1200-meter event. **Idiot Proof** (Benchmark), runner-up in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, and **Benny the Bull** (Lucky Lionel), fourth in that event and subsequent winner of the GI DeFrancis Dash, represent the main opposition. A pair of Group 2 tests on the undercard set the table for the later events. The Godolphin Mile looks a wide-open affair, with Four Roses Thoroughbreds' **Diamond Stripes** (Notebook) vying for favoritism with the Godolphin duo of **Elusive Warning** (Elusive Quality) and **Blackat Blackitten (GB)** (Inchiner {GB}). In its eight-year history, the UAE Derby has been won by just two trainers--Saeed bin Suroor (5) and Mike de Kock (3). The South African maestro appears to have this race surrounded with **Royal Vintage (SAf)** (Rich Man's Gold) and **Honour Devil (Arg)** (Honour and Glory). Sheikh Mohammed is represented by three in the race, including the filly **Cocoa Beach (Chi)** (Doneraile Court), six-for-seven in her career and undefeated in four starts against male competition. The Kahayla Classic features Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Madjani (Fr)**, looking to take the \$250,000 race for the fourth year in a row. Sheikh Hamdan has won the event in each of the last five years.



THE WORLD'S HIS FOR THE TAKING

Even drawn 12 in this 13-horse field, **Curlin** (Smart Strike) is clearly the one to beat and will be heavily favored to become the fourth horse to complete the GI Breeders' Cup Classic--World Cup double in consecutive seasons.

Scott Blasi, who has been charged with preparing the strapping chestnut during his six weeks in Dubai, called an audible yesterday and sent the colt to the training track, where fewer horses and fewer members of the media were present. "I just

decided we're ready and what's done is done, and that a quiet day would be good for the horse," Blasi commented. "My job is to get him to the race the best we can." Roses in May was able to overcome the 11 hole to win the 2004 World Cup from Dynever, who started to his outside, and Curlin should follow suit. "I think the draw is ok, because of the configuration of the race track, and he will put himself in a good position," Blasi said. Added Eoin Harty, trainer of **Well Armed** (Tiznow), "Even if they started Curlin on Nad Al Sheba road, I don't think it would make much difference!"

Godolphin Going for Fifth World Cup...

and Sheikh Mohammed his sixth (Singspiel {Ire} carried maroon and white silks to victory in 1997). Since beginning the Dubai International Racing Carnival on a domestic rating of 95, the good-looking dark bay has rattled off three straight, including a 1 1/2-length

score from **Gloria De Campeao (Brz)** (Impression {Arg}) and **Lucky Find (SAf)** (Rich Man's Gold) in Round 3 of the G2 Maktoum Challenge Mar. 6. CAN 'BENNY' CARRY THE FLAG?

It's no secret that American-based horses have done quite well in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen. Caller One reeled off consecutive victories in 2001 and 2002 and Our New Recruit, Saratoga County and Proud Tower Too were responsible for the last three runnings. It would only be fitting if **Benny the Bull** (Lucky Lionel)--sporting the red, white and blue and stars and stripes of the New York-based IEAH Stables--added his name to the list. Acquired privately following a sharp victory in the Iowa Sprint H. last June, the dark bay placed a better-than-it-looked fourth in the GII A.G. Vanderbilt H. at the Spa, then came flying to complete the exacta behind champion Midnight Lute in the GI Forego S. Sept. 1. Fourth in the Monmouth slop in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, Benny the Bull closed out the year with a bang, annexing the Nov. 24 GI De Francis Memorial Dash S. Freshened following that score, he resurfaced to post a dominating victory in the Sunshine Millions Sprint, stopping the clock in a snappy 1:08 2/5 at Gulfstream Jan. 26. The five-year-old has several sharp works since the Sunshine Millions, including a pair of five-furlong bullets at Palm Meadows Feb. 17 and 29.

Diabolical Primed For Best...

Diabolical (Artax) really found his niche once kept to one-turn dirt races toward the end of 2006, defeating Fabulous Strike in a quickly run version of the Gallant Bob H. and coming within 3/4 of a length of defeating subsequent champion Thor's Echo in the GI De Francis Memorial Dash S. The handsome chestnut posted his first graded-stakes victory in the 2007 GIII Maryland Breeders' Cup Sprint H. on the GI Preakness S. undercard and closed out his campaign for Jeff Puglisi and Steve Klesaris with a victory over Benny the Bull in the Vanderbilt. Purchased privately by Godolphin with this race in mind, Diabolical sat out the Breeders' Cup Sprint and finished fourth in his first start in the desert in the G3 Al Shindagha Sprint Jan. 24. That prep certainly served the five-year-old well, as he followed with a sharp 4 1/2-length victory in the G3 Mahab Al Shimaal last out Mar. 6. The lightly raced **Barbecue Eddie** (Stormy Atlantic) ships in from California following two good runner-up efforts behind In Summation in the GIII El Conejo H. Jan. 1 and the GII Palos Verdes H. Jan. 21. **Idiot Proof** (Benchmark), who set a track record at Monmouth in last summer's GIII Jersey Shore Breeders' Cup S., was last seen finishing second in the Phoenix Gold Cup H. at Turf Paradise Feb. 16.

She has given the local fillies all they can handle, so **Cocoa Beach (Chi)** (Doneraile Court) takes it to the colts in the G2 UAE Derby this afternoon. “She has looked very classy when winning the UAE 1000 Guineas and

Oaks, and though it will be tough taking on the colts, provided we can avoid trouble on the inside she has to have a great chance of pulling it off,” her jockey, Ted Durcan, said. A perfect four-for-four in her native Chile last year, the dark bay filly was purchased privately by Godolphin and sent to Dubai. She came from out

of the clouds to be second in her Nad Al Sheba debut, a conditions race Jan. 17, then cruised to a 5 1/4-length triumph in the Feb. 8 UAE 1000 Guineas. Six lengths clear at the finish of the UAE Oaks over track and trip Feb. 28, Cocoa Beach is the third choice behind the Mike de Kock pair of **Honour Devil (Arg)** (Honour and Glory) and **Royal Vintage (SAf)** (Rich Man’s Gold) on the UAE Derby morning line. But Durcan, who earned a seventh UAE riding title this year, is confident. “It is a very hot race, but I would not swap her for anything else in the field,” he said. “Cocoa Beach...is a very good filly who is capable of holding her own against the boys. She has done everything we have asked of her and has a lovely attitude, so we have to go there with a degree of optimism.”

Exclusive Club...

In eight runnings, only two trainers have ever won the UAE Derby. Saeed bin Suroor has saddled five Godolphin runners to victory in the race, and Mike de Kock has sent out three of the last five. There is little to choose between the South African conditioner’s duo this year. Both sport records of 4-3-1-0, with Honour Devil besting his stablemate by a half length in the Feb. 14 G3 UAE 2000 Guineas, and Royal Vintage turning the tables by a head going the Derby distance in the Mar. 6 Al Bastakiya. “I don’t know who will come out on top, but they are both in good form,” de Kock commented.

“Honour Devil has proved himself a real fighter whereas Royal Vintage is progressive. That said, they are hopefully both improving.” **Strike the Deal** (Van Nistelrooy) has the potential to crash the UAE Derby party this year. The chestnut colt captured the G2 Richmond S. last year and was a close second to Dark Angel (Ire) in both the G2 Mill Reef S. and G1 Middle Park S. LOTS OF CHANCES IN THE MILE

Last year's G2 Godolphin Mile hero Spring at Last was originally an intended runner in the G1 Dubai World Cup, but has since been rerouted and will make his next start next weekend in New York. But his owner, J. Paul Reddam, has three horses entered on this evening's card, including **Barcola** (Old Trieste) in this event. The chestnut drops back to what should prove to be a very good trip and tries the distance for the first time since taking a Gulfstream allowance last April. Since then, the five-year-old is a three-time stakes winner, all at Delaware Park and all at two turns, and comes into this off a near-miss second to Evening Attire in the Dec. 7 Gill Queens County H. at Aqueduct. He is a threat to lead from flagfall to finish. **Diamond Stripes** (Notebook) will be well-fancied, especially in America's pari-mutuel pools. The grey gelding could do no better than eighth behind Curlin in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Oct. 27, then improved to be third to World Cup hopeful A. P. Arrow in the GII Clark H. at Churchill Downs Nov. 23. He has one start to his credit this season, a fourth as the favorite in the Sunshine Millions Classic at Santa Anita Jan. 26.

"I was asked to train Rock Ascot when it became clear that his Uruguayan trainer was not able to make it," Watson told the *Post*. "Mr. Kadyrov seems keen to get a few horses to race internationally and, I think, for Russia. He is obviously enthusiastic and buying decent horses." Watson added, "Rock Ascot is a nice horse who arrived a bit later than ideal. It is obviously up to the owner where the horse goes after the race." Five-for-nine lifetime, Rock Ascot is coming off a victory in the G1-Uru GP Jose Pedro Ramirez Jan. 6.

Horses from the Land of the Rising Sun have performed well at the World Cup meeting over the past several years, including victories by Heart's Cry (Jpn), Utopia (Jpn) and Admire Moon (Jpn). **Vodka (Jpn)** (Tamino Gimlet {Jpn}), victorious in last year's Japanese Derby, did a half-gallop over the dirt track alongside the other Japanese competitor for the G1 Dubai Duty Free, **Admire Aura (Jpn)** (Agnes Tachyon {Jpn}) and **lide Kenshin (Jpn)** (Thunder Gulch), who runs in the G2 UAE Derby. Vodka's trainer Katsuhiko Sumii, who has already enjoyed overseas Group 1 victories in Hong Kong, USA and Australia, is very happy with his horse's work. "She was shying and was not acquainted with the surroundings when she galloped on the turf earlier this week, so I decided to make her work over the dirt course with other two Japanese runners this morning," he explained. "I think she was doing great. She seemed to listen to the rider and answered him very well." He continued, "With the half-gallop this morning, she should be set for the big race mentally. She controls the quantity of her feed by herself and this is a good sign for her. Actually she lost some weight after she arrived, but she recovered and re-gained the weight during her stay in Dubai. She is in a very good form at this moment." Trainer Hiroyoshi Matsuda, who aims for back-to-back wins in this race following Admire Moon's victory last year, said about his four-year-old Admire Aura, "He was galloping with other two Japanese horses but my horse does not worry how many horses he gallops with. To be honest, he is in the best condition ever and is very relaxed all the time. He went to the parade ring to get familiarized with it and he was so well and settled. You will find out tomorrow how great this horse is." The consistent Admire Aura comes into the Duty Free off a 1 1/4-length victory in the G2 Kyoto Kinen Feb. 23.

EUROEARS SIDELINED Jim and Marilyn Helzer's unbeaten **Euroears** (Langfuhr--Unky and Ally, by Heff) underwent surgery Tuesday to repair a non-displaced condylar fracture in his right hind leg, according to *Daily Racing Form*. The four-year-old, expected to be out of training for at least six months, will spend part of that time at his owners' Texas farm. "He has a very good prognosis," trainer Bret Calhoun told *DRF*. The injury was discovered after the multiple stakes winner galloped Monday at Fair Grounds. "It was a routine gallop, and he came back to the barn and cooled out a little off," Calhoun added. "It was a brutal blow. Mr. Helzer, and me and my staff, we thought we were going to top races with him the rest of the year. We definitely had the Breeders' Cup in mind. We thought he was that caliber." The chestnut son of GSW Unky and Ally captured the Duncan F. Kenner S. Mar. 8 at the New Orleans oval. Perfect in six starts, Euroears has earned \$265,032 to date.

KENTUCKY CASINO BILL ON HOLD Gov. Steve Beshear acknowledged Thursday that there would be no vote on the legislation to authorize casino gaming in Kentucky during the current legislative session. The session ends next week and the bill was never called to the floor, because sponsors could not find the 60 votes needed for it to pass. "For this session, it is dead," Gov. Beshear told the Louisville *Courier-Journal*. "We see no prospect of getting that number of votes with the little time remaining." Churchill Downs Inc President Robert Evans was disappointed at the news. "The...failure to pass casino legislation for racetracks puts Kentucky racing at a significant, competitive disadvantage," Evans said in a statement.

Kentucky Casino Bill cont.

"Casino-style gaming already supports higher purses and racetrack operations in Delaware, Florida, Indiana, Iowa, Louisiana, Maine, New Mexico, New York, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island and West Virginia," Evans continued. "Other states are considering such legislation to support racetracks in their jurisdictions. We watch our fellow Kentuckians cross our borders on a daily basis to enjoy casinos in Indiana, Illinois and West Virginia, where the money they spend on entertainment benefits the health care, education and transportation systems in those states. And increasingly those of us in the racing business watch horsemen take their stables across state lines to compete for higher purses driven by casino gaming at other racetracks. Kentucky is today the center of the Thoroughbred racing world, responsible for more than 100,000 jobs and \$4 billion in annual economic impact. Whether Kentucky remains the leader in Thoroughbred racing in the future depends on the choices we make today."

Hollywood Pushes Back Cushion Track Work:


