The legend of Better Than Honour grew further Saturday at Belmont Park when her son **Casino Drive** (Mineshaft), a 3/4-brother to reigning GI Belmont S. heroine Rags to Riches and a half to 2006 winner Jazil,

earned his way into the final leg of this year's Triple Crown with a surprisingly easy victory in the GII Peter Pan S. The handsome chestnut colt had but one trip to the races to his credit, an 11 1/2-length score in a maiden race at Kyoto Racecourse Feb. 23. He belied his inexperience in

a big way yesterday. "He had so much to overcome: only one race, more than a two-month layoff, long trip and quarantine," said Nobutaka Tada on behalf of owner Hidetoshi Yamamoto. "Now, we have four weeks to go to the Belmont and he has four weeks to improve." Cont. p2



RECAPTURETHEGLORY OUT OF PREAKNESS

Recapturetheglory (Cherokee Run), the GII Illinois Derby winner who was most recently fifth in the GI Kentucky Derby, will miss the chance to rematch with Big Brown after being declared out of Saturday's GI Preakness S. at Pimlico. The colt, owned in partnership by Louie Roussel III and Ronnie Lamarque, spiked a bit of a fever Saturday morning and blood was drawn. Lamarque made it official at 2 p.m., advising Pimlico officials of his decision. "The racehorse comes first," he commented. "He had a slight temperature plus a slight pulse in his right front toe. For the betterment of racing we are electing to give this horse some time and let him regroup. We are really going to miss the Preakness experience. We felt we had a live chance to turn the tables on Big Brown." Preakness News cont. p15


further racetrack accomplishments of Rags to Riches, it's a long way from the final Saturday of February in the Land of the Rising Sun to the first Saturday of June in the Big Apple, but that's exactly what was on the line. Slow into stride from the inside barrier, Casino Drive gained ground rapidly and settled in fourth as **Mint Lane** (Maria's Mon) took the field

through swift fractions of :23.08 for the quarter and :46.31 for the half. He continued to hug the fence on the turn, then professionally knifed through an opening between the pacesetter and GII Illinois Derby runner-up Golden Spikes (Seeking the Gold) in upper stretch. He switched leads on cue and drew clear through the final stages, despite wanting to drift in just a bit. Jockey Kent Desormeaux, who in all likelihood will ride a different horse in the Belmont, is a believer. "Yeah, he can run a lot," he stated. "It's going to be fun. He's a phenomenal talent, and we've got our hands full with this one. It's going to be ultimately exciting for all of the fans. He's got that stride." Indizguys Stable and trainer Mike Mitchell for \$40,000 in November of 2006, the gelding was soon moved up to the optional claiming ranks, winning two straight going long over the Santa Anita turf early in 2007. Rallying to be third, the English-bred was moved up to second via disqualification in the GII San Luis Obispo H. 13 months

ago, before reeling off two straight in graded-stakes company that spring. Victorious in Santa Anita's GII San Juan Capistrano H. in April, the dark bay added a win in this race last May. Given a breather after that effort, the attractive gelding returned with a third in this term's San Luis Obispo Feb. 23, but failed to fire and finished sixth in the 1 1/2-mile GII San Luis Rev H. Mar. 22. He was fourth most recently in the San Juan Capistrano Apr. 20 and was let go at 9-1 while trying to defend his title here. Content to stalk the early pace in fourth through early splits of :24.69, :48.02, 1:12.49 and 1:37.32 for a mile, On The Acorn closed in on favored Champs Elysees (GB) turning for home, hooked up with that rival midstretch and battled late to inch by that foe in the final strides. "This horse has been training great ever since we turned him out," said trainer Mike Mitchell. "I thought the first race back was a super [third in the San Luis Obispo], and I thought it set it up for the next two races. I was scratching my head after the second race, because he just ran so bad. The last time in the San Juan Capistrano, I just thought he was up too close for him. This was just a perfect trip." Lucky Island broke his maiden in a six-furlong event over the turf at San Isidro in Argentina last June 17 before being acquired privately by Sheikh Hamdan's operation. Last of seven after a stumble at the break of a Calder optional claimer Dec. 29, the dark bay added Lasix and posted a big speed figure in taking a Gulfstream allowance Feb. 15 and was most recently an impressive allowance winner on the Wood Memorial undercard at Aqueduct Apr. 5. Settled in midpack along the rails, Lucky Island was forced to steady in behind rivals at the half-mile, but traveled supremely well to the quarter pole. Guided outside pacesetting Man of Danger at the head of the stretch, he overtook that rival at the furlong grounds and drove clear. "The first time we ran him, he bled," said winning trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "Now, he is three-for-three for us on Lasix. This was a big step up from a 'two-other-than.' He proved he belonged. Street Boss won his maiden at first asking at Del Mar Sept. 2 before finishing runner-up to subsequent GISW Johnny Eves in a Santa Anita allowance Sept. 26. Unplaced in two subsequent tries, the chestnut made a successful four-year-old debut in a Santa Anita allowance Jan. 17, then was beaten a neck in Arcadia Feb. 13. He bounced back with an easy score Mar. 6, made it two straight Apr. 14 and was favored here in his graded-stakes debut. Shuffled back to last after clipping heels on the backstretch, Street Boss commenced his rally on the turn. His momentum carried him a bit wide into the stretch, but he took aim on pacesetting Sailors Sunset under a full head of steam and rolled by that rival with nary a crack of David Flores's whip. "He clipped heels at the start," Flores explained. "It was like he got mad after that happened. I could feel it in the middle of the turn, I had so much horse. I was just waiting for room. Making the switch to a conventional dirt surface for the first time in his career, El Gato Malo switched out for the stretch drive and ran down a game Leonides for a narrow victory in this valuable event. A debut winner over six furlongs at Hollywood Park Nov. 18, the West Point runner made a successful transition to two turns and stakes competition, winning the Dec. 15 Gold Rush S. at Golden Gate Fields. He took advantage of a torrid speed duel to add the GIII San Rafael S. at Santa Anita Jan. 12, but found the talented Colonel John a bit too tough in his last pair, a runner-up effort in the GIII Sham S. Mar. 1 and a fifth in the Apr. 5 GI Santa Anita Derby. A lack of graded-stakes earnings ruled out a trip to Louisville, and, after giving careful consideration to a shot at the Preakness, connections decided on this softer spot. A headstrong Samba Rooster set out for the early lead as El Gato Malo found cover while not that far from the front. Given his cue by Rafael Bejarano on the far turn, he bulled his way out, brushing with Texas Wildcatter (Monarchos) in upper stretch, then leveled out and was along in the waning strides. Alessandro Volta advertised his Classic credentials when winning Leopardstown's Listed Eyrefield S. in November and had excuses with a slipped saddle when only fourth in the G3 Ballysax S. back at that venue on his sophomore return Apr. 20. Taken straight to the lead by Johnny Murtagh here, he was shadowed by King of Rome and did that rival no favors when forcing him wide after the sharp turn into the straight. Challenged by Campanologist on his inside, he had that rival's measure despite wandering around as his stable companion reemerged with a late rally. "The track didn't suit him as he's a big galloping horse," his jockey commented. "I thought the way the early races had gone, I had better get him out in front and let him use that stride. He didn't come down the hill very well and didn't turn very well, but in the straight, he got his act together and galloped out well to the line and stayed on. He's a good mover and that should stand him in good stead for Epsom."



Jockey Corey Brown compared Apache Cat favourably to Darley's champion sprinter Exceed and Excel (Aus) after the bright chestnut scored his fourth consecutive Group 1 race, prevailing narrowly from Vormista to snare the A\$259,300 first prize purse and bring his earnings to A\$2,926,625 overall. "He's a superstar," said Brown, himself celebrating his 25th Group 1 victory. "He's the best sprinter I've ridden. Exceed And Excel was the best sprinter I've ridden up until now, but this horse has now gone to the top." Brown settled Apache Cat in third, powering three wide into the straight and keeping a firm hold on his mount until the 200-meter pole. He unleashed the gelding soon after, and the pair surged to best the hard-trying filly Vormista, who was paying close attention on the inside. Only a head separated the pair on the line. Swiss Ace closed late to snare third. Apache Cat's next assignment is the G1 Doomben 10,000 over 1350 meters May 24. Trainer Greg Eurell said Apache Cat's sheer will prevailed, adding, "This is a bit of a magic moment for me. He was nearly sold to Hong Kong as a young horse and, thank God, the sale didn't come off." Vormista's trainer Mark Minervini, meanwhile, is looking forward to a rematch in the Doomben 10,000. "Every time we've asked her to go up a level, she has answered the call," he said.



She's Got the Look...

While attempting to beat Alain de Royer-Dupre's "pearl" Zarkava (Ire) (Zamindar) in today's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (French 1000 Guineas) at Longchamp is a tall order, David Smaga may have a potential spoiler in Modern Look (GB) (Zamindar). Khalid Abdullah captured this prize with Houseproud in 1990 and Zenda (GB) 12 years later and would have had a third edition had the stewards not demoted Price Tag (GB) two years ago. He has two shots at this renewal, and while Conference Call (GB) (Anabaa) has twice felt the draft from Zarkava's explosive power in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac and G3 Prix de la Grotte, Modern Look remains an unexposed danger. Successful in the G3 Prix Miesque at Maisons-Laffitte in November, Modern Look found only the subsequent G1 1000 Guineas heroine Natagora (Fr) too strong in the Listed Prix Imprudence back at that venue last time Apr. 14.

"We ran into the Guineas winner last time on ground that was much too soft for her, but she's been training very well since and looks great," Smaga commented. "We have good ground today, so we can be hopeful of a very good performance." Aidan O'Brien annexed this in 2001 with Rose Gypsy (GB) and saddles an interesting duo in Halfway to Heaven (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}) and Psalm (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). While the former boasts the stronger form, having finished runner-up in the G3 Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial S., Johnny Murtagh is on the maiden Psalm, who was seventh in that Apr. 6 contest. "She was a bit unlucky last time when the saddle slipped up her neck and she's a small and slight filly," Murtagh explained. "We are drawn wide and the Aga Khan's filly looks the one we all have to beat, but her work has been very good and I think she'll run well." Andre Fabre's runners can never be ignored and Mayfair Stud's Azabara (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) will be attempting to become the multiple champion trainer's third winner. She had Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) back in second in a course-and-distance conditions. event last time Apr. 3, but has faster ground and an eight-pound swingaround to contend with here.

Do you have any memories of Big Brown as a youngster? My most poignant memory of Big Brown is that of a yearling, and that was the day we sold him at Fasig-Tipton. The farm manager and I were standing at the back. They had just hammered him down, and then I saw this horse just go streaking down the walk path without his handler. He came out of the sale ring and said, 'I'm outta here.' Apparently he was not having fun (laughs). He sprinted to the back part, stopped at a fence and waited for someone to get him. He came out of that ring running and he hasn't stopped yet.

Favorite vacation spot? My wife and I have a home in Palm Beach, Florida, where we spend the winters, and it's marvelous. We love it there.

How did you acquire Big Brown's dam Mien? I got Mien (Nureyev) when she was being carried by Miasma (Lear Fan), who I bought at auction (for \$350,000 in 1992). So we foaled her at the farm, raced her, and then brought her back to the broodmare band. Big Brown is her second foal.

Who did she produce this year and who is she going back to? She produced a Belong to Me filly and she will be bred back to Stormy Atlantic.

Favorite meal? That's a tough one--I like practically everything! **Drink of choice?** Well, I drink an awful lot of Diet Coke.

What's on your CD player right now? Well, it could be some good Country and Western, it could be some good Classical, or it could be some good oldie rock. I'm pretty versatile. I picked up some of the country from Texas (laughs); George Straight, Patsy Cline.

What's your idea of a perfect day? Getting up early, having some coffee, walking across the farm in the very early morning. Probably there's some dew on the grass. Walking through the pastures and looking at the yearlings and the mares and their babies. I can do that 'til noon if I have time to do it. Frequently after that I'll have a workout, then get on some of my old polo ponies and ride around the farm.

What made you send Mien, Big Brown's dam, to Boundary? When I determine the breedings for my mares, I go through about a three-step process. The first step is to use the results of the Equix mating process. They have a biometric model they use to match up your mare's physical characteristics to a group of stallions that she fits best with. For me, that generates the set of stallions I consider breeding to. Then I take the mare and each of the stallions and create a hypothetical pedigree and then take a look at that pedigree.

What you'll see with Big Brown is a cross of Northern Dancer, a cross of Damascus, and a cross of Round Table. If you look at the principal runners Boundary produced, some of those runners will have Northern Dancer crosses--3x3, 3x4, stuff like that. Some other of his runners have Damascus 3x4, 4x4. Others had Round Table. I looked at Big Brown, and I said, my gosh, all three of those crosses are in this pedigree (Northern Dancer 3x3, Damascus 3x4, Round Table 4x5), so I thought it was a good

Plus, a few years ago, I did a brief study of all the winners of American Classic races, those being the Kentucky Oaks, the Coaching Club of America Oaks, and the Triple Crown races. Some 85 percent of those winners from 1914 to 2002 had one or more crosses in their pedigree of significant female families, as judged by the Bruce Lowe system. The pedigree of Big Brown has for crosses of a mare named Selene in it, and that's the third step--I make sure there's crosses to those mares in the pedigree. And that's how I got to Boundary. It's a bit mathematical.

How much did Boundary stand for at the time? He was \$10,000. And that was probably one of the things that was nagging at me the most. Monticule is a commercial breeder. When you look at a \$10,000 stud fee, you ask 'What is Mr. Market going to say about that?' You can't be real optimistic. You say, 'Man, I hope this foal turns out beautiful, because the market's going to really crucify me if it doesn't.' So that bothered me, but the other stuff I looked at and said, 'That's pretty cool; that's good stuff.'

You've done well with Danzig and Danzig-line horses--having sold the Danzig sons Prussian and the \$9.2-million Plavius. Is he a big favorite of yours? Breeding to Danzig was not a hard decision. If you had a mare that fit him physically and the pedigree fits, it's not hard. The guy was producing 18, 19 percent stakes winners to foals, and what's not to like about that? The fact that Boundary was by Danzig I didn't particularly look at, I was just looking at the fact that one of the crosses that was prominent in Boundary runners was that Northern Dancer cross. And you got that cross through Danzig.

How did you first get into racing? I've loved horses ever since I was a small child. The first time I ever rode a pony I was three years old and I thought that was the biggest deal of my life. I continued my romance with horses until my mid-teens. Then I had a short interlude with motorcycles, and I found those to be even more dangerous than horses (laughs). And so I've been riding horses ever since.

Then in 1973, I came to the University of Kentucky to work on a doctorate degree. In June of '73, when I came here, Secretariat's picture was on the front of Sports Illustrated and being a horse lover and seeing that and seeing all the farms around here, I said, boy, I'd sure like to do this someday. It was a pretty easy sell. I bought the first part of Monticule in 1990, but at that point I was pretty busy with a business career. In '97, I started buying broodmares and continued buying a few each year. I've got 21 now, which is a good number to work with. I'd say four or five now are daughters of members of the broodmare band itself.

You live in Texas. Have you considered opening a farm there, too? When it comes to breeding and racing Thoroughbreds, it's very difficult to compete with the infrastructure Central Kentucky has. There are so many good horse people here, whether you're talking grooms or farriers or farm managers. If you tried to do a good solid breeding operation in some other places in the country, you'd be compromised by that lack of infrastructure.

If you were made commissioner of racing and you had broad powers, what changes would you make to racing? I don't know about specific changes, but I think all of us in this sport have to continually remind ourselves that the only reason we get to do this is



because we have fans that love to be entertained by a good horse race. And anytime we do things in the industry that don't add to, or take away, the fact that people come to the track to be

we're not doing

the industry good. Many people forget that's the final product. That's where we have to excel.

What did you do to celebrate the Derby? Went home and relaxed (laughs). We were at Churchill well after the last race went off. We had plenty of friends and family up in the Jockey Club suites, and I'm sure the service personnel were beginning to wonder when we'd leave.

There has been a lot of talk, both within the industry and out, about the breakdown of Eight Belles. What do you make of the situation? It's absolutely devastating thing to happen to a horse. I don't know anyone in the industry who isn't absolutely beside themselves when they see something like that happen, including myself, and I'm surprised I can talk about it right now without getting emotional, because it bothers the hell out of me. But unfortunately, that's the only injury that millions of millions of people see, and it's on TV and people connect it with 'Racing hurts horses.'

What they don't see is that, out in some farm's pasture, there could be 10 or 15 yearlings running through the pasture, and one gets hurt running, just because they love to run. They don't see the fact that, maybe somewhere in Central Kentucky today, a few horses are arguing over who's the dominant horse and they kick each other and they get hurt. People don't see that. A year ago, I had a beautiful Silver Deputy colt and he was running along in the pasture and slipped and went under a fence and broke a bone. We tried for weeks, but we couldn't save him. Horses exert themselves, horses have really got a heart, they really have a determination, and sometimes they push themselves too far and they hurt. It rarely happens, but it happens. But when it's on TV, people connect it with racing and make assumptions that sometimes aren't very valid.

Another thing that people don't realize is that the quality of that horse--the quality of Eight Belles--is that she said, 'I'm not going to let that horse run away from me; I'm going to chase him down.' That's the epitome of an athlete. If you look at any sport--hockey, baseball, football--and when athletes press themselves to the extreme, when they try like the devil to do the best they can, sometimes they hurt themselves. When they do, it's drastic and horrible and we hate it.

Groom Tesse (GB) scored for the Camici family in 2004 and they put forward a live contender in Permesso, who had Fathayer and Once More Dubai behind when the impressive winner of the Listed Premio Botticelli here last time Apr. 20.

Triple Threats

Kentucky Bear Works at Old Hilltop...

Bear Stables Ltd's **Kentucky Bear** (Mr. Greeley) prepped for Saturday's GI Preakness S. yesterday, breezing five-eighths of a mile in 1:01 over a sloppy Pimlico main track. Jockey Jamie Theriot, who guided the colt to a third-place effort in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. in his most recent appearance Apr. 12, flew in

from Kentucky for the move. "I think it was a great work," Theriot commented. "I think he's at the top of his game. It's a great opportunity to get the pleasure to ride the kind of horses like this in this kind of race. It's a dream come true. You go as a little kid and want to

ride in the Kentucky Derby, these Triple Crown races and have that opportunity and a great shot of winning them. I think he's peaking at the right time. I wouldn't change mounts with anyone." Trainer Reade Baker cautioned earlier this week not to anoint Derby hero Big Brown (Boundary) a Triple Crown winner just yet and wonders what toll the Derby may have exacted. "If Big Brown was in any other race other than coming from Kentucky to Preakness, all the wise guys would be saying he's going to bounce," Baker said. "So, just because we call them the Derby and the Preakness, why can't he bounce? He might be a good enough horse to overcome all that. He's certainly a good horse."

Macho Again Back in the Mix...

One day after declaring Derby Trial S. hero Macho Again (Macho Uno) out of the race, connections have apparently had a change of heart and now plan on entering the colt in next Saturday's Classic. "Last night we sat down and really looked at the field," Stewart said. "There is one superstar in there [Big Brown] and I feel [Macho Again] can be competitive with the rest of them. He has never been doing better than he is now." The West Point Thoroughbreds runner turned in his final major work ahead of the race, going an easy half-mile in :50.80 yesterday at Churchill Downs. "The decision was not based on his work this morning," Stewart added. "He never has been much of a work horse. But we will see how he is in the morning, and we are seriously considering it. It's a once in a lifetime chance and Terry [Finley of West Point] has left the decision up to me."

Steady as She Goes for Racecar Rhapsody...

Jerry Carroll, Stan Kaplan, Ronald Plattner and Mark Guilfoyle's Racecar Rhapsody (Tale of the Cat) turned in his trademark steady five-furlong work yesterday morning at Churchill Downs, covering the distance in 1:01, matching each of his two previous breezes. "He worked well," said trainer Ken McPeek. "He laid off another horse and finished strong." The bay colt is just a maiden winner from six trips to the post, but he has already acquitted himself well in graded-stakes competition. Third in last year's GII Kentucky Jockey Club S., he returned from a 3 1/2-month absence to finish fourth in the GII Lane's End S. Mar. 22 and filled the same spot in the Apr. 19 GII Coolmore Lexington S., finishing just two lengths adrift of fellow Preakness combatant Behindatthebar (Forest Wildcat) after encountering traffic in the stretch. "He's a nice horse, but he's a horse that comes from behind and needs a clean trip," McPeek commented. "He needs plenty of ground." Racecar Rhapsody is expected in Baltimore Wednesday and Robby Albarado, victorious in last year's Preakness aboard Curlin, has the call.

Direct Route for Curtain Call...

Patrick Cooper's **Curtain Call (Fr)** (Sadler's Wells) was taken out of yesterday's G3 Lingfield Derby Trial due to the prevalent fast conditions and could head straight to the G1 Epsom Derby. Trainer Luca Cumani revealed that last year's G2 Beresford S. scorer was most likely to be seen next time in the June 7 Classic. "We will probably go straight to Epsom now," he told *PA Sport*. "He worked this morning and worked well and we will just have to implement a plan B now to get him to Epsom. We will have to have a think about it over the next few days and map out a plan."

Cape Set For York...

Five Horses Ltd's Cape Amber (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}), who graduated at Newmarket last August, has booked her ticket to Wednesday's G3 Musidora S. at York, connections announced. Trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam gave the green light to the filly following her latest home spin. "I am pleased with how Cape Amber is coming along," Chapple-Hyam said. "She has never been extravagant at home, but that was the best she has worked so far this year. She has got to run somewhere, so we are planning to go to the Musidora next Wednesday. FINAL RULES REALEASED REGULATING

FLORIDA HORSE SALES The Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services have released their final Rules and Regulations to implemented by HB1427, a law governing horse sales in Florida. The legislation, which was drafted to prohibit deceptive practices, was unanimously passed in 2007 by the Florida legislature and signed into law by Florida Governor Charlie Crist. The law required the Florida DOACS to conduct public hearings and draft rules and regulations to govern horse sales throughout the state. "It is important for the future of the horse industry to assure horse buyers are treated fairly," said owner/breeder Earle Mack, a proponent of the bill. "These new rules will go a long way to providing transparency and prohibiting some of the deceptive practices used by a minority of horse sellers. This is a giant step forward for Florida and I hope it is a starting point for horse sales throughout the nation." Included among the rules outlined in the final draft:

- Full and accurate disclosure to the buyer and owner/seller of any dual agency tactics (where an agent works for the buyer and the seller)
- Sales agent or trainer must fully disclose and obtain the consent of the principal, in writing if practicable, any legal or equitable ownership interest, either directly or through an entity in which the agent or trainer exercises any ownership or control, or such agent shall not purchase on behalf of its principal, nor recommend that its principal purchase or have purchased, any horse in which the agent or trainer has such ownership interest
- Sales companies must publicly disseminate accurate sales results within 90 days after the close of a public sale or auction disclosing and/or correcting any sales results based upon the information sales company receives in the ordinary course of business, that sale should be properly characterized as "reserve not attained" or "not sold." The auction company or licensee shall make this disclosure in the same manner it used to publicly disseminate the initial sales results, as well as in response to any written inquiry to the auction company or licensee.

"I commend the concerned horsemen and horsewomen, the DOACS and particularly the Florida Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders and representatives of Ocala Breeders Sales Company, for their earnest efforts to accomplish the proposal of these breakthrough administrative rules," Mack added. "Without the ultimate cooperation of all involved it would not have been possible. These rules will provide substantial protection for all horse purchasers in Florida and will insure that continued focus upon integrity in the horse marketplace is a paramount concern for those interested in protecting this valuable source of commerce in the state."




