Champion juvenile **War Pass** (Cherokee Run) will face nine rivals as he looks to rebound from the first loss of his career in Saturday's GI Wood Memorial S. at Aqueduct. The dark bay colt, last in the Mar. 15 GIII Tampa Bay Derby, will break from post five and has been in-

stalled the 6-5 morning-line favorite. "For whatever reason, he just didn't show up," trainer Nick Zito said of War Pass's seventh-place finish "You want to be confident and draw a line through the Tampa race. I'm apprehensive, excited, happy--and cautious. I'm a fan, too, and I want to see a horse like War

Pass run big. I always have confidence when I have War Pass." Trainer Todd Pletcher will send out GIII Gotham S. runner-up Texas Wildcatter (Monarchos) in the Wood. The gray colt started 2008 with a thirdplace effort in the Feb. 2 Whirlaway S. before missing by just a nose in the Gotham. "We put blinkers on him for the Gotham and that really made a difference," explained Pletcher. "He lost focus on the far turn of the Whirlaway, so we thought the blinkers would help." Pletcher has watched his charge steadily improve. "He's improved his performance with each race and part of that is due to maturity," the trainer said. "He showed he belongs with these the last time." Texas Wildcatter will break from post one and is listed at 5-1 on the morning line. Tale of Ekati (Tale of the Cat) is another standout juvenile looking to rebound from a poor effort in the Wood. The Barclay Tagg trainee was a lackluster sixth in the Mar. 8 GII Louisiana Derby. "He ran all right," Tagg said of his charge's Louisiana Derby effort. "His head was turned at the start, so he got away from the gate bad and that ruined his chances." Tale of Ekati will break from post eight and is 9-2 on the morning line.

APRIL SUNSHINE BRINGS ROSES IN MAY

Since its inception in 1935, the GI Santa Anita Derby has seen 13 three-year-olds emerge to wear the roses in the GI Kentucky Derby. That honor roll shows eight Santa Anita Derby winners, including turf luminaries Sunday Silence (1989), Winning Colors (1988), Affirmed (1978) and Swaps (1955). The other Santa Anita Derby heroes to go on to success under the Twin Spires are Majestic Prince, whose unbeaten run in 1969 encompassed the Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. before a career-ending third in the GI Belmont S.; Lucky Debonair in 1965; Determine, the grey 1954 victor; and Hill Gail, whose triumphs in both 1952 Derbies added more trophies to Calumet Farm's case.

But it's not just the Santa Anita Derby winners to look out for four weeks hence. In 1997-98, respectively, the Bob Baffert-trained runners-up **Silver Charm** and **Real Quiet** captured the first two legs of the Triple Crown before coming up second-best in the Belmont; both colts were honored as Eclipse Award winners. **Ferdinand**, third to subsequent champion Snow Chief in the 1986 Santa Anita Derby, posted a popular Kentucky Derby triumph for Charlie Whittingham and Bill Shoemaker. *Cont. p2*



DUBAI TIMES IN DOUBT The Racing Post has called into question the accuracy of the times for races on last Saturday's G1 Dubai World Cup card at Nad Al Sheba. Members of the Racing Post staff noted discrepancies of almost exactly a second over the official time for all races after the G2 Godolphin Mile, the first Thoroughbred race on the card. Contacted about the discrepancies, Emirates Racing Authority steward Gerard Bush told the paper, "We thought the times were okay on the night, but there does appear to be a question mark, and the sectional times are probably wrong. We're not sure whether that means the overall times are also wrong, but we're looking into it. In the meantime, we've removed the sectionals from our website." Under the original times, Jay Peg (Saf) (Camden Park) set a course record of 1:46.20 in the G1 Duty Free, Sun Classique (Aus) (Fuji Kiseki {Jpn}) was just :05 off the course record in the G1 Sheema Classic and Curlin (Smart Strike) recorded the thirdfastest time in the World Cup.

IFHA: CURLIN BEST SINCE GHOSTZAPPER

Curlin (Smart Strike)'s win in Saturday's G1 Dubai World Cup earned him a rating of 130 from the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities. That is the highest rating in the world for a dirt horse since Ghostzapper earned a 130 in 2004. The rating, made by a panel of official handicappers drawn from the major racing nations connected to the IFHA, includes performances from Oct. 1, 2007 through Mar. 31, 2008. Dylan Thomas (Ire) (Danehill) and English Channel (Smart Strike) were next on the list, each with a rating of 125. Youmzain (Ire) (Sinndar {Ire}) was rated at 124 and Admire Moon (Jpn) (End Sweep), Literato (Fr) (Kendor {Fr}) and Sacred Kingdom (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) were all rated at 123.

COOL COAL MAN WORKS AT CHURCHILL Cool Coal Man (Mineshaft) worked four furlongs at Churchill Downs yesterday (video) in preparation for the Apr. 12 GI Toyota Blue Grass. Working in company, the Nick Zito trainee completed the work in :47.40, the fourth fastest of 25 moves at the distance. Cool Coal Man is coming off a half-length victory in the GII Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 24. "This is actually how he did it before the Fountain of Youth," Zito said of the work. "He's not a robust colt, but he's a really flashy little guy. I think his name is appropriate. I always talk about letting them run through the lane a little bit [before a race]--kind of like a 'blowout' the old-fashioned way. We're still traditionalists, right?" Asked why he chose the Blue Grass for Cool Coal Man's Derby prep, Zito said, "I would prefer to have run on a conventional track like Churchill Downs, but the Blue Grass is a good race and I've been lucky in it a lot of times, too. And I saw what Street Sense did last year, and if he could run that kind of race, I'll take it and then maybe we'll get lucky in the big one."

The sequence is rounded out by a pair of colts who rebounded from fourth-place finishes in Arcadia to shine on the first Saturday in May. **Gato del Sol**, fourth in the 1982 Santa Anita Derby on April 4, returned to run second in the GI Blue Grass S. on April 22 before posting a career-defining score nine days later in the Kentucky Derby. More recently, **Giacomo** completed the Santa Anita superfecta in 2005, but his late surge secured the roses at 50-1.

True Colors...

Back in 1988, a strapping filly named Winning Colors bounced back from her first-career defeat in the GI Las Virgenes S. to take the GI Santa Anita Oaks by eight lengths, an effort which made her the 5-2 favorite against colts in the Santa Anita Derby. The third filly to win this race, she thumped the boys, giving jockey Gary Stevens the first of his record nine victories in the meeting's marquee event for three-year-olds, and trainer D. Wayne Lukas his fourth trophy. Her historic victory four weeks later at Churchill Downs was the first Kentucky Derby triumph for both of those Hall of Famers. Cont. p3

A maiden winner at Saratoga, the big grey filly didn't make her next appearance until Dec. 27, when she won a six-furlong allowance at Santa. Stevens was aboard

her for the first time that day, and recalls being very impressed with her.

"When I got back to the jocks' room, I saw Jacinto Vasquez," Stevens said. "I remember telling him, 'I'm going to win the Derby with this filly.'"

Vasquez, who'd piloted Genuine Risk to victory in the 1980 Kentucky Derby, laughed at his younger colleague.

"I was very, very confident," he said, "as long as we got a clean break. I was even more confident when we turned into the backstretch--she was able to slow it down, and I knew the way she could come home. I let her out a notch at the quarter pole, and let her out another notch at the eighth pole, and she won by [7 1/2] lengths. I galloped her out another eighth after the wire, and I had no doubts that she could get the distance [in the Kentucky Derby]."

Winning Colors was able to mirror that effort at Churchill Downs, holding off the previous year's champion juvenile Forty Niner.

"I can't even put it into words," Stevens said when asked about winning his first Kentucky Derby. "It took me a while to realize what she'd done for my career and what she'd really accomplished as the third filly to win the Derby. There was the media rush after the race and everyone asking about the Preakness, and it took a while to sink in."

"After all of the interviews, Jacinto was the first person waiting to congratulate me."

The Derby's Not the Only Game in Town...

They may not have worn the roses, but several Santa Anita Derby winners made history in other ways. The

1938 victor, **Stagehand**, became the only three-year-old ever to win that year's Santa Anita H., defeating the mighty Seabiscuit. **Sham** won the 1973 renewal before chasing home Secretariat in the Kentucky Derby and Preakness; **Codex** won for Lukas in 1980 and, after skipping the Derby, triumphed at Pimlico; and 1986 hero **Snow Chief** re-

bounded from defeat in the Derby to land the Preakness. In 1992, A.P. Indy was forced to miss the Kentucky Derby, but victories in the Belmont and GI Breeders' Cup Classic earned him Horse of the Year. Point Given, a dominating winner of the 2001 Santa Anita Derby, came up fifth-best in Louisville before storming through the Preakness, Belmont, GI

Haskell H. and GI Travers S. on his way to Horse of the Year honors. Like Winning Colors, Point Given was ridden to victory by Stevens.

"He won so easily [in the Santa Anita Derby]," Stevens said. "He was so gifted. He had sprint speed, too, and unfortunately it showed in the Kentucky Derby. I'll always feel that he should have won the Triple Crown."

Big Brown is not the first son of the mare Mien to have carried Paul Pompa Jr.'s colors. In January of 2007, Pompa took a chance on a first-time starter by Gulch out of the

daughter of Nureyev, tossing a slip into the claim box at Gulfstream Park. The bay, named Snake River Canyon, was beaten less than a length when third that afternoon, and his new connections had high hopes.

Unfortunately, Snake River Canyon would spend only a short time with Pompa's trainer, Pat Reynolds.

"I claimed him from Frankie Brothers from his very first start, and he ran a bang-up race right out of the box--it was very gutsy," Pompa related. "I took him for \$62,500, and we ran him back for \$75,000. He ran

a tremendous race. Horses kept coming at him and he kept putting them away. He won--then his original owner [Greg Besinger] claimed him right back. But he made a very big impression on us."

Less than a month later, Snake River Canyon's little brother by Boundary was offered at Keeneland April. Consigned by Eddie Woods, agent, he was the only horse Pompa purchased from the sale.

"Big Brown was on our short list," the New Jersey native said. "He vetted good, we stuck with him and we got him."

Pompa does not rely on a single venue when it comes to adding to his stable. In addition to claiming and two-year-olds sales, he frequently shops at the yearling sales. But, when it comes to the sales ring, he always relies on the same team.

"We have a sharp team at Hidden Brook Farm," the owner explained. "Jack Brothers, Dan Hall, Mark Roberts and Sergio de Sousa--they go through all the horses and compile the short list, and then it's my responsibility to get the veterinarians there. I make the final decisions based on what the vets say, and what the page says. That's the way we go about it, and then it's on to the auction process."

Pompa, the president of Truck Rite Corp in Brooklyn, got into the game eight years ago.

"I've always had an interest in sports," he said. "I like the competition, and this was an outlet for that. I had reached success on a professional level, and I didn't have any real bad habits. I was looking for some action.

"I'm not a real bettor--I don't hit the windows hard," he added.
"But I wanted to see what it was like to own racehorses."

What started out as a hobby has quickly become a business as well. Pompa's horses, whch now number about 25, broke \$1 million in earnings for the first time in 2005; last year, he had 149 starters, 27 winners and purses of \$1,325,667.

"Initially, I got into racing just to have fun, but as you get into it and start to get educated, you start to believe you can do certain things--you want to keep moving forward."

Pompa progressed from horse owner to pinhooker several years ago, and hit a homerun at Fasig-Tipton Calder this year with a son of Street Cry (Ire). The \$425,000 KEESEP yearling went to John Ferguson for a sales-topping \$2.1 million.

"I have been involved in pinhooking for the last several years because it can be very lucrative," Pompa said. "Hidden Brook has also picked out the horses we've sold at auction--we had a Not For Love that sold for \$550,000 and a Tiznow that sold for \$600,000. We also sold Bujagali (Johannesburg) [a \$170,000 KEESEP yearling] for \$475,000."

The money invested in the Street Cry colt was the most that Pompa had ever spent at auction, but he was not surprised that the return was so high.

"We thought he would bring that kind of money," he said. "He breezed like a freak, in :10 2/5 like he was in a gallop. He vetted beautifully, and there was buzz about the stallion."

In addition to Team Hidden Brook, Pompa credits David Scanlon for his success at the two-year-old sales.

"He is the one who prepares them for the sales," he remarked. "He has done a great job for me."

Not all of the yearlings bought as pinhooking prospects find new homes. Hidden Brook signed the ticket on Backseat Rhythm for Pompa as a \$75,000 KEESEP yearling, but she RNA'd at \$240,000 as a BESMAR juvenile. The El Corredor filly went on to finish second in the GI Frizette S. and third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies.

But it is Big Brown who has provided the most excitement. The bay cruised to an 11 3/4-length debut score at Saratoga last summer, catching the attention of IEAH Stables. IEAH purchased a 75-interest in the colt after that performance. They had to wait until 2008 to see what their money had bought, but Big Brown more than made up for that patience with his overpowering win in Saturday's GI Florida Derby.

"It was thrilling--the biggest thrill I've had in racing," Pompa said of Big Brown's latest performance. "To break from the 12 hole and cut out the fractions he cut out--it was amazing."

Does Pompa ever second-guess his decision to sell?
"Not at all," he said. "The IEAH people are young, aggressive successful businessmen, and they paid me a lot of money for

him. I was able to retain a quarter share--there are no regrets."

And Pompa isn't taking his profits and tucking them into a savings account.

"I keep the money in the sport," he said. "When we make money, I put it back into racing; I don't take it off the table.

"I just want to have a real nice stable," he continued. "My trainer, Pat Reynolds, has done really well for me, and I always emphasize quality over quantity. But you have to be fiscally responsible--that's very important."

Still, when it comes time to head to Churchill Downs for the 134th running of the Kentucky Derby, Pompa will go all out.

"I'll bring my family, a lot of relatives, a few close friends," he said. "We'll probably have 25 people there." ... Andy Belfiore


