CHURCHILL CUTS PURSES 20 PERCENT

Churchill Downs yesterday announced a 20-percent purse cut, effective May 14. According to a press release issued by the track, the move was made in re-

sponse to the horsemen's refusal to approve the distribution of the Churchill simulcast signal to advance-deposit wagering sites. "We have been left with no option but to reduce overnight purses to offset the amount of lost handle because Kentucky horsemen have prevented horse racing fans from wagering through ADW platforms," said Churchill President Steve Sexton. "We are disap-

pointed because the failure to send the signal will negatively impact the product both on and off the racetrack. While we are still hopeful this impasse can be resolved, we have no choice but to act now." The current round of purse reductions will affect overnight purses, and the release went on to say that there was a potential for Fall Meet stakes race purses to be reduced as well. The Kentucky Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association and Kentucky Thoroughbred Association representatives also have informed Churchill that further discussions regarding ADW contracts be conducted with the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Group, an alliance of horsemen's groups from around the country. Commenting on the purse cut, THG President Bob Reeves said, "As far as I'm concerned, this was retaliatory and unnecessary. I believe they should have worked with the KHPBA and the KTA in advance of announcing any purse cuts to make sure they were warranted." Talks with Churchill on the ADW issue have stalled. "Churchill has refused to talk to the THG," Reeves said. "They have been consistent in their position that they want negotiations to be with the local horsemen's groups at their tracks." Reeves added, "I am very proud of the horsemen represented by our members. They understand that, in trying to get more money for purses from ADW companies, we are involved in a very high-stakes game." Churchill, however, believes that the horsemen's demands regarding ADW contracts are not reasonable. "Since Churchill Downs' entry into the ADW business in 2007, we have nearly doubled host fees paid by ADW businesses to our racetracks and horsemen partners through successful negotiations with local horsemen," said Sexton. "Kentucky horsemen and the THG are now demanding even more, but their plan is simply not feasible for ADW companies, including TwinSpires.com." Calder Cuts Stakes Purses, p7

Remarking on the post of Thewayyouare, Racing Manager Herve Barjot told PA Sport, "It is a big field and it is not a good draw for a race like the Guineas." But Barjot added, "He had the perfect season last year and we think he is a very nice colt. Andre Fabre has done a great job getting him ready for Sunday, but it really depends which way the field will go. His breeding suggests he will get further than a mile and the plan is definitely to go for a Derby, but which one we will decide after Sunday." Other leading players done no favors by their post position are Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's G3 Prix de Fontainebleau winner Tamayuz and Godolphin's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere scorer Rio de la Plata, but Micheline Leurson and Haras du Camp Benard's Hello Morning has a distinct advantage breaking from the two hole. He has just a halflength to find on Thewayyouare on their Criterium International form and found the testing ground against him when just over a length third in the Fontainebleau over this track and trip Apr. 13.

"He worked well on Tuesday and ground conditions should be ideal as he is much better suited to good or faster," she said. "On his last run, he showed improvement and he has improved again since, so we are hopeful of a good run." Paul Cole has yet to capture this prize and saddles a duo in Sir George Meyrick's General Eliott and Michael Spencer's "TDN Rising Star" River Proud.

While the former has an Apr. 25 Sandown conditions success to his name, River Proud boasts some of the best form on offer due to his second in the G2 July S. and success in the G3 Somerville Tattersall S. at Newmarket last term. He has to rebound from a tame fourth in the Apr. 17 G3 Craven S. at that venue, where Noel O'Callaghan's Alexander Castle was back in fifth.

"We're very happy with both of them, but River Proud broke a bit too quick first time out and didn't give the best of runs," Cole's son and assistant Oliver told *PA Sport*. "He'll probably need a lead and a typical French pace might not make that easy as they often go slow. General Eliott is very versatile and quite straightforward and we think he's a proper horse."

Emphatic when the 2 1/2-length conqueror of Conference Call in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac here on Arc day, Zarkava looked even better back over track and

trip on her return in the Apr. 13 G3 Prix de la Grotte, where she replicated the margin over that rival. "We are looking forward to the race on Sunday," the Aga Khan's Racing Manager Georges Rimaud told *PA Sport* yesterday. "We thought there were going to be less than 14, but it'll be interesting and we just hope she won't get into any traffic problems. I think there will be plenty of pace with that number of horses in the

race." British-trained fillies have a sparse win rate here, with only four having taken off with the spoils since 1980. Mick Channon went close to glory with Nahoodh (Ire) in the Newmarket equivalent last weekend and will be hoping for compensation with Jaber Abdullah's Nijoom Dubai. Having won Royal Ascot's G3 Albany S. in June, she was racing for the first time since finishing sixth in the G3 Nell Gwyn S. at Newmarket last time Apr. 16. "She has definitely improved for her run in the Nell Gwyn and her work since has been of a high standard," Racing Manager Bruce Raymond commented. "She went nicely in a piece with Nahoodh, who then ran so well in the 1000 Guineas, so we are hoping that she goes there with a chance. If she can recapture the form that saw her win the Albany, then you'd have to think that she would be very competitive." The Wertheimer silks graced the winner's enclosure courtesy of Ivanjica in 1975 and Dancing Maid (Fr) three years later and will be carried by Goldikova and Kayaba this time. The former hails from the Freddy Head barn and was far from disgraced when failing by a short head while giving eight pounds to Azabara in a courseand-distance conditions event Apr. 3. The Carlos Laffon-Parias-trained Kayaba earned her spot with a Saint-Cloud conditions score Apr. 11.

Sir Michael Stoute sent Tajaaweed to Doncaster's G1 Racing Post Trophy just 17 days after his debut win at Nottingham in October and, despite his 10th-place finish there, connections remained unshaken in their faith in the imposing colt. Drawn widest of all here, he was restrained in rear and had most of his rivals in front as the field passed the winning post for the first time. Making his move on the inside of Achill Island as that rival was committed approaching the final furlong, he had Unnefer to deal with wider out and only managed to defeat that rival in the final 50 yards. "He had an awful draw and can pull, so I didn't want to gun him up there, and Sir Michael said to just ride him with confidence and keep him balanced, as he's a tall horse," jockey Richard Hills said. "I didn't really want to go to the inside either, so he has overcome a lot of obstacles and showed a nice turn of foot." Sheikh Hamdan's Racing Manager Angus Gold suggested that a tilt at the June 7 G1 Epsom Derby, which Stoute won with his only previous Dee S. scorer Kris Kin, is in the cards. "It was nice to see him handle the track as well as he did and I like the way he knuckled down for an inexperienced horse," Gold said. "He has gained a lot of useful experience today and, if Sir Michael is happy with him, we'd be wrong not to consider the Derby." "Before she met dad, my mother had never been to the races," said West, a second-generation horseman. "On their first date, they went to the track and a horse my father saddled won." Two-for-three since changing hands, Homemade Brew makes her stakes debut after winning an optional claimer at Santa Anita Apr. 25. West, who saddled 17-1 Ashley's Kitty to victory in the 2007 Railbird, bids to become the first conditioner in the race's 45-year history to take it back-to-back. "Both

fillies came into the race the same way," said West. "Ashley's Kitty had won twice, once in a claiming race and once in an allowance race before her first stakes win in the Railbird." Tyler Baze, who picks up the mount, was aboard Homemade Brew for the first time Tuesday, guiding her through a five-furlong breeze in 1:00 flat. "Tyler worked her for the first time and loved her," said West, adding, "I've got a filly on the improve, and I've got to be happy with a horse in that zone."

CALDER STAKES PURSES CUT Calder Race Course announced vesterday that the purses for eight upcoming stakes races will be cut. The May 26 GIII Memorial Day H., July 4 Mecke H. and July 12 J J's Dream S. and Frank Gomez Memorial S., which originally had purses of \$100,000, have been reduced to overnight stakes with purses of \$36,000. The remaining four stakes on the July 12 Summit of Speed program have also been cut, with the GI Princess Rooney H. and GII Smile Sprint H. reduced \$100,000 to \$400,000; and the GII Carry Back S. and GIII Azalea S. decreased \$50,000 to \$250,000. Steve Sexton, executive vice president of Churchill Downs Incorporated, Calder's parent company, cited the ongoing dispute with the Florida horsemen over advance-deposit wagering and slots revenue, which has blocked Calder from selling its signal out of state for the cut. "We continue to be disheartened that the Florida horsemen are blocking out-of-state wagering on Calder's races, and although we regret having to implement further purse cuts, it is a move that must be made in light of our current business situation," said Sexton in a press release. "Both the Florida horsemen and Calder continue to lose handle daily, and customers who enjoy wagering on Calder races are being unjustly penalized as a result of this situation. We continue to hope that the Florida horsemen will reconsider their stance of not discussing a purse contract until a slots agreement is reached, despite the fact no slots will be operational in 2008. Unfortunately, if this impasse continues we will have to make some difficult decisions regarding additional reductions to the overnight purses, as well."

Godolphin's **Ibn Khaldun** (Dubai Destination) will bid to restore his reputation in the May 24 G1 Irish 2000 Guineas, connections announced yesterday. Last year's G1 Racing Post Trophy hero was sent off the 7-2 second favorite for the Newmarket Classic, only to trail in 10th. "We examined him from head to toe and can't find anything wrong at all," Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford said. "He is so well and fresh in himself he is rearing up, so it's a complete mystery but we are going to put that behind us now and move forward. We've got the Irish Guineas to look forward to."

On the plus side, he gets blinkers, a strong move for Dollase (see trainer profile), and quite a few horses have jumped going from cushion to dirt. But this one isn't that fast, faces traffic coming from far back in a big field, and will take a lot of money. Borderline contender, underlay.

3 Golden Yank Yankee Gentleman 20-1

Got down to a good one in his third lifetime start, and returned to that level in his second start this year. This is a good pattern for a new top, and that last one was really concealed--he comes out of a fast Arkansas Derby, where he was wide (3w3w, upper left), and carried high weight. He faces traffic coming from behind, but with decent figures, an inside draw, a good pattern and three local works, Golden Yank is live to get a piece of this at a big price.

4 Poni Colada Volponi 15-1

Has developed a lot already, and bounced badly after every good effort. Since he just ran well, he's much more likely to bounce than run the new top he needs.

5 King's Silver Son Mizzen Mast 15-1

Tailed off last year after a promising start. After finally breaking through two back he bounced badly last time, at a point where he should have been able to pair up. He'll probably run better now, but the weak pattern makes it unlikely he'll run the new top he needs.

6 Texas Wildcatter Monarchos 8-1

Ran the best figure of anyone in this field in the Gotham, then bounced badly in the Wood. The Pletcher horses have started firing again in the last couple of months, and the barn has done well shipping into Lone Star (see profile). The Thoro-Graph Race Shape shows us that this colt has more early speed than the horses inside him, so he should drop in and get a good trip. Strong contender.

Ide Like a Double Ide 15-1

Has developed a lot, and is unlikely to develop more short term. Which leaves him too slow to contend.

8 Isabull Holy Bull 30-1

Moved forward slightly last time and may be ready for a new top, but has many lengths to make up.

9 Samba Rooster <u>Songandaprayer</u> 9-5

Jumped to a new top in his last start for Wolfson, and paired up that figure in his first start for Baffert. When Baffert's 3yos get good they stay that way for a while, and the barn has done extremely well shipping into Lone Star (see profile). The Race Shape tells us this colt should easily clear the field and save ground on the turns, worth an extra Thoro-Graph point or two in a big field. Strong contender.

10 Leonides Richter Scale 10-1

Is questionable at the distance, and has an ouchy pattern-he's reacted badly to every good effort. It may take a while to get back to that good February figure.

11 My Pal Charlie Indian Charlie 12-1

Developed well from two to three while racing a lot in a short of time. The post hurts, but he has two siblings that ran negative numbers at three (far right of page), and could make an impression before the year is over.

12 Fort Apache Mineshaft 30-1

Jumped to a new top last time, but would need an even bigger jump now to get involved here.

13 Real Appeal Successful Appeal 30-1

Threw in a real stinker last time at Hawthorne, but with a terrible draw even a return to his best won't hit the board.

Bottom Line: Texas Wildcatter and Samba Rooster are clearly the strongest contenders. Golden Yank could be value in the exotics.

SPECIAL NTRA BOARD MEETING REVIEWS EQUINE SAFETY ISSUES The Board of Directors of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association discussed a variety of issues regarding equine health and safety during a special teleconference yesterday. The NTRA Board underlined its intent to continue its coordination and implementation of industry-wide communications on the issues, and urged support of initiatives to further ensure the well-being of Thoroughbreds. "The industry's number one priority is the health and safety of the horse," said NTRA President and CEO Alex Waldrop. "We are coordinating with our member organizations on a number of ongoing safety initiatives to reach actionable findings more quickly and to ensure the broadest possible industry implementation of those findings. It is clear that the status quo is not an option, and we need to bring a renewed sense of urgency to these initiatives. Our fans and industry stakeholders expect nothing less."





"He was the horse that stepped on Gary Stevens after he fell from Storming Home (GB)," McGee said. Honor In War finished ninth in that race.
