JOCKEY CLUB FORMS SAFETY COMMITTEE

The Jockey Club Chairman Ogden Mills Phipps Thursday announced the formation of a seven-member committee to study every aspect of equine health. The issues to be reviewed by the committee include breeding practices, medication and track surfaces. The committee will be comprised of Chairman Stuart Janney III, John Barr, Jimmy Bell, Dr. Larry Bramlage, Donald Dizney, Dell Hancock and Dr. Hiram Polk Jr. "All seven of these individuals have dedicated a major part of their lives to Thoroughbred breeding and racing and have shown a consistent and unwavering concern for the welfare of Thoroughbreds," Phipps said in a press release. "We will reach out to involve others in the industry and we will do everything in our power to encourage changes that will benefit the breed in any way. We will do this in a timely manner." Three of the seven members of the panel participated in the two Welfare and Safety of the Racehorse Summits, and the recommendations resulting from the Summits will be the basis of the work done by The Jockey Club committee. The Summits, underwritten by The Jockey Club and Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation, were held in October 2006 and March 2008. A strategic plan drawn up after the first summit and a summary of recommendations emanating from the second are available at www.grayson-jockeyclub.org/summit. Responding to Thursday's announcement, NTRA President Alex Waldrop said, "The Thoroughbred Safety Committee is a major step that will provide the examination of the horse welfare and safety issues so badly needed in the wake of recent catastrophic injuries. The NTRA supports the committee's work and plans to work closely with it to build support for the committee's recommendations with the many constituencies we represent. At the same time, we will redouble our efforts to promote Thoroughbred racing to core and target fans as the safe, responsible sport that it is. Now more than ever, no practice, policy or tradition is more important than those that best protect and promote the health of the Thoroughbred athlete."

WHAT THE DOCTOR ORDERED

Chester's tight ever-turning circuit lends itself to tactical dilemmas, but Ryan Moore had the timing honed to perfection when steering **Doctor Fremantle**



Caught flat-footed at the start, the bay recovered quickly and ran with the choke out off Pampas Cat's steady fractions. Tracking that rival throughout, he seized a gap on the final turn as All the Aces grabbed the initiative out wide. Getting to that foe with 150 yards remaining, he was pulling away as the line approached. "It was a muddling race and he quickened well, pricked his ears and idled and then went through with it," the owner-breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe commented. "On both sides of his pedigree, he's got the stamina for a Derby, but he is not in the June 7 G1 Epsom Derby and we have Twice Over (GB) that we are aiming towards that. Fourth behind Ask (GB) in the G3 Gordon Richards S. at Sandown eight days later, he benefitted from positive tactics to record a career-best here. Sent straight to the lead by Darryll Holland, where he was shadowed by Maraahel, he looked booked for the silver medal as that rival swooped at the eighth pole, but fought back in the final 50 yards to deny the Shadwell stalwart a fourth consecutive edition of this prize. P.S.U Grad, a \$375,000 Barretts May juvenile purchase, returned to Fairplex Sept. 15 to take the Barretts Debutante S., restricted to graduates of that sale. A well-beaten 10th when moved to a synthetic surface for the GI Oak Leaf S. Sept. 29, the dark bay was an improved fourth when placed on the grass--against optional claiming foes--in her 2008 bow at Santa Anita Jan. 18. Going a mile on Bay Meadow's main track Feb. 9, she came out one length on top in a \$32,000 optional claimer before finishing a good second most recently in the six-panel GIII Santa Paula S. Mar. 20. Lovely Isle, beaten only a length in the one-mile GI Las Virgenes S. Feb. 9, tired to seventh after setting the early pace going a sixteenth further in the GI Santa Anita Oaks Mar. 8. The filly faded to fifth last time out in the Santa Paula S.


Confidence Grows in Big Brown Camp...

Immediately following his tour de force in the GI Kentucky Derby, trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. seemed less than certain that Big Brown (Boundary) could repeat that performance in the May 17 GI Preakness S. But, after seeing how the colt came out of his Derby victory, Dutrow is no longer hedging his bets. "This is the best he has come out of a race since I've had him," the conditioner said during a press conference yesterday. "In his other two races, he ran down a little bit in front, but he didn't this time. He is eating up everything to this point and he looks as happy as he can be. Seeing the way he has come out of the Derby, I feel good about him." As for the competition Big Brown will face in the second leg of the Triple Crown, Dutrow remarked, "I'm feeling that we have the best horse, the fastest horse in the race. It's not coming up a stellar field--anyone can see that, especially me. The only horse I could have any respect for coming into the Preakness is Harlem Rocker (Macho Uno). He is threefor-three; there is a little buzz about him. But that's as far as it goes. If Brown gets over the two-week thing, and runs the way he has been running, he's going to be tough to beat. Judging by what I've seen, I don't see him falling off his game."

Equipment Change for Recapturetheglory...

Looking to avoid the problems encountered by fifthplace finisher Recapturetheglory (Cherokee Run) in the paddock before the GI Kentucky Derby, trainer Louie Roussel said yesterday that the three-year-old will have cotton stuffed in his ears and be sporting ear plugs at Pimlico. Recapturetheglory was unnerved by the crowd at Churchill. He had a handler on either side as he headed to the paddock to be saddled, but was barely in control as he came through the tunnel. "I was in shock," Roussel said. "I thought at any moment they might have to scratch him. He was completely out of it. I don't know what happened, if it was the crowd noise, but he just wasn't sane that day." The dark bay then threw jockey Eddie Baird as he was heading back through the tunnel on his way to the track. Roussel gave Baird credit for getting back on board after getting tossed. "It looked like he got the wind knocked out of him. He was on his back and his goggles were scattered everywhere. But he took a minute to get his breath back, then he got back on and rode a great race." Looking ahead to the Preakness, the New Orleans native added, "We'll do a couple of things differently. He has had cotton in his ears when he has been galloping at Churchill, and he'll have the cotton and the ear plugs on Preakness Day. They will pull them out at the starting gate. We also saddle in the infield--he won't have to go through a tunnel--which should help. I don't know how many lengths he lost by running half his race in the paddock, but I have to give him another chance to prove himself." Recapturetheglory heads to Maryland Saturday.

Macho Again Possible for Preakness...

West Point Thoroughbred's Macho Again (Macho Uno), winner of the Derby Trial Apr. 26, may make his next appearance in the GI Preakness S. May 17. "They want to keep our options open for the Preakness," said West Point representative Jeff Lifson. The colt, who galloped a mile and a half over a muddy track before the mid-morning renovation break at Churchill Downs yesterday, is also being considered for the May 31 GII Ohio Derby and the June 7 GII Woody Stephens S.

Won in recent years by subsequent G1 Epsom Derby heroes Oath (Ire) and Kris Kin, this has become a significant pointer to the blue riband and has attracted an unusually large field this time. Godolphin's Alexandros has not been seen since finishing third in Deauville's G1 Prix Morny in August. He had previously won the Listed Prix Roland de Chambure at Longchamp and G3 Prix de Cabourg back at the Normandy venue in July and Saeed bin Suroor is hopeful that he can book his ticket to the June 7 feature. "Alexandros is doing well and I am happy with his preparation," he said. "He is fit and healthy. It will be a tough race to win, but we are looking forward to a good performance from our colt on his first start this year." Aidan O'Brien saddles Achill Island, runner-up in last fall's G2 Royal Lodge S. at Ascot and Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf at Monmouth. He was sixth in the Apr. 13 G3 Prix la Force on his sophomore bow at Longchamp. "He got tired in very bad ground in France and we think he has come on a good bit for that," O'Brien said.



With three straight Group 1 wins under his belt this campaign, Apache Cat has a stranglehold on betting here as the odds-on favourite. The five-year-old gelding won the G1 Lightning S. first-up at Flemington Feb. 2, then added the G1 Australia S. to his tally at Moonee Valley Feb. 16. He was then kept fresh ahead of his dominant 2 3/4-length win in the G1 TJ Smith S. at Randwick April 26. Trainer Greg Eurell noted that Apache Cat has not lost a race shorter than 1400 meters since he finished third in the Listed Aurie's Star (1200 meters) at Flemington in August 2006. Jockey Corey Brown, who has partnered the white-faced assassin in his last three outings, said Apache Cat's BTC Cup barrier draw was ideal. "He'll be able to do the same thing he did the other day [in the TJ Smith], position himself and pounce when he has to," Brown said. "He should get the absolute perfect run of the race."

OVER READY Connections of Twice Over (GB) (Observatory) yesterday issued an upbeat bulletin ahead of the unbeaten colt's outing in Thursday's G2 Dante S. at York. Khalid Abdullah's homebred sidestepped the G1 2000 Guineas following his victory over Raven's Pass in the G3 Craven S. at Newmarket Apr. 17 and will prep for the June 7 G1 Epsom Derby in the extended 10-furlong trial. "He is in good form and worked yesterday morning on the Limekilns gallop," Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe commented. "[Trainer] Henry [Cecil] seemed pleased, as did [jockey] Ted Durcan and he is in good nick. Missing a Classic is always a nervous thing, but the main idea was to give him the correct run at the Epsom Derby and the Dante is the best trial, so at the moment we are happy with that decision."

Warrd and Boy Added to Poulains Field...

Godolphin's new acquisition II Warrd (Ire) (Pivotal (GB)) and the Calvera Partnership's Paco Boy (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}) were yesterday supplemented for Sunday's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp. Connections paid €24,000 each to add the duo. II Warrd boasts a 4 1/2-length success in the Apr. 12 Listed Easter S. at Kempton when trained by Marcus Tregoning, while Paco Boy scored a success for the Richard Hannon stable in Newbury's G3 Greenham S. Apr. 19. Their presence brought the total declarations to 20, headed by Il Warrd's stable companion Rio de la Plata (Rahy), who will be ridden by Frankie Dettori. Martin Dwyer will ride II Warrd. Godolphin's Racing Manager Simon Crisford reports that Rio de la Plata, the reigning G1 Jean-Luc Lagardere winner, is ready for the one-mile Classic. "It was always the plan to go for this race as he liked the track last year," he said. "It seemed to suit him very well and he has had a good winter."

Tamayuz Gets Green Light...

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's unbeaten Tamayuz (GB) (Nayef) will line up in Sunday's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp, trainer Freddy Head confirmed yesterday. Successful in the Apr. 13 G3 Prix de Fontainebleau over course and distance, the homebred pleased his trainer in a recent workout. "I am delighted with him at the moment and he worked very nicely on Tuesday," he said. "He is well within himself and all we have to do is wait and cross our fingers." Another to book his ticket on Tuesday was Sean Mulryan's G1 Criterium International hero Thewayyouare (Kingmambo), who will be making his seasonal debut for the Andre Fabre stable. "He did a very good piece of work on Tuesday and everything seems in good order, so he has the green light to go," the owner's Racing Manager Herve Barjot commented.

Pasquier Favoring Look...

Stephane Pasquier looks set to partner the David Smaga-trained Modern Look (GB) (Zamindar) in Sunday's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (French 1000 Guineas) at Longchamp. While Khalid Abdullah is also represented by last year's G1 Prix Marcel Boussac runner-up Conference Call (GB) (Anabaa) in the Classic, the owner-breeder's retained rider is almost certain to ride last year's G3 Prix Miesque winner, who was runner-up to Natagora (Fr) in the Apr. 14 Listed Prix Imprudence at Maisons-Laffitte. "She was running on over seven furlongs last time and has worked well and come on since," Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe said yesterday. "At the moment, Stephane is leaning towards her, but if she is drawn 16 of 16, he might think again."

Unequivocally, the death of Eight Belles in Saturday's Kentucky Derby is one of the saddest tragedies that our sport has ever endured. The tragedy lies in the loss of a truly brilliant filly who gave everything she had to her very last moments. It also lies in the overwhelming devastation felt by the owner, trainer and jockey team who deserve our deepest sympathies right now, and in the deep sadness felt by every compassionate person who witnessed Eight Belles untimely death.

Immediately following this tragic loss, the group People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals (PETA) was quick to point the blame in the direction of the filly's connections, calling for the withholding of purse money and sanctions against the filly's owner, trainer and jockey. Let me say right now, as clearly as I can, PETA is absolutely wrong to present these baseless and unjust allegations against Rick Porter, Larry Jones and Gabriel Saez. These claims are slanderous, wholly unsubstantiated and indicate a blatant disregard for the truth. To say that a filly that draws away from 18 of the best three-year-old colts in the country before galloping out with her ears pricked was "doubtlessly injured before the finish" demonstrates the disturbing matter-of-fact tone used to mask their ignorance of the subject.

Despite these unfounded statements, it is vitally important that we, as a sport, don't cover our ears to all the criticisms directed towards horseracing in the wake of the Eight Belles tragedy. This is not a time to make this an "us" versus "them" affair. Our sport continues to suffer from a public image standpoint and it is important that we recognize this fact. The view that horseracing is primarily an elitist and even savage game driven by money and ego is completely inaccurate, but nevertheless, it is not uncommon among some on the outside of our sport. We must, through education, dialogue and a continued insistence on progress, help ourselves to factually dispel the myths that our critics perpetuate. In the last few years, the Thoroughbred industry has taken some very important steps in furthering the safety of our horses and the integrity of our sport. While the use of synthetic tracks is still in its infant and fact-gathering stages, their adoption demonstrates a very active pursuit of a safer environment for our horses. Recently, sales companies and racetracks have begun more fervent drug-testing and are beginning to implement stronger punishments for violators. While this represents progress, our testing methods must be improved and a violation must carry a punishment severe enough to truly discourage those who try to play outside the rules.

Also, our continued commitment to the safety and happiness of the horse is demonstrated in the proliferation of Thoroughbred retirement farms in which horses continue to be cared for after their racing days have ended. These are the points of progress that we must promote, but by absolutely no means can we rest on our laurels. As each of us should know, we have a long way to go if we are to mend the public relations void between our industry and the general public. Change can come, but it will only come as a result of a united effort. Horse racing continues to be a factional endeavor, and without a true, central governing body to regulate our sport and implement new regulations, we will only continue our baby-step approach towards progress. Racing must have a National Governing Body That Oversees the Enforcement of Standard Rules in Every State (and I don't mean the Federal Government).

As we all know, jumping atop a soapbox and preaching the gospel of progress is very different from getting our hands dirty and implementing true change. Now, during this unprecedented period of bad publicity, the horse industry must unite to bring about the changes that will help ensure the vitality of our great sport.

NYRA, MID-ATLANTIC SIGN SIMULCASTING

AGREEMENT The New York Racing Association and the Mid-Atlantic Cooperative signed an agreement yesterday, which will allow NYRA simulcasts to return to 16 East Coast tracks. The agreement will go into effect today, just in time for opening day at Monmouth Park in Oceanport, New Jersey. The two factions have been locked in negotiations since Belmont Park kicked off its 2008 season Apr. 30. "NYRA is very pleased ro have this agreement in place with such a major simulcast partner," said Hal Handel, NYRA Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer. "We are glad to bring our races back to the fans at Mid-Atlantic tracks, and I'm sure the fans will be happy to have NYRA races back, expecially as we head into the heart of the New York racing season." Mid-Atlantic Cooperative consists of Meadowlands, Monmouth Park, Freehold Raceway, Atlantic City Race Course, Philadelphia Park, Penn National Race Course, Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs, Charles Town, Delaware Park, Dover Downs, Harrington Raceway, Ocean Downs, Rosecroft Raceway, Colonial Downs and Suffolk Downs. The two groups had previously signed an agreement, allowing the Mid-Atlantic tracks to simulcast the GI Belmont S. June 7.



Brad Martin Dismissed from Buckram Oak Suit:

Brad Martin has been dismissed from a Kentucky lawsuit involving the sale of Buckram Oak Farm in Lexington to Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Farm in 2005. Martin's attorney Michael Meuser confirmed his client was voluntarily dismissed from the suit on Apr. 24 and that Martin had paid nothing in exchange for the dismissal.

Eastern Tent Caterpillar Population Up Sharply:

Eastern tent caterpillars, which have been linked to the devastating outbreak of Mare Reproductive Loss Syndrome (MRLS) in 2001, are now wandering and experts warn that the population of the insects are at their highest levels since. "The eastern tent caterpillar populations are dramatically up this year--the highest I've seen since the MRLS crisis," said Dan Potter, University of Kentucky College of Agriculture professor of entomology. "The larvae are full size, many trees are totally defoliated and I've seen very large numbers of caterpillars moving along fence rails and wandering out many meters into pastures adjacent to the cherry trees we are using to conduct eastern tent caterpillar trials. Maturation and wandering of eastern tent caterpillars is occurring a bit late this year due to the cooler spring," he added. While there have been no reported cases of MRLS, Neil Williams, the University of Kentucky's Livestock Disease Diagnostic Center associate director and pathology section chief, said that it is prudent for equine professionals to remain vigilant. Entomologists at the University of Kentucky advise farm managers to keep pregnant mares out of pastures bordered by cherry trees or other hosts for the next few weeks. During the 2001 outbreak, an estimated 30 percent of the Thoroughbred foal crop was lost at an economic cost of \$336 million due to losses in all breeds of horses.

Farm Bill Contains Tax Provision for Horse Owners:

House and Senate Conferees for the 2007 Farm Bill approved a final version of the bill yesterday, which includes legislative language to amend the depreciation schedule for racehorses. The final version of the Farm Bill is expected to pass both houses and be sent to the President for approval. Under current tax law, racehorses are depreciated over either three or seven years, depending on their age when it begins training. Legislation contained in the 2007 Farm Bill allows an owner to recover his/her costs over the period of time that the horse is likely to race. "This provision will provide enormous economic incentives to the horse racing and breeding industry and also bring more fairness to the tax treatment of one of the most important assets in our industry: the racehorse," said NTRA President and CEO Alex Waldrop. "A simplified, uniform depreciation schedule for racehorses will help keep buyers in the market for racing bloodstock and improve the overall economics of horse racing and breeding. The NTRA and the whole horse industry owe a significant 'thank you' to Kentucky's senior Senator Mitch McConnell for his steadfast leadership on this important issue, which is critical to Kentucky's signature agribusiness. We also thank Senator Blanche Lincoln (D-AR), Rep. Dennis Cardoza (D-CA) and other Members of Congress who supported this legislation."
