





TERRIFIC TWELVE FOR KENTUCKY OAKS

A top-shelf field of 12 has been drawn for Friday's 134th running of the \$500,000 GI Kentucky Oaks at Churchill Downs. The nine-furlong event features a trio



of Grade I winners--Country Star (Empire Maker), Little Belle (A.P. Indy), and Golden Doc A (Unusual Heat)-and an additional five graded stakes winners. The terrific 12, however, is more likely to become the elite 11 after the expected defection of Fox Hill Farm's Eight Belles (Unbridled's Song), who drew post 12 for the

Oaks but looks more likely to take on the boys in the following day's GI Kentucky Derby. Ironically, her trainer, Larry Jones, entered in the Oaks as a backup plan should she draw a bad post in the Derby. Now, a bad draw in the Oaks could ensure Eight Belles, the tepid 5-2 morning line choice, runs for the roses.



Awesome Chic to Get New Jockey in Albarado...

Aurora Springs Stable's filly **Awesome Chic** (Awesome Again) drew post three in the Oaks, where she will get a new jockey in Robby Albarado. Irwin Rosendo had ridden her in all five of her previous races, including her latest, a win in the GIII Florida Oaks. "Rosendo is an excellent rider, but with a crowd of over 100,000 people and all the excitement, we thought we needed a jockey with more experience," Aurora Spring's Jose Acero explained. "Robby [Albarado] breezed her two times and said she likes the track." Awesome Chic galloped 1 1/2 miles at Churchill yesterday under exercise rider Ariel Carrasquillo.

To Go, Or Not to Go?


That is usually the question for a trainer when his charge draws the rail, as Barry Abrams's filly **Golden Doc A** (Unusual Heat) did in the Oaks. Before the posts

were even drawn, however, Abrams was thinking race tactics as he gave exercise rider Stephen O'Callaghan a leg up on his chestnut filly at 7 a.m. for a mile-and-a-half spin around the Churchill Downs oval. "I was thinking about blowing her out three furlongs this morning," the trainer said, "but if I had she'd have gone in :34 and it would have wound her up and put speed on her mind. She doesn't

need that. She's going to take back and make a run at them through the stretch, so the strong gallop was the right thing for her." He added of post position, "They've got that long run into the first turn and she's going to be in the back anyway. She should be laying about seventh or eighth on the fence and then come running in the stretch. I've got the right rider [Hall of Famer Kent Desormeaux] for it and he'll know what to do."

'COMPANY' OUT OF GUINEAS Godophin's G1 2000 Guineas ambitions took a dent yesterday following the news that Fast Company (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) will sidestep Saturday's Newmarket Classic. Last year's G1 Dewhurst S. runner-up, who was set to join Ibn Khaldun (Dubai Destination) due to the forecast rain, scoped dirty at evening stables. A statement on www.godolphin.com read, "Fast Company will not run in the English 2000 Guineas following a poor blood count which was taken at evening stables on April 29. All plans are now on hold for the colt while he is given a period of time to recover. Fast Company holds entries in both the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains [at Longchamp May 11] and the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas [at The Curragh May 24]. A decision will be made at a later date with regard to his next intended run." Last year's G1 Racing Post Trophy winner Ibn Khaldun had earlier received an upbeat bulletin from Racing Manager Simon Crisford, who told Racing Post, "Ibn Khaldun has had a good winter. Obviously, he needs to be a better horse than he was last year. There are various formlines that indicate he needs to be better than he was when he was winning the Racing Post Trophy, and we are hopeful he has improved over the course of the winter. Rio de la Plata (Rahy) is still more likely to go to France."

'Dream' On...

Andrew Balding yesterday gave the green light for Jeff Smith's Dream Eater (Ire) (Night Shift) to take his part in Saturday's 2000 Guineas. Last year's St Leger 2yo S. winner will be having his first run since finishing sixth in the G1 Middle Park S. at Newmarket in October. "He's got some very solid form from last year and I don't think we saw the best of him, but he's mature tremendously well over the winter," Balding explained. "He was a bit of a handful--he let himself down in the preliminaries and raced a bit keen, but he has come back from a break and matured, which will stand him in good stead. He has always had a lot of class and plenty of ability and settles better now, so that gives him a chance of getting the mile. He's a lively outsider and has what it takes; so as long as the ground doesn't get too soft, he'll run a big race."

Poulains Bid for 'Proud'...

Paul Cole will send Michael Spencer's **River Proud** (Proud Citizen) to Longchamp to tackle next Sunday's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains. Last year's G3 Somerville Tattersall S. winner was fourth on his return in the G3 Craven S. at Newmarket Apr. 17, and his conditioner is hoping the **3** "**TDN Rising Star**" **3** can rebound in the mile Classic. "He ran well enough in the Craven, but he broke away from the gate almost too well and ended up in front, where we didn't want him to be," Cole told *PA Sport*. "As a result, he tired late on, and we would have preferred to hold him up and challenge late. We are looking at the French Guineas for him now, and we just have to hope for a bit more luck next time around."

Big Brown Tours Churchill...

IEAH Stables and Paul Pompa Jr.'s Big Brown (Boundary) looked a picture of confidence and class and he took his first spin around Churchill's oval yesterday morning, leaving trainer Richard Dutrow Jr. all but predicting a victory Saturday in the 134th Kentucky Derby. "I feel very confident that if Big Brown breaks

with the field, I think he's going to run a big race," Dutrow said. "I just haven't seen any other horse with my eyes that can beat him. That's all." Big Brown, shadowed by a large contingent of media types, walked to the track at 8:30 a.m. at the conclusion of the renovation break. Under exercise rider Michelle Nevin, he galloped about 1 1/2 miles. "He traveled very good. I was with him the whole way." Dutrow said. "A lot of horses really like flying; he's one of them. He ate up everything last

night. He trained good this morning. We're happy with things." Dutrow said Big Brown will gallop Wednesday and work three-eighths on Thursday. Like Tagg, the trainer said he won't make any changes in how he handles the colt. "I'm training him for a horse race," Dutrow said. "It doesn't make me feel anything different just because he's training for the Kentucky Derby. Even though it's the biggest race in the world, still, I'm basically training him for a horse race. That's the only way that I'm looking at it. I've been dreaming about the Derby all my life. So now I'm here. I don't want to put more into training him, because I think all you have to do is basic stuff around him. His talent and his ability is going to get us there, not my training techniques. Just him. He's the one's that's got us here. Any goodenough horseman can do what I've done with this horse. Any jockey can do what Kent [Desormeaux] has done with this horse. Any groom, hotwalker. It's the horse that is what is making the whole game go here."

I've got the fastest horse in the race, but the issue is how do you dole out that speed. I like the way Migliore sits him. I thought his ride in the Santa Anita Derby was a good one. Distance isn't a question with this horse. I know what they say about his breeding, but...he'll run on."

Fair Breeze, who garnered prizemoney in each of her seven pattern-race starts last year, missed by a short neck in the Oct. 28 G1 Premio Lydia Tesio at Rome's Capanelle, her only try at the highest level. She gained some measure of compensation when registering a career-best win in the G3 Hessen-Pokal at Frankfurt last time Nov. 11 and bagged a fifth stakes score with a crushing victory in this contest. Stalking Claire et Bleu in second from flagfall, the German raider eased by that rival with 450 meters remaining and coasted to the line under a sympathetic drive for an impressive win. "She worked very very well with a Group 1 horse from my stable last Monday, and I thought she came here with a very good chance," explained winning trainer Mario Hofer. "I didn't think she'd win as easily as she did because it was such a strong group race. She's improved with age; she's from a good German family and we hope we can win a Group 1 race with her. She'll return to France for the G2 Prix Corrida [at Saint-Cloud May 29], and we'll give her a summer break after that as she prefers testing conditions. The plan is to then bring her back in the autumn for the G1 Prix de l'Opera [at Longchamp Oct. 5]." Click for the Racing Post chart.

After taking a small step backwards when runner-up by a neck to Circular Quay in the GII New Orleans H. at Fair Grounds Mar. 8, Grasshopper hopes to get back to winning ways here. Never off the board in nine career starts and first or second in eight of those, Grasshopper showed that he had the talent when he ran Street Sense to a half-length in last year's GI Travers S. He opened up 2008 with a rousing 2 1/2-length tally in the GIII Mineshaft H. in New Orleans Feb. 9 and lost little in defeat in his latest. A big effort in the opening day feature at Belmont would help solidify his status as one of the best handicap horses not named Curlin on the East Coast. A horse with as much or more to prove is Sightseeing. Winner of last year's GII Peter Pan S., he failed to win in his next five and hasn't hit the board in his last three, including in his seasonal debut, a grassy Gulfstream allowance Feb. 29. Sightseeing tries to regain the spark returning to the main track and the site of his biggest win.

TERLINGUA DIES Overbrook Farm's Terlingua

(Secretariat--Crimson Saint, by Crimson Saint), a multiple graded stakes winner who became the dam of leading sire Storm Cat, was euthanized due to the infirmities of old age. The 32-year-old mare will be buried at Overbrook. She had been pensioned since in 2000. Bred by Tom Gentry, the second foal from the swift Crimson Saint was acquired for \$275,000 as a yearling

at Keeneland July by D. Wayne Lukas for Bob Beal and Lloyd French. Lukas, a leading Quarter Horse trainer at the time, had only been training Thoroughbreds for a few years at the time. Terlingua debuted victoriously in the Nursery S. and added victories in the GII Hollywood Lassie S., GII Hollywood Juvenile Cham-

pionship S. and GII Del Mar Debutante S. before heading east. She notched a third in the GI Frizette S. and second in the GII Alcibiades S. In two more seasons at the track, the powerfully built chestnut scored in the GIII Santa Ynez S., the La Brea S. and Las Flores H. before retiring with a record of 17-7-4-1 and earnings of \$423,896. Her exploits contributed to the popularity at auction of Crimson Saint's subsequent progeny, which included the \$1.8-million Pancho Villa (Secretariat), the \$1.1-million Alydariel (Alydar), the \$7-million Laa Etaab (Nijinsky II), the \$3.5-million Royal Academy (Nijinsky II) and the \$2.1-million Navajo Pass (Secretariat). Of those, Royal Academy landed the 1990 GI Breeders' Cup Mile and Pancho Villa became a multiple stakes winner, while Alydariel scored black type in the Las Palmas H. Terlingua was acquired privately by Overbrook and, while her first foal, Lyphard's Dancer (Lyphard), never made it to the races, her second will immortalize her in pedigrees for the foreseeable future. Storm Cat (Storm Bird), foaled in 1983, carried Overbrook's colors to victory in the GI Young America S. before coming up a nose short in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, and became the most popular--and most successful commercial--stallion of his generation. His offspring have amassed over \$112 million to date, and his 160 stakes winners include the likes of overseas champion Giant's Causeway; Breeders' Cup winners Cat Thief, Desert Stormer, Storm Flag Flying and Sweet Catomine; and 12 champions/highweights. Terlingua produced multiple graded stakes winner Chapel of Dreams (Northern Dancer) in 1984 and, while her subsequent offspring failed to measure up to those two, her permanent residence at Overbrook was assured. Her last foal, the 2000 mare Final Legacy (Boston Harbor), resides at the farm, and produced a Strong Hope filly this season before being bred back to El Corredor.




THIRD-CROP BLUES

Of course you've heard of the War of the Roses. In our world, we have the War of the Blues--Godolphin Blue against Coolmore Blue. This war is being fought now in the breeding sheds as well as on the racetrack, and leadership among third-crop sires is proving to be an interesting battleground in this war. In Europe, Invincible Spirit (Green Desert) and Rock of Gibraltar (Danehill) are battling it out for supremacy among third-crop sires, though it's all to the greater glory of Danzig, if you ask me. Coolmore's Rock of Gibraltar was a top miler whose runners are staying 10 furlongs anyway; Invincible Spirit was a sprinter himself whose runners seem best up to a mile. He became a success at the Irish National Stud, after which Darley bought a substantial share in him.

While there may be as many as five GI Kentucky Derby starters from the first crops of their sires (which are now classed as second-crop sires, since their second crops have now reached racing age), there are exactly zero from the second crops of three-year-olds by their sires, which are now classed as third-crop sires. Confusing, I know, but third-crop sires now have four-year-olds racing, so any Derby starters by these sires would be from their second crops. But because there are none, now is a good opportunity to review these sires, before we jump into the second-crop statistics once the first Classics have been run.

The cumulative progeny earnings leader among North American third-crop sires is Darley's Street Cry (Machiavellian), who did of course sire last year's Kentucky Derby winner Street Sense in his first crop. He has held the edge over Coolmore's Johannesburg at every pole. They were one-two on the 2006 Freshman Sire List, again one-two on the 2007 Second-Crop Sire List, and are two-three on the 2008 Third-Crop Sire List so far this year. Moreover, Johannesburg sired a massive 261 named foals in his first two crops, of which an impressive 194 (74 percent) have already made the races (his second crop are just four months into their three-year-old year, remember), and 95 have won. By comparison, Street Cry has sired 58 winners from 167 foals--94 fewer than Johannesburg. Street Cry's average earnings per foal are an impressive \$57,235; Johannesburg's are less than half that (\$27,068). In APEX terms, at the end of 2007, Street Cry sported a 3.33 A Runner Index. Johannesburg, by comparison, had a still very credible 2.48 rating. In cumulative progeny earnings terms, Johannesburg is well over \$1 million in front of third-placed Include, so it's fair to say there is a Darley-Coolmore one-two on the western side of The Pond, too.



Street Cry is the first for-real World Top 12 sire Darley has stood, but even though he leads Johannesburg (by less than a thousand dollars) in 2008 earnings, both are being upstaged at the moment by **Jump Start**, a son of A.P. Indy *(see below)* who has been represented by six stakes winners already this year, including three in the last two weeks. We maybe shouldn't read too much into it: he leads Street Cry and Johannesburg by about \$130,000 this year, but still only ranks 38th on the 2008 General Sire List (bloodhorse.com), and is only up to seventh in cumulative earnings among North American third-crop sires. Still, his name is appearing in good company, which it really wasn't doing that much before.

Significantly, the top 10 North American third-crop sires all stand in Kentucky.

Include (Broad Brush), fourth this year and third overall, looks a really useful sire, with six stakes winners, including two Grade I-winning fillies, in his first crop.

Orientate (Mt. Livermore), the champion sprinter in 2002, got his eighth stakes winner, and his second Grade I-winning filly from his first crop, when Intangaroo won the GI Santa Monica H. at Santa Anita in early February.

Officer (Bertrando) is also proving really useful, with a 2.10 ABC Runner Index (the magic 17-percent ABC Runners), and a 2.79 two-year-old ABC Index. He has 12 stakes winners and 22 stakes horses, the only North American third-crop sire besides Street Cry and Johannesburg to have above 10 and 20, respectively, in those two categories.

Yonaguska (Cherokee Run) is the leading third-crop sire in both 2008 winners (37) and overall winners (106), though his ABC Index (0.87) could stand to be higher.

Pure Prize (Storm Cat) has impressive APEX ratings, including a 2.94 two-year-old ABC Index; **E Dubai** (Mr. Prospector) has similarly impressive APEX ratings, including a 2.96 rating for two-year-olds. **Mizzen Mast** (Cozzene) recovered from a slow start and now has well-above average 1.60 ratings for both A and B Runners.

Florida sires fill four of the next eight places, headed by **Three Wonders** (Storm Cat) and **Graeme Hall** (Dehere), who has a 1.70 ABC Index, with an especially notable 2.56 index for those pay-as-you-go C Runners. **Snow Ridge** (Tabasco Cat) and GI Preakness winner **Red Bullet** (Unbridled) have also consistently rated in this sire crop's second 10.

Two California sires also rate among the top 18: **Tribal Rule** (Storm Cat), a Wygod family stallion; and **Thunderello** (Montbrook), sire of Monterey Jazz, winner of two \$300,000 graded stakes this year.

Two exiles from Kentucky are also among the 18 North American third-crop sires with progeny earnings over \$1,950,000. **Came Home** (Gone West) went to Japan with APEX ratings of 0.93 for A Runners and ABC Runners; and **Buddha** (Unbridled's Song), who actually ranks second only to Yonaguska in 2008 winners (with 36). He's now in Pennsylvania.

A.P. Indy: the Sire Line...

Now that he's reached the age of 19, with his 12th crop of three-year-olds now racing, there aren't too many secrets left about A.P. Indy. He's twice been Leading Sire on the North American General Sire List and five times the world's leading sire by APEX A Runner Index--in spite of clearly being nowhere near that good in Europe. It's not any more a question of how good a sire he is; now it's time to start assessing his medium-term influence. He's always been a good filly sire (47 percent of his 117 A Runners through the end of 2007 were fillies, versus the normal 40 percent), and he had 27 A Runners as a broodmare sire through the end of 2007--surely a very good start in that sphere. There is always a little doubt whether a sire who is so effective for fillies and mares will be as effective as a sire of sires.



But, equally intriguing, the OBS sales are up \$8-million, while those now held outside of Ocala are down \$17-million – over 20 percent. Does this really mean the growth market for two-year-olds is limited to Ocala and Europe?"



That's why Jump Start's impressive start to 2008, as detailed above, could be even more significant. Up until

now, Jump Start looked to be a little bit above-average stallion (1.34 A Index, 1.26 ABC Index through end 2007), and, though connections optimistically bumped him to \$20,000 for 2007 after a promising eighth placing on the 2006 Freshman Sire List, he was quickly dropped back to \$10,000 this year after failing to improve on that

placing in 2007. He only had four stakes winners all last year, but he has already had six this year, including three stakes-winning three-year-olds and two stakesplaced four-year-olds in the last two weeks. This elevator is going up!

Equally significant, though, is the question of where Jump Start figures among the sons of A.P. Indy and how A.P. Indy figures as a sire of sires. Through the end of 2007 he had 11 sons with APEX ratings, of which I'd only vaguely, or not at all, heard of the bottom three by ABC Index in the accompanying table--Weekend Cruise, Historic, Matricule. And A.P. Valentine did stand at Ashford in the 2003 covering season, but didn't have the requisite 10 foals of 2004 to qualify for APEX ratings. So I threw them out. This left eight stallions I had heard of with 2007 APEX ratings. Five of the eight had A Runner indexes above 1.30, and only one of the eight had an ABC Index below 1.00. The jury is still out on one of the five, Aptitude (1.36 A, 1.14 ABC), but I'd say Jump Start's good start this year makes him the fourth son of A.P. Indy to suggest he has real merit as a sire.

Pulpit, from A.P. Indy's first crop (1994), won the then-GII Blue Grass S. and ran fourth in the GI Kentucky Derby in what was to be his final career start, and he became A.P. Indy's first major son at stud, retiring in 1998, with his first foals arriving in 1999. He's been far from an overnight sensation: Langfuhr performed virtually head-and-head with him in their early seasons, and Pulpit's stud fee ping-ponged between \$35,000 and \$75,000 before reaching \$80,000 in 2006, where it has stayed. Obviously he must be doing pretty well these days to sustain such a high fee. Sure enough, he ranked ninth on the 2007 General Sire list, and is 12th so far this year (though if Pyro rebounds on Saturday, that could change dramatically for the better). Also, though, he backs up a very solid 2.39 A Runner Index with an impressive 2.09 index for ABC Runners--indicating nearly 17 percent of his runners are paying their way and more. That 17 percent ABC Runners to Starters figure (translating to an ABC Index in the 2.13 range) does seem to indicate a sire is consistently siring a good number of useful 'name' runners.

As much as Pulpit was heralded as a sire prospect, A.P. Indy's second-best son, **Malibu Moon**, was totally



unheralded. Winner of a five-furlong maiden race at Hollywood Park from only two starts at two, he was already at stud at Country Life Farm in Maryland at three and his first foals were born in 2001. From 210 foals in four Maryland crops, he sired over 80-percent starters from foals, and 24 stakes winners, a sensa-

tional (these days) 11.4-percent stakes winners from foals, including the 2004 champion two-year-old Declan's Moon from his second crop. His first Kentucky crop of 100 foals, two-year-olds last year, included no fewer than 54 two-year-old starters and 26 two-year-old winners, and he ranked seventh on the 2007 Two-Year-Old Sire List. He's a big success story.

only start at four. He stood for as much as \$25,000 in 2006, the year after his Stevie Wonderboy was named champion two-year-old colt of 2005, but was back down to \$20,000 for 2007, and to \$12,500 this

year, equaling the lowest fee at which he has stood. He had nine stakes winners last year, and I think will turn out better than his current stud fee says he is.

Counting Jump Start as a success story as well, that's four of A.P. Indy's eight sons with half a chance who are decent or better sires. There's still a chance for Aptitude to figure on the plus side of the equation, and even Golden Missile (0.70 A, 1.32 ABC), who was exiled from Kentucky to New York this year, gets his share of useful runners. Only General Royal and Crowd Pleaser, both of whom died in 2006, were disappointing--yet they had ABC Indexes of 0.80 and 1.04, respectively, indicating they weren't totally without merit.


Perhaps just as significantly, there are a slew of A.P. Indy-line sires in the pipeline. We count 19 sons of A.P. Indy with first foals 2006 and later which stand for \$5,000 or more, plus five by Pulpit and one each by Stephen Got Even (Stevie Wonderboy, of course, \$17,500 at Airdrie) and Old Trieste (Silver Train, \$25,000 at Vinery, first foals this year).

The sons of A.P. Indy include Mineshaft, who was 17th on the 2007 Freshman Sire List, but is seventh on the 2008 second-crop list; Friend's Lake, whose first two-year-olds have averaged \$193,000 at the sales this year; and, of course, the great **Bernardini**, whose mares in foal averaged over \$1 million last November.

Pulpit's sons include Sky Mesa, who is up from 20th on the Freshman Sire list to 10th on the second-crop list; Tapit, whose first two-year-olds averaged \$139,000; and Corinthian, winner of last year's GI Met Mile and the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile S.

It all adds up to there being every chance that A.P. Indy is really just getting started as a sire of sires, and the early returns look plenty encouraging.

RUSSELL BAZE WINS 12TH ISAAC MURPHY

Racing Hall of Fame jockey Russell Baze, North America's all-time leading rider who passed the 10,000-win



plateau earlier this year, will collect his unprecedented 12th overall Isaac Murphy Award from the National Turf Writers Association later this season for finishing the 2007 season with the highest winning percentage of any North American jockey. Baze, who rode his 10,000th

winner on Feb. 1 at Golden Gate Fields, won the first nine Isaac Murphy Awards and now collects his third straight. He finished the 2007 season with a winning percentage of 32.9 percent after winning 399 races from 1,211 mounts. Baze won easily over runner-up Ricky Frazier, who posted a 26 percent win percentage, and third-place finisher Mario Gutierrez, who won at a 25-percent clip. Presented by the National Turf Writers Association, the Isaac Murphy Award is named in honor of the 19th century African American jockey who won with 44 percent of his career mounts. Jockeys need to have ridden a minimum of 500 races to be eligible for the award. Baze will receive his honor from the National Turf Writers Association later this year. Rounding out the top 10 leading jockeys in 2007 by winning percentage were Jeremy Rose (24.3 percent), John Davila Jr. (24.2 percent), Glenn Corbett (23.8 percent), 2004 Isaac Murphy Award winner Ramon Dominguez (23.8 percent), Joe Crispin (23.5 percent), E. T. Baird (22.7 percent), and Alex Birzer (22.6 percent).

'FASTNET' ROCKS CLASSIC FINALE A pair of yearlings by Coolmore's first-year sire Fastnet Rock (Aus) showed the way at yesterday's concluding Classic Session of the Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale.



The highest price of A\$190,000 was achieved by hip 514, who was purchased by Gary Moore and John Hutchison on behalf of Macau-based Dr. Stanley Ho. From the Widden Stud draft, the son of Star of Alexis (Risen Star) hails from the family of U.S. turf champion Manila. "We are keen to upgrade the quality of horses

coming into Macau, and Dr. Ho has decided to lead the way," Moore said. "With this type of horse going to Macau, hopefully it will give other owners the confidence to bring in horses of similar quality, which will inevitably upgrade the standard of horses in Macau." Six lots later, a daughter of the Danehill stallion was acquired by Paul Moroney Bloodstock for A\$160,000. Consigned by Brooklyn Lodge as agent, the bay filly is the second foal from the Peintre Celebre mare Stocktake (Aus), herself a daughter of G1 Golden Slipper heroine Burst (Aus) (Marauding {NZ}). In all, 12 yearlings made six figures at the final session; a total of 145 sold for an aggregate of A\$5,385,000. The average was A\$37,138, the median was A\$25,000 and the clearance rate was 83.8 percent. Buyers hailed from throughout Australia as well as New Zealand, Hong Kong, Singapore, Malaysia, Macau and Ireland. "It was great to see buyers from all parts of the world competing for these yearlings over the past three days.
