CURLIN ON TOP OF THE WORLD

Horse of the Year Curlin (Smart Strike) added to his legacy at Nad Al Sheba last night with a record-setting

Robby Albarado in the saddle, Curlin revved up to take over the lead at the stretch without being asked, and left little doubt about who the best horse in the world is, pouring it in on in the stretch. "It's a great privilege for me to be on him," Albarado said. "What a horse; I just show up and ride him and get the glory--everybody works so hard, but I am the one that's seen. He does it all on race day. It's easy when you ride a great horse like Curlin. He's not even tired."

Something Special Since Day One...

Racing fans who attended Gulfstream Park on 2007 GI Donn H. day knew they were in store for an entertaining day at races, but couldn't have possibly imagined that they would see two subsequent G1 Dubai World Cup winners compete on the same card. Invasor (Arg) parlayed his heroic victory in that year's Donn into an impressive run in the desert, which proved to be his final career start. While all eyes were on Horse of the Year Invasor on Donn Day, Curlin introduced himself to the racing world with a breathtaking 12 3/4-length victory on the undercard for trainer Helen Pitts and Midnight Cry Stables.

'BIG' DAY FOR DUTROW

Trainer Rick Dutrow Jr., who saddled Saint Liam and Silver Train to victories in the 2005 Breeders Cup at Belmont, kicked off Saturday with two of the biggest wins of his career in Dubai--Diamond Stripes (Notebook) in the G2 Godolphin Mile


and Benny the Bull (Lucky Lionel) in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen-and ended it with a bang in the GI Florida Derby with Big Brown (Boundary). Dutrow decided to stay at Gulfstream to saddle Big Brown, and certainly couldn't have been disappointed with

what he witnessed. "We've got a Kentucky Derby contender," Dutrow said of Big Brown. "It's a long way off, and a lot of things have to happen right, but I expected him to run just like what we saw. This day ranks on top of my career. He came out of the gate like we wanted him to. I loved being on the outside--it eliminated our chance of getting in trouble. Going into the race, the only way we could get beat was if we got in trouble. On the first turn I knew it was over. I knew the horses in here couldn't catch him. All I have to do is stay out of his way. I let him do what he wants."

Earning **TDN Rising Star"** following that decisive score, the \$57,000 KEESEP yearling was purchased privately by a partnership which included Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Stables, George Bolton and

Padua Stables. Turned over to Steve Asmussen, Curlin made a quick return on investment for his new connections, reeling off runaway wins in the GII Rebel S. in March and the GII Arkansas Derby in mid-April. Bet down to 5-1 while making only his fourth career start in the GI Kentucky Derby, Curlin beat 17 of his



rivals home, finishing a very respectable third behind Street Sense. Wheeled back two weeks later for racing's second jewel of the Triple Crown, he came charging down the lane to defeat the Derby winner by a head, and fell only a head short to Rags to Riches three weeks later in the GI Belmont S. Freshened after a grueling Triple Crown campaign, the Kentucky-bred could only manage a third-place finish behind Any Given Saturday in the GI Haskell Invitational S. at Monmouth in August. Curlin quickly made that effort a distant memory while taking on his elders in the fall, gamely defeating Lawyer Ron in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, and following with a dominating performance in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Given plenty of time off following his championship nine-race season in 2007, he prepped for the World Cup with a eye-catching 2 1/4-length handicap victory at Nad Al Sheba Feb. 28.

Pacemakers Hang on to Hit the Board...

Front-runners Asiatic Boy and Well Armed hung on to place a well-beaten second and third after contesting the early pace. Last year's G2 UAE Derby hero, ridden by Johnny Murtagh, edged out Well Armed by a neck. "My horse has run a marvellous race and he fought and fought to get his second place," Murtagh said. "The winner is a monster." Well Armed, 11th behind Discreet Cat in the 2006 UAE Derby, gave a good showing following a game victory in the GII San Antonio H. Feb. 9. "He broke well and had horses on him the whole way and never really got a big breather," jockey Aaron Gryder offered. "But at the same time he was relaxed doing it. He fought as hard as he could for second money."

Smart Score...

Fares Farms raced MGSW Barbarika (Bates Motel), but didn't have much luck with the mare in the breeding shed, and sold her in 1998 in foal to Miswaki for \$50,000 at Keeneland November. The Lexington-based operation kept what turned out to be her most important produce, however. Barbarika's 1994 foal, the Deputy Minister filly Sherriff's Deputy, never made it to the races due to a reported slab fracture, and was bred to the Texas stallion Hadif at three. The resulting filly, a winner named Deputy, was purchased by Equus Farm in foal to Posse for \$7,500 at the 2007 Keeneland January, a month before Curlin made his splashy debut. Ten months later, Deputy--covered by Fusaichi Pegasus--RNA'd for \$220,000 at Keeneland. After producing two foals by Excellent Secret (Mr. Prospector--Lady's Secret) in 1999 and 2002, Sherriff's Deputy dropped Comic Hero (Wild Zone) in 2003, but found herself with more exalted company thereafter, albeit with mixed results. A breeding with Smart Strike in 2004 resulted in the reigning Horse of the Year; barren to Buddha the following season, the mare produced a Medaglia d'Oro filly in 2006 that subsequently died. Her 2007 Saint Liam filly RNA'd for \$600,000 at Keeneland November just days after Curlin's GI Breeders' Cup Classic score, and Sherriff's Deputy failed to get in foal to Smart Strike in 2007. Fares Farm manager Shannon White explained the decision to send Sherriff's Deputy to Smart Strike in 2004. "We didn't know if we were going to race the resulting foal or sell," White said on www.faresfarm.com. "Smart Strike at the time had a high percentage of stakes winners, and, for a stud fee of \$20,000, we thought that represented a great value." Fares opted to sell Curlin as a yearling; he was picked up for \$57,000 at Keeneland September by Ken McPeek on behalf of Midnight Cry Stables. Sherriff's Deputy is in good company at Fares Farm. Among the other mares boarded at the facility is Elizabeth Moran's Turkish Tryst (Turkoman), the dam of last year's popular Grade I winner Hard Spun (Danzig). That mare foaled a Kingmambo filly last spring before being bred to both Storm Cat and Giant's Causeway.

Big Brown (Boundary) had faced the starter only two previous times, but looked like a seasoned veteran in yesterday's GI Florida Derby. Breaking from the dreaded 12 hole, Big Brown was hustled to the front end by Kent Desormeaux and found himself three wide on the first turn. Blazing the way through fractions of :22.76 and :45.83, the handsome bay was all alone in the stretch and streaked under the line five lengths clear of Smooth Air (Smooth Jazz). "My plan was not to get on the lead, but rather to get close enough to the rail so as not to get caught wide," Desormeaux explained. "Riding him was like bounding through a meadow. He just galloped around. When a horse sets fractions like that and still tells me that he's got more, and that the other horses can't get to him, that's something special. He's a major talent; possibly the best horse I've ridden. I thought that after the first time I rode him. I'd have to say that he's my Derby horse."

Inbred 4x3 to the Buckpasser mare Lassie Dear, Jay Peg captured eight of his first 10 starts in South Africa for trainer Basil Marcus, whose brother piloted the bay yesterday; another Marcus brother, Selwyn, is one of his co-owners. Victories in the G1 Cape Guineas and G1 Cape Derby last January at Kenilworth earned Jay Peg honors as champion three-year-old colt, but he lost his next three outings in his native land, including an eighth-place finish in his final outing, the G1 Durban July H. at Greyville July 7. Jay Peg was transferred to Herman Brown for the Dubai Carnival. He rebounded from a sixth in the G3 Al Rashidiya Jan. 31 to finish third in a local Feb. 22 handicap, and showed further improvement with blinkers added to finish second by a length to Lord Admiral (El Prado {Ire}) in the G2 Jebel Hatta Mar. 6 over this course and distance. Ryan Moore had been aboard for his last three, but opted to pilot stablemate Linngari (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire})--the 2007 Duty Free runner-up--instead.

Jay Peg was away quickly from post 14 and crossed over to show the way from Seachange (NZ) (Cape Cross (Ire)) on the rail and a rank Floral Pegasus (Aus) (Fusaichi Pegasus). The South African star was still in

front as they straightened for home, but found himself beset by the fillies Vodka (Jpn) (Tanino Gimlet {Jpn}) and Darjina. He dug in gamely and flashed under the wire in new course record time. "He's kept improving, and I think this shows that you've Dubai Racing Club got to train a horse to peak



on Dubai World Cup night and not for the beginning of the carnival," said Brown, winning for the first time on World Cup night. "It's great for the owners also because if you convert this currency [\$3 million] into our rand, it amounts to an awful lot [R24,119,891]." A three-time Group 1 winner in France last year, Darjina fended off former Ballydoyle inmate Archipenko (Kingmambo) to claim the \$1-million runner-up prize. "She's given me a perfect ride, but in the end she's really just 85 percent today, and we'll see her at 100 percent soon," commented rider Christophe Soumillon. As for Moore, he and Linngari crossed the line 14th. "I had the choice between Linngari and the winner and I got it wrong," he said. "It's a real sickener and, ironically, Jay Peg was going to go to England to join my dad Gary. I don't think we will get him now."

lengths) in the G1 Durban July H. The chestnut opened her Dubai campaign with a handy score in the Feb. 7 Cape Verdi S. under 136 pounds, and was shouldered with 137 in the Balanchine S. 15 days later. Trapped on the rail at the quarter pole, she fought her way out of the

jam in deep stretch and rocketed past the leaders to take it by a neck. The Australian-bred enjoyed a dream run yesterday, however, saving ground on the turn and easing outside in the stretch to get the job done. Sun Classique could continue her career in Europe, possibly targeting the Royal Ascot meeting. "We were very confident before the race," breeder and co-owner Lionel Cohen told *Racing Post*. "The prize-money wasn't the attraction--we believed she was one of the greatest fillies on the planet. She's been very special and now the rest of the world has seen how good she is." Cohen bought Sun Classique in utero for A\$32,000 at the 2003 Inglis Broodmare sale.



THE AMERICAN SHAHEEN

If U.S.-based horses keep up this pace in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen, they may have to rename it "the American Shaheen." Breaking from the 10 post, Benny the Bull (Lucky Lionel) didn't appear to be traveling too comfortably in the early stages while racing behind horses. Guided to the extreme outside by Edgar Prado, the Florida-bred began to roll while racing on his left lead and came flying to reel in fellow American Idiot Proof (Benchmark) to take it by 1 3/4 lengths. "I knew I had Idiot Proof within striking distance and I hadn't really asked my horse yet," Prado offered. "Today he had to prove he could run against the best horses in the world and he did it. When I asked him for a little bit more, he gave me 100 percent."

Another Shrewd Private Acquisition by IEAH...

IEAH Stables put itself on the map when private purchase Kip Deville (Kipling) won last year's GI Breeders' Cup Mile, and doubled up on that success with Benny the Bull's emphatic score in the desert. Acquired following a victory in last June's Iowa Sprint H., he ran well in his first three starts sporting his new red, white and blue silks, finishing fourth in the GII A.G. Vanderbilt H. July 28, second in the GI Forego S. Sept. 1 and fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint Oct. 27. Favored at 6-5 in the Nov. 24 GI De Francis Memorial Dash, Benny the Bull posted a career high, scoring by 1 1/4 lengths. Freshened following that effort, he set the Gulfstream main track a blaze in his next start, stopping the clock in a snappy 1:08 2/5 while annexing the Jan. 26 Sunshine Millions Sprint by 4 1/2 lengths. According to trainer Rick Dutrow, there are no immediate plans for Benny the Bull's next start.

Diamond Stripes, a \$340,000 KEESEP yearling purchase, sat out his juvenile season, but was certainly worth the wait. The son of Romantic Summer began his career with four straight tallies, including the 2007 GIII Pegasus S. at The Meadowlands. He lost his un-

beaten status in that term's GI Stephen Foster H., but ran a big race to complete the trifecta, only a half-length behind Flashy Bull. Third behind champion Lawyer Ron in the GI Whitney H. and the GI Woodward S. last year, the Florida-bred got back on track with a victory in the GII Meadow-

lands Cup H. A well-beaten eighth while trying 1 1/4 miles for the first time in the sloppy conditions at Monmouth in GI Breeders' Cup Classic, Diamond Stripes closed out the campaign with a third-place finish in the GII Clark H. Shipped to California for the Jan. 26 Sunshine Millions Classic, he placed fourth, beaten 8 3/4 lengths over the Santa Anita Cushion Track. Trainer Rick Dutrow said from Florida, "When he started coming back on the leader, I knew they were in trouble. When he starts coming on like that, nobody is getting past him and, with no late comers, I knew they were in trouble. Now we have to think about the [GI] Met Mile [on May 26 at Belmont Park]. There aren't too many big handicap horses in the division this year. It looks like this is his distance. They always talk about having to wait with horses coming back from Dubai, but we'll see if the Met Mile would be about right."

Lightly Raced Elusive Warning Runs a Big One...

Making only his fifth career start, Godolphin's Elusive Warning rallied from far back beneath Kerrin McEvoy after getting squeezed at the start to lead briefly in the stretch, but was turned back by the game victor and had to settle for second. "He got to the front at the 150 meter [mark], but then levelled out," McEvoy said. "I tried hard and did get a check shortly after the start, which may have cost him the race." Elusive Warning won his first two starts by a combined margin of 12 1/2 lengths over the Aqueduct inner track last winter, and ran a good race off the bench to complete the trifecta in a Nad Al Sheba handicap Feb. 22. Making his stakes debut last time, he reported home a game winner over Blackat Blackitten (Ire) (Inchinor {GB}) and Asiatic Boy (Arg) in the G3 Burj Nahaar Mar. 6.

NYRA Losses Double for 2007:

The New York Racing Association posted a net loss of \$34.28 million for 2007, nearly doubling 2006 losses of \$17.83 million. The 2007 figure included the \$7 million spent on bankruptcy reorganization, and an IRS payment of \$9.3 million, both one-time expenses. Under the 25-year franchise extension agreed on last month, NYRA surrendered its claim to the Aqueduct, Belmont Park and Saratoga real estate, and therefore will not have to pay taxes on that land next year that were assessed at \$17 million in 2007. NYRA could emerge from bankruptcy after a hearing set for Apr. 11, and President and CEO Charles Hayward is hopeful for the company's future. "Despite showing a significant deficit again this year, we are optimistic that in 2009 we will turn an operating profit for the first time since 2001," Hayward said in a statement, but added, "NYRA faces significant challenges in maintaining and improving our facilities and operations due to the lack of resources over the last decade, and will continue to be cash constrained until distribution of VLT revenues begins." The franchise to operate VLTs at Aqueduct has not yet been awarded, and it is estimated that it will take a minimum of a year after that contract is finalized before slots will be up and running at the track.


