Triple Threats

BIG BROWN WORKS AT PALM MEADOWS

IEAH Stable and Paul Pompa Jr.'s Big Brown (Boundary) gave every indication of being ready for a big effort after breezing five furlongs in :58 3/5 at Palm Meadows Training Center in Florida Thursday. In his final serious work ahead of the GI Kentucky Derby at Churchill Downs May 3, the bay was accompanied by his regular rider Michelle Nevin. "He did exactly what we wanted him to do," said trainer Richard Dutrow Jr. "He did it the right way, looked real good, and did it in racehorse time, while well within himself. He went about his business in a smooth and ordinary way." Dutrow Jr. seemed unfazed by the quick move. "Right now, I'm not concerned in any way," said Dutrow Jr. "We needed to turn his head loose a little in the lane, because we've kept him covered up in his last couple of breezes. I told Michelle [Nevin] to let him out just a notch in the stretch, she did just that. The colt took the bit, and just carried her to the wire. With the race 10 days away, that was what we needed and wanted." Big Brown will be flown from his Florida base to Louisville, Kentucky, Apr. 28, and should arrive at Churchill Downs by 5:00 p.m. The big bay is expected to have an easy threefurlong breeze over Churchill's main track next Thursday. "I've never been in this kind of spot before, but I don't feel any pressure, not as long as my horse is going good," added Dutrow Jr. "I'm having fun. This is what I was born to do." cont. p3








THE MRS. IS COMING TO TOWN

Longchamp will play host to Mrs. Lindsay (Theatrical {Ire}) on Sunday as Bettina Jenney's G1 Prix Vermeille and GI E. P. Taylor S. heroine is set to return in the €300,000 G1 Prix Ganay. Trainer Francois Rohaut vesterday warned that the four-year-old may need her return after the recent wet weather has held up her preparations in the south west corner of France. "She looks very well in her coat and seems in very good form, but I have to say she has not had the ideal preparation," he revealed. "We have had a lot of rain and the training grounds have sometimes been in very poor condition, so it has been difficult to work her. She has missed two pieces of work, so I'd say she's not going to be 100 percent, but it's a good race for her to return in." It is well-documented by now that the chestnut is a fifth-generation homebred from Jenney's Derry Meeting Farm and her success in the Vermeille mirrored the achievement 27 years earlier of her fourth dam Mrs. Penny, England 's champion two-year-old filly and co-champion three-year-old filly in England and Ireland. Now Mrs. Lindsay, who is named after Jenney's mother and who failed to sell as a yearling, is on the road to a potentially thrilling seasonal finale in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at this venue. "She is in good enough form to run a good race, but she is most definitely not there yet and the decision to keep her in training was due to the possibility of a tilt at the Arc," her conditioner continued. "Her program this year will be geared towards that race--after this will be the G2 Prix Corrida [at Saint-Cloud May 29] and [June 29] G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud, before she has a summer break and returns for the G1 Prix Vermeille [at Longchamp Sept. 14]." Longchamp's ground conditions look likely to be testing on Sunday, but Rohaut is not overly worried. "She's won before on soft ground, so although she is best on a fast surface I'm not too concerned," he added. "She has done well at a mile and a quarter, even if she is best at a mile and a half, and ideally, we want a true-run race."--Claude Beniada

GUINEAS PASSED OVER

Khalid Abdullah's G3 Craven S. scorer Twice Over (GB) (Observatory) will bypass next Saturday's G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, connections announced yesterday. Following deliberations regarding the campaign of the Henry Cecil-trained three-year-old, who defeated Raven's Pass in last Thursday's Newmarket prep, the decision was made to aim at the June 7 G1 Epsom Derby. A statement issued by the ownerbreeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe read, "After consulting with Henry Cecil, Prince Khalid has decided that the colt will miss the 2000 Guineas and run in the [May 15] G2 Dante S. at York with a view to going to the Vodafone Derby. If, after the Dante, it was thought that the colt would not stay a mile and a half, then the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club would become an option. The decision was taken with the colt's longterm future in mind."

Cool Coal Man Readies for Derby...

Robert LaPenta's Cool Coal Man (Mineshaft) put in his final work for the GI Kentucky Derby at Churchill Downs Thursday, negotiating a half-mile in: 47.40 while in company. Ridden by Megan Smillie, the bay was partnered by stablemate Chris Got Even. The pair, who worked over a fast track following the renovation break, recorded internal splits of :11.60, :23.40, :35 and galloped out in 1:02.60. "I was very happy," confirmed trainer Nick Zito. "He was galloping along the right way. You always worry about the breeze before the Derby, but they were really comfortable." Julien Leparoux, who is scheduled to ride the colt in the May 3 Classic, was aboard maiden Chris Got Even for the work. "I just wanted Julien to see his horse, which is why I had him work the other horse" explained Zito. "Basically, I just wanted him to get alongside him and see what kind of horse he's got instead of being on top of him. Plus, Megan gets on him all the time and I didn't want to change anything." Zito plans to train the bay up to the Derby in much the same way that he trained the colt up to a victory in the GII Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 24. "He's not a big, giant horse, but he's perfectly built," said Zito. "I don't think many horses can boast his record as far as conditioning goes. Nobody has three, mile-and-an-eighth races, so I don't want to overdo it. I don't want to underdo it. I'd rather have him gallop all week into the Derby."



Stream of Gold (Ire) has hit the board in five of six starts in the U.S. Passed late in last September's GI Turf Classic Invitational at Belmont Park, the gelding had to settle for second place behind turf champion English Channel and closed out the 2007 season with another runner-up finish behind Einstein in the GII William L. McKnight H. at Calder in December. The sevenvear-old kicked off 2008 with a third in the 1 3/8-mile GI Gulfstream Park H. Feb. 23 and employed his customary closing finish to score in the GII Mac Diarmida H. Mar. 16. Transduction Gold showed his affinity for the Keeneland turf last October and stormed from off the pace to win the GIII Sycamore S. over this trip. The five-year-old failed to handle the wet turf at Monmouth Park during a soggy edition of the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Oct. 27 and trailed home a distant eighth.

Suspended jockey Blake Shinn was forced to watch from the sidelines last Saturday as replacement Glen Boss produced an inspired ride to give trainer Gai Waterhouse her third Golden Slipper victory with Sebring. Now, the young hoop can't wait to be reunited with the Sebring and is convinced the colt has the ability to replicate Dance Hero's Triple Crown feat. Sebring somehow overcame missing the start by at least a length, winning the Slipper by a half-head from Von Costa De Hero. The pair are the only Slipper runners backing up here. "The way that Sebring hit the line showed that he has the ability to go on and win the Triple Crown," Shinn, 20, said. "He overcame plenty of obstacles to win" But trainer David Hayes believes Von Costa de Hero, who races in Sheikh Mohammed's colors, can turn the tables. "All my horses tend to improve having a run the Sydney way under the belt," he said. "He seems great at the moment but you won't definitely know until race day. I have a lot of respect for Sebring, but my bloke had a bad barrier and hadn't had a race for nearly six weeks and will benefit greatly from the run." Hayes said the colt would settle closer to the action that he did last week when a wide draw limited jockey Craig Williams's options. Von Costa De Hero is already a winner over the seven-furlong trip, having captured the G2 VRC Sires' Produce S. at Flemington Mar. 8.

The prospect of a an extremely heavy track diminishes the chances of eight-year-old Takeover Target, who was last seen out 16 weeks ago when he carried 135 and was beaten via disqualification in the G2 Villiers H. Jan. 5. On that occasion, a nose separated him from Honor in War and stewards favoured the latter in a protest. Takeover Target will head next to the KrisFlyer International Sprint in Singapore May 18, en route to England. "Takeover Target has never won on a heavy track. The only time he's been on it was in the (2006) Oakleigh Plate at Caulfield when he ran third," said trainer Joe Janiak. Apache Cat is, however, proven in the wet, and chases his third win at racing's highest level and his third consecutive win. Having scored a first-up G1 Lightning S. win Feb. 2 ahead of a decisive 1 3/4-length win in the G1 Australia S. Feb. 16, he is primed to clash with Takeover Target for the first time. Trainer Greg Eurell confirmed plans to go to Japan for the Centaur S. and Sprinters' S. later this year with the striking chestnut. Magnus is untested on ground this heavy but trainer Peter Moody is unconcerned. The entire was disappointing when beaten fourth in the G1 Galaxy H. Mar. 22 at Randwick. "I don't think the wet will worry him too much, but he'd have to win to warrant a trip to England," Moody said.

The Australian Jockey Club's signature Doncaster-Derby meeting will be run on a heavy track with rain falling steadily across Sydney's eastern suburbs all week but the main contenders for the Derby have demonstrated this week at trackwork they are not averse to rain-affected going. Trainer Nigel Blackiston, formerly a long-time foreman for Bart Cummings, is poised to record his first Group 1 victory with VRC Derby runner-up Littorio and points out his sophomore has had the benefit of a spring racing campaign whereas many Sydney-based runners were sidelined during the El outbreak.



"I'm not over-confident because there are a lot of nice horses in the race, but he's had the extra experience and the extra preparation as well," Blackiston said. "That's definitely going to be in our favour. It will be a real, tough staying test on Saturday with the track and the weather." Largo Lad impressed trainer David Hayes with a powerful gallop on a waterlogged Kensington track Tuesday, the course proper having been closed after some 100mm of rain fell. Sporting blinkers, Largo Lad galloped in the rain over 1400 meters in 1:34.7 with his final 600 meters in :39.1 and his final furlong in:12.3. Largo Lad made his debut for the Hayes stable in last weekend's Rosehill Guineas when fourth to the Anthony Cummings-trained Dealer Principal. He was switched from trainer John Ledger to Hayes after his eighth to Weekend Hussler in the Randwick Guineas Mar. 29, having been purchased by Hayes' clients Scott and Matthew Perrin as a potential Melbourne Cup prospect. "It was the first time that we have put him under pressure in trackwork and he seemed to really hit the line well, " Hayes reported. "The biggest test was whether he handled the soft ground. Looking at the way he has run, I think he does." Dealer Principal also galloped smartly on Tuesday over 1600 meters, clocking:36 for the final 600 meters and:12.8 for his final furlong.





Churchill Files Suit against THG & FLHBPA:

Churchill Downs Incorporated, Calder Race Course and Churchill Downs Technology Initiatives Company filed suit against the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Group (THG), the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association (FLHBPA) yesterday, according to a press release. The suit, which alleges violations under the Sherman Antitrust Act and is a result of the FLHBPA's refusal, acting in concert with the THG, to approve the distribution of Calder races to out-of-state off-track betting sites, including advance-deposit wagering (ADW) companies, was filed in the United States District Court for the Western District of Kentucky Thursday. "Florida horsemen are preventing horse racing enthusiasts from wagering on Calder races, which is unfortunate for the racetrack, horsemen, and most important, our customers," said Steve Sexton, executive vice president of Churchill Downs Incorporated, Calder's parent company. "Despite what we have accomplished for them, by nearly doubling the host fee rate paid to Florida Horsemen, the FLHBPA and the THG, are simply seeking even more money to the detriment of all other parties. We are filing suit to ensure those interests are protected."

He is survived by his parents, Bobby and Carmen Covert, and sister, Lauren Taylor Covert. 

SHAMARDAL COLT TOPS INAUGURAL INGLIS

SESSION II The newly introduced Session II of the Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale got off to an inauspicious start with pouring rain and a noticeably high pass-in rate, but the sale improved toward the end of the evening with trainer Anthony Cummings leading the charge. Cummings purchased 15 yearlings, primarily for Patinack Farm, helping to push the sale toward an average of A\$81,226 for 117 sold from 195 catalogued. Inglis, as agent, signed the ticket for the top-priced yearling, a A\$275,000 colt by Darley's prominent freshman sire Shamardal (Giant's Causeway) out of Salty Sal (Salt Lake), herself a half-sibling to G1SP Hong Kong-based Aint Here (Aus). Cummings signed for a Hussonet colt out of Straight Lake (Salt Lake), a half-sister to G1SP Moonflute (Aus) for A\$240,000. He was also purchaser of a A\$210,000 Al Maher (Aus) filly out of Coverage (Aus) (Covetous {Aus}) offered by Yarraman Park. The filly is a half-sister to SW Uber (Aus) and to SP Viva Caro (Aus). "It has been pleasing shopping here," Cummings said. "One had to search a little harder than in the first few days of the sale, but nevertheless there are good bodied, nice types and good buying at the money. It was difficult [but] I had a list and got through them and I am quite pleased with what we are taking home, and looking forward to getting them to the track sometime soon." Inglis managing director Mark Webster said he was uncertain if the Session II concept would become a permanent feature of the Sydney-based sale company's calendar. "The clear message to come out of today is if there were good horses on show, there was interest from trainers," Webster said. "The clearance rate was a little softer than I would have expected...there were 195 horses and that is too many to go into the Classic sale. Because of EI, we had 200 extra horses and we had to work out what to do with them. I have no problem selling extra horses off the back of Easter if we can maintain the quality. It did not go as well as I would have liked but nice horses sold well and A\$83,000 is still a lot of money, so it is not a bad result." Webster added that 41 horses sold for more than A\$100,000.

"Darren Beadman has not at any time been asked to return to Australia to ride for Darley," Tait said. "We wish him every success with his engagements in Hong Kong. At the present time, we have no plans to retain a jockey."

STAR WAY DIES Star Way (GB) (Star Appeal--New Way, by Klairon), the sire of 18 Group 1 winners and 60 stakes winners, died at Windsor Park Stud last Friday. He was 31. Purchased by Windsor Park Stud's Nelson Schick as a four-year-old, he has been a resident at the stud for the past 27 years, starting in the breeding shed in 1981, "Star Way was a very special character and his accomplishments at stud have been a life-changing event for those of us here at Windsor Park," Schick said in a statement. "His contribution to the overall success of our operation cannot be adequately measured." Star Way was champion two-year-old sire with a first crop that produced five Group 1 winners, a feat that was later matched by Sadler's Wells. His fifth crop also yielded a further five Group 1 winners among 10 group-winning sophomores. Star Way has also excelled as a broodmare sire with his daughters producing 45 stakes winners, including Australia's current leading sire Encosta de Lago (Aus). Star Way's final crop, his 27th and sired at age 30, are due to be born this coming spring. He is the sire of 539 winners from 819 runners to date, for progeny earnings of A\$36-million. Among his leading earners is Sky Chase (NZ), a three-time Group 1 winner, and Shankhill Lass (NZ), winner of the VATC 1000 Guineas. He also sired Filante (NZ), a dual Group 1 winner.

A PIVOTAL NICK IN THE MAKING!

It is rare when a stallion, even the best of stallions, sires three SWs during the same week, or even during the same month, for that matter. But, that is exactly what Cheveley Park Stud's Pivotal accomplished, not in a week or a month, buton the same day (4/12/08) when his First-Time SWs Heaven Sent (WNR: A), Jazz Jam (WNR: A), and II Warrd (WNR: B+) won listed races in Great Britain. To make it even more unique, all of them won at the same distance (one mile) and on the allweather surfaces. Not done yet, just four days later Pivotal's 3yo daughter Infallible (WNR: A + +) won the G3 Nell Gwyn Stakes. Pivotal stands for 85,000 euros (about \$150,000) and is considered, rightfully so, one of Europe's top stallions. Pivotal was not alone in producing three SWs that Saturday. Daughters of Rahy were also responsible for three SWs - Rutherienne (WNR: A + +), winner of the G2 Jenny Wiley Stakes at Keeneland, as well as previously mentioned Jazz Jam and Heaven Sent. While Rahy has done little as a sire of sires, he has become a broodmare sire extraordinaire. In 2008, he is tied for second place with five SWs as a broodmare sire. To date, daughters of Rahy have produced 40 unrestricted SWs, including five G1 winners. As a complete outcross to Northern Dancer and Raise a Native, daughters of Rahy should be a major player in the population of highlevel stakes performers for years to come, especially considering he's still active at stud.

The Pivotal/Rahy nick certainly looks like a mega-nick in the making. In addition to Jam Jazz and Heaven sent, G1 winner Megahertz is by Pivotal out of the Rahy mare Heavenly Ray. In fact, from four Pivotal foals of racing age out of Rahy mares, three of them are SWs! Even the most ardent detractor of the power of the nick would have difficulty ignoring this one. Considering the Pivotal/Rahy success to date, it will be most interesting to follow the two registered Pivotal/Rahy 2yo's this year - a colt named Count Paris (Pivotal--Dearly, by Rahy) and a filly named Funhouse (Pivotal--Fun and Games, by Rahy).
