When a colt wins his first three races by a total of 29 lengths and is described by Kent Desormeaux as "possi-

bly the best horse I've ridden," it's time to sit up and listen. Could this colt, Big Brown, follow Unbridled, Thunder Gulch, Monarchos and Barbaro as the fifth Florida Derby winner to follow up in the Kentucky Derby in the space of 19 years? Everything about his track performances suggests he can, yet Big Brown cost no more than \$60,000 when he was offered at

Fasig-Tipton's Kentucky Fall Yearling Sale, where the average price was little more than \$15,000. Big Brown's year-younger half-sister by Horse Chestnut made it into last year's Keeneland September catalog, but as hip no. 5031 in Book 8.

But, before you go jumping to any wrong conclusions about the quality of Big Brown's bloodlines, let me assure you that this son of Boundary has a fascinating pedigree, which owes a lot to Claiborne Farm.

Big Brown is out of Mien, a mare by Nureyev out of a daughter of Lear Fan. Mien, a winner on turf at three from only two starts, is the only representative of this particular pairing, but the reverse cross--Lear Fan on Nureyev mares--enjoyed significant success.

The motivation for the Lear Fan--Nureyev cross lay in the fact that it created 4x5 inbreeding both to Nantallah and the celebrated mare Rough Shod, through their son Lt. Stevens and their daughter Thong, one of the most influential broodmares of modern times. You'll hardly need me to remind you that Nantallah's other matings with Rough Shod resulted in Ridan, winner of the Florida Derby before finishing third in the Kentucky Derby in 1962, and Moccasin, the champion juvenile filly of 1965.


The potency of the Nantallah--Rough Shod pairing seemed to be successfully transmitted down the generations by mating Lear Fan to Nureyev mares. Of this cross's 49 foals, eight (or 16 percent) are credited with becoming stakes winners (although those eight include Vaporetto, a leading jumper in France). Among the cross's best representatives were Loup Solitaire (G1 Grand Criterium), Verveine (G2 Prix de l'Opera and now the dam of two Group 1 winners) and the Group 3 winners Fantastic Fellow and Far Lane.

Big Brown's second dam, Miasma, won a six-furlong maiden before being tested at up to Group 1 level at two in England. This daughter of Lear Fan then continued to compete well at around a mile at three, to the extent that her price at the end of the year was equivalent to nearly four times the \$20,000 she had cost as a yearling.

Miasma's owner, Dr Gary Knapp of Monticule, has continued to seek out this Nureyev/Lear Fan cross, and the mare produced three consecutive foals by Nureyev's son Theatrical, the latest being a two-year-old colt which sold for \$130,000 last year and is now with rookie trainer David Lanigan at Newmarket.

Part of Miasma's appeal as a broodmare is that her bottom line traces to some famous mares. Her sixth dam was the noted English mare Carpet Slipper, which

means that her fifth dam, Her Slipper, was a half-sister to Godiva (1940 1000 Guineas and Oaks), Windsor Slipper (Irish Triple Crown in 1942), and the noted broodmares Coventry Belle (ancestress of the 2004 Derby winner North Light), Blaith na Greine and Silken Slip-

per. This family has been a fertile source of Classic winners in Europe, and Her Slipper played her part as the dam of the outstanding producer Vali, whose recent descendants include Aragorn, Atticus and One Cool Cat.

Perhaps the most important thing to mention here is that Carpet Slipper herself had a distinguished half-sister in the Yorkshire Oaks winner Dalmary, who found fame as the dam of none other than Rough Shod. In other words, there seems to have been a conscious effort to duplicate this blood, and Mien--another member of the Monticule broodmare band--has three lines of this family in her pedigree. Mien's mating to Horse Chestnut was probably designed to add yet another line.

For those who prefer to concentrate on the less distant generations of a family, the best winner from Big Brown's family in recent years has been Hidden Lake, the champion older mare of 1997, who is a half-sister to Big Brown's third dam, the winner Syrian Circle.

Hidden Lake, who collected three Grade I wins at four, was foaled when her dam, the Round Table mare Friendly Circle, was a veteran of 22. Friendly Circle therefore provides a ray of hope for all elderly mares, showing that perseverance can pay off. Hidden Lake was her 12th foal, and she had previously hit the stakes target with first foal Ginistrelli, winner of the G3 Derby Trial in England, and her fourth, Midway Circle.

Most modern-day Kentucky Derby candidates raise the question of whether he will be as effective (or better) over 1 1/4 miles as he is over shorter distances. With Big Brown, this question is particularly relevant because of his sire, Boundary. This former Claiborne stallion, who was pensioned at the age of 15 in 2005 because of declining fertility, made seven of his eight appearances over six furlongs, his other start being his third in the GII Tom Fool S. over a furlong longer.

Bred by the partnership of Claiborne and the late William Haggin Perry, Boundary established himself as a very talented performer in the colors of Perry's widow. Boundary displayed great potential in winning his first two starts in April and May of his three-year-old season but, unfortunately, was unable to race again until the following January. He didn't make his stakes debut until the end of May in his four-year-old season, when he extended his unbeaten run to five with his win in the GIII Roseben H. Another fine win later came his way in the GIII A Phenomenon H., when he narrowly defeated Cherokee Run, but that proved to be his last appearance. He clearly wasn't easy to train.

Although Boundary's fee never rose higher than \$20,000, and was markedly lower for much of his career, his ownership brought him some outstanding opportunities for a stallion in his price range. He made the most of some of these chances, notably siring the champion European juvenile Minardi from the royally bred Yarn, and he also sired the Grade I-winning sprinter Pomeroy.

One clearly can't rely on Boundary to provide Big Brown with much stamina, but this appears to have been remedied by some of the inbreeding in the Florida Derby winner's pedigree.

Big Brown is inbred 3x3 to Northern Dancer, who triumphed in both the Florida and Kentucky Derbys, and

3x4 to Damascus. Although Damascus ran only third in the first leg of the Triple Crown, he won the second and third legs and confirmed his stamina with victories in the Travers, Woodward and Jockey Club Gold Cup (then over two miles) later in the year. Big Brown is

also inbred 4x5 to Round Table, who was third in the Kentucky Derby as a prelude to numerous terrific performances over 1 1/4 miles. Boundary's good turf miler Conserve is inbred 3x3 to Northern Dancer, and his fast daughter Roxelana is inbred 3x4 to Damascus.

Incidentally, this is the second consecutive week I have mentioned a leading winner which is inbred 3x3 to Northern Dancer and which was sired by a fast son of Danzig from a Nureyev mare, Big Brown's predecessor being the dual Grade II winner Costume. Desert King, another horse bred on this cross, stayed well enough to win the Irish Derby.

I suppose if you are going to inbreed closely to Northern Dancer, it might as well be through two stallion sons who achieved the extraordinary rate of around 18percent stakes winners.

Although the Kentucky Derby was the only leg of the Triple Crown to elude Danzig as a sire, this brilliant stallion has made quite an impact on the Churchill Downs Classic. His sons Stephan's Odyssey and Hard Spun found only one too good for them, and another son, Polish Navy, sired the 1993 winner Sea Hero. Fusaichi Pegasus is out of a Danzig mare, while Funny Cide is by a stallion out of a Danzig mare, so it wouldn't be too much of a shock to see a Kentucky Derby hero by Boundary.

CORRECTION: Diamond Stripes (Notebook), winner of Saturday's G2 Godolphin Mile, is a Florida-bred, not a Kentucky-bred, as was reported in Sunday's TDN.



Triple Threats cont. Pyro Works at Keeneland...

GI Toyota Blue Grass S. favorite Pyro (Pulpit) worked six furlongs in 1:14.60 (video) at Keeneland Monday morning. With regular exercise rider Dominic Terry in the irons, the colt went his last quarter in :23 and his last eighth in :11.20. "I got him galloping out in 1:27 3/5 and the last five-eighths in 1:00 4/5," said assistant Scott Blasi, who was back from Dubai in time to supervise the move for trainer Steve Asmussen. Blasi added, "He looked great to me. I hadn't seen him in six weeks." Despite the presence of the GII Louisiana Derby winner, as well as GII Fountain of Youth victor Cool Coal Man (Mineshaft), in the Blue Grass line-up, trainer Michael Matz said yesterday that he will start Visionaire (Grand Slam) in the Apr. 12 test. The Apr. 5 GII Illinois Derby at Hawthorne Park had also been under consideration for the hero of the GIII Gotham S. "Obviously, I didn't want to face Pyro and Cool Coal Man," said Matz. "My big worry was having an extra week before the [Kentucky] Derby, and I won't get that now with going in the Blue Grass, but he won't have to ship up there [to Hawthorne] and back again. He's going to stay here now until he is shipped up to Churchill."

Bob Black Jack to Blue Grass...

GII San Felipe S. third **Bob Black Jack** (Stormy Jack), who had been pointing for the Apr. 12 GII Arkansas Derby, will instead go to the Blue Grass. "I can't get in the Arkansas Derby because we don't have enough money," trainer James Kasparoff said. "We're like 16th on the list of earnings...so it looks like he's just going to stay on the plane and go to Lexington instead."

Ten Added to Triple Crown Nominees...

The connections of eight colts and two fillies have put up the \$6,000 for a late nomination to the Triple Crown. There are a total of 459 nominees this year, just one off the record set in 2007. The new nominees are: Godolphin's Barrier Reef (Mizzen Mast), John T.L. Jones's Big Glen (Cactus Ridge), Fox Hill's Eight Belles (Unbridled's Song) (f), Bernard and Bea Oxenberg's Hey Byrn (Put It Back), Russata Stable's Jazz in the Park (Ecton Park), Super Horse Inc's Kinsale King (Yankee Victor), B. Wayne Hughes's My Pal Charlie (Indian Charlie), Brereton Jones's Proud Spell (Proud Citizen) (f), Charlotte Wrather's Rosso Corsa (Ferrari {Ger}) and Peachtree Stable's Spurrier (Dixieland Band).

HAMMER TODAY A total of 303 juveniles have been catalogued for today's Fasig-Tipton Texas Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale at Lone Star Park. Last year, the Grand Prairie venue put out a 355-horse catalogue, and saw 183 juveniles bring an aggregate of \$3,263,200.



The average was \$17,832, down 23 percent from 2006, and the median was \$10,000, a drop of 33 percent from the previous year, but Fasig-Tipton officials are optimistic about this year's offering. "The quality of sires represented in the sale continues to go from strength to strength," said Tim Boyce, director of sales for Fasig-Tipton's Texas division. "The vast majority of our two-year-olds are by stallions known nationally, not

regionally. The first-season sires are particularly impressive. There are 13 Grade I winners with first-season juveniles and seven of them--Action This Day, Congaree, Lion Heart, Medaglia d'Oro, Pleasantly Perfect, Ten Most Wanted and The Cliff's Edge--are all \$1million-plus earners." The under-tack show for the sale was held Sunday. Two two-year-olds clocked bullet furlongs in :10 1/5. The first was hip 120, an Oklahoma-bred filly by Aggie Southpaw consigned by Robert Brewer, agent (video). The second was hip 201, a filly by freshman sire Cuvee offered by Pike Racing, agent (video). Hip 159, a colt by Storm Day out of a half-sister to GISW Swap Fliparoo, recorded the fastest time for a quarter, getting the distance in :22 1/5 (video). He is from the Diamond D Ranch, agent. A filly by Unbridled's Time, offered as hip 280 by Vickers Racing, had the fastest three furlongs, going in :36 2/5 (video). He was purchased by Harold Forman. During the one-day sale, 172 two-year-olds grossed \$1,826,600 for an average of \$10,620.

Any Limit On Gulfstream Work Tab:

MGSW Any Limit (Limit Out), out of action since finishing third in the GII Vagrancy H. last June, breezed a half in :48 2/5 at Gulfstream Park Monday morning. The five-year-old mare went through a series of setbacks last year, and was breezing toward a 2008 campaign in December when she suffered a severe laceration during training. "She cut her leg pretty good," said Hall of Fame trainer Allen Jerkens. "It was a freak thing, where she got cut by a loose shoe or something in the track. It cut her ankle really bad." It has not yet been decided where she will make her return. "We hope to have her ready to go in about a month," Jerkens said. The winner of the GIII First Lady H. and GIII Hurricane Bertie S. at four, Any Limit has compiled a record of 17-6-1-4 and earnings of \$327,688.

MEC Parent Company to Sell Controlling Interest?

Responding to the concerns of its shareholders, Magna International Developments yesterday announced a proposal that includes selling MID's majority interest in Magna Entertainment Corporation to an undisclosed third party for \$25 million. Both MID and MEC are controlled by Frank Stronach, but MID's shareholders have expressed their unhappiness that their company has been called on to prop up the struggling MEC interests. MEC, which operates nine Thoroughbred tracks, including Santa Anita, Gulfstream Park, Laurel Park and Pimlico and Lone Star Park, has lost more than \$200 million over the last two years. "Over the last three years, disagreements with certain of MID's shareholders have impacted our relationship with Magna International and, as a result, impaired our ability to grow our core real estate business," MID CEO John Simonetti said in a press release. "While we have considered a number of possible solutions, they were ultimately not pursued due primarily to a lack of consensus among the various stakeholders. The reorganization proposal, which has expressions of support from both the Stronach Group and a majority of our public shareholders, appears to offer a new opportunity to re-establish a strong working relationship with Magna International." The proposal also calls for a new Board of Directors for MID, with five nominated by the Stronach Group and Magna International, and four by the shareholders. It would require the unanimous approval of the board for MID to do business with MEC in the future.




