STORM CAT COLT TOPS KEENELAND APRIL

The clouds were gathering over the Keeneland sales pavilion all day long, and the storm finally hit at 7:37 p.m. That's when Don Gato, a strongly made son of Storm Cat, entered the ring and touched off a bidding

war that ended with Mammed Mirza Gusseynov landing the colt for \$800,000. It was the top-priced horse of the two-day April Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale.



Gusseynov's veterinarian, Guy Khoury, who was sitting with Lexington-based advisor Hanzly Albina toward the left side of the pavilion,

outlasted several bidders on the far side of the ring. including Alex Solis, who bowed out around the \$575,000 mark; as well as reported representatives of Jeff Singer. Catalogued as hip 123 from the consignment of Hartley/De Renzo, the colt is three-quarter brother to GI Kentucky Oaks winner Summerly (Summer Squall). He breezed an eighth in :10 1/5 Monday (video). Solid Results As KEEAPR Goes Prime Time...

Overall, the two nights of the Keeneland April sale saw a slight gain in average and a slight dip in median. The RNA rate improved dramatically, from 47.1 percent last year to 38.4 percent this time around. Geoffrey Russell, Keeneland's director of sales, was pleased with the overall results. "We sold five fewer horses [than last vearl for a few hundred thousand dollars less, so for all intents and purposes, it's the same," Russell said. "I think this format worked well. Night sales do work; it gives it an extra buzz. There was a great feel. I think it added to the experience of this sale." Looking ahead, he added, "I'd like more horses in the sale--that's where you get into a 'boutique sale.' You need a critical mass to attract buyers, and when you don't have that critical mass some people just don't come. So I'd like to have more horses."

A Brief Geography Lesson...

Adding an international flavor to the sale, Mammed Mirza Gusseynov's purchase of the sale-topping Storm Cat colt takes the story from Lexington, Kentucky, to the Republic of Azerbaijan, a former satellite of the Soviet Union which declared its independence in October of 1991. Azerbaijan, has a population of about nine million and is located due east of Turkey on the Caspian Sea.

A businessman and booster of horse racing in the country, Gusseynov built Hippodrome of Azerbaijan, which began conducting racing last summer. Gusseynov, who is based in the capital of Baku, also operates a stud farm there and runs a breeding operation. The farm currently stands Chairman, a winning 11-year-old son of Deputy Minister, and the stakes winner Irish Conquest (Conquistador Cielo), who was third in the GII Illinois Derby in 1996.

And while Don Gato may eventually find his way overseas, Guy Khoury, the veterinarian at the Hippodrome of Azerbaijan, said the colt will most likely continue his career in the United States.

"For the moment, we'll stay here," he said, adding that Gusseynov might even purchase a farm in the Blue Grass State.

Khoury said a trainer had not yet been decided on. Gusseynov also purchased hip 105, a colt from the first crop of Smarty Jones, for \$75,000. Jerry Bailey Sales Agency, Agent II, consigned the chestnut.

Here I Go Again...

Named by the farm workers which tended to him as a yearling, Don Gato--Mr. Cat--was slated to go through the Keeneland September Sale, but came up with a



'ding,' according to Eaton Farms' Tom VanMeter, and was subsequently scratched. Soon after, Randy Hartley and Dean De Renzo purchased a halfshare in the horse from his breeders, VanMeter, Michael Lowenbaum and Dr. Rand E. Dankner.

"He's a nice horse," VanMeter said just before congratulating the winning bidders. "He's out of a Classic-producing Mr. Prospector mare."

Asked if the colt was close to failing to meet his reserve, VanMeter laughed and said, "Well, let's just say I think he was very well bought."

The sale of the colt comes a day after it was announced that 25-year-old Storm Cat is experiencing fertility issues. The Overbrook stallion is standing for \$300,000 in 2008.

"Obviously, with the news, they're not going to be making many more of these," said VanMeter.

VanMeter first purchased Don Gato's dam, the Mr. Prospector mare Here I Go, for \$500,000 at this very sale in 1998.

"She was the first horse ever--ever--to go :10 flat at a two-year-old sale," he said. "My great friend Maurice Miller consigned her. She's been great to us."

An allowance winner on the track, Here I Go produced Summerly, her second foal, to the cover of Summer Squall. That miss won the Oaks in 2005. The 12year-old Here I Go had a Bernardini colt last Saturday night.

"She was scheduled to go back to Storm Cat, but I don't know about that now," said VanMeter. "But man, those Mr. Prospector mares make a lot of us look smart."

In addition to hip 123 and to Summerly, who brought \$410,000 as a KEESEP yearling, Here I Go also produced a Menifee filly that went for \$160,000 at FTSAUG in 2004, a Touch Gold colt that brought \$255,000 at KEESEP 2005 and a Touch Gold filly that was sold for \$300,000 at KEESEP 2006. -Lucas Marquardt

Zayat Zeros in on Dynaformer Colt...

With only three hips left to go through the ring, an attractive colt by Dynaformer reeled in a \$500,000 final bid from Zayat Stables yesterday. In the absence of Zayat primary Ahmed Zayat, trainer Bill Mott handled the bidding duties. "I didn't buy it; all I've got is a pen," joked Mott, adding, "I thought he was very special. He was just a very nice horse; a very refined Dynaformer. Some of them tend to be a little coarse, but I thought he was somewhere in between. He was big and strong, but he was smooth enough and had a lot of quality." According to Mott, he will join his string in New York shortly. A \$260,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase, the Apr. 14 foal was offered by Kip Elser's Kirkwood Stables. "We thought he would bring somewhere around what he brought," said Elser. "Mentally, he is very solid and businesslike; a real professional." The colt is out of nine-year-old Biscayne Bay (A.P. Indy), a daughter of champion two-year-old filly Flanders, making her a half sister to champion three-yearold filly Surfside and stakes-placed Flanders Fields. "He's a horse that you don't ordinarily see at a twoyear-old sale," explained Elser. "He's by a horse that gets top-class runners going long, out of a young mare that gets top-class runners going long, and out of a great Overbrook family." During Monday's breeze session, the bay stopped the timer in :21.2 for a guarter of a mile. "He didn't work as fast as some here, but he acted like a horse who wants to go long and be a good three-year-old next year." With a slew of outstanding dirt performers, including Kentucky Derby hero Barbaro, Dynaformer is also responsible for English champion sophomore filly Ocean Silk. "He will go over anything you put him on," Elser said. "I had him over dirt, turf and Polytrack, and he's been very good over all three." -C.B.

Out of the Woods, In the Money...

Consignor Eddie Woods, after a lackluster opener to the April sale, rebounded with a strong session high-

lighted by the sale of hip 155, a More Than Ready--Riverboat Miss (Storm Cat) filly for \$625,000. It was the top price for a filly at April.

From the family of Grade I winner River Special, the chestnut worked an eighth in :9 4/5 at Monday's breeze show, drawing the attention of Team

Darley. Jimmy Bell, representing

Sheikh Mohammed's operation, launched the winning salvo. Jess Jackson was the underbidder.

"She really was striking," Bell said after signing the ticket. "And she fits the profile of what Sheikh Mohammed is looking for in his two-year-old purchases. She's a lovely mover on the race track--her time speaks for itself--and she's hard to fault on a shank. And she really has a lovely female family and, with a little racing luck on her part, we look for good things."

Bell said Sheikh Mohammed would decide where the filly would continue her young career.

"It was a great price," an ebullient Woods said of the transaction. "She went to a great house, and the underbidder is a great house. It's what a horse like that is supposed to bring at the end of the day."

It was the second of three big successes on the night for Woods. Earlier, he sold hip 131, a colt by Tale of the Cat, for \$460,000. And, with bidding in its final hour, he sold hip 170, a Holy Bull colt, for \$460,000. Carolyn Wilson was the winning bidder on the horse, a son of the 13-year-old GSP mare Tipperary Melody (Rahy). The handsome gray was purchased last September for \$65,000 by Elite Racing's Ben McElroy and Gabriel Duignan, who subsequently offered a 50-percent share to Woods.

"They asked if I wanted a piece and I just said, 'send him over,'" said Woods.

Watching the proceedings from the back walking ring, Woods let out a triumphant howl as the bidding climb past the \$400,000 mark.

"I was thinking \$175,000 for him, but it was one big shootout, wasn't it?" he chuckled. *-Lucas Marquardt*

Cozzene Closes Day 2 With a Bang...

With the crowd dwindling and a single horse left to pass through the ring, many thought the action would abate, but Hip 191 punctuated the evening with a robust \$600,000 final bid from Alex Solis Bloodstock, who was acting on behalf of an unidentified pair of West Coast clients. Offered by agent Niall Brennan Stables, Agent VII, the filly, who is out of Brookdale (Turkoman), negotiated an eighth of a mile in :10.1 Monday. The grey, who was a \$200,000 yearling purchase at Fasig-Tipton July last year, was the sole purchase on the day for the 23-year-old Solis, who is the son of the top West Coast jockey. "There were two horses we really, really liked in the sale, and we didn't get the other one," explained Marette Farrell, associate of Solis. "So this is the one we really went after. We waited and waited, and we're absolutely delighted we got her. She's just so athletic and classy. Her breeze was effortless. We went back to the walking ring [before she went under the hammer], and she just oozed class. She just walked around there like she was walking around the winner's circle." The filly is expected to join trainer Julio Canani's string in California. -C.B.

McMahon and Partners Ready for More...

McMahon Bloodstock's Mike McMahon says that when it comes to selecting yearlings, he likes to go after the best representative from a given sire's crop. He thought he found the best filly of More Than Ready's 2007 yearling crop at Keeneland September last year, a handsome chestnut with a big walk, and paid \$250,000 for her. Yesterday, he found a few others who might share his opinion on the filly, namely Jimmy Bell, who last night paid \$625,000 for the filly on behalf of Darley.

"She was gorgeous as a yearling," McMahon said after congratulating Bell. "I like to buy the best by a sire, and she was the best More Than Ready. I love More Than Ready--I think he's the greatest."

McMahon originally purchased the filly as a pinhooking prospect for a pair of East Coast-based clients, Henry Mast and Stephen Wigmore.

"Henry's been a client of mine for years, actually," said McMahon. "He had Miss Lodi, who sold for \$2 million here a couple years back. Steve is a fairly new client. He's from the Boston area."

McMahon added that he was happy with the price, but said he wouldn't have been surprised if she brought even more for a filly who was a standout from the beginning at consignor Eddie Woods's Ocala training center.

"She's always been fast, she's always been quick," he said. "She does things normal horses don't do. But give Eddie Woods credit. He did a wonderful job with her." -Lucas Marquardt

Jackson Adds to his Collection...

After securing Monday's session-topping Langfuhr colt for \$700,000, Stonestreet Stable's Jess Jackson was again busy during yesterday's finale. In the span of a minute and a half, Jackson, sitting with bloodstock

advisor John Moynihan, purchased hip 99, a Scrimshaw filly for \$435,000 and hip <u>101</u>, a Seattle Fitz (Arg) colt for \$290,000. He later added hip <u>190</u>, a Forestry filly, for \$250,000. Jackson was the sale's leading buyer, nabbing a total of five juveniles for \$1,895,000.

"We liked her athleticism," said Jackson

about the Scrimshaw filly, who was the sale's thirdhighest-priced miss. "She's pretty; petite, but not yet fully grown. We haven't been buying many fillies, and mares in foal are getting expensive. So we thought we'd give her a chance, and hopefully she proves to be the athlete she looks like." cont. p7

"Her pedigree's a little light, but sometimes mares pop up from nowhere," Jackson continued. "She seems a better investment that most of the fillies we've seen."

From the first crop of Grade II winner Scrimshaw, by Gulch, the daughter of the Private Terms mare Christmas Rose was purchased by Leprechaun for just \$55,000 out of last year's Fasig-Tipton July Sale. She made a strong case for herself with a :9 4/5 breeze-just a tick off the world-record for an eighth--at Monday's breeze show.

"She is just absolutely gorgeous," said Leprechaun's Mike Mulligan. "She was spectacular on the track and was worth every penny. They won't be disappointed. We've done very well with young, unproven stallions. She had all the ingredients to be a good horse." *-L.M.*

Unbridled's Song Colt Builds Momentum...


It didn't take long for things to get rolling at Keeneland vesterday, and by the time Hip 117 strolled into the ring, the crowd was ready to spend some money. A handsome gray by Unbridled's Song, out of the Grade I winning mare Gaviola (Cozzene), brought a \$475,000 final bid from Mike McCarty early in the evening. Signing the ticket for the Apr. 15 foal was trainer Steve Asmussen, who will train the horse. McCarty, owner of McCarty Corp., an Austin-based construction company, enjoyed previous success with Keeneland April graduate Private Vow, who won the GII Belmont Futurity in 2005. Consigned by Jerry Bailey Sales Agency, the colt breezed a quarter mile in :21.1 during Monday's breeze show. "He breezed very good and galloped out well," said Asmussen. "He fit the part, physically and, mentally, and I expect him to be a runner." The fourth foal out of 11-year-old Gaviola, winner of the GI Garden City BC H., the handsome colt RNA'd for \$210,000 last year at Keeneland September. The colt's dam was purchased by ClassicStar for \$1.9 million in 2004. -C.B.

Narvick Secures Tale of a Cat Colt...

Narvick International went to \$460,000 to land a Tale of the Cat colt from the draft of Eddie Woods, Agent XII. Consigned as Hip 131, he breezed an eighth in :10 1/5. Narvick President Emmanuel de Seroux commented, "I thought he had a really good action. A very nice horse overall, but what sold me on him was his action." De Seroux added that the son of Lady Linda (Torrential), MGSP, \$307,377, will race in California for Marsha Naify. "I thought he was going to bring about \$350,000," Woods offered. "He was the type of horse that always wanted to give you a little bit extra. He's a beautiful-looking horse; very athletic, but still immature. He still has a ways to go, but a really sound nice horse." Bred in Kentucky by Domino Stud of Lexington, he was purchased by Bradley Thoroughbreds Brokerage, agent, as a \$110,000 KEESEP yearling. Tale of Ekati, another son of Tale of the Cat, punched his ticket to the GI Kentucky Derby with a determined score in Saturday's GI Wood Memorial S. at the Big A.



"The Fasig Texas Two-Year-Old sale, not surprisingly, followed the year's general trend: gross down 12 percent, number sold down nine percent, average down a few hundred dollars – about four percent. Revenues this year are down about 10 percent from 2006-2007 highs, but with the number catalogued and sold down even more, the average for those sold is actually up. Keeneland's two-day April Two-Year-Old sale ends tonight, followed by Doncaster later this week and Tattersalls next week, in Britain."

Earnhardts Land Cat Dreams Filly...

Freshman stallion Cat Dreams (Storm Cat) enjoyed a huge score at Keeneland yesterday when a filly from his first crop brought a \$230,000 final bid from trainer Bob Baffert, who signed the ticket on behalf of Hal and Patti Earnhardt. The dark bay was consigned by agent Jon Jazdzewski, acting on behalf of Patience Jazdewski and Susan Dare. Jazdzewski is a member of the Mediation Center of Kentucky Board of Directors, a non-profit organization that provides both family and general mediation in legal cases. Offered as Hip <u>163</u>, the Feb. 28 foal rolled home in a snappy :9.4 during Monday's breeze show.

"She's very fast and I like the way she's made," said Baffert, explaining his interest in the filly. "She's very proud and just has a way about her that's all class. She has Monarchos in there, too, so that's definitely a good thing."

The filly is the second foal out of Siphonophora (Siphon {Brz}), who is a half sister to Kentucky Derby winner Monarchos.

"Being by Cat Dreams, we thought we could steal her, maybe get her for \$120,000," said Baffert. "Unfortunately, we had to go a lot higher than that."

A longtime client of Baffert, the Earhardts also campaigned another sparking filly in champion Indian Blessing, and the West Coast trainer said his newest acquisition brought that star to mind.

"She just looks like a runner, and she reminds me a lot of Indian Blessing," Baffert remarked. "They both have a lot of class and speed."

Cat Dreams, who currently stands at Tommy Town Farms in California, was campaigned by B. Wayne Hughes and won his only start before injury cut the his career short.

"B. Wayne had some mares that he wanted to breed and wanted to support the stallion," said Bongo's Bob Feld, who owns a 50-percent interest in the stallion. "He always wanted to stand the stallion out west. After the horse got hurt, with so much speed and being by Storm Cat, he thought he would do well in California. Wayne likes to try a regional market first with his young stallions."

The filly, who sold as a yearling for \$16,000 at Keeneland in January, realized a \$10,000 final bid when offered at Keeneland September later in the year. Cat Dreams, who stands for \$4,000 at Tommy Town, had a yearling average of \$7,306 for 17 head sold in 2007, with a median of \$6,000.

"The word has really gotten out on this horse and his babies," added Feld. "I saw this filly when she was born, and she was always a very nice filly. She has all the tools, she is perfectly built, great shoulder, great balance. If she is any indication, Cat Dreams will be a stallion to watch." -C.B.

What They're Saying At The Sales...

Pete Bradley:

"I'm not the first person to say this, but these boutique sales are very difficult in that you don't have a lot of people looking in the \$25-75K range. Secondly, the pinhookers have so much invested in these horses. They start spending \$150,000 or \$200,000 on a horse, and they are not willing to let them go for much less than that. The combination of not having the depth of buyers, coupled with having unwilling sellers, makes for a large number of RNAs. This sale, Fasig Calder and Barretts probably become victims of their own success, which is essentially what happened to the Keeneland July sale. The question is do you open it up to more mid-range horses, or do you try to cultivate one open and one select session? I'm not sure. I do think you have to have a number of horses in the \$25-75K range. That helps with the horses that people overspend on and still become useful horses, but they just aren't \$250,000 horses."

The latter, who is set to run in next Thursday's G3 Craven S. at Newmarket, was one of two Henry Ceciltrained colts added to the Blue Riband alongside Gestut Ammerland's impressive Newmarket conditions winner Kandahar Run (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}). Other notables were Sean Mulryan's Gran G1 Criterium International winner Thewayyouare (Kingmambo) from the Andre Fabre barn and the Sangster Family's G2 Royal Lodge S. victor City Leader (Ire) (Fasliyev).

BALLYDOYLE FIRM UP GUINEAS PLANS Aidan O'Brien will send Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's Jupiter Pluvius (Johannesburg) and Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo) to the May 3 G1 2000 Guineas, he announced yesterday. The Ballydoyle conditioner issued upbeat bulletins on the former, who won the G3 Killavullan S. at Leopardstown in October; and the G2 Coventry S. scorer, who has not been seen since finishing third in the G2 Futurity S. at The Curragh in August. "Jupiter Pluvius is on target for the race," he told guests at a Newmarket racecourse lunch by telephone yesterday. "He worked this morning and went well. Henrythenavigator is in good form, and good, fast ground is very important to him. Plan (Storm Cat) is also on target, and Zulu Chief (Fusaichi Pegasus) might go to a maiden at Newmarket next week. It will be interesting to see what happens. The are coming along nicely, but we haven't pressed any buttons yet." BIG OPENER AT ROYAL ASCOT Ascot officials have announced that this year's Royal Meeting (June 17-21) will begin with three Group 1 races. With the former traditional opener, the G2 Coventry S., shuffled to the fourth race on Tuesday's card, the festival will start with the G1 Queen Anne S., followed by the newly upgraded G1 King's Stand S. and G1 St James's Palace S. Charles Barnett, the track's chief executive, explained, "The Queen Anne was the traditional curtain raiser to Royal Ascot until its promotion in 2003. With the promotion of the King's Stand S., we felt that we had the opportunity to begin with a bang and make a statement that this card is amongst the best staged anywhere in the country all season, if not the best." Also among the changes will be the adoption of an armband for the leading jockey akin to the yellow jersey in cycling. A presentation of the jockeys to the crowd will precede the royal procession. GETAWAY HAS CUP AIM Baron Georg von

Ullmann's Getaway (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) is being prepared for a tilt at Epsom's G1 Juddmonte Coronation Cup June 6, for which 45 entries were unveiled vesterday. Last year's G2 Prix Kergorlay winner--fourth in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe in October--was one of a quartet entered by Andre Fabre as he chases a seventh renewal of the £200,000 contest. Von Ullmann's Racing Manager Paul Harley said yesterday, "The Juddmonte Coronation Cup is on the agenda for Getaway. It's part of the plan, although it is early days at the moment. He has been very well over the winter, and Mr. Fabre is very pleased with him. Although he had been running over a trip further than a mile and a half, Mr Fabre always said that one day he would bring him back in trip for a Group 1. He's a big, late-developing horse. At this stage, we have every reason to be getting quite excited about him." Harley also revealed that the Jens Hirschberger-trained G1 Deutsches Derby winner and G1 Grosser Preis von Baden runner-up Adlerflug (Ger) (In the Wings {GB}) may contest the Coronation Cup, although the June 29 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud is also on the agenda. "He's a horse we like a lot and he's definitely a decent horse in his own right," Harley added. "He's done very well over the winter. If Getaway takes his chance, then Adlerflug could be directed towards the Grand Prix de Saint Cloud, or something like that."
