NAFZGER, PRADO ELECTED TO HALL

Three horses, two jockeys and one trainer have joined the members of the National Museum of Racing's Hall of Fame. Trainer Carl Nafzger, who saddled Street Sense to victory in the GI Kentucky Derby last year, and jockey Edgar Prado, who was aboard Barbaro when he took the "Run for the Roses" in 2006, head the list. It was the first time the two had appeared on the Hall of Fame ballot. Also elected to the Hall were MGISW Ancient Title and champions Inside Information and Manila, and two-time Derby winning jockey Ismael "Milo" Valenzuela, who was the regular pilot for the great Kelso. The 66-year-old

Nafzger, a former rodeo rider from Texas, also conditioned Eclipse winners Banshee Breeze and Unbridled, one of two horses to capture the Derby and the GI Breeders' Cup Classic in the same year. "You've also got to remember the responsibility of where you are now," Nafzger said after the announcement. "You represent a sport and you better represent it good. I just hope I can represent it as good as some of the people who are in the Hall of Fame." Prado, 40, led the nation in races won from 1997-99, and earned the Eclipse Award as top rider of 2006. "I'm just speechless; I'm shaking like a leaf," the native of Peru said when hearing the news. "Just to be nominated for the Hall of Fame among all my peers was great. To win is amazing." Valenzuela, now 73, rode from 1951-80, booting home 2,545 winners and earning more than \$20 million in purses. "I am the happiest man today knowing that I have been recognized and accepted to the Hall of Fame," Valenzuela said. "This was my last chapter in my racing career that I wanted to complete. My last ride across the finish line, at 73, being inducted into the Hall of Fame." The six new members will be inducted in Saratoga Springs on Monday, Aug. 4. *Hall Horses, p2*

FEVER PITCH AT INGLIS DAY TWO

The second session of the Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale gained almost feverish momentum yesterday, with a relentless procession of million-dollar yearlings pushing the session average from a first-day figure of A\$337,850 to A\$348,929. Industry predictions that the market would steady after strong gains in recent years proved wide of the mark as the Southern Hemisphere's premier select sale surged to new records. A full brother to champion mare Alinghi (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) took centre stage. The colt, from Yarraman Park Stud's celebrated producer Oceanfast (Aus), was knocked down for A\$2.2 million to the bid of Anthony Cummings. "We always thought he was a star, and Anthony Cummings is a very good judge, so we're very pleased," Yarraman's Harry Mitchell said. Cummings was acting on behalf of owner Nathan Tinkler's Patinack Farm. Dominant purchaser at Australian and New Zealand majors earlier this year, Patinack has been somewhat eclipsed at Easter by the resurgence of Bob Ingham, who has purchased 14 yearlings thus far at an average of A\$671,786. *Easter cont. p2*

Deja Lago...

Encosta de Lago (Aus) had a A\$2.2-million yearling here last year and matched that when his colt from Oceanfast (Aus) went to trainer Anthony Cummings, purchasing for a syndicate that included Patinack Farm. "I thought he was the best of the colts at this sale. On type and pedigree, it just works," Cummings said, adding that the powerfully made youngster was similar in build to his champion full sibling Alinghi (Aus), the winner of 11 races and more than A\$3.5 million. "He's got that strength behind that Alinghi had, and we valued him very highly. I had a little bit more gas left in the tank, but was happy to get him for that price." Yarraman Park's Harry Mitchell said the family-owned farm bought Oceanfast for A\$80,000 when she was in foal to King Charlemagne (Aus), and the mare has been a veritable goldmine for the operation. Oceanfast's four yearlings have now returned more than A\$6.7 million at the sales since 2005. "We were very lucky," Mitchell said. "We bought the mare before Alinghi ran. It is a dream result." Lavish Result...

Arrowfield chief John Messara's bold project to send mares to esteemed stallion Sunday Silence 10 years ago is yielding stunning results. Yesterday, a Redoute's Choice (Aus) colt from the homebred Sunday Silence mare Lavishly (Aus) fetched A\$2 million when knocked down to agent John Hutchinson, acting with John and Gary Moore on behalf of giant Macau-based owner Stanley Ho. "He was one of the best Redoute's Choice colts in the sale," Hutchinson said. "He has an international pedigree. We looked at all the top-class colts in the sale, but kept coming back to him. Our advice is to keep him in Australia to race due to his stallion potential. There is not a lot for young horses over there [Hong Kong]. Hopefully he will develop into a Guineas horse." Messara added, "He represents two of the most significant sire influences of recent times, and he is from a wonderful family which includes Linamix, a very successful sire in France, so he has got everything to make a sire, and he is an athletic individual." Of the Sunday Silence breeding project, Messara explained, "It was always going to be a long-term thing, but it has still yielded some great results short term with horses such as Keep The Faith (Aus), Sunday Joy (Aus) and a number of others out of a tiny little sample. We are now getting the benefit from the females, we've already produced El Daana (Aus), now this colt. And in Japan, Sunday Silence is a wonderful broodmare sire, as you would have expected."

The Duel Down Under...

Despite the absence of any autumn racetrack stars, Redoute's Choice (Aus) is dominating with 27 selling at an average of A\$655,730 and gross of A\$17.6 million, with arch-rival Encosta de Lago (Aus) on his heels. The Coolmore sire has had 26 sell at an average of A\$591,346 and gross of A\$15.3-million, and he is poised for a big afternoon today. Encosta de Lago has a filly from Group 1 winner Special Harmony (Aus) and a half-brother to Group 1 winner Juste Momente (Aus) and ringside fireworks are expected for both. Encosta de Lago accounted for three of the top four lots offered Monday, with the A\$2.2-million Oceanfast (Aus) colt, the A\$1.9-million full to MG1SW Mnemosyne (Aus) (which sold to agent Demi O'Byrne), and the How Funny (Aus) colt knocked down to Tom Magnier for A\$1.7-million. Vinery Stud-based More Than Ready, the sire of G1 Golden Slipper S. winner Sebring (Aus), has had seven sell at an average A\$327,857. The progeny of leading first season sire Exceed and Excel (Aus) are in enormous demand, with Ingham Bloodstock snaring a filly out of the champion two-year-old One Under (NZ) for A\$900,000. Big Day for Tyreel...

Tyreel Stud founder Jim Fleming held court in style in the Tyreel marquee just behind the sale ring for many years, and his sons Dean and Paul have picked up the baton in brilliant fashion following the death of their father last December. Tyreel is leading vendor on average with seven going under the hammer at an average of A\$800,714. Contributing to the sparkling result was a A\$1.7-million Encosta De Lago (Aus)--How Funny (Aus) colt and a A\$1.2-million Redoute's Choice (Aus)--In the Past (GB) colt. "I'd say Dad would be looking down from above and be pretty pleased," Dean Fleming said. "It is an emotional time for us, because we are selling these horses basically on behalf of dad. To get results like this is a great achievement and a nice reward for all the Tyreel team."

Ferguson Sets Frenetic Pace...

The hits just kept on coming for Tyreel. Five lots after the A\$1.7-million colt, Darley's John Ferguson landed a Redoute's Choice (Aus)--In the Past (GB) colt for A\$1.2 million. Darley has supported its own stallions, buying a A\$750,000 Exceed and Excel (Aus) colt (Lot 14) and a A\$450,000 colt (Lot 210) by the same sire, as well as an Elusive Quality filly (Lot 40) for A\$160,000. But Ferguson has also signed for a colt by Flying Spur (Aus) and five by Redoute's Choice, including a A\$1.1-million filly by that sire out of Hanky Panky (Aus) (Anabaa). Hanky Panky is a half-sister to Arrowfield stallion Not a Single Doubt (Aus) and to Natural Is My Name (Aus), dam of Golden Slipper runner-up Zizou (Aus). Brian Gorman of Bellerive Stud, which consigned the filly, said connections were thrilled with the result. "She is a lovely filly, a total professional, from a fantastic family; she is very typical of the Easy Date fillies that have done the job in the past, and I think she made what the market dictated, which was very pleasing to everybody," Gorman said. Gorman added Hanky Panky had a Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) filly at foot and was back in foal to Redoute's Choice. Darley also targeted a Tyreel colt by Redoute's Choice out of dual Group 1 heroine Pace Invader (NZ), going to A\$850,000 for the third foal from the prolific winner, herself a A\$660,000 purchase at the 2005 Magic Millions National Sale for agent Vin Cox. Pace Invader has a Danehill Dancer (Ire) filly and was covered by Fusaichi Pegasus last spring.

Staying Power...

Standing as usual under the historic fig tree facing the sale ring, Coolmore's Tom Magnier struck early and stayed resolute over 20 bids to secure an Encosta de Lago (Aus) colt out of the Rory's Jester (Aus) mare How Funny (Aus) for A\$1.7 million. The yearling, offered by Tyreel Stud as lot 160, is the first foal from How Funny and has a weanling full brother at Tyreel. The mare was covered by Commands (Aus) last spring. Later in the day, Coolmore's Demi O'Byrne went to A\$1.9 million for a full sibling to Group 1 winner Mnemosyne (Aus), offered by Emirates Park. The colt, by Encosta de Lago, is also a half-sibling to SP Tantat Secret (Aus).

Ingham Excited...

Bob Ingham, having divested all of the stock owned by his family and that of his late brother Jack Ingham when his Woodlands operation was sold to Darley last month, has wasted no time rebuilding. Ingham has purchased 14 yearlings thus far at Easter to race with his wife Norma and their four children. The sale has been a very happy hunting ground for Ingham over the years, with purchases such as Musket (Aus), Mnemosyne (Aus), Camarilla (Aus) and Forensics (Aus). The jovial horseman, sitting in his usual spot behind the auctioneers box beside high-profile owner Lloyd Williams, kept up the momentum Monday. "It is very exciting," Ingham said. "I feel like a 15-year-old buying these horses. It is certainly exciting for the kids." Ingham's purchases Monday included a A\$1-million Encosta de Lago (Aus) colt, purchased from the Coolmore consignment. He paid the same amount for a daughter of that sire offered by Widden Stud. With the Foreign Investment Review Board (FIRB) approval of the sale of Woodlands to Darley expected within days, Ingham is hoping Golden Slipper winner Forensics (Aus)--a A\$900,000 Inglis Easter purchase--can give him a swansong G1 Doncaster H. win at Randwick Saturday. Forensics will race in Ingham's famous silks in the Doncaster, possibly for the last time, before she joins the Darley empire. She has been installed the morning-line favourite for the famous Randwick mile race.

Dehere Chimes In...

With fewer runners than many of his contemporaries, Dehere has statistics that are the envy of many, and agent James Bester is among fans of the consistent Coolmore sire. He went to A\$775,000 for a quality colt from Milanova (Aus) (Danehill) offered by Tyreel Stud. The colt is the first foal from Group 3 winner Milanova, a full-sister to champion two-year-old and promising young sire Holy Roman Emperor (Ire). Dehere has had eight yearlings sell at this sale at an average of A\$306,875.

Lot 359, c, Redoute's Choice (Aus)--Sequin (Aus), by Lure
Consigned by Highgrove Stud

Ron and Debbie Gilbert purchased Sequin for A\$100,000 at this sale in 1999 as the first foal from Subterfuge (GB), a daughter of Machiavellian who would prove to be something of a blue hen. Subterfuge has produced MG1SW Scintillation (Aus) (Danehill), who has notched 12 wins in Hong Kong, as well as MSW & MG1SP Shania Dane (Aus), SP Puzzle Book (Aus), SP Danevade (Aus), SP Liatrix (Aus)--a A\$1.3-million Easter yearling--and the A\$1.25-million Easter two-year-old Mothwing (Aus), who is unraced. So, although Sequin did not set the track alight for the Gilberts, her appeal has continued to grow via the deeds of her half-siblings. Her first foal, a A\$65,000 purchase, is the GSP Get To Work (Aus) (Snippets {Aus}), while last year she had a Falbrav filly go under the hammer at this sale for A\$375,000.

Lot 377, c, Redoute's Choice (Aus)--Snowdrift (Fr), by Polish Precedent

Consigned by Tyreel Stud

Imported to Australia by the Marheine family's Stratheden Stud, grand producer Snowdrift (Fr) was purchased by Tyreel's Paul Fleming for A\$1.5 million at the Inglis Easter Broodmare Sale in 2005 from the draft of Vinery. This colt is a half-brother to Golden Slipper placegetter Portillo (Aus) (Red Ransom), herself an A\$850,000 purchase for Woodlands when offered by Tyreel last year; and to G1 Galaxy S. winner Snowland (Aus) (Snippets {Aus}) and Widden Stud stallion Snippetson (Aus) (Snippets {Aus}). Snowdrift has an Encosta de Lago (Aus) colt at foot and was sent back to Redoute's Choice (Aus) last spring.

Lot **384**, f, **Encosta de Lago (Aus)**--Special Harmony (Aus), by Spinning World

Consigned by Coolmore Stud

Among the most prized of Coolmore's impressive draft of 57 yearlings is the first foal of triple Group 1 winner Special Harmony (Aus) (Spinning World). Sold as a A\$95,000 yearling by Coolmore to agent Rob

Roulston at Magic Millions 2002, the Lee Freedman- trained Special Harmony captured the G1 VRC Oaks, G1 Arrowfield Stud S. and G1 1000 Guineas, retiring in May '05 with a record of 23-10-3-1 and a bankroll of A\$1,879,580. "We sold Special as a yearling and her mother has been here since, so this is the

first time we have the opportunity to offer the first foal of a foal born here, so to speak," said Coolmore's Peter O'Brien. "She was a champion race mare, as tough as they come, and I don't think you will find a first foal anywhere that is as good as this filly. She has incredible substance for a young one, like her mother, a great temperament, great balance, great movement, and I would love to own her myself. Plus Spinning World will be a good broodmare sire. I can guarantee there will be plenty of toughness, and the pedigree is just getting better and better." Special Harmony has a Redoute's Choice (Aus) weanling colt and was covered by Encosta de Lago (Aus) in 2007.

Lot **373**, c, **Encosta de Lago (Aus)**--Skates (Aus), by Danehill

Consigned by Coolmore Stud, agent

This colt, out of stakes-placed Skates, who was first past the post in a Listed event but relegated second in the stewards' room, is among those that are the talk of the sale. Skates is a three-quarter sister to last season's top juvenile Murtajill (Aus) and Magic Millions winner and promising young sire Bradbury's Luck (Aus). His second dam Skating (Aus) (At Talaq) was the champion sprinting filly of her time, with wins in the G1 AJC Doncaster H. and G1 STC Coolmore Classic, and she has proven just as successful at stud in leaving six stakes horses. Lot 373 is a half-sibling to talented grey mare Juste Moment (Aus) (Giant's Causeway), a A\$300,000 purchase from the Coolmore draft at the 2005 Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale, who recently won the G1 SAJC Robert Sangster S. "This is one of the most current families in the country at the moment, with a good horse every week, and this colt matches the pedigree," says Coolmore Stud's Peter O'Brien. "He is a terrific-looking horse with unbelievable action and great balance. He is going to be an early horse and he has got plenty of scope to train on. He is a trainer's horse and every trainer that has seen him has fallen in love with him."




Colonel John Arrives at Churchill...

GI Santa Anita Derby winner Colonel John (Tiznow) arrived at Churchill Downs after a flight from California yesterday. Trainer Eoin Harty accompanied the WinStar homebred on the cross-country trip. "It was an early start for everybody out there [in California], but once we got on the road it was pretty uneventful," said Harty. "Everything was pretty smooth. It was the quickest way from Los Angeles to Louisville by far." The Irish horse-

man is not yet feeling the pressure of having his first GI Kentucky Derby starter. "It's still two weeks out and the pressure hasn't really kicked in yet," he said. "But I'm sure as the days go by and we get closer to the kickoff, I'll be a little more anxious than I am right now." Colonel John, never worse than second in his six career starts, is two-for-two this year, but will be racing on conventional dirt for the first time in the Derby. His conditioner does not believe that will be a factor. "I think the [synthetic] tracks are safer and certain horses have a chance of staying sound longer," said Harty. "From what I've seen, horses can ship off of the synthetic surfaces and run very competitively."

Pyro Breezes in Keeneland Fog...

Trainer Steve Asmussen sent GII Louisiana Derby winner **Pyro** (Pulpit) out to work in the fog at Keeneland yesterday. Looking to rebound from his 10th-place finish in the GI Blue Grass S., the dark bay went six panels with GSW Noonmark, but it is anybody's guess what the final time might have been. "I was on horseback and it was so foggy that I only saw the last 50 feet of the work," Asmussen said. "But from what I saw, it looked fine." He added, "When you work three-quarters with Noonmark, I'd call it a serious drill. Their instructions were to go in 1:14, and they usually hit their mark. Pyro seems just fine to me." The conditioner's other Derby hopeful, GII Arkansas Derby runner-up **Z Fortune** (Siphon {Brz}), also worked yesterday, but later in the morning. The clockers caught the colt going a half in :50.20.

Zito Names Riders for His Derby Starters...

Trainer Nick Zito said yesterday that jockey Julien Leparoux will ride GII Fountain of Youth S. winner **Cool Coal Man** (Mineshaft), and Rafael Bejarano will be aboard **Anak Nakal** (Victory Gallop) in the Kentucky Derby. "I've got two good kids that I've had success with," Zito said. The winner of the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. last fall, Four Roses' Thoroughbreds Anak Nakal has been off the board in all three starts this season, most recently running fifth in the Apr. 5 GI Wood Memorial. Robert LaPenta's Cool Coal Man comes off a ninth-place finish in the Apr. 12 GI Blue Grass.

Honest Pursuit Possible for Oaks...

Overbrook Farm's well-bred **Honest Pursuit** (Storm Cat) is being considered for the GI Kentucky Oaks, according to trainer Dallas Stewart. The daughter of Honest Lady (Seattle Slew) is coming off a 6 1/2-length maiden victory at Keeneland Apr. 4. That nine-furlong maiden event was the filly's fifth start. If she goes postward in the Oaks, Garrett Gomez will have the mount.

Denis of Cork Works at Churchill...

Mr. and Mrs. William Warren's **Denis of Cork** (Harlan's Holiday), who will need another defection if he is to make it to the starting gate on the first Saturday in May, worked five furlongs in 1:00 flat at Churchill yesterday. Calvin Borel was in the saddle. The colt galloped out six panels in 1:12.40. "I let him finish up a little bit from the quarter pole to the wire," Borel said. "I was very impressed with the last quarter of a mile--very impressed." The winner of the GIII Southwest S., Denis of Cork finished fifth as the favorite in the GII Illinois Derby last time out. According to Churchill Downs, he is 21st on the graded-earnings list for the Derby.

Prado to Ride Pure Clan in Oaks...

Edgar Prado has picked up the mount on GI Kentucky Oaks hopeful **Pure Clan** (Pure Prize). Julien Leparoux rode the filly in her last five starts, including wins in last year's GIII Pocahontas S. and GII Golden Rod S. IEAH Stable purchased a controlling interest in Pure Clan over the winter from Lewis Lakin. In two starts this term, the filly was second in the Mar. 16 GIII Honeybee S. and third in the Apr. 6 GII Fantasy S. Trainer Robert Holthus said the rider change was the owners' decision. "The owners have had good luck with [Prado]," Holthus explained. Prado is scheduled to work Pure Clan Friday at Churchill Downs.

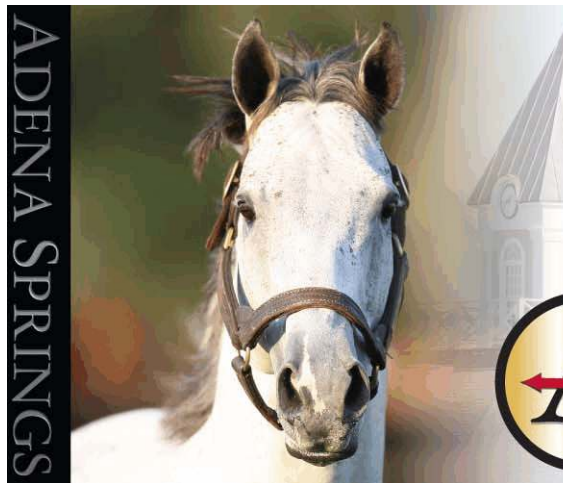

No Approach to Epsom...

Princess Haya of Jordan's **New Approach (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) is on course for Newmarket's May 3 G1 2000 Guineas, but looks set to sidestep the June 7 G1 Epsom Derby, trainer Jim Bolger announced yesterday. "Sheikh Mohammed, Princess Haya and John Ferguson have left the horse's progress to me," Bolger said yesterday during a press day at his County Carlow base. "After he has run at Newmarket, we'll see how that goes and make some decisions. But I would be more keen to go for the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas [May 24], then the G1 Irish Derby [June 29] and give Epsom a miss. I haven't won the Irish 2000 before and it's a race I'd like to win, so that's the route I'd prefer to take." Bolger added that he had not experienced any hold-ups with the unbeaten champion juvenile of 2007 as he prepares for his return. "I'm very confident in the horse's ability and couldn't be happier with him," he continued. "He's heavier and stronger than last year and has a marvelous constitution. He's very sound and a hardy horse." As he was in his major tests at two, New Approach will be accompanied by his companion Metamorphosis (Ire). "We don't want to take any chances, horses like him don't come along too often, so when they do you have to take all the precautions," he explained. Bolger will be represented by Ennistown Stud's G1 Moyglare Stud S. and G1 Phoenix S. winner **Saoirse Abu** (Mr. Greeley) in the G1 1000 Guineas.

Mulling It Over...

Connections of Thursday's G3 Craven S. winner **Twice Over (GB)** (Observatory) continue to delay on a decision regarding the colt's participation in the May 3 G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket. While the mile Classic has not been ruled out, early indications from trainer Henry Cecil suggested that Khalid Abdullah's homebred may wait for the G2 Dante S. at York May 15 en route to a choice of Derbies. "Henry Cecil pointed out immediately after the Craven that the 2000 Guineas was not necessarily on the agenda, and the advice to anyone thinking of backing him remains the same--hold fire for the time being," Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told the *Racing Post*. "The prince is away until next week and I doubt a final decision regarding the 2000 Guineas will be made until then."

One undoubted benefit of the shuttle stallion concept is that a stallion can be seen in a new light by breeders in one hemisphere, thanks to his achievements in the other. There's arguably no better example of this than the great Danehill, who was once on the brink of becoming just another stallion on Coolmore's star-packed Irish roster. In 1994, in his fifth season, Danehill's fee was a mere IR9,000gns, which placed him only 10th in the pecking order among Coolmore's Irish stallions. Although he started to flourish with his northern hemisphere runners in 1995, the Coolmore team was prepared to lease him to Japan for the 1996 season, which suggests he still wasn't considered vital to the operation's success.

It was a different story in Australia. Three consecutive titles as champion sire of juveniles were immediately followed by three general sires' championships, and Danehill had the winner of the prestigious Golden Slipper S. in each of his first three crops. Altogether he was champion sire nine times in the space of 11 years, his last championship coming in the 2004/5 season.

These achievements can only have helped boost Danehill's reputation in Europe, where he eventually became champion sire in 2005, 2006 and 2007.

Part of Danehill's appeal as a stallion, from a pedigree viewpoint, was that he was inbred 3x3 to Natalma, one of three daughters of Almahmoud to have produced a champion stallion. This, in turn, will have reflected well on More Than Ready when the Vinery stallion arrived to stand his first season in Australia at a fee of A\$22,000 in 2001. More Than Ready is by Southern Halo, a horse inbred 3x4 to Almahmoud through Cosmah and Natalma, so he had obvious appeal as a mate for mares with Danehill blood.

It is worth pointing out that the last few years have seen a flourishing partnership develop between Danehill and Machiavellian, another stallion with a parent inbred to Almahmoud through Cosmah and Natalma. Danehill sired four stakes winners from only 10 foals out of Machiavellian mares and Machiavellian's son Medicean has two group winners among his first eight foals out of Danehill mares. Incidentally, Southern Halo isn't the only son of Halo with a good record with Danehill mares. Sunday Silence (who isn't inbred to Almahmoud) sired four stakes winners, including the dual Grade II winner Silent Name and the classic-placed Japanese colt Six Sense.

More Than Ready has also flourished with Danehill's daughters and granddaughters. His first Australian crop featured two very good--but very different--colts out of Danehill mares. One, Perfectly Ready, was a Group 1-winning sprinter, whereas the other, Benicio, won the G1 Victoria Derby over 1 9/16 miles. And now More Than Ready has sired Sebring, the unbeaten winner of the G1 Golden Slipper S., from a mare by Flying Spur, one of Danehill's five Golden Slipper winners.

Sebring is More Than Ready's second stakes winner from his first six foals out of daughters of Flying Spur, a stallion inbred 4x4x5 to Natalma.

Danehill isn't the only son of Danzig to appear among the broodmare sires of More Than Ready's best winners. The American Grade II winner Ready To Please is out of a Pine Bluff mare, while Augusta Proud, the filly who lost her unbeaten record in the Golden Slipper, is out of a Langfuhr mare. Interestingly, Pine Bluff was also inbred 4x4 to Almahmoud (while Langfuhr is closely inbred to Nearctic, who sired Northern Dancer from Natalma). More Than Ready also sired the Group 1-placed Australian filly Deloraine from a Danzig mare.

Before we attribute all of Sebring's considerable talent to these multiple lines of Almahmoud, I should quickly point out that he is another high-class winner whose pedigree features inbreeding to both Mr. Prospector (4x4) and Northern Dancer (4x5x6).

More Than Ready now looks to have the two-year-old sires' championship sewn up, having earned more than three times as much as his nearest pursuers, Encosta de Lago and Red Ransom. He had finished a remote second to Redoute's Choice on this list in 2004/5, when Carry On Cutie won the G1 Champagne S., and there's every reason to think he'll continue to shine in this sphere. The five-time juvenile winner has covered at least 120 mares in each of the last four Australian seasons and is sure to be in great demand later this year.

More Than Ready is obviously a very fecund stallion. If you combine the number of mares covered in each hemisphere, he coped with 297 in 2004, 331 in 2005, 272 in 2006 and 299 last year. It will be interesting to see whether raising his fee from \$40,000 to \$60,000 affects the size of his Kentucky book this year. Although I am a fully paid-up member of More Than Ready's fan club, I couldn't help thinking \$60,000 was plenty to pay for a horse still awaiting his first northern hemisphere Grade I winner after four years with runners. That said, he sires an attractive proportion of tough stakes winners, and it would be no surprise to see his profile continue to rise in the northern hemisphere, thanks partly to his Australian achievements.

**TRACKNET PESSIMISTIC ABOUT THG'S
DERBY/OAKS DAY PROPOSAL**

The Thoroughbred Horsemen's Group yesterday announced a plan that would allow advance deposit wagering companies to offer the entire cards from Churchill Downs on Kentucky Oaks and Kentucky Derby days. But, according to TrackNet Media Group CEO Scott Daruty, ADW companies are unlikely to accept the offer. TrackNet Media, which negotiates the sale of signals from Churchill Downs Inc. and Magna Entertainment Corp. tracks, has been at odds with THG over the issue of distribution of ADW revenue. Looking to break the deadlock for two of racing's biggest days, THG, representing the Kentucky Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association and the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association, yesterday proposed that ADW companies enter into a two-day only contract that would allow them to take bets from their customers on the Oaks and Derby programs. "THG and TrackNet do have a substantial disagreement over what is the right business model for account wagering, which could impact account wagering activity at [Calder, Churchill and Lone Star]," said THG President Bob Reeves. "But THG has proposed to TrackNet that we enter into a special two-day licensing agreement enabling TrackNet's two account wagering companies, XpressBet and TwinSpire.com, as well as all other national account wagering companies, including TVG, Youbet.com, The Racing Channel, BetPad and more, to bring the Derby and Oaks day programs to all account wagering customers." In order to do so, ADW companies would have to agree to THG's business model for account wagering revenue, and Daruty said yesterday that, even for a short period, he did not believe such an agreement would be feasible. "The THG has been pushing a new account wagering model which really doesn't work for account wagering companies," Daruty remarked. "Their most recent proposal just says that if account wagering companies agree to this flawed economic model, they can take the Derby and Oaks days for wagering purposes. I'm not sure that anything is going to happen on this--it really doesn't make any sense, even for two days, to accept the model."

Churchill Appeals To Kentucky Horsemen...


According to published reports, Churchill Downs President Steve Sexton has sent a letter to the KHBPA and KTA, requesting that the horsemen's groups honor a contract signed in October of 2006 that gives Churchill the right to sell the signals for the GI Kentucky Derby, GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic to ADW companies. "Given the gravity and urgency of the situation, we request the HBPA's confirmation that it will honor those obligations," Sexton stated. The contract does include a clause that would allow the HBPA to withdraw its consent, but Sexton added that he did not believe that clause applied here.

Calder Opens Without Purse Contract...

As a result of the ongoing dispute regarding the ADW revenue, there was no signed purse contract between Calder and the Florida division of the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association when the track's 2008 meet opened yesterday. Without such an agreement, the Florida HBPA has denied Calder their permission to simulcast to inter-state and advance deposit wagering facilities. "It's unfortunate that the Florida horsemen have chosen to not discuss a contract with us until all issues with advance-deposit wagering and future slot machine revenue splits are resolved, because we are willing to provide our simulcast signal to off-track betting facilities and horseplayers nationwide," said Churchill Downs President Steve Sexton. "We've communicated to the Florida HBPA that we do not know when slot operations will commence. Our discussions are ongoing and we hope to resolve our differences expeditiously."

MACHO UNO COLT TOPS OBS APRIL OPENER

Trainer Terry Pompay, buying on behalf of Klaravich Stables, went to \$250,000 to get the session-topping Macho Uno colt at the OBS April Spring Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training yesterday. The gray, out of Enterprizing Cat (Storm Cat), was consigned by Woodside Ranch, Agent V. His second dam is GI Spinaway S. winner Family Enterprize (Tri Jet), who herself produced SW and MGSP Silver Bird (Lit de Justice). Both the average and the median showed slight declines on the first day, with the average dropping 11.6 percent to \$25,890; and the median showing a 5.2-percent decrease to \$18,000. The buyback rate, at 28.5 percent a year ago, was 29.8 percent yesterday. The sale continues today at 10:30 a.m. For complete results, go to www.obssales.com. **Toppers, p2**

An injury limited his starts in his next two years, but the bay looked set to rebound in 2008, winning a nine-furlong Santa Anita allowance in 1:46 3/5 before closing out his career with a runner-up finish in a Keeneland allowance Apr. 5. From the family of Classic winner Little Current and last year's star Hard Spun, Chattahoochee War was produced by GSW Buffalo Berry (Ire). He retires to stud with a record of 15-4-5-2 and \$553,416 in earnings. At the time of his injury, he was preparing for Friday's GII Fifth Third Elkhorn S. at Keeneland.

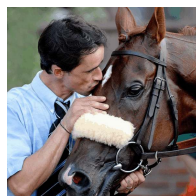

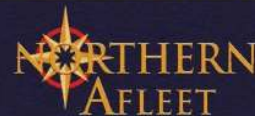
