BEHINDATTHEBAR TO AWAIT PREAKNESS

GII Coolmore Lexington S. winner **Behindatthebar** (Forest Wildcat) will not be entered in the May 3 GI Kentucky Derby, and will instead await the May 17 GI Preakness S. "I spoke with Satish and Sasha Sanan this morning and we all thought 16 days between two races was a lot of pressure to put on the horse," trainer Todd Pletcher explained. "If he'd gone to the Derby, it would have been three races in 30 days. In all fairness to the horse, who I believe has incredible potential, we will continue to go the Classic route by pointing toward the Preakness." Owned by Padua Stables and partners Michael Shustek and Don Stanley, Behindatthebar is three-for-five lifetime.

Big Truck Sharp in Final Prep...

Looking to put his 11th-place finish in the GI Blue Grass S. behind him, GIII Tampa Bay Derby winner **Big Truck** (Hook and Ladder) worked a bullet five furlongs in :59 2/5 at Churchill yesterday morning. The bay galloped out six panels in 1:14. "He worked very well," said trainer Barclay Tagg. "He did everything right. He likes the surface." Exercise rider Kristen Troxell was in the saddle for the move. Also having their final Derby preps yesterday were **Bob Black Jack** (Stormy Jack), who clicked off a half in :48 3/5 and went out five-eighths in 1:02; **Visionaire** (Grand Slam), who got his half in :48 2/5; and **Denis of Cork** (Harlan's Holiday), who went the same distance in :48 and galloped out an extra furlong in :12 1/5. "He worked so good--nothing this horse does surprises me," said trainer David Carroll of his charge, Denis of Cork, who, with defection of Behindatthebar, will now make it into the Derby field. "I am over the moon," Carroll said. "It's great news and I am very happy for [owner William Warren] and his family, and for my staff and my family. Mr. Sanan called Mr. Warren this morning to tell him, and then Mr. Warren called me. I'm excited. Now all we need is to get a good post."

Asmussen Duo Tune Up...

Trainer Steve Asmussen sent out both of his Derby runners to work yesterday morning. **Z Fortune** (Siphon {Brz}) went first, going a half in a modest :51 flat. As the GI Arkansas Derby runner-up was galloping out, stablemate **Pyro** (Pulpit) broke off to go the same distance in :49 4/5. "They went over the track well," Asmussen said. "We were very fortunate with the weather, and the track was in excellent shape this morning." He added that Pyro, who beat just two in the GI Blue Grass as the even-money favorite, was on his toes as the Derby approaches. "If anything, he was a bit too sharp today," the Texas-based horseman remarked. "He needs to relax. The Derby isn't for showing off in the middle of the race. It's for showing off after it."

Smooth Air Back on Track...

Smooth Air (Smooth Jazz), beaten five lengths by Big Brown when second in the GI Florida Derby, galloped for the first time after getting three easy days due to an elevated temperature. The bay went two miles. "He's back to himself," said exercise rider Susie Milne. Smooth Air had returned to the track for a jog Sunday. "[Sunday] he was a little wobbly," said trainer Bennie Stutts Sr. "We had given him a tranquilizer because we didn't want him to get too hot, and the pony just took him around there. When he was back in the barn walking, though, he took a rip out of his blanket. He was feeling good. Today, you saw a racehorse out there."

Proud Spell Definite for Oaks...

Trainer Larry Jones said yesterday that **Proud Spell** (Proud Citizen) will be entered in the May 2 GI Kentucky Oaks, and not the Derby. "I've finished second in both [the Derby and the Oaks] now," said Jones. "Island Sand in the 2004 Oaks and Hard Spun in last year's Derby. I don't know if we can improve off that, but it sure gives us a taste to try again." Proud Spell, third in the GI Ashland S. last time out, walked the shedrow Monday after her sparkling five-furlong move in :58 2/5 the day before. "She should be the favorite, or at least second choice, based on what she's accomplished," her conditioner added.

Rasierra Could Supplement to Oaks...

Lloyd DeBruycker's **Rasierra** (Kafwain) may have punched her ticket to the Kentucky Oaks with her eye-catching four-furlong workout yesterday morning. With James Theriot in the irons, the bay filly clicked off a bullet half in :46 3/5, the fastest of 44 at the trip. She would have to be supplemented to the race for \$25,000. "I don't know if we are going yet, but she worked unbelievably," said Cody Autrey, who took over the filly's training from Ray Tracy two weeks ago. "I had her going five-eighths in :58 3/5 and galloping out in 1:12 2/5. She only took two sips of water when she came back." A maiden winner at Prairie Meadows in her career opener last June, Rasierra has not scored since, but she has been second in her last four tries. She was beaten a half-length in her latest, the Apr. 12 Instant Racing S. going a mile at Oaklawn Park.

19 REMAIN ON TARGET FOR 2000 GUINEAS

There were no surprises at the five-day confirmation stage of the G1 2000 Guineas, with the main protagonists all among the 19 colts going forward for the 200th renewal of the mile Classic at Newmarket on Saturday. Stonerside Stable's **Raven's Pass** (Elusive Quality) remains on target and Jimmy Fortune is confident the Apr. 17 G3 Craven S. runner-up can raise his game even further. "He's in great form and seems to have come on for his run in the Craven," Fortune said. "I was really pleased with the way he ran as I didn't think he'd get that close and he ran a lot better than I thought he would. He's stepped up on his work at home, he's in very good order and is happy. It will be a bigger field on Guineas day, they'll go a good gallop and hopefully we'll be able to sit behind the right ones." Harry Herbert, racing manager to Highclere Thoroughbred Racing, feels that, while the Peter Chapple-Hyam-trained **Fireside (GB)** (Dr Fong) is lacking in experience, he is entitled to take his chance in Saturday's feature event and was bullish about his chance.

"We had hoped to run Fireside in the G3 Greenham S. and he was in super form, but we found that he had a bit of mucus in his throat, so we had to pull the plug," explained Herbert. "He worked very impressively last Saturday, he scoped 100-percent clean afterwards and his blood is good, so we're prepared to step up and give it a go." The remaining entries include unbeaten champion juvenile **New Approach (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), Godolphin's Group 1 winners **Ibn Khaldun** (Dubai Destination) and **Rio de la Plata** (Rahy), G1 Gran Criterium hero **Scintillo (GB)** (Fantastic Light) and a Ballydoyle quartet of **Henrythenavigator** (Kingmambo), **Jupiter Pluvius** (Johannesburg), **One Great Cat** (Storm Cat) and **Plan** (Storm Cat). Trainer Aidan O'Brien is planning on three of those four going postward. "It's looking like Jupiter Pluvius, Plan and Henrythenavigator, although we won't be finalising plans until Tuesday or Wednesday," O'Brien told *Racing Post*.

...And 18 Left in the 1000 Guineas...

As with the G1 2000 Guineas, there were no surprises as 18 fillies stood their ground for Sunday's G1 1000 Guineas. They are headed by G3 Nell Gwyn S. victress **Infallible (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}). Cheveley Park Stud's homebred leapt to the head of the ante-post lists with a stunning victory in the Apr. 16 trial and is another leading Classic light emanating from John Gosden's Clarehaven Stables. "She was very impressive in the Nell Gwyn and has never been off the bridle before," commented big-race partner Jimmy Fortune. "We don't know how good she is as we've never asked her to do anything serious. She does everything so easy at home and hopefully she has enough experience to handle a big field." The remaining entries are headed by last season's G1 Cheveley Park S. heroine **Natagora (Fr)** (Divine Light {Jpn}) and Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's recent G3 Fred Darling S. victress **Muthabara (Ire)** (Red Ransom). Also remaining in contention are Cheveley Park Stud's G2 May Hill S. winner **Spacious (GB)** (Nayef) and another Ballydoyle quartet--**Halfway to Heaven (Ire)** (Pivotal {GB}), **Kitty Matcham (Ire)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), **Psalm (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) and **Savethisdanceforme (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}).

In Anticipation of Precipitation...

With the Rowley Mile track currently described as good-to-firm, Newmarket's clerk of the course, Michael Prosser, will welcome all of today's forecast rain to ease underfoot conditions. "We need it, too, as the course is drying out," Prosser told *Racing Post*. A half inch of rain is due to fall between noon and midnight today and Prosser added, "We've missed all the showers that were around [Monday] and the going is good to firm--with a GoingStick reading of 9.7--but that should change once the rain arrives. Because it's been dry for the past couple of days, the ground will be receptive to the rain, so I'd expect any we get to have a significant effect, although exactly how much will obviously depend on the amount that falls."

Newhaven Park Stud-owned **Raise**, runaway winner of the G2 Adrian Knox S. at Randwick on Saturday, is aiming to repeat the feat of her full sister Rena's Lady (Aus), who completed the Adrian Knox-Oaks double last autumn. But the Joseph Pride trainee comes up against the formidable filly **Zarita**, an authoritative winner of the G1 SA Oaks and G1 SA Derby and A\$2.80 morning-line favourite here. Zarita started favourite in the G1 VRC Oaks last spring after her stunning win the G2 Wakeful S., but could only manage eighth behind Arapaho Miss (Aus). She returned this season to place in the G3 Vanity S. before winning the G2 Angus Armanasco S. and Kewney S. and the G1 SA Oaks and Derby. Jockey Greg Childs galloped Zarita in Sydney's clockwise way of going and said her first race on a right-handed track would not prove a problem. "She's really workmanlike, really professional," Childs said. "She got onto her Sydney leg when I worked her and that won't be a problem. She's done everything she's been asked to do. She just keeps lifting another notch. Her win in the Australasian Oaks in Adelaide was good, but her win in the South Australian Derby was better."

As I've pointed out before in these notes, it is very important that a stallion should be in the right place at the right time. And this was surely very much on the minds of the Adena Springs team when, in the fall of 2003, they added up the pros and cons as to whether Macho Uno would be best served by basing him at their branch in Kentucky or Florida.

One very definite pro for considering Macho Uno worthy of a place in Kentucky was his record as a two-year-old. He'd started out at Saratoga, following up his debut win with a highly encouraging third in the GI Hopeful S., in which he finished only a neck behind the dead-heaters City Zip and Yonaguska--both enjoying the benefit of much more experience. Macho Uno confirmed the promise of this fine effort when he trounced the opposition in the GI Grey Breeders' Cup S., and the next stop for the progressive son of Holy Bull was the Breeders' Cup Juvenile. He won that too, hanging on by a nose from the strong-finishing Point Given, with Street Cry a respectable third. The result was reflected in the Experimental Free Handicap, which placed Macho Uno top by a pound from Point Given, and the Eclipse Award was also his.

It would be wrong to suggest that Macho Uno didn't train on, but he certainly didn't build significantly on his juvenile achievements, perhaps because he proved somewhat injury-prone. The 2001 Triple Crown was done and dusted before Macho Uno was next able to race, in a Saratoga allowance (which he lost narrowly). He managed to defeat Unbridled Elaine in the GIII Pennsylvania Derby next time out and was far from disgraced on Breeders' Cup Day, when he filled fourth place behind Tiznow, Sakhee and Albert the Great.

Although these efforts were good enough to earn Macho Uno an International Classification rating of 120, this placed him 10 pounds below his old rival Point Given. It was a similar story at four, when a victory in the GII Massachusetts H. and a fifth in the Breeders' Cup Classic weren't enough to stop his rating falling to 116, some eight pounds below Street Cry.

Although a slight filling behind a knee was found after Macho Uno's third Breeders' Cup venture, it wasn't considered serious enough to prevent his staying in training at five, the intention being to send him to Bobby Frankel. Unfortunately, he never made it to the races.

With memories tending to be so short, a blank year prior to retirement represents a serious setback for virtually any potential stallion. Even those--like Macho Uno--which performed at the highest level tend to lose out to the horses which were carrying all before them in the months before their retirement, so this could be considered another con against his standing in Kentucky.

And then there was Macho Uno's pedigree to take into account. I guess no stallion which has sired six Grade I winners, including winners of a Kentucky Derby and a Breeders' Cup Juvenile, as Holy Bull has done, can be described as a failure. However, he had only two Grade I winners from six crops of racing age by the end of 2003, so this amounted to another con to set against the distinct pro of Macho Uno's being a half-brother to Awesome Again. Not only had Awesome Again been an outstanding performer and a winner of the Breeders' Cup Classic, but he had also made a fine start as a stallion. His first crop--three-year-olds of 2003--had produced the Grade I winners Toccet and Ghostzapper, to boost his fee to \$75,000 for 2004.

So would it be best for Macho Uno to stand in Kentucky, or to Adena Springs South? In the end the Adena Springs team opted for Florida, where Macho Uno's grandsire Great Above, great-grandsire Minnesota Mac and great-great-grandsire Rough'n Tumble had been based. With his sire line carrying the Tartan Farms hallmark, Florida breeders could be expected to welcome Macho Uno with open arms, and they sent him 112 mares in his first year.

The last 12 months have proven that Macho Uno was indeed the right horse in the right place. From 67 named foals in his first crop, he has already sired four stakes winners, his total being boosted by the weekend double by the unbeaten Harlem Rocker in the GIII Withers S. and Macho Again in the Derby Trial S. Macho Uno's previous stakes scorers were Wicked Style (GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity and GIII Arlington-Washington Futurity) and Swiftly Victress. Another son, Cool Gator, did enough in Canadian graded stakes towards the end of last year (including when a head second in the Grey Breeders' Cup S.) to be one of the leading fancies for the Queen's Plate, which, theoretically, could also be on the agenda for the Canadian-bred Harlem Rocker. It's worth remembering that Awesome Again's first big success came when he carried the Stronach colors to victory in the 1997 Queen's Plate.

Thanks principally to Wicked Style's Grade I success, the decision was made to transfer Macho Uno to head office in Kentucky, leaving four crops in Florida. His fee was raised, but only to \$20,000--a fraction of the \$150,000 now being charged for Awesome Again.

Macho Uno's early results show how successful the Adena Springs operation can be at "making" a stallion, with help from its sizeable broodmare team. Wicked Style was bred by Adena Springs (which sold his dam Deviletta for \$41,000 several months after his birth), while Swifty Victress's dam Caught Fire was carrying this stakes winner when sold by Adena Springs for \$35,000.

Clearly neither mare was greatly out of the ordinary and the same could be said of Macho Again's dam Go Donna Go, who changed hands for \$25,000 in 2004.

Harlem Rocker is another Adena Springs graduate. His dam Freedom Come earned nearly \$220,000 in reaching the first two in seven of her nine starts, and she was second in a pair of Canadian sprint stakes as a four-year-old. She therefore ranks among the better performers by the champion sprinter Lit de Justice--a stallion that not even the might of Adena Springs could turn into a success. Freedom Come's Grade III-winning half-brother Boomzeeboom stayed better, as he showed when winning GIII Affirmed H. at 1 1/16 miles and running third in the the nine-furlong GII Swaps S. Their dam Zee Lady earned an Experimental H. rating of 111 and possessed plenty of speed, as did her sire, Mr. Prospector's son Unreal Zeal. There isn't much stamina to be found here, but Macho Uno and Holy Bull just about stayed 1 1/4 miles, so Harlem Rocker may stay further than the mile of the Withers S. One thing's for sure--this highly promising colt is destined to help focus more attention on his 10-year-old sire, whose pedigree makes him an option for so many mares.

Gestut Auenquelle's homebred **Oriental Tiger (Ger)** (Tiger Hill {Ire}) impressed when making all to comfortably land the G2 Gerling-Preis at Cologne on Sunday. The five-year-old entire looks to have really come to himself and is now the unbeaten winner of two pattern races this season. "I just leave him alone to try and keep him happy and he seems to be quite happy out there in front," commented winning rider Terence Hellier. Oriental Tiger had shown enough promise as a juvenile when finishing third in the G3 Preis des Winterfavoriten and Listed Junioren-Preis and went on to finish runner-up in G1 Grosser Preis von Baden and third in the G1 German Derby during his sophomore campaign. His dam is the Big Shuffle mare Oriental Flower (Ger), herself the leading juvenile of 1996 and a close relative to the likes of champion mare Rose Bowl and the King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. victor Ile de Bourbon. Tiger Hill has made a good start to the season as a sire, his son Young Tiger (Fr) took the Listed Prix du Grand Camp, while Echoes Rock (Ger) and Song of Tiger (Ger) both ran stakes placed in France. The Cologne race meeting also staged two Listed events which were won by senior runners. The 10-year-old **Sacho (Ger)** (Dashing Blade {GB}) scored in the Listed Jean Harzheim Sprintpreis, the race he also won a year ago. Sacho is an own brother to the multiple group-winning miler and sprinter Soave (Ger), who also kept up his winning ways as he grew older. The Listed Excelsior Hotel Ernst-Meile went to the game nine-year-old entire **Willingly (Ger)**, a son of the recently deceased Sussex S. winner Second Set (Ire). Willingly scored in the G3 Furstenberg-Rennen at three and has frequently been group and Listed placed over the years. Second Set is also prominently represented by the three-year-old Listed Preis der Dreijahrigen victor Black Out (Ger), who is unbeaten in three outings this season. The two maiden races on the card were strongly contested and could well have seen future top winners break their maiden here. Gestut Ittlingen's homebred colt **Royal Pepper (GB)** (Royal Applause {GB}) won handily enough and can boast some smart relations in the G2 Goldene Peitsche and G3 Premio Omenoni winning sprinter Raffelberger (Ger) (Auenadler {Ger}), his stakes-winning own brother Raptor (Ger) and last year's group-placed Red Diva (GB). The RNA rate climbed to 23.1 percent. "The sale has maintained a consistent pace with good competition on those yearlings warranting the better money," William Inglis Bloodstock Director Jonathan D'Arcy said. "It was pleasing to see seven horses top the \$100,000 mark, while other buyers have secured excellent value for money over the first two days--as people have come to expect at Classic. The progeny of first-season sires were particularly well received." Graduates of the sale are eligible to compete in the newly introduced A\$2.5-million Inglis Race Series. The final session of the Classic sale begins at 11 a.m. today.
