LAST CHANCE LEXINGTON

With nearly all the preps for the May 3 GI Kentucky Derby in the books, Saturday's \$325,000 GII Coolmore Lexington S. at Keeneland represents one of the last chances for graded earnings for those still wishing for a

spot in the starting gate on the first Saturday in May. A field of 11 has been drawn for the 1 1/16-mile contest, the winner of which has gone on to Churchill seven times in the last 10 years. While the Lexinaton's first money of \$201,500 essentially quarantees a

Derby spot for the winner, the \$65,000 runner-up prize might get two of the runners-- Tomcito (Street Cry {Ire}) and Atoned (Repent)--into the Derby, should their connections opt to go to Louisville. One Lexington entrant already ensured of a spot in Derby, earnings wise, is Southern Equine's Salute the Sarge (Forest Wildcat). The colt won his seasonal debut in the sixfurlong San Miguel S. at Santa Anita Mar. 29, but trainer Eric Guillot understands that time is against him. "If he wins the Lexington impressively, he's still only got two weeks [to the Derby], and [he's] going from three-fourths off a layoff to 1 1/16 miles to 1 1/4 miles in six weeks," said Guillot, adding that he considered the Sarge a "questionable distance horse."

HITTING STRIDE

When looking for the Craven winner, it is wise to start with Sir Michael Stoute's entry, as the master of Freemason Lodge has an impressive eight editions to his name. Since 1985, when Shadeed started the ball rolling en route to success in the 2000 Guineas here, he has reintroduced the likes of Ajdal, Doyoun (Ire), Desert Story (Ire) and last year's winner Adagio (GB). While Perfect Stride (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) does not have obvious credentials here, having been beaten at 1-4 in a conditions event at Leicester in September, Saeed Suhail's descendant of Bloomsbury Stud's matriarch Mrs Moss (GB) is an intriguing contender. "Perfect Stride has done extremely well over the winter," the owner's Racing Manager Bruce Raymond said. "He seems a much more mature horse. His work has been pleasing this spring, with each piece bringing further improvement. But this year's Craven looks an exceptionally hot race. 
The connections of Shadwell homebred Alwajeeha opted to scratch out of a race last week in favor of the Appalachian, and the three-year-old miss rewarded

"She's a super filly," said Neal McLaughlin, assistant to and brother of the trainer. "I want to congratulate Rick Nichols [vice president of Shadwell Stable] for talking to Kiaran. We decided to scratch her out of a race last week and run in the stakes today. He was right. She's a stakes filly. We're going to have a lot of fun with her this year." Not sighted until early November, the homebred took to the task straightaway with a fluent score over course and distance and was the subject of support to better more experienced rivals here. Held up in last place early, she changed gear passing halfway and had all rivals covered by the furlong marker on her way to an emphatic success.

"Her work has pleased me this spring and she's got a lot of talent," her trainer commented. "Jimmy [Fortune] was quite keen to get her covered up and fortunately she got left--she's cruised up and pricked her ears when she's in front. It's only her second run and she's still learning--she needed the experience and she has to go to the [May 4] Guineas. Good ground is fine for her, but firm wouldn't necessarily be her cup of tea and a mile will be her trip." Fortune added, "We thought she'd come on for the race and she won like a high-class filly, so hopefully she'll go all the way." Click for the Racing Post chart.

BREEDERS' CUP CHALLENGE TO EXPAND TO


EUROPE Breeders' Cup officials announced that the Breeders' Cup Challenge will expand to Europe for the first time with the addition of three 'Win and You're In' races. The newest races, all run at a mile at Ascot Racecourse in England, are the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S., sponsored by Sony; the G1 Meon Valley Stud Fillies' Mile; and the G1 Juddmonte Royal Lodge. The three new qualifying races will be held Sept. 27--during Ascot's Festival--and will be televised on BBC and TVG networks. "Ascot is one of the world's greatest racing venues, and for centuries has been the hallmark of the finest competition in international racing," said Breeders' Cup President and CEO Greg Avioli. "It is an honor and a privilege for us to be able to include these tremendous races from Ascot in this year's Challenge." The additions bring the total 2008 Breeders' Cup Challenge series races to 53, up from 24 races in 2007. The Queen Elizabeth II is an automatic qualifier for the Breeders' Cup Mile; the Fillies' Mile grants an automatic berth in the Juvenile Fillies Turf and the Royal Lodge is a qualifier for the Juvenile Turf. "We would like to think that this will have a positive effect on nominations for the three races as they are perfectly positioned as launch pads to the new turf races at the expanded Breeders' Cup World Championships," said Charles Barnett, Chief Executive at Ascot.

Barnett continued, "Also, the Queen Elizabeth II S., Europe's undisputed Mile Championship and the highest rated race in the world over that trip in 2007, has consistently produced runners that go on to contest the Breeders' Cup Mile." Since its inception in 1984, 29 horses from Europe have won Breeders' Cup races. This year's Breeders' Cup Challenge begins in the United States on July 5 with races from Monmouth Park in New Jersey, and is one of seven new North American markets and tracks that will hold 2008 Breeders' Cup Challenge races. The others are Emerald Downs, Suffolk Downs, Delaware Park, Calder Race Course and Woodbine. Belmont Park, Saratoga, Arlington Park, Del Mar, Keeneland and Santa Anita will also host Challenge races again this year.

MONBA Jockey Edgar Prado announced yesterday that he will ride GII Lane's End S. winner Adriano (A.P.

Indy) in the GI Kentucky Derby May 3. Prado chose the colt over a pair of horses he guided to Grade I victories in recent weeks: Monba (Maria's Mon), winner of last Saturday's GI Blue Grass S.; and Apr. 5 GI Wood Memorial hero Tale of Ekati (Tale of the Cat). "We went back and forth, back and forth," Bob Frieze, Prado's agent, told Daily Racing Form. "We won on Adriano in the Lane's End before we rode the other two. We felt obligated toward Graham [trainer Motion]. We had told Graham to let Edgar work the horse first,

then we'd make a decision." Adriano got the green light for the Derby when he breezed four furlongs at Churchill Downs in :50 flat (29/42) on Sunday. Replacing Prado on Monba is Ramon Dominguez, who, incidently, rode Adriano in his first three starts. Dominguez hasn't ridden the Todd Pletcher-trained Monba.

HAAFHD FILLY HEADS THE WAY AT TATTS

With several of the world's biggest owners--including Sheikh Mohammed, Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum and

Michael Tabor--in attendance, Tattersalls' Craven Breeze-Up Sale began last night in Newmarket with its most successful session ever. Agent Luke Lillingston, acting for an undisclosed client, topped the session when he bid 380,000gns for a filly from the first crop of G1 2000 Guineas winner Haafhd (GB) (Alhaarth {Ire}). The juve-

nile, out of Allespagne (Trempolino), is a half sister to Cruzpiel (Ire) (Singspiel), third in the 2003 G3 Queen's Vase at Royal Ascot. Jamie McCalmont was underbidder on the filly, who had been bought in for 48,000gns at Tattersalls in October. She was offered from John Hassett Jr's Bloodstock Connection.

Lillingston later bought a 300,000gns Mr. Greeley filly from Willie Browne's Mocklershill Stables. The juvenile, out of GSP Miss Gazon (Ire) (Royal Academy) had cost \$90,000 as a yearling at Keeneland September.

"They are both for an existing owner who is a new client to me. I don't know who will train them, but the Mr. Greeley could go to France or Ireland," said Lillingston. "The Haafhd was one of the best fillies here and obviously we don't know about the sire, but I have a great feeling about him."

Sheikh Hamdan bought four lots for a total of 1.055-million guineas. The quartet was headed by a 375,000gns colt by Gainesway stallion Mr. Greeley, who was represented by three of yesterday's top six lots. The two-year-old, out of stakes-placed Dehere of the Dog (Dehere), was a \$260,000 Keeneland September yearling offered by Eddie O'Leary's Lynn Lodge Stud. Kuwaiti owner Saleh Al Homaizi was underbidder.

Arch out of Annul (Conquistador Cielo). Mike Ryan was underbidder on the half brother to GSP Brief Bliss (Navarone), who had been bought for \$160,000 by Con Marnane at Keeneland in September.

"We started buying here a couple of years ago and we've been attracted by the quality of the

horses," said Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Stud director Richard Lancaster. "Once they were almost exclusively two-year-old types, but now you have a wide range and horses you'd look on as ones for the future."

A Mr. Greeley filly, who had cost Marnane €75,000 at Deauville in August, was sold for 340,000gns to Blandford Bloodstock's Tom Goff.

"She's for a long-standing UK-based client and was a very racy filly," Goff said of the two-year-old out of Danse du Diable (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). The filly is a half sister to GSP Wicked Clutch (Fr) (Arctic Tern).

Dublin-based agent John McCormack was also acting for an undisclosed client when spending 300,000gns on a Dansili (GB) colt consigned from Gay O'Callaghan's Yeomanstown Stud.

"He's by a sire doing the right things, got a page behind him, so blue sky is what you hope for at the moment," said McCormack. "The horse spoke for himself and he is for a new British-based client."

The colt is out of the unraced Merle (GB) (Selkirk), a half sister to MGSW Solo Mio (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and from the family of Sakura Reiko (Fr) and Marienbard (Ire).

During yesterday's session, Tattersalls sold 64 two-year-olds for a total of 6,477,000gns. The average of 101,203gns increased 36 percent from a year ago, while the median rose 30 percent to 67,500gns. The sale's finale begins tonight at 5:45 p.m.


Bog Standard...

While Aidan O'Brien has yet to win this race, his runners have not been from the top tier of Ballydoyle's sophomores. Evie Stockwell's The Bogberry (Hawk Wing) has to overcome a 299-day absence since injuring himself when trailing in Royal Ascot's Listed Chesham S., but his trainer is expecting better things. "We were expecting a good run from him [at Ascot], but he ran badly and came home lame behind," O'Brien told the Racing Post. "He needed a good break after that and was back working very well late on, but we just ran out of time last season and he didn't have another run. He's been working well on the bridle." Peter Chapple-Hyam, who scored with Painter's Row (Ire) in 1995 relies on Violet Mercer's Declaration of War (Ire) (Okawango), who was battle hardened at two. Successful in Epsom's Listed Woodcote S. on Derby day, he was runner-up in both the G2 Superlative S. on the July Course here and Longchamp's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere before signing off with a sixth in Doncaster's G1 Racing Post Trophy in October. "The more rain we have the better for him," his trainer said. "I've been happy with his recent work and I hope he runs a big race for all concerned." Facing a tough task is Roalco Limited's Indian Skipper (Ire) (Indian Danehill {Ire}), who has to find enormous improvement off an impressive maiden win on Lingfield's Polytrack Mar. 28. "I'm throwing him in at the deep end, but I've always thought he was a very nice horse," trainer Mark Tompkins told PA Sport.

Alfathaa Out...

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Alfathaa (GB) (Nayef) will miss today's Craven S. after being found to have a foot abscess. Trainer William Haggas broke the news on the TTDN Rising Star", who was fifth in the G2 Royal Lodge S. on his last start in September. "We thought it would improve, but it's got worse," he told PA Sport. "Until it bursts, he is very sore but he is out of the Craven. We were taking him to the race to find out where we were with him. I hope this is short term and it is not a million to one that he could go straight to the Guineas, although it's not ideal going there without a prep."

Q: A recent study in Australia of 80,000 repository X-rays demonstrated that most common bone abnormalities revealed in X-rays of sales yearlings have no effect on subsequent racing performance. As a buyer, how do radiographic findings affect your sales purchases? As a buyer or seller, have you had any good fortune with yearlings you bought or sold which had veterinary issues?

TOM RYAN, CHEROKEE EQUINE:

I am thrilled with the findings of this study and the debate that it has generated. Finally, we have solid data



that seems to demonstrate that, in our pursuit of perfection, we often bypass clinically sound racing prospects due to lesions that have little or no effect on performance. I'm not saying that veterinarians are totally at fault here, as in most cases they are only providing a service that is generally straight forward, allowing the buyer make an informed decision on

their purchase. With that said, I've experienced both sides of the fence as both buyer and seller, and I am convinced that some veterinarians are incapable of saying yes [how they ever managed marriage, I don't know!] I feel that there are a few vets who wish to earn a living from overanalyzing X-rays and producing negative reports which, of course, is always the safe bet. Are we not all in this industry to breed, buy and sell racehorses?

How do radiographic findings affect my sales purchases?

X-ray reports have a great effect on my sales purchases because I may fall in love with a yearling and know, in my heart, this horse has all the right parts, but if I bring him to OBS or Calder as a two-year-old and he still has a little 'this or that,' the same vet who said no to the pinhook but will be okay as a racehorse at the yearling sales will most likely say no as a racehorse six months later. I buy yearlings every year for end-users and enjoy it when they're willing to give a horse the necessary time to mature and don't have an unrealistic need for early speed. Cont. p13

Have I ever had any good fortune with yearlings I've bought or sold with veterinary issues?

The ones I've bought to go racing rather than pinhooking have been very productive, and the ones I've tried to sell with veterinary issues at an auction have cost me a fortune. Some were horses with clinical problems that needed to become riding horses; others were failed due to a negative mindset rather than a real problem. As a breeder, buyer and seller of yearlings, I am all too familiar with the escalating costs of getting the product to the marketplace. Because of the scope of this industry, we have little control over who makes the final decisions: Is he a suitable pinhook or only clean enough to become a racehorse? Who becomes accountable when he develops into the next Premium Tap and you have just sold a Grade I winner for \$4,500. Accountability???

TRAINER KEN MCPEEK:

Many years ago, I bought a yearling that six OCDs in his front legs. He was a excellent bodied horse and I



was able to purchase him for a very reasonable price. We gave him time for the bone issues and he ultimately set a track record and started more than 100 times in his career. Without that experience, I may not have purchase Curlin. All vet issues need to be analyzed by the individual horse. As a trainer, I have dealt with an enormous amount of soundness situations and that experience helps me

decide which veternarian findings that I can accept or decline when recommending the purchase of a racehorse for my clients.

ROB WHITELEY, LIBERATION FARM:

The Australian study is monumental in that it uses 2,700 + horses and 80,000 X-rays, and is the first large research effort to relate sales repository X-ray



findings to later racing success. Let's hope it is the first of many such studies and that we will see a comparable American study in the near future. Furthermore, let's hope that it also inspires our American veterinary clinics to conduct similar research relating corrective limb procedures and other surgical interventions to racing performance.

Meanwhile, I continue to have great compassion for sales vets as they perform their duties. They

function somewhat in the dark and between a rock and a hard place. With very limited research data to point to that relates repository findings to later racing success, sales vets are asked to do the impossible. They are asked to make guesses about the probability that a horse's career may be impaired by certain irregularities, even though they are missing an empirical basis for making prescient or accurately predictive judgments. This unhappy situation puts sales vets in a no-win predicament: If they approve the purchase of a horse that has "issues," and it fails to perform successfully, the big finger of disappointment and blame can point back at them. On the other hand, if they turn down one of the many sales horses with perceived "issues," and it goes on to a stellar career, frustrated buyers who missed out on "the big horse" may also blame the sales vet for the lost opportunity. Either way, sales vets are vulnerable to criticism.

This vulnerability is magnified because, without having significant scientific data as a reference, sales vets are reduced to using their own anecdotal experience or professional inference as the basis for supporting their opinions and predictions. This puts the onus squarely on them and their personal experience, rather than on scientific data. In layman's terms, sales vets, therefore, become personally accountable for their educated guess work. Anyway it's looked at, sales vets are on the hot seat. Being asked to make predictive statements without having reference to empirical data is a little bit like walking through a minefield with only a part of the map. No wonder, therefore, that sales vets often adopt conservative or ultra-conservative positions, and sometimes simply just report a list of findings, without commentary, which often puts buyers off of horses that they otherwise like and want to buy.

And why shouldn't sales vets be conservative, given this scenario? It's a scary and lonely spot to be in, having to make predictive statements that are not grounded in statistical fact. Some cynics say that sales vets are overly conservative in order to "cover their ass;" or that they turn down horses to "create more business for themselves." But this is not fair. Their conservatism is a natural instinct in the face of uncertainty. Operating largely in the realm of guess-work without hard science to back up their guesses and prognostications, sales vets in general are merely being prudent.

Simply put, however, vets will be on firmer ground, and sellers and buyers will benefit, if we have more research data like that in the recent Australian study.

Meanwhile, until more research is conducted, buyers who miss out on good horses because of veterinary issues and input should lighten up on blaming vets. Instead, buyers should empower themselves and take more responsibility for the decision making process. Rather than blame their vet when they miss out on an eventual Derby horse, or another World Cup Champion like Curlin, buyers should instead seek to inform themselves better about the many "normal" irregularities in young horses. They should also avoid being overly picky and try to be more forgiving, while focusing on identifying athletes that can overcome little issues.

It is often self-defeating to go searching for the illusory "perfect" horse. In that regard, reading the CBA booklets on "Scoping," "OCDs," and "Buying Sales Yearlings" (available at consignorsandbreeders.com) would be time well spent.

Another good use of time would be phone calls to vets or clinics to encourage research in America that builds on the Australian effort by correlating X-ray findings and vet procedures to later racing success. Phone calls to the sales companies to encourage their participation in a joint effort would also be a good idea, as they installed the repositories (which now contain a wealth of essential data) and collect entry fees and commissions that could help fund meaningful research, thereby serving the sales scene and their full spectrum of constituents in the best way possible.

BARRY BERKELHAMMER, ABRACADABRA FARM

I definitely try to use the veterinary findings in our favor. I believe the majority of the veterinary findings



do not affect their racing performance. If all the findings in yearlings did have an affect, I think the breed as we know it would be tainted. I think with the repositories, having all the X-rays and using them as a tool has given everybody a chance to get more educated. We have more information than we did in the past. Now, everybody has the chance to digest all the findings that are out there.

I try to be fairly lenient when it comes to racing horses and any lesions that we find. I depend heavily on my veterinarian to buy horses as opposed to just finding horses to be failed. I look to him to help me determine which lesions will have an affect and which ones won't. We try to be very open-minded about buying a horse, overlooking some things and taking a little bit of a price break when we can get it.

The most notable horse that we bought was Grade I winner Purge. He had a lot of veterinary findings, but they were all fairly benign in nature. There were a few different findings in different places, but my veterinarian, Dr. Ruel Cowels, told me to go in there and have confidence and buy because he thought, as a racehorse, it would really never hurt him.



TERRY FINLEY, WEST POINT THOROUGHBREDS:

Of course, we spend quite a bit of money performing vet exams at the sales. Plenty of other buyers do as



well. The findings of this study don't surprise me in a big way. We know that a good number of these "radiographic issues" identified at the sales can, and are, successfully managed by racetrack vets in conjunction with the trainers. Most professional buyers look at the entire picture when buying horses. So, if we come upon a fairly correct, balanced horse that has a good look to him, we would be more inclined to take a shot after

learning of the presence of a bone defect.

I think it helps to have someone like Buzz Chace on our buying team. He was a vet tech for Dr. Devine in New Jersey for many years, and he has looked at and evaluated racehorses for almost 50 years. Certainly, I think the relationship a buying team has with a sales vet is vital. We use Dr. Bill Baker [of the Woodford Clinic in Lexington] for most of our sales work. He consults on our entire stable, not just at the sales. He does all of our surgeries and is really part of the team. He knows he doesn't always have to be on the "conservative side" when evaluating prospects.

So, in summary, it really comes down to gut feel, experience and risk tolerance. We try to stay away from vet issues that render horses train wrecks, but we'll take a good number of shots buying horses we think can overcome bone problems. A good horse makes owners, trainers, jockeys and vet look smart.



O'BRIEN OUTLINES HARADASUN PLAN Aidan O'Brien may start Haradasun (Aus) (Fusaichi Pegasus) in the G1 Juddmonte Lockinge S. at Newbury. Last year's G1 George Ryder S. and G1 Doncaster H. winner and G1 Cox Plate third is a possible for the May 17 contest, according to his conditioner. "Haradasun could be a bit special," O'Brien told the Racing Post. "He is naturally very guick and is guite fit.
