HERE COMES THE SUN

Today's G1 Prix Ganay offers a clean slate for Khalid Abdullah's Zambezi Sun (GB) (Dansili {GB}) as he faces a potentially exciting four-year-old campaign. Despite winning the G1 Grand Prix de Paris at this venue in July, the homebred rounded off his sophomore season somewhat anti-climatically. Only third behind Soldier of Fortune (Ire) in the G2 Prix Niel back here off a summer break in September, he was eighth after being hampered on his third visit for the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe the following month. Trainer Pascal Bary is hoping for better fortune this time. "He seems in very good form at present," he commented. "After the Grand Prix de Paris, he had an interrupted preparation for the Prix Niel with a foot problem. He still ran a good race there, but it was not ideal leading up to the Arc, and that is probably why he didn't run to his best. That is all behind him now, and he is training very well, so we are hopeful. He likes it good or faster, so the decent ground will help."

Put Up Your Duke...

While last year's hero Dylan Thomas (Ire) is secure at stud, Aidan O'Brien is looking to fill the void from the ranks of Coolmore's now-familiar older horse brigade. One that might fit the bill is Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's **Duke of Marmalade (Ire)** (Danehill), who returned from a serious fracture to take part in some of the major battles last term. Fourth in both the English and Irish G1 2000 Guineas in May, he went down by a neck to Excellent Art (GB) in the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot the following month before filling fourth spot again after a break in York's G1 Juddmonte International S. in August. Runner-up to the aforementioned Dylan Thomas in the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown, he wound up with a third in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. back at Ascot.

'HARLEM' ROCKS THE WITHERS

Unbeaten Harlem Rocker (Macho Uno) rallied impressively from off the pace to defeat J Be K (Silver Dep-

uty) by 2 1/2 lengths in Saturday's GIII Withers S. at the Big A. Sitting in third while J Be K rattled off fractions of :23.91 and :46.41, jockey Eibar Coa swung out the

fever. "He has a low grade fever and he is being treated with anti-biotics," said trainer Bernie Stutts Jr. "He has an elevated white cell count that shows infection. His temperature is normal [Saturday morning] and if it stays down and I am able to train [Sunday], we'll be OK. He doesn't need to work. He's fit." Second to

Big Brown in the GI Florida Derby Mar. 29, Smooth Air breezed seven furlongs in 1:25.80 at Calder last Saturday and shipped to Churchill the following day. "He had a clean bill of health before leaving Florida," Stutts added. "I don't think it came from shipping, because that would show up right away. We trained him Thursday morning, but when we came back to the barn at noon, he had left some feed in the tub and he always eats everything. We knew then we had a sick horse." Stutts continued, "He didn't go to the track Friday and Dallas Stewart's vet Dr. [Phil] Tripp worked on him and gave him plenty of fluids and got his temperature down. But [Friday] afternoon it went back up higher than it was the day before." Stutts is still looking for his first Derby starter at age 70. "He's a horse with a future," Stutts said. "Nobody is looking more to run in the Derby than I am, but he has to be 100 percent to run."

Jockey Mike Smith was aboard for the drill. "Perfect," said Lobo. "Exactly what I wanted--it was an awesome work." The dark bay colt registered splits of :12.40, :24.40, :36.60 and :48.60, and galloped out in 1:14.80. "He was very relaxed out there today," said Smith, who steered Giacomo to victory in the 2005 Run for the Roses. "He wanted to please. And when I galloped out with him, he pulled hard on me. He wanted more."

Bea Oxenberg's Hev Byrn (Put It Back) needs a few dropouts to make the Derby cut, but the GIII Holy Bull S. winner posted five furlongs in 1:01.20 at Calder yesterday. "We're still ready to go to the Derby if he were to get in," said trainer Eddie Plesa Jr., "although that looks pretty doubtful. He worked a good fiveeighths this morning [second-fastest of 33]. If he doesn't get in the Derby, we'll watch the race and see who drops out after that and look at the [GI] Preakness [May 17] as an option. Another possibility would be the [GII] Ohio Derby [at Thistledown May 31]." Fourth to Big Brown in the Florida Derby, Hey Byrn is currently 27th on the graded-earnings list with \$140,000...Fellow Calder-based runner Golden Spikes (Seeking the Gold), second in the GII Illinois Derby at Hawthorne Apr. 5, will go on the road again for his next outing. "I was looking at the [GII] Peter Pan at Belmont [May 10], but that race might come up a little tougher with Keep Laughing and some others in there," noted trainer Marty Wolfson. The colt's other option is the same afternoon in the \$400,000 GIII Lone Star Derby.

Successful in Newbury's G3 Greenham S. last April, Major Cadeaux appeared not to quite get the mile of the G1 2000 Guineas when sixth at Newmarket last May on his only try at this trip. He may not line up in the starting gate all that often, but when he does, watch out. Surf Cat, the 2006 winner of this race, faced the starter only three times last season, placing second in a pair of sprints--the GI Triple Bend Invitational H. July 7 and the GII Pat O'Brien H. Aug. 19. He ended the campaign with a rare off-the-board finish (fifth) when trying grass for the first time in the GII Oak Tree Mile Oct. 7. Freshened for his six-year-old season, he resurfaced with a third-place finish in the Jan. 21 GII Palos Verdes H. before annexing the GII San Carlos H. Feb. 16. The dark bay was last seen crossing the wire second in the Apr. 5 GII Potrero Grande H. Kept within striking distance by Alex Solis here, Surf Cat fought his way past the pacesetting Desert Code after a long drive. "He's really coming around," Solis said. "He was real kind today. In some of his earlier races, he was a little mad and sour, but as he goes along, he's getting better and better. He's coming back to his old self." Trainer Bruce Headley added, "I thought this race set up perfect because he had a couple of nice speed horses out in front of him. Alex [Solis] got him to relax and it seems like that's his best race when he relaxes like that. The pace set up perfect because he wasn't out with them or in between them, he was trailing them. His best races have been like this. We'll place him in either The Californian or the Metropolitan Mile, it depends on the weights."



South African expatriate Lloyd, enjoying his first Australian Group 1 success [and his 81st overall], said he had long been convinced the colt was capable of winning the Derby. "I've been working him the last couple of weeks," he said. "He is a difficult horse, quite keen and heady, but he was better off where he was, and when they slowed up the pace there was a hell of a lot of jostling and nowhere to go either out or in." Nom du Jeu was sent out at 25-1 at his first outing since Mar. 23 when the headstrong colt was runner-up in the G3 3YO Classic at Awapuni. Baker had planned to start the dark bay in the G1 Rosehill Guineas Apr. 12, but a spiked temperature prevented Nom du Jeu from participating in the race won by Dealer Principal (Aus). "He is a genuine staying horse," said Baker. "I think he is a handy horse. If the NZ Derby winner had been in this race he would have probably distanced them--he's a real good horse--but this horse is a good stayer, an old fashioned English-type horse." Baker said Nom du Jeu, from the first of four Southern Hemisphere crops for Montjeu (Ire), was still six months from reaching a physical peak; while he would not commit to a G1 Melbourne Cup tilt for the sophomore, he warned Aussies that C'est le Geurre (NZ) would take a ton of beating if sent to Flemington on the first Tuesday in November. The Cambridge-based Baker also trained Nom du Jeu's dual Group 1-winning dam Prized Gem, who won the G1 Brisbane Cup and G1 Kelt Capital S. in 2002.

Caught in the Ruck...

While Nom du Jeu's connections took home a tick over A\$1-million for the win, a tale of woe unfolded for other runners and their jockeys, with Darren Beadman, rider of well-supported Largo Lad (Aus), limping back to the scale with a torn boot after being pushed in to the running rail, after which his mount sought to over-race before finishing second last. NSW Racing Stewards took a dim view of the scrimmage in Sydney's blueriband race with Larry Cassidy, rider of Steel Giant (Aus) (Carnegie {Ire}), held accountable and suspended to May 19. Hong Kong-based Zac Purton is out until May 18 for causing strife that cost 3-1 favourite Littorio (Aus) ground.

Triple Honour is by the Danehill sire Honours List (Ire), a FF3-million yearling who won the Railway S. for Aidan O'Brien before going amiss.

"I was a little concerned when we hit the turn and Takeover Target looked like he would be hard to catch, but to his credit, my bloke digs deep, he knows where the winning post is," said Brown. "He took a little while to get going in the heavy ground, but once he got into gear up the rise, he attacked the line really solidly." Trainer Greg Eurell is no stranger to overseas competition, having represented Australia in showjumping at the 1984 Los Angeles Olympics.

The emphatic win of his "masked assassin" cemented plans to campaign abroad; Eurell has feature sprints in Japan and Hong Kong in mind for the gelding ahead of a possible tilt at Royal Ascot next year. "If he's as successful as we hope he'll be in Japan, then I know the owners are keen to look at Royal Ascot," Eurell said. In the short term, Apache Cat will point to Brisbane's G1 BTC Cup May 10 and G1 Doomben 10,000 May 24.

Sebring, with regular rider Blake Shinn back aboard, stalked modestly performed filly Love and Kisses as Von Costa De Hero (Aus) raced wide without cover, looming as the field swung around the turn. The prospect of the glamour colt breathing down his neck did not perturb Shinn, who let Sebring surge to the front to deny a fast-finishing Samantha Miss by a length. Love And Kisses held on for a close-up third. Gai Waterhouse is widely regarded as a brilliant asset to Australian racing for her indefatigable enthusiasm and charisma, but behind the "froth and bubble" is a trainer of formidable determination; since winning a 10-year battle for the right to actually train at all, Waterhouse has made Randwick her personal realm, collecting 47 Group 1 trophies since 1993, including five Sires' Produce S. wins. "He is the champion two-year-old, there are no two ways about it," Waterhouse affirmed.

"This is the most dominant male seen in Australia for a long, long time; he donkey-licked them in the Slipper coming from last, he has won the Sires' over 1400 meters on a heavy track and he will be even better of the 1600 meters of the Champagne S. He's a very relaxed colt; he's not fazed by anything, and I've trained him to win the Triple Crown."

Stonerside Stable's G3 Solario S. winner was runner-up in the G3 Craven S. at Newmarket 10 days ago, 24 hours after Cheveley Park Stud's homebred Infallible had captured the meeting's G3 Nell Gwyn S. "They both worked yesterday and Infallible did a lovely piece of work, skipping two or three lengths clear of another under Jimmy [Fortune]," he said. "It wasn't demanding; just a nice exercise as she's inclined to look about in the clear. I was happy with her and she cantered this morning, while Raven's Pass breezed solidly over about 7 1/2 furlongs on the Al Bahathri gallop. He was very comfortable doing that and cantered this morning."

NATAGORA READY Stefan Friborg's Natagora (Fr) (Divine Light {Jpn}) was reported firmly on course for Sunday's G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket. Having come through her prep in Maisons-Laffitte's Listed Prix Imprudence in smooth fashion Apr. 14, last year's G1 Cheveley Park S. winner and G1 Prix Morny runner-up will line up as one of the favorites for the mile Classic. "Everything is under control following her reappearance and she went quietly on the grass again on Wednesday," the owner's Racing Manager Patrick Barbe commented. "It was just an easy canter and she is happy--eating well and training well. All the lights are green and we hope for the best. She won very easily in the Prix Imprudence, especially as the ground was against her. On the other hand, the heavy going probably made it more of a stamina test. In that testing ground, the distance, while not quite equivalent to a mile at Newmarket, was close to it. I don't think we have any doubts about her getting the mile at Newmarket. The dam is by Linamix and the second dam is by Margouillat, so she has a lot of stamina in the pedigree." Ground conditions could be on the testing side by the weekend after a wet forecast. Clerk of the Course and Director of Racing Michael Prosser revealed that the current description is good to firm and added, "The weather is beautiful today, breezy and sunny, but the forecast is unsettled. There is currently rain forecast every day from tomorrow through to Friday."





INGLIS CLASSIC SESSION KICKS OFF TODAY

Inglis's unremitting television promotion of its Classic Yearling Sale, which kicks off its three-day run today, was rendered delightfully superfluous when Classic sale graduates Triple Honour (Aus) (Honours List {Ire}), a A\$50,000 buy, won yesterday's G1 Doncaster H. and brought his bankroll to A\$1.3 million, while stylish filly Raise (Aus) (Arena {Aus}), a A\$72,500 purchase, won the G3 Adrian Knox S. on the same card. An upside-down sale calendar courtesy of the Equine Influenza disruption means the Classic, usually among the first of six annual majors in Australia, is the last this year. While the elite Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale was the gourmet feast buyers have been salivating for, the inaugural "Easter Session II" was an unremarkable second course. Classic, however, has always been the source of well-priced racehorses and, as a second tier of consignors moved into the Newmarket complex on Anzac Day, it was obvious there were plenty of well-prepared youngsters. Easter Session II will probably find its niche if Inglis retains the format for 2009. It was dented by a number of factors, one being the limited amount of time would-be buyers had to inspect the 195 yearlings. This resulted in buyers asking to look at specific horses rather than viewing an entire draft. Secondly, a trainer-led bench bought exceptionally good value yearlings at the median or less at Easter, and recent history shows it is this sector that tends to yield plenty of stakes winners. The third factor negating the impact of Session II was simply bleak weather, but Sydney has since turned on its most dazzling autumn sunshine ahead of the Classic sale. Inglis Director Jonathan D'Arcy said, "With the introduction of Easter II, some of the better horses ended up there, so we are probably looking at an average of around \$30,000 to \$35,000. But, having said that, a lot of trainers from interstate are attending the sale." At the Classic Sale last year, 427 sold at a gross of A\$16,708,409 and an average of A\$39,129. Top price was A\$350,000 for a colt by Street Cry (Ire). The sale, comprising 533 lots, begins at 3 p.m. at Newmarket.

Widden in Vogue...

Widden Stud, which sold Triple Honour (Aus) at this sale last year, has 17 on offer by in-form stallions, with Lot 83, a Choisir (Aus) half-brother to SW Canny Fly (Aus), attracting admirers. "He is a nice, big, strong, lengthy Choisir, he stands over a bit of ground," commented Widden's Ryan McEvoy. Another popular colt is 111, a half-brother to SP Lady Cay (Aus) by Viscount (Aus). "He is a nice style of horse, he looks like a real runner," said McEvoy. Others among Widden's draft include a Danewin half-sister to promising two-year-old Warpig (Aus) and a forward-looking Red Ransom colt from the immediate family of G1SP Beauty Watch (Aus).

Figures Add up for Lomar Park...

Fastnet Rock (Aus) was runaway leading freshman sire at Inglis Easter and his draft are expected to be sought after here, with one potential star being Lot 373, a fetching filly from proven producer Misty Dawn (Aus) (Mister C). "She is the image of her father," says Lomar Park's Paul Davies. Long-time breeder Fred Peisah's Lomar Park Stud has an impressive record-over the past four years Lomar has sold 68, and of those, 58 have raced (46 as two-year-olds), winning 78 races in total, and yielding 13 stakes performers. The stud is home to emerging Danehill stallion Arena (Aus), the sire of Raise (Aus) and Rena's Lady (Aus).

Velvet Touch...

Boutique Southern Highlands farm Velvet Stud, owned by leading Australian fashion designer Lisa Ho and her husband Philip Smouhart, is only in its second year, but has a smart draft of four including Lot 438, a Falbrav (Ire) filly out of Queen Emma (Fr) (Irish River {Fr}), herself from the family of G1 Hong Kong Cup winner Agnes Digital (Jpn). Eight-time Group 1 winner Falbrav stood at Arrowfield for three seasons and has recently burst into prominence with three first-crop winners, putting him second on that sires' table. The last was the A\$550,000 Inglis Easter graduate Fravashi (Aus), an eye-catching winner for Woodlands trainer Peter Snowden at Canterbury less than a week ago.
