#### NIGHT FALLS ON KEENELAND APRIL

For the first time in the history of this auction, the Keeneland April Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale will be held over a pair of evening sessions, the first of which kicks off tonight at 7:00 p.m. The move from one after-



noon session has elicited myriad opinions from consignors and buyers, some positive, some negative. "I like the idea, but after all the scratches, there are going to be so few horses selling that by the time buyers get into a groove, it's over," offered consignor Randy Hartley. "But I like the

idea of the night sessions, where people come out to the track and socialize, go have dinner, come back to the sale and buy horses. The concept's good; Keeneland's trying to class it up." (for more opinions, see 'What They're Saying...p6-7).

The one and only breeze show for the April Sale-representing another change, from two under-tack shows--was held under idyllic blue skies at Keeneland yesterday afternoon. Like it did last year, the Polytrack surface yielded fast times, with seven horses working sub-:10 eighths.

Earning the world-record bullet for an eighth was



consignor Niall Brennan's hip 7, a half-brother to GII Fountain of Youth S. winner Cool Coal Man (Mineshaft) by Langfuhr. The well-made gray zipped through the distance in :9 3/5 (video). Two shared the bullet for

#### End of an Era...

When <u>hip 140</u> exits the ring at the Keeneland April sale's final session Wednesday, it will mark the end of a long-established tradition in horseracing. The final draft of horses offered as part of the Cynthia Phipps Dispersal will be led by <u>hip 44</u>, a dark bay filly by Saarland, who sells during today's session. Niall Brennan Stables will act as agent for the pair of juveniles. Phipps died tragically after sustaining injuries in a fire in her Manhattan apartment Oct. 24. Following the scratch of an Orientate filly, the Phipp's sole representation of the fairer sex will come from Beirhaus, a May 1 foal out of Preservation Hall (Dixieland Band). The filly is the second foal out of her seven-year-old dam, who is a daugh-



ter of graded stakes winner Lead Kindly Light and a half-sister to Grade I winner Gold Fever and Grade I-placed Emanating. "I really like the Saarland filly," said Brennan. "She has a lot of Unbridled about her. For a May foal, she's a big strapping filly, very well made, and has a very solid pedigree. The further she goes, the better she'll be. She's got some speed. There is a lot of improve-

ment in her, and she's been breezing well. She's a nice big filly that is going to excel at a distance." The final horse due to sell at public auction from the Cynthia Phipps dispersal is hip 140, a bay colt by Cherokee Run. The Apr. 8 foal is out of Mood Music (Kingmambo), another daughter of the aforementioned Lead Kindly Light. The bay covered an eighth in :10.3 during the breeze show Monday. "They are both doing well and I think they will give a good account of themselves," said Brennan. Phipps, who raced Grade I winners Gold Fever and Versailles Treaty, also campaigned champion threeyear-old filly Christmas Past. *--C Bossinakis* 

#### Hartley/DeRenzo Stick to Game Plan...

After an exceptionally strong 2006 two-year-old season, highlighted by the sale of the \$16-million The Green Monkey, pinhookers went into that year's yearling sales with plenty of confidence...and plenty of money. The momentum failed to carry into 2007, however, and many pinhookers opted for a more conservative approach during the latest round of yearling sales.

One operation that didn't scale back much on its yearling buys is Hartley/DeRenzo Thoroughbreds. Randy Hartley and Dean DeRenzo came to Keeneland with two of the sale's top five priciest pinhooks, though hip 60, a filly by Seeking the Gold that cost \$300,000, was subsequently scratched.

"For my me, I just want to buy the best horses, and

it's hard to go for A-string horses and not spend a lot," explained Hartley. "It's just what we try to do, and for us, at least, when we do well, it's with those kinds of horses. So we just stuck with the same program last year. Because of it, we didn't buy too many horses--I think we only got, like, 12 horses."

Hartley/DeRenzo, of course, were responsible for turning The Green Monkey from a \$425,000 yearling to an eight-figure juvenile, but they had been investing in expensive yearlings well before that, said Hartley.

"We've always done it that way," he said. "When we first started, we were buying \$300,000 Danzigs, \$350,000 Nureyevs."

Hartley added with a laugh, "It's scary, but I just like dealing with quality horses. There are some that pan out that you didn't pay a lot for, and some you raise that pan out, but for us, it's usually the ones we paid a lot for as yearlings."

Hartley/De Denzo's most expensive public purchase who will go under the hammer at April is <u>hip 130</u>, a Medaglia d'Oro colt who was acquired for \$250,000 as a Fasig-Tipton Saratoga yearling. **Cont. p3**

"He's a really nice, two-turn horse," said Hartley. "He looks like he's four, and the great thing about this sale is that you can sell a horse like that--a horse that wants to go long. He's out of a Kris S. mare, so he's bred to run a mile and a half."

But Hartley/DeRenzo's most expensive pinhook of the sale is a horse it purchased privately. The operation acquired a 50-percent interest in <u>hip 123</u>, a Storm Cat 3/4-brother to GI Kentucky Oaks heroine Summerly (Summer Squall) and, while Hartley didn't reveal the cost of that interest, he did admit, "This is one of the most expensive horses we've ever bought. He's from a great family, and since Storm Cat's getting on in age, we felt this was the right time."


The bay colt, who was bred by Tom VanMeter, Michael Lowenbaum and Dr. Rand E. Danker, worked an eighth in :10 1/5 during yesterday's breeze show (video).

"He's blocky, but he's tall, too," said Hartley when asked to describe the colt. "He's your typical Storm Cat: short head, short ears. And he's a handful. But he's a really nice horse." --L.M.

Consigned by Scanlon Training Center, Agent I A \$175,000 Keeneland November weanling, hip 6 RNA'd for \$180,000 at Fasig-Tipton Saratoga, then resold to Dave Scanlon for \$125,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton October Sale, "She's a real nice Maria's Mon filly with a lot of page," Scanlon said yesterday after the breeze show. "She's a big, two-turn filly that looks the picture of a Classic horse. And Maria's Mon was just a fantastic sire." A little while earlier, hip 6 had breezed an eighth in :10 1/5 (video). She hails from a family that has worked well with Maria's Mon; her fullsister is GISP Ilusoria, herself the dam of Peak Maria's Way (Pyramid Peak). Another sister, Unacloud (Unaccounted For), is the dam of GISW Meadow Breeze (Meadowlake).

The colt is grandson of South Sea Dancer, who is the dam of MGSW Signal Tap and a sister to champions Storm Bird and Northernette. "He has a lot of Northern Dancer in him," observed Brennan. "We think he will go two

turns and, obviously, the pedigree has jumped up at the right time; it's a very active young pedigree. He's just a lovely young horse." Explaining the colt's inclusion in the Keeneland April catalog, Brennan added, "Being a May foal, we decided to keep him for this sale just to give him the extra time. But he has a very solid mind and getting better every week. The light seems to have just gone on. You can really see the change in his training ,and he's become really focused. He hasn't been pushed because he's a May foal. He's bred to go two turns and, physically, we think he's going to improve."

From the first crop of champion sprinter Speightstown (Gone West), this miss was produced by

Consigned by Niall Brennan Stables, Agent XIII By a top sire who needs no introduction, this bay put up an easy :10.1 for an eighth of a mile at Monday's breeze show (video). Out of multiple stakes winner and graded stakes placed Sweet Nanette, the May 1 foal is among three juveniles representing her sire at Keeneland. "She's a very pretty filly," said consignor Niall Brennan. "She's very racy and very athletic. She's quick and could turn out to be more like her mother, but she's deceptive in that she's really moves quickly over the racetrack. She's got speed, but she can stretch it out. She's only a May foal, but she has good size and a beautiful profile."

#### 76, f, Trippi-United Bog, by Linkage

Consigned by Wavertree Inc (Ciaran Dunne), agent The bay, by GISW and leading Florida sire Trippi, hails from a proven Florida family. She is a half-sister to Bog Hunter (Hunting Hard), a multiple stakes winner in the Sunshine State, and the Mar. 14 foal showed her best yesterday with a sparkling :10.0 flat breeze over the Polytrack (<u>video</u>). "We thought coming up here that she was probably our fastest horse, and the way she galloped out kind of affirmed that impression," said Ciaran Dunne. "You could pretty much run her next week if that's what you wanted to do."

#### 88, c, Orientate--Art Student, by El Prado (Ire) Consigned by Parrish Farms

Purchased by G. Ray Trisler, Mays Farm and G.W. Parrish for \$62,000 last year at the September Sale, this strapping chestnut was produced by a stakes winner and is a half to the stakes winner Art Show (Out of Place). Hip 88 was sent out to a quarter-mile move yesterday and stopped the clock in :21 2/5 (<u>video</u>). "For a horse his size, he's got quite a lot of speed," said consignor G.W. Parrish.

#### Jump Start Colt Euthanized After Breeze...

A colt by Jump Start--Precisely (Summing) was euthanized at Keeneland shortly after completing a furlong breeze during the latter part of yesterday's breeze show. While racing down the lane, hip 43, who was consigned by Becky Thomas' Sequel Bloodstock, appeared to prop in the stretch and seemed to be in distress down to the wire. The colt, a half-brother to GIII Bay Shore S. winner Precise End, was euthanized shortly thereafter.

## What They're Saying At The Sales...

#### Niall Brennan, Consignor

Discussing the new format at Keeneland this year and how it will affect consignors:

"I think [the two-day format] is worth trying. Fasig-Tipton tried something new this year, trying to get the action back to the scene. They tried to create a little more atmosphere there again. It seems to work at Saratoga when they have the night sale after racing. We'll see if it works here too. In the past, the breeze was always on Monday, and we were still scrambling to get all the vet work done. At least now it's night time, so people have all day to focus on the horses that are going to sell that day.

#### **Consignor Randy Hartley:**

"I love the single breeze show. It's hard to be away from home some 2 1/2 weeks. I hope they all do it; it saves expenses and, really, the first impression is everything. If your horse didn't make the cut the first time around, he's probably not going to make it the second, either. One of the things I wish would happen is for more trainers [on the grounds at Keeneland] would come over and see what we've got. I guess so many people have Derby fever right now, it's hard to get them off that train of thought."

#### Consigner John Stephens, Stephens Thoroughbreds:

"I think the one breeze show is plenty. It's not always going to go your way, but you could have three breeze shows and it's not always going to go your way. As far as the sale being at night, I think they're just trying to get more people involved in the sale, to get results that are positive for the sale. As far as it affects us, we just bring our horses here, hope they breeze well, and hope for the best. The reality is, if the horses don't present themselves well, you're not going to do very well, and the sales company, no matter what they do, can't handle that for you. If the horses do well, there's usually someone there to buy them."

#### Todd Pletcher, Eclipse Award-winning trainer:

"I think probably the trickiest part we'll be the veterinary stuff; first looking at the horses to see which ones you like, then doing the necessary vet work. [The two sessions] help, but you can't necessarily approach it like, 'I've got all day tomorrow because they sell Wednesday.' You've got to have a plan [for the entire sale], because some people are working on a budget. You can't just assume you're going to buy something on Tuesday, then buy something on Wednesday; you have to look at the big picture. I guess if I was putting the sale together, I would have had just one evening session on Wednesday."

#### Terrie Baze, Old School Thoroughbreds, Consignor

"I'm very impressed with the Speightstowns. They come out as impressive weanlings, and they go on to become very impressive yearlings and two-year-olds. They have nice consistent times. They are just goodlooking individuals. I also like Proud Citizen; he's doing really well. His horses appear to be better three-yearolds than two-year-olds, and in my book there is nothing wrong with that, since the majority of the money in this business is made with the three-year-olds and not with a two-year-old."



#### Consignor Mike Mulligan, Leprechaun Racing:

"If all those people that were in the grandstand and that were on the apron [Monday] actually buy a horse, this is going to be one hell of a horse sale. There were a helluva lot of people out there. Whether that equates to a lot of buyers, that will depend on the quality of the horses. All year, the buyers have been looking for horses, and every good, quality horse has brought plenty of money. In Miami, there was probably enough money there that if the horses vetted well and jumped through all the hoops, they would have spent another \$30 million. In March, every good horse around brought plenty of money."

#### **Consignor Randy Miles:**

"I loved the idea of one breeze show until today. It's 4 o'clock right now; I'm not sure what's taking them so long. I really thought we'd show some today, but I guess not. It's a good thing we didn't have 250 horses in the sale. (When asked about Keeneland's Polytrack) "I love this surface. When they come back, they're not blowing, they're not tired. I'm tickled to death with it."


#### **Consignor Murray Smith:**

"I like the change in format, but I'm not sure one sale night wouldn't be best because of the low number of horses. But I do like the night format, and I do like the one breeze. And I also think the buyers have plenty of time. The vets are here, it's close. From a yearling buyer's point of view, these guys get a lot of information. Sometimes too much information, and it takes them off horses. If your gut instinct tells you to buy the horse, and he vets well, buy him. Sometimes you can start doubting your own picks, and the more you critique a horse, the more faults you begin to find, and you talk yourself off a horse. As a yearling buyer, I can see a horse in the rear walking ring 10 minutes before he's supposed to sell, ask the consignor if they vet--'Yes they do'--and I buy him. A good horseman knows what he wants."

"Horses like Tale of the Cat are just a little too fast for their own good" was how trainer John Forbes assessed the situation after his colt had suffered a career-ending injury in 1998. The four-year-old had been injured in the process of working five furlongs in :59.4 in preparation for the GI Meadowlands Cup--a race which offered the son of Storm Cat a chance of gaining a long-overdue Grade I victory.

Tale of the Cat had been a little too fast for his own good throughout his career, but not too fast for his

The King's Bishop represented the colt's third win from his first four starts. A pair of easy successes at around 1 1/16 miles at Monmouth had encouraged his connections to consider tackling longer routes in the Haskell Invitational or even the Travers. However, a fourth-place finish in the Haskell led to Tale of the Cat dropping down the distance scale, rather than moving up it, and he stuck to seven furlongs when third in the GI Vosburgh S. His next target was to be the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, until inflammation in a joint put him on the sidelines, and he didn't race again until July 1998. **Cont. p9**

her trainer revealed she had been working well at home and had, like her sire High Chaparral, improved from two to three.

Perhaps because top-level opportunities for sprinters were harder to find in 1998, or perhaps because his price meant he had to pursue more prestigious prizes over longer distances, Tale of the Cat started out at a mile on his return. Two allowance wins earned him a shot at Awesome Again in the GI Whitney H. over 1 1/8 miles and he was far from disgraced in finishing second, but it was back to seven furlongs for what turned out to be his final effort, another third in the Vosburgh.

I think it is fair to say that speed rather than stamina was his strong suit, judging by his subsequent exploits as a stallion. None of his best winners thus far has succeeded in winning a graded race over a distance longer than 1 1/8 miles, and only three had managed to score over that distance prior to Tale of Ekati's victory over the game War Pass in the GI Wood Memorial. One of Tale of Ekati's predecessors, Lion Heart, stayed 1 1/4

miles well enough to finish second to Smarty Jones in the GI Kentucky Derby. If any son of Tale of the Cat is going to be suited by the Derby distance, you would have to think that it is going to be the Wood winner, even though he is inbred 4x3 to Mr Prospector. His first two dams are by Sunday Silence and Nijinsky, winners of six classics between them, and he is also inbred 4x4 to Northern Dancer and 5x3 to Nijinsky.

Sunday Silence may have failed in the GI Belmont S., but that didn't stop him siring some outstanding stayers, such as Deep Impact, in Japan. Tale of Ekati's dam Silence Beauty hardly had a chance to display how well she stayed, following her purchase for \$1 million as a Keeneland July yearling. She raced only as a twoyear-old, her best effort being a third over a mile in Ireland.

However, we know that her dam Maplejinsky stayed well enough to win the GI Alabama S. over 1 1/4 miles, even though she was a daughter of the champion sprinter Gold Beauty and a half-sister to the flying Dayjur.

Maplejinsky proved an outstanding buy at the \$750,000 she cost as a yearling. In addition to becoming a dual Grade I winner, she produced four foals--all fillies--for Georgia Hofmann before being sold to Japan, in foal to A.P. Indy, for \$2.7 million as a nine-year-old in 1994. Her first foal, by Blushing Groom, was that outstanding performer Sky Beauty, who recorded nine Grade I victories between the ages of two and four (when she was voted champion older female). Sky Beauty, who sold for \$2.85 million as a nine-year-old, stayed well enough to win the GI CCA Oaks and Alabama S., but her Group 3-winning Storm Cat colt, Hurricane Cat, seemed best at around a mile. Coincidentally, the family has produced yet another Alabama winner in the luckless 2006 winner Pine Island. This daughter of Arch was out of Maplejinsky's granddaughter Matlacha Pass, a sister to the excellent Pleasant Home and the Grade II winner Country Hideaway (these three Seeking the Gold fillies being inbred

2x4 to Mr Prospector). Pleasant Home triumphed in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff in 2005, a year after Silence Beauty had been acquired by Charles Fipke for \$525,000. Fipke's investment has already produced one major dividend in Tale of Ekati, the foal Silence Beauty was carrying at the time of her purchase,

and there could be other gems in store. The mare has been a regular visitor to Fipke's stallion Perfect Soul and her first foal by him realised \$280,000 as a weanling, before reselling for \$775,000 as a yearling.

That price of \$775,000 dollars for a yearling by a \$15,000 stallion provides an excellent insight into how successful this female line has been, and Tale of Ekati is bred well enough for anything. But is he good enough to cope with the likes of Big Brown and Pyro? I'm not yet convinced that he is, especially as we are still awaiting the first Kentucky Derby winner from the Storm Cat male line.

Hero of the California Derby Jan. 27, the dark bay ran third to Pyro in the GII Louisiana Derby Mar. 8 before finishing fourth in Saturday's GI Santa Anita Derby. Trainer Paddy Gallagher indicated that he would discuss his options with the colt's owners and rider Alex Solis. "We'll see what they think about his race and go from there," he said.

KARAKA HORSES GIVEN ALL CLEAR The 10

horses imported to New Zealand from the U.S. have cleared quarantine after a second round of tests showed the group is free of equine influenza. Samples initially taken from the horses at the Karaka guarantine facility tested positive for the disease, but MAF Biosecurity New Zealand announced Friday it would retest the horses, who had all tested negative for El prior to leaving the U.S. "We have completed a second round of tests and retested the original samples, and are now certain that the initial positive result was due to contamination in the laboratory," explained MAF Biosecurity New Zealand's Animals Imports Team Manager, Dr. Rachelle Linwood. "While we are very pleased that all samples have now tested negative, it is disappointing that cross-contamination occurred." An investigation is currently underway to ascertain the cause of the contamination. All restrictions placed on the Karaka facility have now been lifted.




