#### STORM CAT FERTILITY A CONCERN

Storm Cat (Storm Bird--Terlingua, by Secretariat), perennial leading sire at the track and at the sales, has shown signs of decreasing fertility during the first months of the current breeding season. According to published reports, fewer than half of the 31 mares he has covered this year have scanned in foal. "Well, he is 25 years old and he is having normal age degeneration, and with that comes some increased infertility," explained Ric Waldman, director of stallion operations for Overbrook Farm, where Storm Cat has stood his entire breeding career. Storm Cat, once the most expensive stallion in the world at \$500,000, is covering mares this season for \$300,000, the same fee as fellow leading sires A.P. Indy and Distorted Humor. Storm Cat began to see his fertility decline last year, Waldman said. "His numbers dropped to 70 percent last year, so a continued decrease is not entirely unexpected." Waldman added that there are no plans to limit the numbers of mares Storm Cat will be bred to for the remainder of the year, nor have any longer-term decisions been made regarding the future of the stallion. "We will just keep monitoring his book as the season goes along and, as time passes, we'll have a better idea of what's happening." Storm Cat is the sire of 160 stakes winners worldwide, 32 of which have won at Grade/Group 1 level, including Giant's Causeway, Forestry, Tale of the Cat, the late Hennessy, Cat Thief, dual Classic winner Tabasco Cat, as well champions Storm Flag Flying and Sweet Catomine. His daughters have produced 91 stakes winners. While the success of Storm Cat offspring at the races is unmistakable, his reputation as a sire of top-selling yearlings is unprecedented. A total of 88 of his sons and daughters have sold for \$1 million or more, led by Jalil, a colt out of Tranquility Lake (Rahy). He was purchased by John Ferguson on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed for a salestopping \$9.7 million at the 2005 Keeneland September sale. Storm Cat is responsible for seven of the top 10 priced colts to sell at Keeneland as well as three of the

#### SEVEN FOR SEVEN AT KEENELAND DAY 1

Pop open a bottle of bubbly? Vacation in Tahiti? Nah. When it comes to a G1 Dubai World Cup victory, owner Jess Jackson is happy to celebrate by picking up some more horses for his Stonestreet Stable. At last night's opening session of the Keeneland April Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale, the vintner got the action off

to a fast start when he went to a session-topping \$700,000 for hip 7, a Langfuhr half-brother to GII Fountain of Youth S. hero and GI Toyota Blue Grass S. hopeful Cool Coal Man (Mineshaft).

"It's been a great year for us, so we're celebrating by buying another horse with some potential," said Jackson, who captured the

world's richest race two weeks ago with reigning Horse of the Year Curlin.

By Lane's End's Langfuhr, the late May 22 foal was produced by Coral Sea (Rubiano), a winning half-sister to Signal Tap from the family of Storm Bird, et al.

"We're very pleased; he's a very good addition," said Jackson, who added with a wry smile, "But it's going to be hard to beat Curlin."

Steve Asmussen, who conditions Curlin, will also train this colt. *Cont. p2*

#### Fast Work, Big Price...

Hip 7 put buyers on notice Monday when he roared through an eighth in :9 3/5, which equaled the world record for the distance. And while winning bidder Jess Jackson was impressed with the work, he said it wasn't the colt's biggest selling point.

"That horse's breeding is what I was interested in," Jackson said. "Langfuhr's got a lot of good blood. "His speed and precociousness are interesting, but what I'm really interested in is his long-term potential. We think he could be very special. And the people who were bidding against me know something about horses, too."

The underbidders Jackson referred to were representatives of WinStar Farm. Doug Cauthen and Elliott Walden sat two sections away from Jackson, himself front and center in the pavilion alongside bloodstock advisor John Moynihan, and were the last remaining challengers to Jackson in a bidding duel that also included Dogwood Stable's Cot Campbell.

Jackson said he would likely give the colt some time to develop in the expectation his new purchase, a May 22 foal, would be a two-turn animal.

"I'm looking for long distance," he said. "He's a very special horse with speed, but what you're really looking for is the one who can go a mile and a half. We'll be having lunch with the previous owners and trainers, and we'll be asking Steve and Scotty [Blasi, assistant trainer] what to do with him."


Jackson has picked up a few high-profile runners at juvenile sales this season. He bought the top two horses at Barretts March, an \$800,000 Silver Deputy filly and a \$650,000 Sir Cherokee colt.

The sale of hip 7 was a nice pinhooking score for consignor Niall Brennan, who acquired the colt with partner Mike Ryan for \$135,000 at last year's Keeneland September Sale. At that point, Brennan was aware of his half-brother Cool Coal Man, but that one had yet to even break his maiden. Five months later, Brennan was looking pretty smart after that Mineshaft colt posted the mild upset in the Fountain of Youth in late February.

Entering the April Sale, Brennan was worried his charge's early spot in the catalog might compromise his chances.

"He sold very early in the sale and there's not much momentum," said the Irishman. "It's hard to get a line on whether he brought a fair price. Several people may have stayed away because they may have thought he was going to bring too much, but we're very happy. He's going to a great home. He's a great horse and they really got a great buy. If his brother wins the Blue Grass on Saturday, they're going to end up looking really smart, aren't they?" -Lucas Marquardt

#### The Beat Goes on Keeneland...

The new two-day evening format of Keeneland's Two-year-Olds In Training Sale concluded its first day yesterday with gross expenditures topping the \$7-million mark and the average weighing in at a healthy \$209,618. From 64 horses offered Tuesday, 34 found homes, and the median figure closed at \$165,000. "It was a typical two-year-old sale," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "Performance counts, and when performance matters, the market becomes very polarized. The good ones bring good prices." Heading the consignors at the end of the first session was Niall Brennan Stables, selling eight for \$2,710,000. Leading the buyers on the evening was B. Wayne Hughes, who purchased two for \$1,250,000. Commenting on the new format, Russell added, "I think the format worked well. It was the best-attended preview I've been to. We had a great crowd, and the atmosphere was festive." When asked the overall feeling after the first day, Russell concluded, "It was a good day at the office. We're satisfied." -C Bossinakis

#### Hughes Times Two...

By the time the workout videos had been scrutinized and the vetting was complete, Seth Semkin and Richard Mandella, comprising the main buying team for B. Wayne Hughes, had whittled their prospects to two. And after landing their first pick, a Cozzene colt for \$575,000, the men were back to secure the second, a muscular son of Aldebaran for \$675,000. It was the day's second-highest price.

"We're very happy to get both," said Semkin from the rear walking ring, where he fought off a challenge from Dublin-based bloodstock agent John McCormack, the direct underbidder. "Mr. Hughes was very game. They both sold very strong, I thought. This colt's a really nice-moving horse. And the family helps, with the full-sister being as talented as she is."

Catalogued as hip 45, the Jan. 14 colt is a full-sibling to the now three-year-old Grace Anatomy, third in last year's GI Darley Alcibiades S. here at Keeneland, and is a grandson of the top grass mare Plenty of Grace (Roberto), a Grade I winner and also the granddam of the fleet Diabolical. *Cont. p4*

Whether hip 45 will be a speedster like Diabolical or a two-turn animal remains to be seen, said Semkin.

"I couldn't say that he looks like a route horse by looking at him physically," said Semkin. "The family has so many route runners on the bottom side, so I would say that helps him. Aldebaran himself was a good miler, and he's obviously extraordinarily fast, so we'll have to see if he can stretch out."

Mandella will train both colts.

Hip 45 sported the co-fastest breeze Monday for a quarter mile after stopping the clock in :20 2/5. A \$100,000 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga purchase by Timbertown Stables, he was consigned by Kip Elser's Kirkwood Stables. -Lucas Marquardt

#### Derby Duo for Kirkwood?

It would be an accomplishment for anyone who breaks and trains two-year-olds to have a horse represented in the GI Kentucky Derby. To have two is a

special feat, one that Kirkwood Stable's Kip Elser is on the verge of achieving. Last year, Elser sent both **Cool Coal Man** and **Smooth Air** (Smooth Jazz) through their early paces.

The latter was a homebred for Mount Joy Stables, who was not offered at sale, while Cool Coal Man, purchased by Robert LaPenta as a yearling, RNA'd for \$850,000 at Fasig-Tipton Calder. This spring, both horses have made their mark in South Florida. Smooth Air captured the GII Hutcheson S. and, more re-

cently, was a very good second to Big Brown in the GI Florida Derby, while Cool Coal Man will be among the favorites in Saturday's GI Toyota Blue Grass S. following his victory in the GII Fountain of Youth S.

"To have two horses, who may or may not be in anybody's top five [for the Derby], but who will hopefully show up [in the Derby] is very exciting," Elser said from his barn yesterday as he looked over his 2008 wares.

Elser has fond memories of both of his accomplished former pupils.

"Cool Coal Man was a beautifully balanced, nice horse," he said. "He was slightly on the small side, because he was a late May foal, but he was a cool horse with a great attitude. We took a May foal and got him ready for Calder, and that's mentally very hard on them. But he took it, which is a sign of a good horse."

Elser continued, "One day at Saratoga I was there to see Nick [Zito] one morning and he was kicking in the stall and broke the top stall chain. He's just a bouncy, good-feeling horse."

Smooth Air, meanwhile, was the consummate pro, said Elser.

"He was--and still is--as steady and business-like as any horse can be," said Elser.

Being by a graded stakes-winning sprinter, Smooth Air doesn't necessarily have a two-turn pedigree, but Elser said that wasn't on his mind last spring.

"At the time, I didn't know enough about Smooth Jazz to think he wouldn't get two turns," Elser laughed.

Last night, Kirkwood's draft was highlighted by the sale of hip 45, an Aldebaran colt, for \$675,000, and looks to keep the momentum going tonight through its last offering, hip 188, a bay colt by Dynaformer who as a \$260,000 Keeneland September yearling is one of the pricier pinhooks of the sale.

"He's a top-notch colt," said Elser. "He's big, and not as plain and awkward at this stage as quite a few Dynaformers are. To me, he looks like the ones that turn out well." -Lucas Marquardt

#### B-Line for Son of Cozzene...

With the barrel still smoking following the sessiontopping \$700,000 final price on a Niall Brennan consigned Langfuhr colt, another pupil from the Brennan school--this time a son of Cozzene--reeled in a \$575,000 final price from B. Wayne Hughes. Hughes, who was bidding from the back of the pavilion, was flanked by advisors Sam Semkin and West coast trainer Richard Mandella. The May 4 foal negotiated an eighth of a mile in :10.1 during Monday's breeze show. "He has a big stride and is very powerful," said Mandella, explaining the decision to buy hip 16. "We went back to the barn and he was nice and relaxed and is very laid back." By GI Breeders' Cup Mile hero Cozzene, the colt is out of Fluttery Danseur (Wavering Monarch), winner of three graded stakes, including the GII Landaluce S. The 19-year-old mare has produced GI Citation H. runner-up Hendrix (Sultry Song) and stakes performer On Gossamer Wings (Afternoon Delites). "Cozzene seems to be a little heavier sided to producing horses for the turf, but the way this colt moved over this track, I don't see why he shouldn't be able to handle the dirt. But if he wants turf, then it's turf," Mandella continued. The price for the juvenile far exceeded the top price of \$240,000 last year for a two-year-old by Gainseway stallion Cozzene. The colt, who was a \$225,000 Keeneland September purchase for Nick de Meric, is expected to join Mandella's Southern California string. "He has a good family top to bottom," added Mandella. "It was his presence, the way he was made and the way he moved over the track and he has the pedigree to back it up." Brennan was selling on behalf of a de Meric partnership. Paul Pompa Jr. was underbidder on the colt. -C Bossinakis

#### WinStar Strikes Gold at Keeneland...

A handsome colt by first-season sire Medaglia d'Oro realized a \$450,000 final bid from WinStar Vice President Elliott Walden, acting on behalf of Maverick Racing, at Tuesday's opening session at Keeneland. Offered by Mike and Brit Mulligan's Leprechaun Racing, hip 77 is out of the unraced mare Viaduct (Thunder Gulch), who is a half sister to Passing My Way (Pass the Glass), the dam of GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Filles heroine Phone Chatter. Bought by a syndicate, the Apr. 15 foal breezed an eighth of a mile in :10.1 during Monday's breeze show (video). "The market is strong for good horses, so he brought more than we had hoped," said Walden, who added the colt was purchased for Maverick racing, a subsidiary of WinStar Farm.

"He's very neat, a beautiful mover and will probably be a two-turn horse," Walden continued. "Hopefully, one day we can put him in the stall as a stallion." The colt, who was secured for a mere \$25,000 by Hidden Brook at last year's Keeneland September Sale, is the sole representative of a pinhooking syndicate made up of Hidden Brook clients. "The Medaglia d'Oros were selling strongly [as yearlings] and we liked his offspring on a whole, but he was just a little behind," said Hidden Brook's Jack Brothers. We saw the potential for him to improve. Since then, he just blossomed, and when he got here, he stepped up and became a major league horse. He showed very well in the ring, and looked good under tack and just went the right way." Standing at Stonewall Farm, nine-year-old Medaglia d'Oro averaged \$119,957 for 77 yearlings sold in 2007, with a top price of \$675,000. "We hoped for a six-figure horse, but we didn't expect the price that he brought," added Brothers. -C Bossinakis

#### Pletcher Lands Pair for Klaravich

Trainer Todd Pletcher enjoyed the laurels of a championship in 2004 when the flashy colt Speightstown closed out the season with a victory in the GI Breeder's Cup Sprint, and went back to that same well yesterday, securing a bay filly by that sire for Seth Klarman and Jess Ravich's Klaravich Stables for \$300,000. Enjoying a strong evening with four juveniles bringing over \$300,000, Niall Brennan consigned hip 40, who was part of an in-house partnership. Purchased as a yearling for \$200,000 at Fasig-Tipton Saratoga last August, the attractive filly stopped the timer in :10.1 for her furlong breeze (video) Monday. "I liked her performance on the racetrack, she breezed well and galloped out strongly," said Pletcher. "She's a very athletic filly, and was one of the nicest Speightstowns I've seen at the sales, and obviously I'm a big fan, having trained him. There's been a lot of buzz about him and he produces very nice, balanced horses." The bay is out of multiple stakes winner North Lake Jane, who was runner-up in the GI Selene S. The 11-year-old mare is a daughter of MGSP Cassowary, the dam of GSWs Meadow Flight and People's Princess. Later in the evening, Pletcher signed the ticket on hip 67, a chestnut colt by freshman sire Read the Footnotes, on behalf of Klaravich. Purchased for \$220,000, the New York-bred, out of Structured (West by West), negotiated an eighth in :10 flat Monday (video). -C Bossinakis





#### The 'Tate of Victory...

It has been a good spring for consignor G.W. Parrish's Parrish Farms and its partners. At OBS February, the operation sold the sale's top-priced colt, a Speightstown juvenile for \$475,000, and a few weeks

later sold a Proud Citizen filly at Fasig-Tipton Calder for \$320,000. That filly was purchased for just \$52,000 as a yearling by a partnership that included G. Ray Trisler and Mays Farm, and yesterday Parrish Farm joined with that group for a similarly

stylish score. Hip 88, an imposing chestnut son of Orientate, was purchased as a Keeneland September yearling for \$62,000 by Trisler, Mays Farm, Bennett and Parrish. Last night, Peachtree Stable's John Fort, sitting in the back of the pavilion, saw off all challengers to buy the colt for \$350,000.

"The horse had a great energy around him," Fort explained with a smile shortly after signing the ticket. "But that was probably my last bid."

Fort said the colt would get a break before resuming his training.

"We'll give him some time at the farm," he said. "He's not really a 'now' horse; he looks like a horse that is just learning how to run. But he's the kind that could be a big horse down the road."

Ray Trisler, who watched his horse sell from the rear of the pavilion, agrees that it make take the colt sometime to develop, but says he expects the horse to go on to big things, too.

"I think they're going to do fine with this horse," Trisler said. "This is not the last time you're going to hear from him. It's funny, of the four partners in on the horse, two of us really liked him, and we got the other guys excited about him. But we had no idea the horses would turn out this well. G.W. did a great job with him."

While many big horses go through a "gawky teenager" phase as yearlings, Trisler said that wasn't the case with this colt, at by the time he entered the ring at September.

"He was actually always a really good-looking horse, but he was long-legged and not the type you'd typically pinhook," Trisler explained. "But he's a great runner, and he's done everything right on the farm." -Lucas Marquardt



"The Fasig Texas Two-Year-Old sale, not surprisingly, followed the year's general trend: gross down 12 percent, number sold down nine percent, average down a few hundred dollars - about four percent. One of seven horses in this year's sale to break the :10 barrier was hip 149, a colt by Officer out of Push Her (Devil His Due). The chestnut, who is a half-brother to Canadian stakes winner Montero, stopped the clock in :9 4/5. "We caught him galloping out silly fractions, and I wasn't sure they could go that fast," offered Dunne. Just a tick behind that colt were a slew of performers who recorded a :10 flat final time for an eighth of a mile, including hip 125, a bay filly by Medaglia d'Oro (El Prado {Ire}) out of the Homebuilder mare Home Together. The Mar. 26 foal is a half-sister to stakes winner Cin Cin. "She looks like a filly who will get two turns," said Dunne. "She's really fast, has got a good way of going, and is a really classy type of filly." "This is a really immature filly who isn't even close to finished yet," said Dunne. "Might be one of the most exciting prospects we've had in a long time." - C Bossinakis



Matz opted to take the colt to Fair Grounds for his stakes/two-turn debut, the GIII Risen Star S. Feb. 9, and Visionaire ran third to Pyro (video). He went up to New York next out and, despite being lost in the fog for much of the GIII Gotham S. Mar. 8, rallied determinedly to win by a nose (video). "He made a good step from his first try going two turns in the Risen Star to the Gotham--he made some big improvement there," Matz continued. "The pace was very slow in the Risen Star; [as for the Gotham], other than the start and the finish, I didn't see much of the race."

Assuming Visionaire punches his ticket to the Kentucky Derby, Matz added, "He'll probably get to Churchill a week ahead of time, and will probably have his last breeze there." Visionaire, a son of the stakes-placed Scarlet Tango (French Deputy), has the tough Silver Tango (Silver Badge)--she won 17 of 47 career starts and earned \$473,242--as his second dam, and hails from the family of graded winners Merengue and Point Determined.

#### Tagg Pair Work at Keeneland

Trainer Barclay Tagg sent out a pair of three-year-olds to work four furlongs yesterday at Keeneland. GIII Tampa Bay Derby winner Big Truck (Hook and Ladder), who remains possible for Saturday's GI Toyota Blue Grass S., covered the distance in a co-bullet :46.60. It was the fastest of 56 works at the distance yesterday. "He worked a little faster than I desired, but not too fast," Tagg said of the drill. "He's a fast horse. But he did it very easily and he handled the track well." Tagg will wait to see how Big Truck comes out of yesterday's work before making a Blue Grass decision. "He jogged yesterday and galloped today and he will work twice before the Lexington, maybe [Wednesday]," said trainer Dante Zanelli.


**BRUGES GUINEAS BID IN DOUBT** Connections of the unbeaten Bruges (Ire) (Marju {Ire}) appear to have lost their battle to make the May 3 G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket. Acquired by Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum following his success in the Listed Golden Fleece S. at Leopardstown in July, the David Myerscough-trained colt has not raced since, and may need more time before he can debut in the Shadwell silks, "He's been a bit frustrating since Sheikh Hamdan bought him, being held up with a niggling joint problem which hopefully has resolved itself, and he scoped dirty recently," the owner's Racing Manager Angus Gold explained vesterday. "He is being treated at the moment, so I don't think he will make the Guineas as we need to get a prep run into him."

MUTHABARA ON TRIAL Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Muthabara (Ire) (Red Ransom) looks set to reappear in one of next week's trials for Newmarket's G1 1000 Guineas May 4. Injured after winning Sandown's Listed Star S. in July, the John Dunlop-trained filly is being lined up for either Wednesday's G3 Nell Gwyn S. at Newmarket or Newbury's G3 Fred Darling S. three days later. "She hasn't been asked any major questions yet, but she did go to Goodwood last weekend and Richard Hills went to have a sit on her," the owner's Racing Manager Angus Gold commented. "Mr. Dunlop and Richard were both very happy with her, but, like all fillies, she could do with some warmer weather. She won both her starts impressively last year and looked a nice filly in the making before she had a tiny hairline crack in her pelvis, but the signs are that she's moving well and has a lot of enthusiasm. She's showing plenty of speed and at the moment, all being well, we're aiming to run her in one of the trials next week and then take it from there." Gold also revealed that the Newmarket maiden winner Shabiba (Seeking the Gold) may also line up in a prep for the Marcus Tregoning stable. "We'll probably aim her at a trial next week and she's working well," he added. "She would have been a sharp filly last year, but she arrived late from Dubai and then had hold-ups, but she's potentially a very nice filly. It's just a question of how far she will stav."



Barry Irwin, head of Team Valor International, was the fifth-leading buyer by gross (R7.885 million for 13 head) and gave a ringing endorsement. "This is the best-value Thoroughbred sale in the world," he said. "It takes courage to come here, but I again enjoyed myself thoroughly and will be back next year." The overall top buyer was Form Bloodstock, which was acting on behalf of several clients, including Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Maktoum of Dubai. They purchased 29 horses for nearly R24 million.
