THE COLONEL AND THE CAT

WinStar Farm LLC's **Colonel John** (Tiznow) and West Point Thoroughbreds' **El Gato Malo** (El Corredor), the top two three-year-olds in California, head a field of 11 which was entered for Saturday's Gl Santa Anita Derby in suburban Los Angeles. If all horses go postward, it will match the 2005 renewal as the largest field since

13 ran in 1981. While Colonel John will be the first Santa Anita Derby starter for trainer Eoin Harty, the Irishman is no stranger to the event. As chief asssitant to Bob Baffert from 1993 to 2000, Harty helped prepare a total of six starters, including the victorious Cavonnier (1996),

Indian Charlie (1998) and General Challenge (1999). Never worse than second in his five career trips to the post, Colonel John rallied from midpack to complete the exacta in the GI CashCall Futurity Dec. 22, but showed versatility in his latest, tracking a much softer pace before going on to a half-length success over EI Gato Malo in the GIII Sham S. Mar. 1. Harty is extremely high on his colt. "When you've been around horses for a long time, you know the really good ones from the horses that just seem to have enough talent," he commented. "He's always struck me as a horse that will show up on Derby day and run a credible race."

On the Derby Bubble...

Despite his status as one of the leaders of his generation, El Gato Malo has a lot on the line this weekend. With graded-stakes earnings of \$130,000, the bay gelding could use some additional purse money to guarantee his spot in the Kentucky Derby in a little more than four weeks. Trainer Craig Dollase believes his horse is ready to put up a good effort, but is not looking to squeeze the lemon dry. "He's really coming to this race very focused. Hopefully, this is not going to be his best race," the conditioner commented Yankee Bravo (Yankee Gentleman) and Coast Guard (Stormy Atlantic) are in need of a top-two placing if they harbor any ideas of making the gate on the first Saturday in May. Neither horse is without a chance. Yankee Bravo broke his maiden in one European start and has since won a pair of stakes since being returned to this country. His most recent appearance, his first on a conventional dirt, resulted in a very promising third to Pyro in the GII Louisiana Derby Mar. 8. Jockey Alex Solis is full of confidence. Asked if his mount is ready to factor on this stage, he said, "I think the other ones should worry about whether they're ready to compete with him." Coast Guard, runner-up in the GII R.B. Lewis S. Feb. 2, looks to atone for an eighth-place effort in the GIII El Camino Real Derby on the Bay Meadows main track Mar. 8. He returns to a synthetic surface on Saturday.



Inner Light Added to Wood Field...

IEAH Stables and WinStar Farm, who will be represented by GII Remsen S. hero Court Vision (Gulch) in Saturday's GI Wood Memorial, will also send out Inner **Light** (Songandaprayer) for the nine-furlong event. A \$650,000 FTFFEB purchase, the chestnut colt was third to C "TDN Rising Star" Saratoga Russell in a six-furlong Gulfstream allowance Feb. 9, but stretched out to the one-turn mile and posted a twolength score over the GIII Bay Shore S. bound Jockey Ridge in Hallandale Mar. 7. "We've kind of looked at the Wood for a while for Inner Light and we decided to give him a chance to play the game," said trainer Bill Mott. "He's always been overanxious, but he seemed to settle much better in his last race. Will he handle two turns? We don't know for sure, but it seems he is heading in the right direction." Inner Light will run as a coupled entry with Court Vision. IEAH Stables purchased an interest in the colt following his Gulfstream allowance victory, according to WinStar President Doug Cauthen. --Alan Carasso

Big Truck Joins Tagg at Keeneland...

Trainer Barclay Tagg was on hand yesterday at Keeneland to oversee his string of horses, including Eric Fein's GIII Tampa Bay Derby upsetter Big Truck (Hook and Ladder). The conditioner is still mulling over his options for the New York-bred, and said a local start is not out of the question. "I might run him in the [GI Apr. 12 Toyota] Blue Grass and I want to see how he handles the Polytrack. That's why he's here," Tagg commented. The Ketucky Derby-winning trainer said that should Big Truck not display a liking for the synthetic surface, he remains a possibility for the GIII Holy Bull S. at Gulfstream Park Apr. 12.--A.C.

NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL

IMMIGRATION

Faced with a shortage of immigrant workers in seasonal businesses such as landscaping and summer resorts, the business community continues to pressure Congress to reauthorize a bill that would exempt foreign workers who have held H-2B visas from the annual 66,000 cap. Until recently, returning immigrant workers were exempt from the cap, but that legislation lapsed last year. Efforts by Sen. Barbara Mikulski (D-MD) to revive the bill proved futile.

Rep. Charles Boustany (R-LA) and Rep. Bart Stupak (D-MI) are pursuing separate strategies to move immigration legislation. Boustany has offered a petition to bring a bill to the House floor, which has some 50 Republican supporters. However, House Republican leaders are more focused on an immigration enforcement measure sponsored by Rep. Heath Shuler (D-NC). Stupak's bill has 145 co-sponsors.

Meanwhile, the H-2B program is under attack by representatives who cite news reports of widespread abuse of immigrant workers. Still others call for reforms to crack down on illegal immigrants. The growing gridlock and a Presidential election year make it unlikely that Congress will address immigration issues before 2009.
